QUICK KICKS

- Florida State is ranked No. 9 by the National Soccer Coaches Association and No. 11 by TopDrawerSoccer for the week of October 18.
- The Seminoles have been ranked in the Top 25 of the NSCAA poll for 156 straight weeks and earlier this season snapped a streak of 51 consecutive weeks in the top 5 (Dec. 4, 2012 - Oct. 4, 2016).
- The Noles rank second in the nation with a 0.349 goals against average and are tied with Northwestern as the only schools in the country that have given up only five goals this season.
- The Seminoles are 11-9-5 all-time against Duke, most recently meeting in the 2015 NCAA National Semifinal, where the Blue Devils earned a 2-0 victory.
- FSU has won each of the four meetings with Louisville and have recorded three straight shutouts in the series. The Seminoles have not allowed the Cardinals to score since 2001.
- Florida State is 64-1-3 in its last 68 home matches, dating back to 2011. The only loss during that span was to Florida on September 5, 2014 (2-1). The Noles are currently on a 30-match unbeaten streak at the Seminole Soccer Complex, holding a record of 29-0-1 and outscoring their opponents, 93-6.

NO GOALS FOR YOU!!

The Florida State defense has stood strong so far in 2016, allowing just five goals on the season and posting 10 shutouts so far this year.

Prior to allowing a goal at South Alabama on September 5, the Noles has started the year with a consecutive scoreless streak of 294:23, marking the third-longest streak to open the season in program history, trailing the 2009 (349:18) & 2010 (343:23) teams.

It took opponents 518:28 to find their next goal, before Virginia scored at 8:52 in the match on September 25. It marked the fifth-longest scoreless streak in school history.

The Noles have allowed just five goals so far in 2016, which is the second-fewest goals allowed over the opening 13 games of a season in school history and is tied with Northwestern for the fewest goals allowed in the NCAA so far this season.

THREE'S COMPANY

Freshman forward **Deyna Castellanos** opened her career in impressive fashion, scoring one goal in each of the first three matches of 2016. She now has four goals for the season.

Castellanos matched **Selin Kuralay** (2005) as the only first-year players in program history to record a goal in each of their first three matches for the Garnet and Gold.

In all, scoring a goal in each of the first three games of the season has happened just four times, adding in **Tiffany McCarty** (2009) and **Erin Grimsley** (1997).

TEN CLEAN SHEETS

The Florida State soccer program is no stranger of recording shutouts, as the Noles have averaged 16.5 clean sheets per season over the last four years, including a school-record 19 shutouts during their run to the 2014 NCAA National Championship.

The 2016 Seminole team is nearly on pace to match that record as FSU already has posted 10 shutouts through the first 14 games of the season. The 10 shutouts is tied for 11th-most in school history and is on pace for 18 total shutouts on the season.

SECOND HALF SUFFOCATION

While the Seminoles have done an outstanding job of keeping opponents off the scoreboard, they have been excellent in the second half and overtime in recent games. FSU has surrendered just five goals on the year, but four have occurred in the first half of play.

Over its last 19 matches, Florida State has allowed just two goals after the 45:00 mark, a breakaway goal by Duke at 89:59 of the NCAA semifinal in 2015 as the Noles pressed their numbers high for the equalizer and a goal by Boston College at 50:04 in the match on October 6, 2016.

They mark the only blemishes in the last 1018:56 of second half or overtime action, dating back to November 8, 2015 against Virginia.

ACC STANDINGS

Florida State enters the 10th weekend of 2016 tied for third place in the conference standings with a 10-2-2 overall record and a 4-1-2 mark in ACC play. FSU leads the conference in fewest goals allowed, surrendering just five goals so far this season, and its 10 shutouts is tied for first in the conference.

Redshirt junior goalkeeper **Cassie Miller**, freshman forward **Deyna Castellanos** and sophomore **Megan Connolly** are among the top 10 in the conference in eight different categories, as Miller leads the ACC with a 0.36 goals against average, 0.57 shutouts per game and is tied for the conference lead with eight shutouts.

DUKE REMATCH

The Seminoles will meet the Blue Devils for the first time since the 2015 NCAA National Semifinal match that saw Duke earn a 2-0 victory. It was the second victory for Duke in the last 13 matches of the series, dating back to 2006.

Overall, FSU holds a 11-9-5 advantage all-time over Duke, while the squads are 8-8-5 in 21 meetings during conference play.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

While the goal scorers of Kristen McFarland, Deyna Castellanos and Megan Connolly may make the headlines, it is a complete team effort to score those goals and that is on display as 13 different Seminoles have assisted on a goal this season.

Led Kirsten Crowley, Kaycie Tillman and Connolly with four assists apiece, three assists from Macayla Edwards and two assists each from Elin Jensen, Haylie Grant, Emma Koivisto and McFarland, the Noles are able to produce goals from anywhere on the field.

SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

Redshirt senior Kirsten Crowley not only leads the team on the field, as the defender has been named the Seminole captain for the 2015 and 2016 seasons, but she also is a leader off the field and has been recognized as one of 30 candidates for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award, presented by Premier Sports Management.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

Crowley earned All-ACC Second Team honors for her play in 2015, along with NSCAA All-Region accolades. She earned FSU Soccer's Golden Torch Award in 2015 and 2016, going to the student-athlete with the highest GPA. She has also volunteered at several community services events throughout her Florida State career.

TDS MIDSEASON TOP 100

The Seminoles have placed four Seminoles in the 2016 Midseason Top 100 List from TopDrawerSoccer.

Reshirt senior defender Kirsten Crowley comes in at No. 12, while sophomore Megan Connolly is ranked No. 18. Redshirt junior Cassie Miller slots in at No. 26 and junior Emma Koivisto closes it out at No. 66.

FSU is tied with Stanford and USC for the most athletes in the country ranked in the top 26.

A strong class of newcomers have also been recognized by TopDrawerSoccer as Florida State has placed four on their list of the Top 100 Freshmen in the country.

Forward Deyna Castellanos ranks No. 2, with defender Malia Berkely (No. 12) and midfielder Heidi Kollanen (No. 28) not far behind. Forward Kristen McFarland wraps up the Seminole contingent at No. 42.

FSU is tied with UCLA for the most student-athletes ranked in the top 50 of the Freshmen Top 100 list.

#LA VINOTINTO

Freshman forward **Deyna Castellanos** has missed each of the last six matches as she has competed for her home country of Venezuela at the 2016 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup in Jordan.

A recipient of the Golden Boot for leading the scoring at the 2014 U17 WWC in Costa Rica, Castellanos has built on that success, scoring five goals in six games so far during the 2016 tournament, including both goals in a 2-1 victory over Mexico in the quarterfinals on October 12.

She now leads all scorers in U17 Women's World Cup history with 11 goals and Venezuela will play Spain in the bronze medal match on October 21.

- Florida State head coach Mark Krikorian took over the Seminole women's soccer program in 2005 and has proven to the nation that FSU soccer will be a national title contender on an annual basis.
- In his first 10 seasons in Tallahassee, Krikorian has led FSU to a 2014 National Championship, eight College Cup appearances, including a recent string of four straight trips (2011-14), three appearances in the national championship game (2007, 2013 and 2014) and three ACC titles (2011, 2013 & 2014).
- Under Krikorian, FSU is the only school in the nation that has ranked in the top 10 of the final NSCAA poll over the last 11 years.
- Krikorian recorded career college win No. 300 with a 1-0 win at Arkansas in 2012 becoming the 25th coach across all NCAA divisions to reach that milestone.

PAIR OF ASSISTS

Sophomore **Macayla Edwards** has moved into the midfield this season after featuring primarily on the defensive backline during her 2015 freshman season.

She has made an impact in her new role already, setting a career high with two assists at Vanderbilt on August 25, aiding the Noles to a 3-0 victory by finding scoring opportunities for Megan Connolly and Haylie Grant.

Sophomore **Elin Jensen** recorded two assists in FSU's 3-0 victory over No. 17 UConn on September 8. It marked the second time in her career that she posted two assists in a game, matching her performance against Evansville in the first round of the 2015 NCAA Tournament.

Redshirt senior **Kirsten Crowley** recorded the second two-assist game of her career on September 22 against Wake Forest, helping the Noles to a 3-0 victory. She also aided on a pair of goals against Pitt on Oct. 3, 2015.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

After graduating a class of six seniors in 2015, the 2016 Seminoles only have six total upperclassmen on their roster.

Eighteen of the 24 players on the team this year are either freshmen (10) or sophomores (8). That matches the 2007 team for the highest amount of underclassmen on a team (18 of 26) since Mark Krikorian's arrival in 2005.

That the team is comprised of 75% underclassmen is the highest ratio of first and second-year players under Krikorian.

Each of the top four scorers on the team - **Kristen McFarland, Deyna Casetllanos, Megan Connolly** and **Kaycie Tillman** - are either freshmen or sophomores.

RARE HOME LOSSES

The Noles currently hold a 30-match home unbeaten streak and are 5-0-1 at the Seminole Soccer Complex so far in 2016. It is so rare to lose at home that only five of the 24 players on the 2016 roster have ever lost a game at the Seminole Soccer Complex, a 2-1 defeat against Florida on September 5, 2014.

That is the only loss any active FSU player has surrendered at home as the next home loss was on Oct. 13, 2011.

NCAA STATS

The Seminoles place in the top 15 in the NCAA in three different categories and rank second in the nation in goals against average (0.349) and fourth in shutout percentage (0.714). FSU also ranks 11th in save percentage (0.872) going into the 10th weekend of the 2016 season.

The Noles have allowed only five goals on the season and are currently tied with Northwestern for the fewest goals allowed in the nation.

Cassie Miller ranks in the Top 20 in the NCAA in three separate categories, owning a 0.356 goals-against average (third), eight shutouts (ninth) and a 0.872 save percentage (17th).

VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

Florida State is 2-0-1 this season against teams ranked in the NSCAA poll, defeating No. 8 Texas A&M (1-0) and No. 17 UConn (3-0), while earning a 1-1 draw against No. 2 Virginia.

Under **Coach Krikorian**, FSU has a combined record of 90-39-14 against opponents ranked by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America since 2005.

HOME SWEET HOME

Florida State is 132-9-6 at home since 2005 when **Mark Krikorian** became head coach at Florida State.

The Noles are 64-1-3 in their last 68 matches played at home, dating back to 2011. FSU has 24 wins over ranked opponents over that time and the only loss during that span was a 2-1 defeat to Florida on September 5, 2014.

FSU has allowed just five goals at home over the last 2178:02 of game time – a goal in the 22' against No. 3 Texas A&M on September 4, 2015, an own goal versus No. 7 Clemson on September 24, 2015, two goals vs. Boston College on Nov. 1, 2015 and a goal versus No. 2 Virginia on September 25, 2016.

ROAD SWEET ROAD

The Seminoles are also impressive away from the friendly confines of the Seminole Soccer Complex, posting a true road record of 20-5-6 since 2013, as well as a neutral site mark of 9-2-1.

FSU has lost just four times in its last 24 road games - all one-goal matches - a 3-2 defeat at No. 14 UF on August 30, 2015, a 1-0 loss at No. 2 UVA on October 25, 2015, a 1-0 defeat at South Alabama on September 5, 2016 and a 2-1 loss at Boston College on October 6, 2016.

DEFENDING ACC CHAMPS

The Noles earned their fourth conference title in 2015 and now own four of the eight ACC championships not earned by UNC.

AUGUST SUCCESS

The Seminoles continued their early season success with three games in the month of August during the 2016 season. FSU owns an all-time record of 40-7-1 and has won 33 of its last 35 matches played during the month of August. The Noles are 31-2-0 in August under head coach **Mark Krikorian** and have outscored their opponents 118-37 all-time in August with 26 shutouts.

QUICK IMPACT

Freshman **Kristen McFarland** had played in 12 games this season, but has only made five starts.

However, she has made the most of her appearances, scoring five goals, including two game-winners, and adding two assists in her 589 minutes played for an average of one goal per 117:48 of match time.

She scored the first goal of her career just 2:47 after she subbed into the game against Middle Tennessee on August 28, and only needed 3:14 of match time after coming off the bench against Mercer on September 15 before putting the ball into the back of the net.

OPENING DAY RECORDS

After a 1-0 win at Texas A&M on August 19, Florida State improved to 16-5-1 all-time on opening day, including a mark of 7-4-0 when opening the season away from Tallahassee.

The Noles are 11-1-0 on opening day under head coach **Mark Krikorian**, including a mark of 6-1-0 on the road.

FSU has won nine straight season openers, outscoring the opposition 23-3.

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After helping the Noles post a 1-0 shutout on the road at No. 8 Texas A&M on August 19, redshirt junior goalkeeper **Cassie Miller** was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on August 23.

It is the second time in her career that Miller had received the weekly honor from the conference, adding to the accolade she earned on October 13, 2015 after defeating No. 1 North Carolina, 1-0, and assisting on the game-winning goal by **Berglind Thorvaldsdottir**.

Kirsten Crowley earned her first ACC Defensive Player of the Week award, and fourth of her career, on September 13 after helping lead the Noles to a pair of shutouts over No. 17 UConn (3-0) and Troy (1-0 OT). Each team managed just one shot on goal, and Crowley made two impressive defensive plays near the end of the match with the Huskies to preserve the clean sheet. She also assisted on the game-winning goal against Troy, heading a pass for **Kristen McFarland** to score in the 91st minute.

TDS TEAM OF THE WEEK

Freshman forward **Deyna Castellanos** wasted no time making an impact for the Garnet and Gold, finding the back of the net on her first shot of the game, giving FSU a 1-0 lead in the second minute at No. 8 Texas A&M. The quick goal earned Castellanos a spot on TopDrawerSoccer's Team of the Week for August 23.

POSTSEASON RECORDS

Florida State set a pair of NCAA Tournament shutout records over the course of the 2014 and 2015 postseasons as the Noles earned their first national championship in 2014.

From the 2013 College Cup until the 2015 College Cup, FSU recorded 10 consecutive shutouts during postseason play. The streak ranks as the longest in the nation, breaking North Carolina's streak of eight games from 2003-04. The Seminoles also own the NCAA Tournament record for consecutive scoreless minutes at 931:47, surpassing UNC's mark of 829:21.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY

The Seminoles placed two student athletes on the preseason watch list for the 2016 MAC Hermann Trophy. Redshirt senior **Kirsten Crowley** and sophomore **Megan Connolly** were two of 36 players recognized on the preseason list.

Florida State is one of eight teams with multiple student-athletes on the Watch List, joining UConn, Duke, Florida, USC, Stanford, Virginia and West Virginia.

It is the 13th straight season that the Seminoles have had a student-athlete named to the preseason Watch List and FSU has had two players selected nine times in the last 11 seasons.

In 2007, **Mami Yamaguchi** won the MAC Hermann Trophy, the first and only player in school history to win the award. Yamaguchi led the country in points that season with 66, while finishing second in goals (24) and assists (18).

ACC PRESEASON POLL

Florida State was chosen as the favorite to win the ACC in 2016, earning 191 points and nine of the 14 first place votes from the league's coaches prior to the season. The Seminoles secured the ACC Tournament championship in 2015, earning FSU's third consecutive league title and fourth overall.

The Noles also placed two student-athletes on the 2016 Preseason All-ACC Team - redshirt senior **Kirsten Crowley** and sophomore **Megan Connolly**. Connolly is the only non-senior to receive preseason accolades from the league.

FRESH FACES

The Seminoles welcome 11 newcomers to the squad in 2016, including 10 freshman and a graduate transfer.

Three freshmen - **Briana Alston** (Ashburn, Va.), **Taylor Hallmon** (Panama City, Fla.) and **Julia Phillips** (Ashburn, Va.) enrolled at Florida State for the Spring 2016 semester, joining the team in January and training with the Seminoles throughout the spring.

Seven others arrived for the fall, with four Americans and three international players. **Malia Berkely** (Liberty Township, Ohio), **Kristen McFarland** (Powell, Ohio), **Doriana Moul** (San Diego, Calif.) and **Clara Robbins** (Stafford, Va.) represent the newcomers from the United States.

The trio of international players that will compete for the Noles this fall are **Deyna Castellanos** (Maracay, Venezuela), **Heidi Kollanen** (Tampere, Finland) and **Yo Tachibana** (Nisshin, Japan). **Amanda Kopale** (Cape Coral, Fla.) comes to FSU after competing for three seasons at Nova Southeastern.

PRESEASON NO. 1

Florida State entered the 2016 season as the No. 1 ranked team by the National Soccer Coaches Association. It marks the second time - and second straight season - that FSU had received a preseason No. 1 ranking and the 14th time overall that the Noles were No. 1 in the NSCAA poll.

In 2012, Florida State earned the program's first No. 1 ranking on August 28 after opening the season with a 2-0 record. The Noles held on to the No. 1 spot for eight consecutive weeks in 2012. FSU regained the No. 1 spot in the final poll of the 2014 season after winning the national championship and ranked as the top team four times during the 2015 season.

NATION'S BEST FRESHMEN IN '15

The Seminoles bring back an impressive sophomore class that shined as the top group of freshmen in the country in 2015.

The eight-member group of **Megan Connolly, Elin Jensen, Natalia Kuikka, Kaycie Tillman, Dallas Dorosy, Olivia Bergau, Macayla Edwards** and **Holly Fritz** tallied 89 of Florida State's 197 points last season and were four of the top six point producers on the team.

Among true freshman on teams that finished the 2015 season in the top 25, Florida State was far and away the nation's leader in production from freshmen.

Connolly was named the TopDrawerSoccer National Freshman of the Year and an NSCAA First Team All-American. She became the first Seminole to earn First Team All-America honors as a freshman.

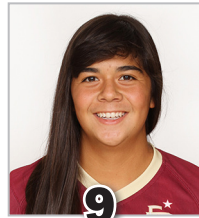
