STARTING 9: NOLES REACH NATION'S-BEST 16th SUPER REGIONAL

- **Super Regional:** Florida State has reached the Super Regionals for the 16th time (in 19 seasons under the SR format), the most in the country. FSU has played in three consecutive Super Regionals, and this is the team's first time hosting a Super Regional since 2013 (vs. Indiana). SHSU is playing in its first Super Regional.
- Regional: FSU won last week's Tallahassee Regional, losing the first game to Tennessee Tech before reeling off four straight wins. In 19 years under the current format, FSU became just the 21st school to win a regional after losing the first game (also did so in 2008). Mississippi State became the 22nd to do so on Monday night.
- Regional 2: The Regional was highlighted by FSU's starting pitching. Over five games, the unit allowed just six earned runs in 36.1 innings, with a 46-6 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Tyler Holton (v. UCF) and Will Zirzow (v. Auburn) threw complete games, while Holton (13), Zirzow (11) and Drew Parrish (12 v. TN Tech) had double-digit K's.
- Regional 3: FSU's Sunday night game against Auburn was an all-time classic, with FSU eventually winning 8-7 in 10 innings. AU scored three in the top of the 9th to take a 7-6 lead, and down to its last strike, **Dylan Busby** hit an RBI triple off the CF wall to tie it up. In the 10th, **J.C. Flowers** was HBP with the bases loaded to win the game.
- **5** ACC Tourney: Florida State went 4-0 in the ACC Championship, including a 7-3 win over No. 2 North Carolina in the Championship Game on Sunday. The win was FSU's 7th ACC Championship, and second in the past three seasons. **Drew Mendoza** hit two HR in the title game, and MVP **Jackson Lueck** was 7-for-16 in the tournament with two HR.
- Honors: Tyler Holton (2nd Team AA, Collegiate Baseball & Baseball America; 1st Team All-ACC) // Drew Mendoza (Freshman AA, Collegiate Baseball; All-Freshman ACC) // Quincy Nieporte (2nd Team All-ACC) // Dylan Busby (3rd Team All-ACC) // J.C. Flowers (All-Freshman ACC)
- 7 Tyler Holton: Holton is just the second pitcher in ACC history to earn Pitcher of the Week honors five times in one season Mike Rogers (NC State). Holton has 10+ K's in three straight games entering the Super Regional and six on the season, the first player since Jonathan Johnson (6 in 1995) to do so for Florida State.
- **Holton 2: Holton** has tallied 132 strikeouts this season, most in the ACC. Holton ranks 5th nationally in WHIP (0.84), 6th in strikeouts (132), 8th in hits allowed per nine innings (5.38) and 10th in wins (10). Holton is FSU's first 10-game winner since 2013 and his 132 strikeouts are 13th-most in a season in FSU history and most since 2000.
- Nieporte: Senior designated hitter Quincy Nieporte has 73 runs batted in this season. Q's 73 runs batted in are the most for a Seminole since Mike McGee had 73 in 2010. Nieporte also has four grand slams this season, most in FSU single-season history and the most in the country this year.

MARTIN (CONT.)

11 GETS WIN NO. 1.900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program.
- » Martin participated in his 3,000th game against as a Seminole vs. Virginia on April 28 - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,637 as head coach (1980-present).

NOLES ADVANCE THROUGH LOSER'S BRACKET, WIN TALLAHASSEE REGIONAL

- For the second time since the current Regional/Super Regional format was instituted in 1999, FSU advanced to a Super Regional after losing the first game of the regional. FSU fell 3-1 to Tennessee Tech Friday night, but rallied to eliminate the remaining three teams in the regional.
- The Noles beat UCF Saturday, Tennessee Tech in a rematch Sunday afternoon, and beat Auburn twice to reach a 16th Super Regional.
- FSU also lost the first game of the regional in 2008 (7-0 vs. Bucknell) before winning the next four. Just 22 teams have advanced to the Super Regional round after losing the opening game of the tournament (Mississippi State also did it in 2017).
- » Only FSU, Oklahoma (2012 & 2006), and Georgia (2008 & 2001) have done it more than once.

FSU PITCHING DOMINATES - AGAIN

- » Florida State's pitching in the Super Regionals was outstanding, allowing just 14 runs (11 earned) and striking out 62 in five games.
- Opponents hit just .220 against nine Florida State pitchers. Three starters (Tyler Holton, Drew Parrish, and Will Zirzow) recorded double-digit strikeouts. Those three, plus reliever Alec Byrd, set career- or season-highs in strikeouts during the Regional.
- » Holton (13 vs. UCF), Parrish (12 vs. Tennessee Tech) and Zirzow (11 vs. Auburn) each finished in the top 10 of the regional round in strikeouts, and finished 1-2-3 among ACC players in the tournament. Zirzow and Parrish had never thrown more than seven strikeouts in a game, while Holton tied his career high of 13 from earlier this season

OFFENSE HEATS UP AFTER SLUGGISH DEBUT

- » After notching just four hits in the opening 3-1 loss against Tennessee Tech, Florida State was consistently solid throughout the rest of the tournament in winning four consecutive games.
- » Quincy Nieporte had eight hits in five games, including a pair of doubles. Nieporte's three RBI in the event give him 73 on the season, the most for an FSU player since Mike McGee had 73 in 2010.
- » Matt Henderson continued his hot streak, accounting for a team-high .524 on-base percentage while going 5-for-15 at the plate.
- » Dylan Busby, FSU's season-saving hero with an RBI triple in the bottom of the ninth against Auburn on a full count, was 6-for-19 in the Regional. He hit FSU's lone triple while adding a pair of doubles in Monday's clincher vs. Auburn and a home run against Auburn Sunday night. Busby has hit 20 doubles this season, topping his 16 from last season, while hitting 14 home runs, tying last season's mark.

DID YOU KNOW

- FSU was the only team with multiple complete games in the Regionals (Tyler Holton vs. UCF, Will Zirzow vs. Auburn).
- FSU and Arkansas each threw 62 strikeouts in the Regionals, 20 more than No. 3 Texas Tech.
- FSU 7.75 K-to-BB ratio was one of only two (LSU, 7.60) above 6.00.

NOLES WIN 7TH ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

- Florida State became just the second 8-seed to win the ACC Baseball Championship, going 4-0 in Louisville, Ky., to secure the league's automatic bid.
- FSU beat 12-seed Notre Dame and 1-seed Louisville in pool play, before beating 9-seed Duke and 2-seed North Carolina in the semifinals and finals, respectively.
- Four Seminoles were named to the All-Tournament team, led by MVP Jackson Lueck.
- First baseman Drew Mendoza, third baseman Dylan Busby and starting pitcher Tyler Holton also earned All-Tournament honors
- Against Notre Dame, starting pitcher Drew Parrish allowed just one earned run in six innings, and Lueck reached base in all six plate appearances (three hits,
- Lueck had a first-inning single and a pair of two-run home runs, including the walk-off in the bottom of the 12th inning that moved FSU to 4-0 on the season against the Irish.
- Playing Louisville for the third time in a week, the Seminoles used a powerful effort from Tyler Holton to reach the semifinals. Holton struck out 10 and allowed just four hits in eight innings in the 6-2 win.
- Against Duke, starting pitcher Cole Sands set career-highs in innings pitched (6.2) and strikeouts (8) in FSU's 5-1 win. Sands would have pitched longer, but a 90-minute weather delay effectively ended his day.
- In the Championship Game, the Seminoles fell behind

- 3-0 in the second inning, but clawed back for a 7-3 win. It was the third consecutive season the Seminoles have played in the Championship Game, winning the title in 2015 against NC State and falling to Clemson in 2016.
- FSU scored six runs against North Carolina reliever Josh Hiatt, who entered the game having allowed just five on the season and none in his past 15 appear-
- Drew Mendoza hit a pair of home runs off Hiatt, in the 7th and 8th innings. FSU took the lead in the 8th on Cal Raleigh's RBI single, followed by Mendoza's threerun home run.

FSU PITCHING DOMINATES

- Going 4-0 in the ACC Tournament, Florida State pitching tallied a 1.62 earned run average, allowing just seven ER in 39.0 innings.
- The team combined to allow just 30 hits and 10 walks while striking out 41, with opponents hitting .205 against the unit.
- Cole Sands, Tyler Holton, Andrew Karp and Alec Byrd each picked up wins in the tournament.

BUSBY, LUECK LEAD BATS

- Sophomore Jackson Lueck hit .438 with 7 RBI and a .550 OBP over four games en route to MVP honors.
- Dylan Busby led FSŬ with a .444 average, four doubles and a home run, adding 15 RBI and a .524 average.
- Combined, the two were 15-for-34 with five doubles, a

triple and three home runs.

Lueck and Drew Mendoza each had 2-HR games in the tournament as well. Entering the ACC Championship, FSU had just two multi-HR games on the season.

TOURNAMENT HELD IN LOUISVILLE, KY.

- For the first time in league history, the ACC Championship was held in Louisville at Louisville Slugger Field, the Triple A home for the Louisville Bats.
- It is the 12th different city to host the ACC Championship. FSU previously won titles in Durham, N.C.; Greensboro, N.C.; Greenville, S.C.; Salem, Va.; and St. Petersburg, Fla.
- FSU has won 11 games over the last three Championships, going a perfect 4-0 in 2015 and 2017 and 3-1 in 2016. The 11 wins since 2015 are the most in a threeyear span since winning 13 from 2002-04.
- With four selections to the All-Tournament Team. Florida State tied Clemson (60) for the most all-time selections, though FSU missed the first five tournaments before joining the league in 1992.

EXTRA INNING WINS

- FSU beat Notre, 5-3, in 12 innings in game one of the tournament. It was FSU's first extra-innings win the event since beating North Carolina, 3-2, in 12 innings
- FSU improved to 4-3 all-time in extra innings games. Before Wednesday, FSU's last extra-inning game in the ACC Championship was a 7-4 loss to Virginia in 2013.

8-SEED WINS IT ALL

- FSU was the 8-seed in the 2017 ACC Championship, the lowest in FSU's 26 appearances in the tournament.
- FSU is just the second 8-seed to win the tournament, joining Georgia Tech in 2012. In 2014, the Yellow Jackets became the only 9-seed or lower to win the event.

FSU's series win at Louisville to end the regular season
- was the first time an ACC opponent has won a series against the Cardinals in Louisville since joining the league in 2015 (was 14-0).
- Furthermore, Louisville, the three-time Atlantic Division champions, is just 3-7 against Florida State over that span (teams split 2-2 in 2015; FSU won series 2-1 in 2016).
- Against the rest of the conference, Louisville is 70-17.
- After falling behind 7-3 in the opening game vs.
 Louisville this year (5/18), Florida State outscored the Cardinals 23-6 over the next 23 innings.

- Against Oakland (3/4), Holton struck out a career-high 13 batters in just six innings of work without allowing a walk. Holton also struck out 13 against UCF in the NCAA Regional.
- Holton became the first Nole with 13 K since Luke Weaver had 14 against Troy in the 2013 NCAA Regionals. He is the first Seminole with consecutive games of 10+ K's since Sean Gilmartin in 2011.
- Holton's six games of double-digit strikeouts are the most in one season for an FSU pitcher since Jonathan Johnson also did it six times in 1995. MLB First Overall Pick Paul Wilson did it eight times for FSU in 1994.

- FSU's top three starters (Holton 0.72, Parrish 1.12, and Sands 1.64) each have ERA's under two in that span.
- Will Zirzow, who had not pitched since May 9, threw a complete-game shutout, allowing just two hits and striking out a career-high 11, in the Regional Final against Auburn Monday night.

NIEPORTE PERFECT IN FINAL HOME GAME

- Designated hitter Quincy Nieporte was a perfect 5-for-5 against Wake Forest (5/14) on five singles.

- The effort earned him All-ACC Tournament honors and was the second time this year the Minneola, Fla., native had a multi-HR game (Jacksonville, 5/9).
- Against JU, Mendoza became the first FSU freshman with six RBI since DJ Stewart had six against Georgia Tech in 2013. He is the first Seminole with two HR and six RBI in a game since Chris Marconcini against Pittsburgh in 2015.

BUSBY NATIONAL POTW

- Junior third baseman Dylan Busby became the first FSU player ever with at least three RBI in five straight games after hitting a three-run homer against Miami (4/21).
- After a two-run home run vs. Duke in the ACC Championship (5/27), his 13th of the year, Busby now has 37 career home runs, the most among active players in the ACC, three ahead of Seth Beer (Clemson).
- For his efforts, Busby was named the NCBWA National Hitter of the Week (FSU's first since DJ Stewart in 2015) and the ACC Player of the Week.

SANDS DEALING ON THE ROAD

- Sophomore pitcher Cole Sands is 6-3 this season, including a perfect 4-0 mark in six games away from Tallahassee.
- The Seminoles have won all five of Sands road starts (Virginia Tech, Notre Dame, NC State, Miami, Louisville, Duke in ACC Tournament). Sands has 34 strikeouts on the road, including a career-high 8 vs. the Blue Devils in the ACC Tournament. Sands previously had 7 each against VT. ND. and Miami.
- Sands also pitched a career-high 6.2 innings against the Blue Devils, and would have gone longer if not for a 90-minute weather delay that ended his afternoon.

NOLES USING LONG BALL

- Florida State has hit 68 home runs in 2017, the most since hitting 86 in 2010.
- The Seminoles hit a home run in nine consecutive games from April 8-22, FSU's longest streak since 2010 (May 27-June 13).

- After starting as the designated hitter against Toledo on March 9 last season, Raleigh has started 114 consecutive games at catcher.

- Taylor Walls led off the game against Florida (4/11) with his fourth home run of the season.

- Before being sidelined for the season with a broken foot, Rhett Aplin had four of Florida State's six outfield assists this season after throwing a runner out at the plate to preserve a tie game vs. No. 3 Clemson (4/17).
- **>>** J.C. Flowers added FSU's seventh assist against Jacksonville (5/9), gunning a runner down at the plate.
- FSU entered the NC State (4/9) game with three outfield assists on the season. In the 5th inning against the Wolfpack, Aplin and Flowers each had an assist.
- At Louisville (5/19), Jackson Lueck had his first two assists of the season, including one in the seventh inning at the plate to help preserve FSU's lead.
- Lueck is the first player with two in one game since Steven Wells had a pair against Miami (5/21) in 2016.

- When FSU swept Notre Dame on March 24 and 25, it was the first three-game road sweep for Florida State since winning three times at Boston College in 2014.
- » It was FSU's first time winning a game at Frank Eck Stadium after the Noles were swept in 2015. Notre Dame joined the ACC prior to the 2014 season.
- FSU added a 5-3, 12-inning win over the Irish in the ACC Tournament (5/24).

- » The Seminoles trailed 7-0 after the top of the first inning, the second time this year that FSU rallied from a 7-0 deficit (Oakland, 3/3).
- » Against the Dolphins, the FSU bullpen allowed just one earned run in 8.1 innings, striking out 8 without walking a batter.
- » Against F6CU on April 4, Jackson Lueck tallied his third hit of the game, an RBI double that scored Taylor Walls in FSU's 7-6 win.
- » Lueck hit FSU's first walk-off home run of the season in the 12th inning against Notre Dame in the first round of the ACC Tournament. Lueck had FSU's last walk-off home run as well, against Miami in 2016.
