STARTING 9: NOLES HOST BC TO OPEN ACC PLAY

- This Weekend:** Florida State (11-2) takes on Boston College (5-6) for a three game series in Tallahassee. The Seminoles last hosted the Eagles in Tallahassee in 2015. All-time, FSU holds a 28-4 lead over the Eagles, and a 12-2 mark in Tallahassee. FSU has won 10 straight over Boston College.
- Last time against Boston College:** FSU beat BC 3-0 in the one game played in 2016 in Massachusetts, after the final two games of the series were cancelled due to rain and snow. Mike Compton, Jim Voyles, and Tyler Warmoth combined to preserve the shutout. It was the fourth straight year FSU has shutout the Eagles.
- Last time out:** Florida State swept UCF in a two-game midweek series in Orlando. On Tuesday, the Seminoles protected a 5-2 lead after a save by closer Drew Carlton. Wednesday's pitching was highlighted by Will Zirzow who threw a career-high five innings and seven strikeouts while earning the win.
- In the Polls:** Florida State remains in the Top 10 across all six polls this week, peaking at No. 2 in the Baseball America poll, where they began the season. FSU jumped up two spots in Collegiate Baseball (No. 8, from 10) and one spot by Perfect Game (No. 3, from 4). The Noles rank third by the NCBWA, Perfect Game, and USA Today.
- NCAA Stats:** Florida State leads the nation in walks, with 97 in 13 games (7.5 per game)...FSU is also tied at No. 2 in sacrifice flies (12), No. 8 in total runs (122) and No. 7 in K-to-BB ratio (4.42). Individually, Taylor Walls leads the nation in walks (20) and is ranked No. 3 in walks per game (1.54).
- Holton unstoppable to begin year:** ACC Pitcher of the Week two weeks in a row, Tyler Holton has a 32-to-4 K-to-BB ratio to begin the year, to go along with a 0.47 ERA. In the last two games, Holton has 11 and 13 strikeouts, becoming the first Nole since Sean Gilmartin in 2011 with 10+ strikeouts in consecutive starts.
- FSU Newcomers:** First-year Seminoles continue to shine this season. Rhett Aplin leads the team with a .382 average and a .706 slugging percentage, while Nick Derr follows with a .361 batting average. J.C. Flowers has also impressed with an on-base percentage of .449 and is second with 11 walks on the year.
- Top in the ACC:** FSU leads the ACC in walks (97) and WHIP (1.04), and is second in sacrifice flies (12), walks allowed per nine innings (2.38), and K-to-BB ratio (4.42). Taylor Walls leads the ACC in walks (20), while Tyler Holton leads in opponent batting average (.113), earned runs allowed (1), and strikeouts (32).
- Miscellaneous:** FSU is 20-for-20 on the season in stolen bases, the most stolen bases without being caught in the country. Dylan Busby is leading the Seminoles with five stolen bases...Entering Friday's game, FSU's nine-game winning streak is the fifth-longest in the country, trailing Louisville & Missouri (12), USF (11) and ECU (10).

THE WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN COLLEGE BASEBALL, MARTIN...

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- » was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.739)
- » owns the second-most wins all-time in NCAA Division I baseball history and most among active coaches (1,909)
- » has led Florida State to 37 consecutive NCAA Regional appearances
- » has taken the Noles on 15 trips to the College World Series
- » has overseen 17 conference championships (11 Metro Conference, 6 Atlantic Coast Conference - 95, 97, 02, 04, 10, 15)
- » coached eight consecutive ACC Atlantic Division Championships (2007-2014) including setting the school record for the most conference wins in a season with a 24-6 mark in 2008 & 2012
- » produced 19 first round draft picks with 17 coming since 1990. Overall, Martin has coached 49 of FSU's 69 players that have reached the Major Leagues

MARTIN (CONT.)

11 GETS WIN NO. 1,900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 34 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,586 as head coach (1980-present).

GAME NOTES vs. BC

AGAINST THE EAGLES

- » Florida State leads the all-time series against Boston College 28-4, and has won 10 straight against the Eagles. In the 32 game series, FSU has won the first 10 (2006-2009) and the last 10 (2013-2016).
- » The teams first met when Boston College joined the conference, and have played every season since as Atlantic Division foes.
- » In Tallahassee, FSU leads the series 12-2. The only year FSU lost the series to BC was in 2009, when the Eagles took the final two games of a series in Tallahassee. FSU responded by beating BC in the ACC Tournament that season.
- » Last season, FSU shutout the Eagles 3-0 in the only game played (two canceled due to weather). FSU has shutout the Eagles five times, including once in each of the past four years.
- » Last season, Boston College reached the Super Regionals, forcing a third game at Miami. The 35 wins were the most for the Eagles since 2005.

GAME NOTES vs. BOSTON COLLEGE

NOLES PERFECT ON THE BASES

- » Florida State is a perfect 20-for-20 on the basepaths this season, joining Connecticut for the most stolen bases without being caught this season.
- » Dylan Busby leads the Noles with five stolen bases, followed by Taylor Walls, Tyler Daughtry and Nick Derr with three.
- » All three of Derr's stolen bases came against UCF on Tuesday and Wednesday.
- » Jackson Lueck and J.C. Flowers are 2-for-2, while Matt Henderson and Cal Raleigh each have a successful steal.
- » Defensively, teams have only succeeded on three of six stolen base attempts on the year, including just 1-of-4 against Raleigh. Raleigh also has three pickoffs this year.

9-GAME WINNING STREAK

- » FSU enters the Boston College series on a nine-game winning streak, the longest since an 11-game stretch early in the 2015 season.
- » The Seminoles have the fifth-longest streak in college baseball entering the weekend, trailing Louisville and Missouri (12), USF (11), and East Carolina (10).

ZIRZOW WOWS VS. KNIGHTS

- » At UCF on Wednesday, redshirt junior Will Zirzow pitched a career-high five innings, allowing just one hit while striking out a career-high seven in earning the win in a 5-0 shutout.
- » Only two batters reached base against Big Z - a single that was erased on a pickoff, and a strikeout that reached on an error that was then erased on a double play.
- » Zirzow's previous career highs in innings and strikeouts came in last year's ACC Championship Game against Clemson (4.1 innings, 6 strikeouts).

HOLTON DOMINATES OAKLAND

- » Sophomore pitcher Tyler Holton continues to shine in 2017, beginning the year with a 32/4 K/BB ratio and a 3-0 record in three starts.
- » His 0.47 ERA ranks second in the ACC and 38th nationally, while his 0.58 WHIP is first in the league.
- » Against Oakland on Saturday, Holton struck out 13 batters in just six innings of work without allowing a walk. He set a career-high in strikeouts for the second consecutive week after having 11 against Samford (2/25).
- » Holton also became the first Nole with 13 K since Luke Weaver had 14 against Troy in the 2013 NCAA Regionals. He is the first Seminole with consecutive games of 10+ K's since Sean Gilmartin in 2011.

NOLES SCORE 44 vs. OAKLAND

- » In three games against Oakland last weekend, the Seminoles outscored the Golden Grizzlies 44-17 and scored 10+ runs in each game of the series.
- » It was the first time since 2010 against Hofstra that FSU scored in double-digits in each game of a three-game series. That season, FSU accomplished the feat each of the first two weekends of the season, against Georgia State and Hofstra.
- » Against Samford, FSU scored 37 runs in a three-game sweep.

NIEPORTE HITS ANOTHER GS

- » For the second time this season, senior Quincy Nieporte connected for a grand slam against Oakland (3/3). He also hit a grand slam in FSU's 8-0 win over Samford (2/25).
- » He is the first Seminole to have two grand slams in a season since DJ Stewart in 2015.
- » Against UCF in 2015, Nieporte had a pair of home runs in FSU's 15-11 win over the Knights - a three-run home

run and a grand slam. The 7 RBI's remain a career high for the Atlanta, Ga., native.

- » Nieporte ranks fourth nationally with 22 RBI, and is third in the ACC. He had three RBI's in FSU's 5-2 win over UCF on Tuesday.

CARLTON MOVES TO BULLPEN - 2-for-2 on SAVES

- » Florida State's Opening Day starter, junior Drew Carlton, was named the team's closer after four games in 2017.
- » Carlton made his first relief appearance of the year against Samford (2/26) in a non-save situation.
- » Against Jacksonville (2/28), the Lakeland native was perfect for the final two innings in picking up his first career save in FSU's 6-5 win over the Dolphins.
- » The game against Jacksonville was Carlton's 38th career appearance, but just his eighth out of the bullpen.
- » At UCF on Tuesday, Carlton again entered in the eighth inning and was perfect against all six batters faced, closing out FSU's 5-2 win. In two save situations this year, he has yet to allow a baserunner.
- » In 2016, Carlton started all 17 of his appearances, finishing with an 8-3 record and 3.94 ERA.

WALLS NATIONAL LEADER IN BB

- » Florida State junior Taylor Walls has reached base in 27 consecutive games.
- » The Cordele, Ga., native has walked 20 times in 13 games this season. His 20 walks are the most in the country, while FSU's 97 walks as a team also rank as the most nationally.

PARRISH SHINES IN FIRST START

- » Freshman Drew Parrish allowed just two hits and a run while striking out six in six innings in his first career start vs. Samford (2/26).
- » He is the ninth current Seminole to start a game. Here is a look at how other Noles fared in their first career start:

PITCHING SHINES TO BEGIN YEAR

- » Before allowing three runs in six innings at Jacksonville (3.00 ERA), FSU's starting pitching had a remarkable 1.28 ERA between five pitchers - Cole Sands, Tyler Holton, Drew Parrish, Andrew Karp, and Drew Carlton.
- » Holton is 3-0, Sands is 2-0 and Parrish picked up the first win of his career against Samford (2/26).
- » Tyler Holton struck out a career-high 13 batters on Saturday (3/4). Holton is the two-time reigning ACC Pitcher of the Week.
- » Drew Carlton, a hard luck loser in the season opener against VCU (2/17), allowed just two earned runs in 5.2 innings. He struck out four and walked zero. It was the second consecutive start that Carlton has not walked a batter after last season's 3-0 win in the Super Regionals at Florida.
- » In that game against Florida last season, Carlton threw a complete-game shutout, FSU's first shutout in 15 appearances in the Super Regionals.
- » Andrew Karp, the Noles midweek starter, allowed no runs and struck out nine against USF (2/21). It was the most strikeouts for Karp in his career and the longest outing (7.0). Karp retired the final 12 Bulls he faced.
- » Against Jacksonville (2/28), Karp allowed three runs in the first two innings, but sat down the final 13 batters he faced.
- » **For just the fourth time in school history, the Seminoles allowed no more than four runs in any of the first seven games of a season.**

NEWCOMERS IMPRESS

- » Seven Seminoles made the first appearances of their careers in the opening series against VCU, and 10 have played this season.
- » With Jackson Lueck missing both games at UCF with an injury, the entire Seminole outfield was composed of freshmen: LF Tyler Daughtry (first start in the field), CF J.C. Flowers, and RF Nick Derr.
- » Six players - Nick Derr (LF), Rhett Aplin (LF), J.C. Flowers (CF), Kyle Cavanaugh (DH), Tyler Daughtry (DH) and Drew Parrish (P) made the first starts of their career in the opening series against VCU.

NOLES ON THE ROAD

- » The Seminoles won at Jacksonville, 6-5, in its first road game of the season before sweeping UCF in two road games earlier this week.
- » Under head coach Mike Martin, the Seminoles have started 3-0 or better on the road eight times now, most recently in 2014 (5-0).
- » The Seminoles are back on the road for five games next week - at Florida (3/14), at Florida Gulf Coast (3/15) and at Virginia Tech (3/17-19).
- » FSU is 9-2 since 2007 in the first road game of a season, including a 3-1 mark against Jacksonville:

WALLS NAMED ALL-AMERICAN

- » Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America.
- » The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State in 2016 and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
- » Walls also earned third team marks from NCBWA and D1Baseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.
- » Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.
- » To begin 2017, Walls has a .209 average with three doubles and a triple. He leads FSU with 19 runs scored and has 12 RBI and 20 walks. His 20 walks are the most in the country.

NOLES SPREAD OUT TO PLAY SUMMER BALL

- » Thirteen current Seminoles played summer ball throughout the country this season, including shortstop Taylor Walls and pitcher Cole Sands on the Team USA Collegiate National Team. Sands joined the team during the trip to Taiwan, while Walls played in 19 games in Cuba, Taiwan, Japan, and California.
