#### **STARTING 9: WHAT TO KNOW**

- Last time out: No. 22 Florida State won a pair of one-run games over No. 20 FGCU, 7-6 and 3-2, on Tuesday and Wednesday. Tuesday's game ended on a walk-off double by Jackson Lueck (3-for-5, 3 RBI), while Wednesday's game ended in the fifth after a lightning and rain delay. It was FSU's first rain-shortened win since 2013 vs. USF.
- Holton among nation's best: ACC Pitcher of the Week Tyler Holton had perhaps the best outing of his career Saturday, throwing seven no-hit innings against No. 8 North Carolina. The Tallahassee native ranks fourth nationally in hits allowed/9 IP with 4.29 and is ninth in the country in WHIP (0.74). He has been ACC POTW three times this yr.
- **3** Noles record second seven-run comeback win: On March 21, FSU trailed Jacksonville 7-0 before having an at-bat, and slowly chipped away at the JU lead until freshman J.C. Flowers' walk-off, two-run single with two outs in the ninth inning. Against Oakland (3/3), FSU also trailed 7-0 before winning 18-10.
- Walls leads country in walks: After notching seven walks in the final two games at Notre Dame, junior Taylor Walls leads the country with 36 on the season. As a team, the Seminoles have been walked 194 times, 15 more than the next closest school. Mercer.
- **Q** among nation's leaders: Senior first baseman/designated hitter Quincy Nieporte is ninth in the country with 38 RBI. He hit his third and fourth grand slams of the year at Virginia Tech, and he is now the single-season record holder for grand slams in a season at FSU. His four grand slams are the most in the country.
- Parrish shines at Notre Dame: On March 25, freshman Drew Parrish threw a complete game, three-hitter in Florida State's 5-1 win over Notre Dame. Only twice, in the 4th and 9th innings, did Parrish face more than one batter, and the Irish's lone run came on an error in the 4th inning. It is FSU's only complete game of the season.
- Noles on the basepaths: Florida State opened the season a perfect 27-for-27 in stolen bases and is currently 34-40 on the year. The Seminoles had the most stolen bases without being caught in the country. Dylan Busby leads the team with six stolen bases on the season.
- **Martin active leader in wins:** Head coach Mike Martin, now in his 38th year as head coach at Florida State, is the active wins leader with 1,918. He also is the all-time winningest coach by percentage, with a .737 mark. He needs iust 58 wins to pass Augie Garrido's all-time wins record (1,975).
- **1.D. Drew jersey to be retired:** Florida State announced that former outfielder J.D. Drew (1995-97) will have his No. 39 jersey retired prior to the game against Clemson on Saturday, April 15. One of the most decorated players in college baseball history, he remains the only player with a 30 HR/30 SB season.

#### THE WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN COLLEGE BASEBALL. MARTIN...

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.738)
- » owns the second-most wins all-time in NCAA Division I baseball history and most among active coaches (1,918)

#### 11 GETS WIN NO. 1.900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 34 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,604 as head coach (1980-present).

Holton is a three-time ACC Pitcher of the Week, joining Paul Wilson (1993 & 1994), Mike Ziegler (2000) and Sean Gilmartin (2011) as the only FSU pitchers to earn the award three times in one season.
- Holton was stellar against No. 8 North Carolina (4/1), pitching a no-hitter before being pulled after 109 pitches in the eighth inning. He walked only one batter, his final of the game, and struck out 8.
- Before the walk, all four baserunners that reached were via error, and each runner was stranded.
- Against Oakland (3/4), Holton struck out 13 batters in just six innings of work without allowing a walk. He set a career-high in strikeouts for the second consecutive week after having 11 against Samford (2/25).
- Holton also became the first Nole with 13 K since Luke Weaver had 14 against Troy in the 2013 NCAA Regionals. He is the first Seminole with consecutive games of 10+ K's since Sean Gilmartin in 2011.
