STARTING 9: WHAT TO KNOW

- **Q** among nation's leaders: Senior first baseman/designated hitter Quincy Nieporte leads the country with 34 RBI's in 20 games played. He hit his third and fourth grand slams of the year last weekend at Virginia Tech, and he is now the single-season record holder for grand slams in a season at FSU. He has six home runs on the year.
- Grand Slams: Nieporte hit grand slams in consecutive games against Virginia Tech (3/17-18). His grand slam on Friday tied him with J.D. Drew (1996), Jeremy Morris (1996), Dennis Guinn (2006), Buster Posey (2008) and Seth Miller (2012) for grand slams in a season at FSU. His shot on Saturday gives him sole possession of the record.
- **Rarp wows at Florida: Tuesday's starter, Andrew Karp, was the hard-luck loser at Florida last Tuesday, recording 11 strikeouts in seven innings at Florida. He is the first Seminole since Randy Choate in 1996 to record at least 11 strikeouts against the Gators, and just the 10th all-time to reach that mark.
- Daughtry, Walls lead country in walks: After recording seven walks last weekend at Virginia Tech, infielder Tyler Daughtry has 26 walks on the season, tying shortstop Taylor Walls for the national lead. As a team, FSU's 152 walks are 24 more than the next closest team (Missouri, 128).
- Last week: After reaching the No. 1 ranking for the first time since 2014, Florida State went 1-4 on the road against No. 5 Florida (0-1), No. 22 Florida Gulf Coast (2-5) and Virginia Tech (9-2, 12-13, 0-17). The game at FGCU was Florida State's first game against the Eagles away from Tallahassee.
- **Holton among nation's best:** Two-time ACC Pitcher of the Week Tyler Holton is 4-0 with a 2.20 ERA in five starts this season. Before pitching just 3.2 innings at Virginia Tech before a 90-minute lightning delay, the sophomore from Tallahassee had a 0.36 ERA and 40 strikeouts.
- Noles on the basepaths: Florida State opened the season a perfect 27-for-27 in stolen bases before going just 1-for-3 at Virginia Tech. The Seminoles had the most stolen bases without being caught in the country. Freshman Nick Derr and junior Dylan Busby are both a perfect 5-for-5 on the year.
- **Martin active leader in wins:** Head coach Mike Martin, now in his 38th year as head coach at Florida State, is the active wins leader with 1,912. He also is the all-time winningest coach by percentage, with a .738 mark. He needs iust 64 wins to pass Augie Garrido's all-time wins record (1,975).
- Miscellaneous: Quincy Nieporte needs just two more grand slams to tie the national single-season record of six, by Alabama's Kyle Bryan in 1984...junior Rhett Aplin leads the Noles with a .348 batting average. He and Dylan Busby both hit their third home runs of the season Saturday at Virginia Tech.

THE WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN COLLEGE BASEBALL. MARTIN...

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.738)
- » owns the second-most wins all-time in NCAA Division I baseball history and most among active coaches (1,912)

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 34 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,594 as head coach (1980-present).

- Carlton made his first relief apperance of the year against Samford (2/26) in a non-save situation.
- Against Jacksonville (2/28), the Lakeland native was perfect for the final two innings in picking up his first career save in FSU's 6-5 win over the Dolphins.
- The game against Jacksonville was Carlton's 38th career appearance, but just his eighth out of the bullpen.
- At UCF (3/7), Carlton again entered in the eighth inning and was perfect against all six batters faced, closing out FSU's 5-2 win. In two save situations this year, he has yet to allow a baserunner.
- In 2016, Carlton started all 17 of his appearances, finishing with an 8-3 record and 3.94 ERA.

- Freshman Drew Parrish allowed just two hits and a run while striking out six in six innings in his first career start vs. Samford (2/26).

WALLS NAMED ALL-AMERICAN

- Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America.
- The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State in 2016 and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
- Walls also earned third team marks from NCBWA and D1Baseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.
- » Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.
- » To begin 2017, Walls has three doubles, a triple and two home runs. He ranks sixth nationally with 28 runs scored and leads the nation in walks with 26.
