

JASON RICH

2007-2008 ALL-ACC CANDIDATE

All-ACC candidate as a four-year returning starter and Seminoles' leading returning scorer averaging 10.3 points per game and free throw shooter, shooting .805 during the 2006-07 season.

Going into the 2007-08 season with 823 career points scored, only 177 away from becoming the 39th player in school history to join the 1,000 point club.

Ranks 21st in school history with a career free throw percentage of .762 and has shot 70 percent or better each of his three seasons as a Seminole.

Seminoles finished 1st in the ACC and 9th in the nation in free throw percentage with a team average of .758, Jason Rich led the way with a team high .805 free throw percentage during the 2006-07 season.

Only returning player on the Seminoles that has averaged 10+ points during the last two seasons. Rich averaged 10.0 points per game during the 2005-06 season and 10.3 points per game during the 2006-07 season.

Played in 95 games, starting 74 games, tying Rich for 19th in school history with the 74 games started, looking to become the 6th player to start 100 or more games as a Seminole.

Named to the Colonial Classic All-Tournament Team, as he helped lead the Seminoles start out the season 3-0, averaging 9.3 points, 5.0 assists and 3.3 rebounds in the Colonial Classic.

Scored his career high of 24 points in a key victory over Maryland on 10-12 shooting from the field to go along with three rebounds and two assists.

One of only two players to play over 1,000 minutes during the 2006-07 season after playing 1,047 minutes, the other being All-American Al Thornton.

Scored in double figures in a career high 21 games, and has average nearly one steal a game, with 94 steals in 95 career games as a Seminole.

In post-season NIT play, Jason has averaged 10.8 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 2 assists per game, shooting .537 from the field, .833 from the free throw line and averaging 31.2 minutes played per game.

Averaged 10.2 points per game, 3.6 rebounds per game, 1.0 steals per game while shooting .524 from three point range, .816 from the free throw line, while averaging over 30 minutes played per game in ACC play.

Continues to improve, last season set career-best statistics for games played, games started, field goals made, field goal percentage, 3-point field goals, 3-point field goal percentage, free throws made, free throws attempted, free throw shooting percentage, offensive rebounds, defensive rebounds, total rebounds, rebounds per game, assists, minutes played, minutes played per game and tied his career in steals.
