FLORIDA STATE ADVANCES TO SWEET 16 OF NCAA TOURNAMENT, FINISHES IN THIRD PLACE IN ACC STANDINGS AND IS RANKED 19TH IN FINAL USA TODAY/ESPN POLL OF OUTSTANDING 2010-11 SEASON

SEMINOLES ADVANCE TO SWEET 16 OF NCAA TOURNAMENT

Florida State finished the 2010-11 season with a 23-11 overall record, an 11-5 record and a third place finish in ACC play, advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1993 and finished the season ranked 19th nationally in the final USA Today/ESPN Poll of the season. It marked the third consecutive season the Seminoles have won at least 22 games, the school record tying third consecutive season they have won at least 10 ACC games and the school record third consecutive season they have finished in the top four of the ACC standings. Florida State is one of only two teams in the ACC (they are joined by only Duke) that has won at least 22 overall games, at least 10 ACC games and has finished in the top four of the ACC standings in EACH of the last three seasons. The Seminoles defeated No. 20 ranked Texas A&M and No. 5 ranked Notre Dame in the NCAA Tournament to advance to the Sweet 16 for the fourth time in school history.

SEMINOLES FINISH SEASON NATIONALLY RANKED

The Florida State men's basketball team, which advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1993, finished the 2010-11 season ranked No. 19 in the final ESPN/USA Today Poll of the year. It marked the second time in the last three seasons that the Seminoles have been ranked in the final coaches' poll. The Seminoles began the NCAA Tournament unranked but defeated No. 20 Texas A&M and No. 5 ranked Notre Dame to advance to the Sweet 16.

SEMINOLES LEADS NATION IN FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Florida State finished the 2010-11 season as the field goal percentage defense national statistical champion with a .363 mark – the second consecutive season they have led the nation in the most telling defensive statistic kept by the NCAA. The Seminoles are the first team to repeat as the field goal percentage national champions since Marquette in the 1993 and 1994 seasons. Florida State's .363 mark ranks as the fourth lowest mark by a leader in the category since the NCAA began compiling the statistic in 1977. The Seminoles are only the sixth team in NCAA history to repeat as the field goal percentage defensive national champions. It marks the third time in the last 14 seasons a Leonard Hamilton coached team has led the nation in field goal percentage defense. The 1998 Miami Hurricanes led the nation with a .379 mark as he took the team to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1960. Hamilton guided the Hurricanes to the NCAA Tournament in three consecutive seasons (1998-2000). Florida State proved to have the nation's top defense as it ranked first nationally in field goal percentage defense (.363), fifth in blocked shots (6.0 bpg), 15th in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.306), 24th in steals per game (8.3 spg) and 27th in rebound margin (+4.9 rpg). The Seminoles were the only team in the nation to finish the season ranked in the top 30 in each of those five statistical categories.

SEMINOLES LEAD ACC FOR THIRD CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Florida State finished as the best defense in the ACC for the second consecutive season as it led the league in three defensive statistical categories (field goal percentage defense, 3-point field goal percentage defense and blocked shots) and ranked second in four more important defensive statistical categories (scoring defense, steals, rebound margin and defensive rebounds). Florida State held its 34 opponents to a .363 combined shooting percentage from the field - a statistic that led the ACC and all of college basketball. The Seminoles are the first ACC team to lead the league statistics in field goal percentage defense in three consecutive seasons since Wake Forest during the 1995, 1996 and 1997 seasons. The Seminoles under Leonard Hamilton are now one of only three programs in ACC history to lead the league in field goal percentage defense in three consecutive seasons - joining Wake Forest and Maryland during the 1974, 1975 and 1976 seasons. The Seminoles' .363 field goal percentage defense mark is the best mark in the ACC since 1960 when NC State held its opponents to a .360 mark and the seventh best field goal percentage defensive mark in ACC history. In the last three seasons, Florida State has held its 101 opponents to a cumulative total of .376 shooting from the field with only three of those opponents shooting 50 percent or better from the field against the Seminoles' suffocating defense.

FLORIDA STATE'S SUCCESS IN THE ACC

Consistency. It's what every program strives for and under Leonard Hamilton it's what the Seminoles have achieved at a very high level. Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last six years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total ACC regular season and ACC Tournament games. The Seminoles have won 58 games against ACC competition. Florida State played in the 2009 ACC Championship game and is one of only two teams in the ACC (they are joined by Duke) who has finished with double digit wins and in the top four of the final ACC standings in EACH of the last three seasons. Including their 11 wins in ACC play this season, the Seminoles average nearly 10 conference wins per year (9.7) since the start of the 2005-06 season.

FLORIDA STATE'S WINNING PERCENTAGE IN THE LAST THREE SEASONS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last three years (since the start of the 2008-09 season) in <u>total games played</u> with 70 wins. The Seminoles averaged 23.3 wins per season with records of 25-10 (2008-09) and 22-10 (2009-10) in the last two seasons and 23-10 during the 2010-11 season. Florida State enters its game against Virginia Commonwealth in the fourth round of the 2011 NCAA Tournament having won 23 of 33 games this season (.700 winning percentage) and 26 of their last 38 ACC games since defeating Boston College on Feb.14, 2010.

SEMINOLES LEAD ACC IN BLOCKS AND STEALS

Florida State also led the ACC in blocked shots (6.0 bpg) for the second consecutive season and in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.306) for the first time since joining the lead for the 1991-92 season. It marks only the 10th time in the history of the league that a team has led the conference standings in blocked shots in consecutive seasons and the fourth time in school history (also in 1993, 1995 and 2010) that the Seminoles have led the league in blocked shots.

FLORIDA STATE'S TEAM AND INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

Florida State was very successful in earning both team and individual awards on its way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Junior Chris Singleton was the most decorated of the Seminoles and earned awards along with guards Derwin Kitchen and Like Loucks.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S WINS OVER TEXAS A&M AND NOTRE DAME

Florida State defeated No. 20 Texas A&M and No. 5 Notre Dame in the second and third rounds of the 2011 NCAA men's basketball tournament to defeat ranked teams in consecutive games for the third time during Leonard Hamilton's tenure.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.369 Florida State led the nation in field goal percentage defense in both 2009-10 (.377) and 2010-11 (.363) and have limited its last 68 opponents in the last two seasons to a combined .369 shooting percentage from the field in winning 69 percent of their games.

0 Florida State was one of only three teams in the ACC (also Duke and North Carolina) that did not lose consecutive ACC games at any point during the 2010-11 season. The Seminoles have not lost consecutive ACC game since January of 2009-10 season.

3 Florida State is ranked third in the ACC in the last three seasons with three victories over ranked teams in the ACC and NCAA Tournaments. The Seminoles defeated No. 1 ranked North Carolina in the semifinals of the 2009 ACC Tournament in advancing to the first ACC Tournament championship game in school history (March 14, 2009, 73-70) and defeated No. 20 ranked Texas A&M (March 18, 2011, 57-50) and No. 5 ranked Notre Dame (March 20, 2011, 71-57) in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the 2011 NCAA Tournament.

3 Florida State ranked second in the ACC during the 2010-11 season as it allowed only 62.0 points per game – the third best scoring defense in school history. Under head coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have recorded three of the six lowest scoring defensive marks in school history.

5 Florida State won five ACC games by at least 10 points during the 2010-11 season. The Seminoles defeated NC State at home by 13 (Jan. 15, 84-71), beat Boston College at home by 16 (Jan. 22, 67-51), topped Wake Forest at home by 16 (Feb. 1, 85-61), defeated Wake Forest by 18 in Winston Salem (Feb. 19, 84-66) and won at NC State by 10 (March 6, 72-62).

5 Florida State made 212 3-point field goals during the 2010-11 season --- the fifth highest single season total in school history and the fourth time in the last five seasons the Seminoles have made at least 200 3-point field goals.

6 Florida State led wire to wire in winning six different games during the 2010-11 season. The Seminoles did not trail in victories over North Florida, UNC Greensboro, Gardner Webb, Mercer, NC State (Jan. 15), Georgia Tech or Miami (Feb. 26).

6 Florida State has played in a school record six consecutive postseason tournaments (the NIT in 2006, 2007 and 2008 and the NCAA Tournament in 2009, 2010 and 2011).

6 Florida State's Okaro White shots .828 from the free throw as a freshman during the 2010-11 season to rank sixth among all freshmen in the ACC in free throw shooting.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE AND HEAD COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

...Florida State is one of only two teams in the ACC (also Duke) during the 2010-11 season that was in the top three of the conference standings for the <u>ENTIRE</u> 2010-11 season. After winning its first game in December, the Seminoles improved to 5-1 before losing for a second time in league play and have <u>NEVER</u> dropped below third place in the league standings.

...Picked to finish fifth in the league standings by the ACSMA in October, the Seminoles finished in third place in the league standings. It marks the third consecutive season the Seminoles finished in the top four in the league standings for the first time in school history.

SEMINOLES EARN 20TH OVERALL AND 10TH ACC WIN

Florida State finished the 2010-11 season with 23 overall wins and 11 ACC wins and finished in sole possession of third place in the conference standings. It marked the school record third consecutive season that Florida State has won at least 20 overall games and 10 ACC games. FLORIDA STATE IS ONE OF ONLY TWO TEAMS (ALSO DUKE) IN THE ACC THAT HAS ACHIEVED THE MILESTONES OF 20 OVERALL WINS AND 10 ACC WINS IN EACH OF THE LAST THREE SEASONS.

SEMINOLES DEFEAT FOUR RANKED TEAMS DURING 2010-11 SEASON

Florida State defeated four nationally ranked teams during the 2010-11 season (No. 15 Baylor on Dec. 25, 68-61, No. 1 Duke on Jan. 16, 66-61, No. 20 Texas A&M on March 18, 57-50 and No. 5 Notre Dame on March 20, 71-57). It marked the 21st consecutive season that Florida State has defeated at least one ranked opponent and the first time since the 2008-09 season that it has defeated at least four ranked teams in the same season. The Seminoles have now defeated 21 ranked teams during the first nine years of the Leonard Hamilton era at Florida State.

HAMILTON IS A GIANT KILLER

In guiding Florida State to its 66-61 victory over No. 1 ranked Duke on Jan.12 in Tallahassee, Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton continued to put himself in some very select company as one of the nation's top coaches. He is currently tied for the national lead among coaches with the most victories over the No. 1 ranked team in the nation since the start of the 2003-04 season. Hamilton has guided Florida State to wins over No. 1 ranked Duke twice (Jan. 12, 2011 and March 1, 2006, as well as No. 1 North Carolina on March 14, 2009, in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament).

FLORIDA STATE'S WINS IN THE 2011 NCAA TOURNAMENT...

...Florida State's wins over No. 5 Notre Dame and No. 20 Texas A&M marked the second time in school history that the Seminoles have defeated at least two ranked opponents in consecutive games. The Seminoles defeated No. 11 Minnesota, No. 18 Kentucky and No. 2 North Carolina before falling to No. 1 ranked ULCA in the title game of the 1972 NCAA Tournament;

...Florida State's victories over nationally ranked Texas A&M and Notre Dame gave the Seminoles four wins over ranked teams during the 2010-11 season. It marked the first time since the 2003-04 season and sixth time in school history that Florida State had defeated at least four ranked teams in the same season;

...Florida State's victory over No 20 ranked Texas A&M marked the Seminoles' first win over a ranked team in the NCAA Tournament since defeating No. 15 Texas Christian on March 13, 1998 (96-87 in Oklahoma City) in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Tournament;

...Florida State's win over No. 5 ranked Notre Dame in the 2011 NCAA Tournament marked the first win over a top five ranked team since the Seminoles defeated No. 2 ranked North Carolina to advance to the NCAA national Championship game on March 24, 2972 (79-75 in Los Angeles, Calif.).

SEMINOLES AGAINST RANKED TEAMS IN THE POSTSEASON

With two wins over nationally ranked opponents in the 2011 NCAA (No. 5 ranked Notre Dame and No. 20 ranked Texas A&M), the Seminoles are the third winningest team in the ACC against ranked teams in the ACC and NCAA Tournaments since the beginning of the 2009 ACC Tournament. The Seminoles have three wins over ranked teams in postseason play including two over top ranked opponents (No. 1 North Carolina in the semifinals of the 2009 ACC Tournament and No. 5 ranked Notre Dame in the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles are ranked third in the ACC in wins over ranked teams in the postseason with three and are one of only three teams in the ACC with a winning record against ranked teams in the ACC and NCAA Tournaments.

7 All-ACC selection Chris Singleton led Florida State as he scored or averaged in double figures against seven of the Seminoles' 11 ACC Opponents. He was in double figures against Virginia Tech (22.0), Duke (18.0) Georgia Tech (16.0). North Carolina (15.0), NC State (11.0), Virginia (11.0) and Clemson (10.5) as a junior.

9 Florida State has won nine of its last 10 in-season tournament games. The Seminoles finished in third place in the Diamond Head Classic in 2010 with a 2-1 record and earned the tournament championships at the 2009 Old Spice Classic (3-0) and the 2008 Global Sports Classic (4-0).

12 Florida State had leads of at least 20 points in 12 different games during the 2010-11 season. The Seminoles held leads of at least 20 points in four different ACC victories – in both games against Wake Forest, in Tallahassee against NC State (Jan. 15) and at home against Miami (Feb. 26).

12 Florida State has won 12 ACC games by double figures (at least 10 points) in the last three seasons. The Seminoles won five conference games by 10 or more points during the 2010-11 season, four by 10 or more in 2008-09 and three games by at least 10 points during the 2009-10 season.

16 Florida State finished the 2010-11 season having won 16 of its last 22 ACC games since a Feb. 14, 2010 victory over Boston College . The Seminoles finished the 2010-11 season with an 11-5 record and won five of its last seven ACC games to close the 2009-10 season.

23 Florida State was undefeated, 23-0, when it outscored its opponent during the 2010-11 season.

23.3 With 70 total wins in the last three seasons (25 in 2008-09, 22 in 2009-10 and 23 in 2010-11) the Seminoles average 23.3 wins per season in those three seasons. The Seminoles' average of 23.3 wins since the start of the 2008-09 season is the highest average for a three-year period in school history and is nearly a win per season better than the Seminoles average win total of 22.7 during the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons.

32 Florida State's largest lead in an ACC game during the 2010-11 season was a 32 point advantage over Wake Forest in the Seminoles' 85-61 win over the Deacons in Tallahassee (Feb. 1). The Seminoles led the game, 74-42, with 6:05 remaining before the final buzzer.

41 Florida State's largest lead of the 2010-11 season, +41 points, came in the Seminoles' 97-63 win over Stetson (Dec. 15). The Seminoles were up 94-53 with 2:40 remaining in the second half of their win over the Hatters.

70 The Seminoles' 70 wins in the last three seasons (25 in 2008-09, 22 in 2009-10 and 23 in 2010-11) is the highest three year win total in school history.

MORE ON FLORIDA STATE'S WINS OVER NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

Florida State defeated both No. 1 ranked Duke (Jan. 12, 2011) and No. 5 ranked Notre Dame (March 20, 2011) during the 2010-11 season. It marked the first time since the 1996-97 season with victories over No. 5 ranked Maryland (Jan. 29, 2997) and No. 5 ranked Wake Forest (March 1, 1997) and only the second time in school history that Florida State had defeated multiple top five ranked teams in the same season.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS OF THE SECOND KIND

Florida State has made a habit of winning most of their games in the last three season as the Seminoles have won nearly 70 percent of their games in the last three seasons. A big part of their success has been the Seminoles ability to win close games. Florida State is second in the league in the last three seasons with 36 overall wins and 22 wins in ACC play in games that have been decided by 1-2-3-4-5 points or in overtime. The Seminoles have won 22 close games in ACC play and are one of only three teams in the conference that has won more than 20 close games against conference opponents and are tied for the league lead with 14 close call victories over non ACC teams. The Seminoles have won nearly 60 percent of their close call games in the last three seasons while the rest of the ACC has won just under 51 percent of their close games combined.

FLORIDA STATE AMONG ACC'S TOP THREE IN VICTORIES OVER RANKED TEAMS

With its four victories over nationally ranked teams during the 2010-11 season, the Seminoles moved into third place amongst the 12 league teams with 16 total wins over ranked teams in the last six years. During that span of six consecutive postseason appearances, the Seminoles have defeated three teams ranked No. 1 (Duke in 2006, North Carolina in 2009 and Duke in 2011), two more top five ranked teams (Florida in 2007 and Notre Dame in 2011), two more who ranked in the top 10 (No. 8 Duke in 2007 and no. 10 Clemson in 2009) and nine other teams ranked in the nation's top 25 at the time of the game. Florida State is tied for first in the ACC with three victories over No. 1 ranked teams in the nation – the Seminoles are tied with North Carolina and Virginia Tech. No other ACC team has more than one victory over a No. 1 (Maryland, Wake Forest and Boston College) and six ACC teams have not defeated a No. 1 ranked team within the last six seasons.

SEMINOLES AMONG ACC'S TOP ROAD WARRIORS

Florida State finished with a 4-4 record on the road in ACC play during the 2010-11 season with wins at NC State, Miami, Wake Forest and Georgia Tech. It marked the third consecutive season that Florida State has finished the ACC portion of its schedule with a record of .500 or better. The Seminoles have proven to be one of the ACC's top road teams for the majority of the first nine seasons of the Leonard Hamilton era in Tallahassee. Florida State is the third winningest road team in the ACC in conference games only in the last six seasons with 21 wins and is tied as the third winningest team in the conference in overall road wins. The Seminoles are one of three teams in the ACC with a winning record on the road in ACC play with a 13-11 record (.542 winning percentage) on the road in ACC play.

SEMINOLES AMONG NATION'S BLOCKED SHOT LEADERS

Florida State finished the 2010-11 season ranked fifth in the in the nation and first in the ACC in blocked shots with a 6.0 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles blocked 10 shots in their victory over Texas A&M and nine shots in their win over Notre Dame during the first weekend of the 2011 NCAA Tournament. Florida State blocked 203 shots during the 2010-11season and reached the 200 blocked shots plateau for the third consecutive season. Prior to the 2008-09 season, the Seminoles had blocked 200 shots in a season only once in school history (1993).

SINGLETON EARNS ALL-ACC HONORS

Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton was named to the All-ACC Third Team and to the ACC All-Defensive team as voted on by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association in his third and final season as a Seminole. It marked the second consecutive season Singleton earned All-ACC Third Team and All-Defensive team honors. Singleton, finished his junior season ranked 15th in the in the ACC in scoring with a career-high 13.1 points per game average, 11th in the ACC with a career-high 6.8 rebounds per game average, second in the ACC with a 2.0 steals per game average and eighth in the ACC with a 1.5 blocked shots per game average. He was injured against Virginia on Feb. 12 and missed six games before returning for the Seminoles' run to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

SINGLETON BIDDING TO LEAD SEMINOLES IN THREE CATEGORIES

Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton became the fifth player in school history to lead the Seminoles in points, rebounds and steals in the same season. He joined David Thompson (1977 who played in Metro Conference), Bob Sura (1994, ACC), Tim Pickett (2003, ACC) and Al Thornton (2007, ACC) as players who have led the Seminoles in all three categories.

...Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton made 35 3-point field goals as a junior. He made at least 30 3-point field goals in each of his three seasons as a Seminole and ranks 17th in school history with 102 career 3-point field goals made;

 \dots Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton earned 55 steals in 2010-11 – he earned at least 50 steals in each of his three seasons as a Seminole. With two steals against North Carolina on Feb. 6, 2011 he became the first player in school history to record at least 50 steals in three straight seasons;

...Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton earned 41 blocked shots as a junior. He is the only player in school history with at least 40 blocks in three consecutive seasons.

SINGLETON'S STEALS NUMBERS IN ACC HISTORY

Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton finished his career ranked 25th in ACC history with a 1.89 steals per game average (180 steals in 95 career games). He ranked first in the ACC in steals (2.2 spg) and fifth in the ACC in blocked shots (1.5 bpg) in 2010 and ranked second in the ACC in steals (2.0 spg) and eighth in blocked shots (1.5 bpg) in 2011. Singleton was the only ACC player to rank in the top five of both categories as a sophomore and the only player in the ACC to rank in the top 10 of both categories as a junior.

SINGLETON EARNS TRIPLE DOUBLE AGAINST UNC GREENSBORO

Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton earned the third triple double in Florida State history with a 22 point, 11 rebound and 10 steal performance in leading Florida State to its 97-73 victory over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 14 at the Greensboro Coliseum. Singleton's triple double was the first triple double in ACC history that included steals, was the third triple double in school history, the first triple double at Florida State since 1995 and the first triple double by an ACC player in the famed Greensboro Coliseum. His 10 steals not only set a personal best mark and a single game Florida State mark but they were the most steals by an ACC player since Duke's Kenny Dennard earned 11 steals on Feb. 3, 1979.

SINGLETON NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF YEAR BY ACC COACHES

Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of the league's 12 coaching staffs in 2011. Singleton was the only unanimous selection – the only player to be selected by each of the 12 teams for the ACC All-Defensive team. Singleton was second in the balloting last season and became only the eighth unanimous selection to the team in the 16-year history of the team. Singleton earned the honor despite missing the final five games of the regular season with the vote coming after the star forward was injured on Feb. 12. The voting was conducted by noted ACC historian Barry Jacobs and is the only all ACC team chosen exclusively by the ACC coaches – those who prepare to play against the players they voted for on a daily basis for a better part of the season.

SINGLETON NAMED TO DIAMOND HEAD CLASSIC ALL TOURNAMENT TEAM

Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton earned All-Tournament team honors in the Diamond Head Classic as he averaged a double double of 17.0 points, 10.3 rebounds, 1.3 blocked shots and 1.0 steals as the Seminoles finished in third place in the eight team tournament. He shot .500 from the 3-point line (10 of 20) and .900 from the free throw line (nine of 10) as he totaled 51 points in the three game event. Singleton scored 28 points against tournament champion Butler and earned a double double of 17 points and 10 rebounds against No. 15 Baylor in the final game of the tournament.

Florida State's Men's Basketball Players By The Numbers

.681 Junior Bernard James shot .681 from the field (16 of 22) in three games during the 2011 NCAA Tournament. He made six of eight shots from the field in the Seminoles' win over No. 5 Notre Dame to send the Seminoles to the Sweet 16 for the first time since the 1993 season.

1 Senior Derwin Kitchen was the only Seminole who has started all 34 games for the Seminoles during the 2010-11 season. He was been in the starting line-up in every game during the season.

1 Senior Derwin Kitchen finished the 2010-11 season as the highest ranked true guard in the ACC with a 5.8 rebounds per game average. He finished the season ranked 19^{th} in the ACC among all players in the rebounding category and the only player in the top 20 of the ACC rebounding category that was 6-5 or smaller.

2 Junior Bernard James earned a double double (against Hartford and Baylor) in the first two starts of his career. He totaled four double doubles during the first year of his Florida State career.

2 Luke Loucks is one of only two players in school history who have been named to the All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball Team multiple times during his career.

3 Junior Deividas Duklys made what proved to be three game winning shots during the 2011 season. He made 3-point shots against Clemson (Dec. 12, 2010), Virginia (Feb. 12, 2011) and Notre Dame in the NCAA Tournament (March 20, 2011) that all proved to be game-winning shots – all three shots put the Seminoles in the lead for good in those games.

4 Senior guard Derwin Kitchen earned four double doubles in 2010-11 – with all four of them coming with points and rebounds. He helped the Seminoles defeat No. 1 ranked Duke on Jan. 12, 2011 with 22 points and 10 rebounds.

5 Junior Bernard James blocked a careerhigh tying five shots against VCU in the Seminoles' Sweet 16 game in the NCAA Tournament against the Rams. His five blocked shots was only one blocked shot shy of the Seminoles' all-time NCAA record of six blocked shots in a single game by Rodney Dobard against Evansville on Maerch18, 1993.

5 Sophomore Terrance Shannon started five games during the 2010-11 season (Duke, NC State, Miami, Boston College and at Clemson) from Jan. 12 through Jan. 29. The Seminoles were 4-1 with Shannon in the starting line-up including a win over No. 1 Duke (Jan. 12, 66-61) during which Shannon started the first game of his career.

6 Florida State utilized six different lineups during the 2010-11 season with the line-up of James, White, Dulkys, Snaer, Kitchen starting the final nine games of the season including the Seminoles three NCAA Tournament games.

KITCHEN FINISHES AMONG ALL-TIME LEADERS IN ASSISTS AND STARTS

Derwin Kitchen was a three-year starter at the point guard position and a starter on three consecutive NCAA Tournament teams as he helped Florida State advance to the Sweet 16 of the 2011 NCAA Tournament in addition to earning his bachelor's degree in interdisciplinary social studies from Florida State on April 30, 2011, he played in 70 wins overall and 31 wins in regular season ACC play. With Kitchen in Florida State's starting line-up, the Seminoles were the third winningest program in the ACC in both overall games and ACC games only. Kitchen finished his career ranked 14th in school history with 308 career assists, tied for 16th in school history with 133 career steals and tied for 18th in school history with 82 career starts in 91 career games despite playing less than three seasons.

KITCHEN ENJOYS BEST SEASON

Senior Derwin Kitchen enjoyed the best season of his career and put up the statistics to support his play. He earned career high statistics for points scored (354), average points scored per game (10.4), games played (34), games started (34), field goals made (125), field goals attempted (253), field goal percentage (.494), 3-point field goals made (27), field goals attempted (76), free throws made (77), free throws attempted (102), free throw percentage (.755), offensive rebounds (51), defensive rebounds (145), total rebounds (196), rebounds per game (5.8), steals (56), minutes played (1,041) and minutes played per game (30.6). Kitchen was Florida State's overall team leader in defensive rebounds (145), assists (121), steals (56), minutes played (1,041), minutes played per game (30.6), games played (34) and games started (34)...

KITCHEN DOUBLES HIS PLEASURE

Senior guard Derwin Kitchen earned a single season career high four double doubles (all during his senior season) with his 17 point and 13 rebound performance in the Seminoles' victory over NC State in the regular season finale for both teams. Interestingly, all four of his double doubles came with points and rebounds – not assists as one might think. Kitchen was the top rebounding guard in the ACC at 6-4 or smaller. He has finished with double figures in assists twice during his career (10 vs. Duke and Alabama A&M during his junior season) but was not able to reach double figures in any other category during either of those two games.

Junior Bernard James, who was a perfect eight of eight in the Seminoles' victory over NC State on Jan. 15, finished the 2011 season with a team leading .657 field goal shooting percentage. He became the first Seminole regular to shoot 65 percent or better from the field since the Seminoles' all-time single season leader – Murray Brown – shot .691 from the field in 1979.

JAMES AMONG THE ACC'S STATISITCAL LEADERS

Bernard James finished his junior season ranked second in the ACC in total blocked shots with 82, third in the ACC blocked shots per game (2.4), and 16^{th} in the league in rebounds per game (5.9). He was one of only six players in the ACC to rank in the top 20 for rebounding and the top 10 in blocked shots.

DULKYS CONTRIBUTES AS A JUNIOR ...

...He earned a career-high 40 assists and averaged a career-high 1.2 assists during the 2010-11 season. He surpassed his previous single-season career high of 34 assists (during the 2009-10 season) in Florida State's win over Miami on Feb. 26;

...He blocked a single season career high 15 shots this season. He blocked as many shots as a junior (15) as he did in the first two seasons of his career combined (15);

...He earned a single season career high 42 steals in 33 games played as a junior. He earned multiple steals in 10 different games this season and had at least one steal in each of his final 10 games of the season.

Florida State's Men's Basketball Players By The Numbers

7 Deividas Dulkys has made 155 made 3-point field goals and finished his junior season ranked seventh in school history for career 3-point field goals made. He needs only 20 to become the sixth player in school history with 175 or more made 3-point shots and needs only 45 to become only the fourth player in school history to make 200 or more from the bonusphere. Duklys is also ranked seventh in school history with 442 career 3point field goals attempted.

7 Junior Deividas Dulkys has made 155 career 3-point field goals – he is one of only seven players in school history who has made 150 or more 3-point field goals during his career.

13 Freshman Ian Miller closed his freshman season by making 13 consecutive free throws. He missed the first attempt of his career on Nov. 14 against UNC Greensboro and did not miss during the remainder of the season.

14 Senior Derwin Kitchen led Florida State in rebounding 14 times and totaled six games with 10 rebounds or more. His season and career high 13 rebounds came in the Seminoles' wins over Hartford (Dec. 12) and at NC State (March 6).

14 Junior Bernard James blocked 82 shots in his first year as a Seminole during the 2010-11 season – the second highest single season total in school history and the 14th highest career total in school history.

15 Led by junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton's single-season career-high seven double doubles during the 2010-11 season, the Seminoles have 15 double doubles in 34 games during the season. It's the most double doubles in a single season by the Florida State players since the 2005-06 season when they totaled a combined 19 double doubles.

20 Junior All-ACC selection Chris Singleton recorded one block <u>AND</u> one steal in Florida State's victory over Texas A&M in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He recorded at least one blocked shot <u>AND</u> at least one steal in 20 of the 28 games he played in during his junior season.

21 Chris Singleton finished his career with 586 rebounds – the 21^{st} highest total in school history.

56 Junior forward Xavier Gibson closed his junior season ranked 24^{th} in school history with 56 career blocked shots.

70 Florida State's third year juniors (Deividas Dulkys, Xavier Gibson, Luke Loucks and Chris Singleton) helped Florida State win 70 games and win nearly 70 percent of their games since the start of the 2008-09 season.

101 Junior Luke Loucks is the most experienced point guard in the ACC entering the 2011-12 season. He has played in 101 consecutive career games – every game of his career as a Seminole.

DUKLYS AMONG SEMINOLES' ALL-TIME 3-POINT SHOOTING LEADERS

Junior Deividas Dulkys, who led the Seminoles with 55 3-point shots made in 2010-11, is one of the Seminoles' top all-time 3-point shooters. He has made 155 career shots from the bonusphere – only six players have made more long range shots than Dulkys in school history. Dulkys needs only 45 3-point shots to become only the 4^{th} player in school history with 200 3-pointers made.

SHANNON ENERGIZED AFTER SURGERY

Sophomore Terrance Shannon underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on Feb. 4 and was back on the court 15 days later against Wake Forest in Winston Salem. He played 16 strong minutes and scored five important points in the Seminoles' victory over the Deacons. Shannon has played his season in three different phases – the first 13 of the season as a reserve, five games as a starter and the last eight games after returning from his knee surgery. He played his best basketball as a starter as he averaged 18.4 minutes played per game to go along with 6.0 points and 4.6 rebounds. He has returned from his knee injury with similar statistics as he is averaging 15.6 minutes played per game to go along with 4.9 points per game and 2.9 rebounds per game.

GREENSBORO, N.C. - Junior All-American candidate Chris Singleton had a triple-double of 22 points, 11 rebounds and 10 steals as Florida State defeated UNC Greensboro, 97-73, at the Greensboro Coliseum. Singletons' triple double was the third in school history and the first in ACC history consisting of double figures in points, rebounds and steals. His 10 steals established a single game school record, a personal best, one off the ACC record and were the most in a game by an ACC player since Duke's Kenny Dennard earned 11 steals on Feb. 3, 1979. Singleton's triple double was the first by a Florida State player since Bob Sura earned 19 points, 12 rebounds and 12 assists against NC State on Jan. 15, 1995. The only other triple double in school history was a 12 point, 16 rebound, 10 assist performance by Reggie Royals vs. Georgia Southern on Dec. 1, 1972. Singleton's steals were the most by a Division I player since Ricky Woods of Southeast Louisiana also had 10 steals vs. Lamar on March 3, 2006. Sophomore Michael Snaer and freshman Okaro White added 16 points each as the Seminoles improved to 2-0 as they played their second game in three days to open the season. In addition to his 22 points, Singleton also had a game-high 11 rebounds and 10 steals for the Seminoles (2-0) to record the first triple-double of his career. Singleton added six assists and four blocks, as well, in the winning effort. Derwin Kitchen was also in double figures for Florida State as he had 11 points on 4-5 shooting.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Derwin Kitchen scored 22 points and Florida State pulled off its latest upset of No. 1 Duke, snapping the Blue Devils' 25-game winning streak with a 66-61 victory. Chris Singleton added 18 points for Florida State which made five free throws in the final 33 seconds to hold off the defending national champions. It was the third time since 2002 that the Seminoles beat a top-ranked Duke team at home. The Blue Devils hadn't lost since a 79-72 setback on March 3, 2010, at Maryland. The 25game winning streak was the second-longest in Duke history. The Seminoles led 28-24 at halftime and by as many as 11 early in the second half, but the game was tight to the finish. FSU fans rushed the floor following the final buzzer, making for a garnetand-gold mob scene at center court, and one was still climbing on the rim 15 minutes after the game ended.

Game No. 22 -- Florida State 85, Wake Forest 61

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - It was another dominating home performance for the Seminole men's basketball team, which used a 54-point scoring outburst in the second half to break away from Wake Forest, 85-61. Aside from its hot-shooting second half, Florida State forced 24 Wake Forest turnovers, using 27 points off the Demon Deacon miscues to its advantage. Ten Seminoles made it into the scoring column, highlighted by five double-figure scorers in Deividas Dulkys (16), Bernard James (13), Michael Snaer (11), Ian Miller (11) and Derwin Kitchen (10). Florida State tied a season high with 10 3-pointers made, doing so for the fourth time this season. Dulkys led the Seminoles from long distance with four treys, helping propel the Seminoles to their 51.4 percent shooting in the second half. Wake Forest never developed any consistency on offense until late in the game, shooting 42.6 percent overall. Florida State put its smothering defensive style on display going into the second official timeout, forcing seven Wake Forest turnovers in just over eight minutes of action. In that span, the Seminoles corralled four steals and took twice as many shots as the Demon Deacons while leading 13-9. They entered halftime with a 31-19 lead. Dulkys' effort on the defensive end guided Florida State to a 12-0 run, first coming through with a breakaway dunk off a steal that energized the crowd, and then another breakaway lay-in off another steal to push the Seminoles ahead 21-14. J.T. Terrell stopped the bleeding with a three-pointer to cut Wake's deficit to 26-17, but the Demon Deacons failed to score over the next 4:36 until a basket-and-foul by Tony Chennault stopped the drought.

Game No. 23 -- North Carolina 89, Florida State 69

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. - Kendall Marshall had nine points and a season-high 16 assists - the most by a UNC player in any Atlantic Coast Conference game - to help the Tar Heels beat Florida State 89-69. Fellow rookie Harrison Barnes had 17 points and 10 rebounds to lead the Tar Heels. Everything started with Marshall, who was thrust into a leading role with the abrupt departure of junior point guard Larry Drew II from the program. Marshall's 16 assists were the most by a UNC player since Raymond Felton had 18 against George Mason in December 2003. Marshall directed an offense that is averaging 93 points over the past three ACC games. He penetrated past defenders to set up layups and dunks for teammates or kicked the ball out - sometimes behind his head - to open shooters on the wing. North Carolina's 89 points and 56 percent shooting were not only the most allowed this season by the Seminoles, who came in leading the ACC in field goal percentage defense and second in scoring defense (60.6 points). It was the most points allowed by the Seminoles since giving up 90 to the Tar Heels almost three years ago.

The 6-foot-9 Singleton, the Seminoles' top scorer and rebounder, had surgey on his foot on Feb. 14. WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - Bernard James scored 15 points to lead Florida State to an 84-66 win over Wake Forest Freshman Ian Miller and junior Deividas Dulkys each scored14 for Florida State, who stayed in sole possession of third place in the league by dominating Wake Forest to win after the break. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Okaro White and Deividas Dulkys scored 17 points apiece and Florida State held off a furious Miami with a 65-59 victory Saturday for its 20th win of the season. White, a freshman starting in place of injured Chris Singleton, knocked down a 10-foot jumper with 31 seconds remaining that gave Florida State a 64-59 lead after Malcolm Grant's 3-point shot 25 seconds earlier moved the Hurricanes to within 62-59. White hit 6 of 11 shots and grabbed seven rebounds while Dulkys connected on four of eight attempts from 3-point range. Grant led Miami with 19 points and 6-foot-10, 300-pound center Reggie Johnson added 17 points and 12 rebounds. Miami shot just 31.7 percent. Florida State won for the second time in three games since losing Singleton - its scoring leader this season - to a broken right foot two weeks ago. It marked Florida State's third straight season with at least 20 wins and 10 in ACC play. Florida State led by double figures through much of the contest, including 61-50 with 4:06 left. The Seminoles jumped to a 16-2 lead on their way to a 36-16 halftime cushion and a fifth straight victory over Miami. Dulkys and Michael Snaer each nailed a pair of 3-pointers that catapulted the Seminoles into the 14-point lead six minutes into the game. Miami's 16 points at the break was the fewest Florida State has allowed in the first half this season. Grant, Miami's top scorer this season, didn't get his first field goal until midway through the second half before heating up. Florida State was as hot in the first half as Miami was cold, shooting 58.3 percent to the `Canes' frigid 17.2 percent. Miami made just 3 of its first 20 shots, falling behind by as many as 22 points in the opening half.

CHICAGO, III. - The United Center was supposed to be a home court advantage for second-seeded Notre Dame but it turned into Cinderella's castle as No. 10 Florida State and No. 11 VCU each advanced to the Sweet 16 where they will meet in the Southwest Regional Semifinals. The Seminoles upset the fourth-ranked Fighting Irish thanks to a deadly combination of their typical suffocating defense and a hot night shooting from the outside in a one-sided 71-57 victory. For the Seminoles this is the lowest seeded FSU team to ever advance to the Sweet 16 and the school's first ever win over a team seeded as high as No. 2. The last time FSU advanced to the Sweet 16 in 1993 the squad entered the tournament as a No. 3 seed. It also ties the deepest NCAA Tourney run ever for a Leonard Hamilton coached team. While the offense excelled, the Seminole defense was humming along at its usual stingy pace. The Irish flirted with a new season low for points in the first half. The fewest points scored by Notre Dame in the opening half was 19 versus St. Johns, mustering just four more in Sunday night's game. Notre Dame's season low shooting percentage in the first half was 28.1% versus Cal and the Irish barley eclipsed that mark against the Seminoles converting on just 30% of their shots in the first 20 minutes. Even more impressively Notre Dame came in shooting nearly 40% from behind the arc but was limited to just 1-10 shooting from three point range in the opening 20 minutes. Things didn't get any better for the Irish in the second half. For the game Notre Dame shot just 30.6% from the field and only 23.3% from three point range. A major accomplishment for the Seminoles considering all five Irish starters shoot better than 40% from behind the arc.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex.- For the 10th-seeded Florida State Seminoles their road to the Elite Eight was just 7.9 seconds away. After trailing for nearly the final 11:00 of the second half, Chris Singleton hit a three-pointer with 45 seconds remaining in regulation to send FSU's Sweet 16 matchup with VCU to overtime. Then with 7.9 seconds left in the extra period the Seminoles were in front 71-70. That is when VCU's Bradford Burgess slipped away from standout senior Derwin Kitchen to hit the game-winner, ending the Seminoles magical run in a 72-71 loss. The Rams used one of the best shooting night's of any FSU opponent this season to move into the Elite Eight. VCU connected on 12 three-pointers during regulation, tying the most that FSU allowed in any game in 2010-11, and the squad shot nearly 42 percent for the game. All this against an FSU team that came in to the night allowing teams to connect on just 36% from the field and only 30% from behind the arc.
