QUICK KICKS

- Florida State is ranked No. 8 by the National Soccer Coaches
 Association and No. 9 by TopDrawerSoccer for the week of Oct. 25.
- The Seminoles have been ranked in the Top 25 of the NSCAA poll for 157 straight weeks and in the Top 10 for 69 consecutive polls.
 FSU snapped a streak of 51 consecutive weeks in the Top 5 earlier this season - Dec. 4, 2012 to Oct. 4, 2016.
- FSU enters the 2016 ACC Championship as the three-time defending champion, earning conference titles in 2013, 2014 and 2015. The Noles are unbeaten in their last seven matches in the ACC Championship.
- The Noles rank second in the nation with a 0.345 goals against average and are ranked in a tie for second nationally with West Virginia and Brown for the fewest goals allowed, surrendering just six goals during the 2016 season.
- Florida State finished the regular season in a tie for fourth place in the ACC and enter the 2016 ACC Championship as the No. 6 seed.
- The only other time that FSU was the No. 6 seed in the tournament (2011), the Seminoles earned their first conference championship.
- The Noles are 12-9-5 in the all-time series against Duke and are 5-1-1 in the last seven matches of the series, including a 1-0 overtime victory in Tallahassee on October 20, 2016.

DEFENDING ACC CHAMPS

Florida State opened the 2016 season as the defending ACC champion for the fourth time in school history and the third year in a row. The Seminoles are the only school other than North Carolina to win back-to-back ACC titles.

The Noles earned their fourth conference title in 2015 and now own four of the eight ACC championships not earned by UNC.

SEVEN STRAIGHT

Florida State is unbeaten in its last seven matches in the ACC Championship, winning each game since a 4-2 defeat to Virginia in the semifinals of the 2012 tournament.

QUARTERFINAL SUCCESS

FSU has an overall record of 9-7-3 in the quarterfinal round of the ACC Championship, however under current head coach **Mark Krikorian**, the Noles have only lost once in the opening round of the tournament, dropping a 3-1 result to Wake Forest in the 2010 tournament.

FSU also did not advance to the semifinal round in 2008, earning a draw against Virginia Tech, but losing in penalty kicks, 4-2.

SIXTH SEED = CHAMPIONSHIP

Entering the ACC Championship as a No. 6 seed is unfamiliar territory for Florida State, as they have been among the top three seeds 11 times in the last 13 years.

However, the only other time that FSU has been the sixth seed (2011), they came away with its first conference championship after defeating 3-seed UNC (1-0), 2-seed Virginia (2-1) and topping 5-seed Wake Forest 3-1 in penalty kicks after a 1-1 draw in the ACC Championship Game.

WE MEET AGAIN

Florida State and Duke will face off in the 2016 ACC Quarterfinal and recently played each other on October 20 in Tallahassee, Fla.

FSU goalkeeper **Cassie Miller** saved Christina Gibbons' penalty kick attempt in the 85th minute and added two other saves in the 90th minute to help force overtime.

Kaycie Tillman headed home the game-winner for Florida State in the 98th minute after **Olivia Bergau** sent a cross in from the right and **Natalia Kuikka** headed a pass back near the six-yard box for Tillman.

FSU is now 12-9-5 all-time against Duke, including a 5-1-1 mark in the last seven matches of the series.

NO GOALS FOR YOU!!

The Florida State defense has stood strong so far in 2016, allowing just six goals on the season and posting 12 shutouts so far this year.

Prior to allowing a goal at South Alabama on September 5, the Noles has started the year with a consecutive scoreless streak of 294:23, marking the third-longest streak to open the season in program history, trailing the 2009 (349:18) & 2010 (343:23) teams.

It took opponents 518:28 to find their next goal, before Virginia scored at 8:52 in the match on September 25. It marked the fifth-longest scoreless streak in school history.

A goal by North Carolina goal at 38:11 of the October 27 match snapped a scoreless streak of 424:15, dating back to the first minute of the match at Syracuse on October 9.

The Noles have allowed just six goals so far in 2016, which is the fewest goals allowed over the opening 17 games of a season in school history. It also ranks in a tie for second nationally with West Virginia and Brown for the fewest goals allowed so far this season.

TWELVE CLEAN SHEETS

The Florida State soccer program is no stranger of recording shutouts, as the Noles have averaged 16.5 clean sheets per season over the last four years, including a school-record 19 shutouts during their run to the 2014 NCAA National Championship.

The 2016 Seminole team is nearly on pace to match that record as FSU already has posted 12 shutouts through the first 17 games of the season. The 12 shutouts is already tied for eighth-most in school history and is on pace for 18 total shutouts on the season.

MILLER: NCAA ALL-TIME GREAT

Cassie Miller has posted an impressive 2016 campaign as the FSU goalkeeper, ranking in the top 10 in the nation in three different categories - goals against average (0.350 - fifth), shutouts (10 - seventh) and save percentage (0.882 - 10th).

However, this season is just one part of an amazing career for Miller as she set the NCAA record for shutouts with 19 in 2014 and finished that season with a 0.34 goals against average.

The redshirt junior now has 37 career shutouts, which ranks 18th in NCAA history. Her career goals against average of 0.43 ranks sixth all-time, but trails only Katelyn Rowland of UCLA (0.40) among goalkeepers that have over 6,000 minutes played.

ACC STANDINGS

Florida State ended the 2016 regular season tied for fourth place in the conference standings with a 12-3-2 overall record and a 6-2-2 mark in ACC play. FSU leads the conference in fewest goals allowed, surrendering just six goals so far this season, and its 12 shutouts is second in the conference.

Redshirt junior goalkeeper Cassie Miller and sophomore Megan **Connolly** are among the top 5 in the conference in five different categories. as Miller leads the ACC with a 0.35 goals against average and is second with a 0.882 save percentage, 10 shutouts and 0.59 shutouts per game.

- Florida State head coach Mark Krikorian took over the Seminole women's soccer program in 2005 and has proven to the nation that FSU soccer will be a national title contender on an annual basis.

STREAK SNAPPED VS. UNC

The 1-0 defeat at North Carolina on October 27 snapped a seven-match unbeaten streak by the Seminoles over the Tar Heels as FSU posted a record of 6-0-1, dating back to 2011.

FSU VERSUS THE ACC

The Seminoles closed out the 2016 regular season with an all-time ACC record of 106-67-22.

Florida State is 85-22-16 in league play under head coach **Mark Krikorian** as more than three-quarters of FSU's all-time wins in the ACC have come with Krikorian at the helm. Under Krikorian, FSU is 52-5-5 against league opponents at home and 33-17-11 on the road.

FSU has finished no lower than second place (including ties) in the ACC 10 times (2005-10, 2012-15) over the last 12 years, claiming three regular season titles (2009, 2012 and 2014).

SPREADING THE WEALTH

While the goal scorers of **Kristen McFarland**, **Deyna Castellanos** and **Megan Connolly** may make the
headlines, it is a complete team effort
to score those goals and that is on
display as 13 different Seminoles have
assisted on a goal this season.

Led Kirsten Crowley, Kaycie Tillman and Connolly with four assists apiece, three assists from Macayla Edwards, Olivia Bergau and McFarland and two assists each from Elin Jensen, Haylie Grant and Emma Koivisto, the Noles are able to produce goals from anywhere on the field.

SECOND HALF SUFFOCATION

While the Seminoles have done an outstanding job of keeping opponents off the scoreboard, they have been excellent in the second half and overtime in recent games. FSU has surrendered just six goals on the year, but five have occurred in the first half of play.

Over its last 22 matches, Florida State has allowed just two goals after the 45:00 mark, a breakaway goal by Duke at 89:59 of the NCAA semifinal in 2015 as the Noles pressed their numbers high for the equalizer and a goal by Boston College at 50:04 in the match on October 6, 2016.

They mark the only blemishes in the last 1160:59 of second half or overtime action, dating back to November 8, 2015 against Virginia.

SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

Redshirt senior Kirsten Crowley not only leads the team on the field, as the defender has been named the Seminole captain for the 2015 and 2016 seasons, but she also is a leader off the field and has been recognized as one of 30 candidates for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award, presented by Premier Sports Management.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

Crowley earned All-ACC Second Team honors for her play in 2015, along with NSCAA All-Region accolades. She earned FSU Soccer's Golden Torch Award in 2015 and 2016, going to the student-athlete with the highest GPA. She has also volunteered at several community services events throughout her Florida State career.

TDS MIDSEASON TOP 100

The Seminoles have placed four Seminoles in the 2016 Midseason Top 100 List from TopDrawerSoccer.

Reshirt senior defender Kirsten Crowley comes in at No. 12, while sophomore Megan Connolly is ranked No. 18. Redshirt junior Cassie Miller slots in at No. 26 and junior Emma Koivisto closes it out at No. 66.

FSU is tied with Stanford and USC for the most athletes in the country ranked in the top 26.

TDS FRESHMEN TOP 100

A strong class of newcomers have also been recognized by TopDrawerSoccer as Florida State has placed four on their list of the Top 100 Freshmen in the country.

Forward Deyna Castellanos ranks No. 2, with defender Malia Berkely (No. 12) and midfielder Heidi Kollanen (No. 28) not far behind. Forward Kristen McFarland wraps up the Seminole contingent at No. 42.

FSU is tied with UCLA for the most student-athletes ranked in the top 50 of the Freshmen Top 100 list.

#LA VINOTINTO

Freshman forward **Deyna Castellanos** has missed each of the last eight matches as she has competed for her home country of Venezuela at the 2016 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup.

A recipient of the Golden Boot for leading the scoring at the 2014 U17 WWC in Costa Rica, Castellanos has built on that success, scoring five goals in seven games during the 2016 tournament, including both goals in a 2-1 victory over Mexico in the quarterfinals on October 12.

She leads all scorers in U17 Women's World Cup history with 11 goals and Venezuela finished in fourth place for the second consecutive time, matching their placement from 2014.

Castellanos earned the Bronze Ball and Bronze Boot awards for her performance at the 2016 World Cup.

VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

Florida State is 3-1-1 this season against teams ranked in the NSCAA poll, defeating No. 8 Texas A&M (1-0), No. 17 UConn (3-0) and No. 4 Duke (1-0 OT), while earning a 1-1 draw against No. 2 Virginia and falling at No. 16 North Carolina 1-0.

Under **Coach Krikorian**, FSU has a combined record of 91-40-14 against opponents ranked by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America since 2005.

PAIR OF ASSISTS

Sophomore **Macayla Edwards** has moved into the midfield this season after featuring primarily on the defensive backline during her 2015 freshman season.

She has made an impact in her new role already, setting a career high with two assists at Vanderbilt on August 25, aiding the Noles to a 3-0 victory by finding scoring opportunities for Megan Connolly and Haylie Grant.

Sophomore **Elin Jensen** recorded two assists in FSU's 3-0 victory over No. 17 UConn on September 8. It marked the second time in her career that she posted two assists in a game, matching her performance against Evansville in the first round of the 2015 NCAA Tournament.

Redshirt senior **Kirsten Crowley** recorded the second two-assist game of her career on September 22 against Wake Forest, helping the Noles to a 3-0 victory. She also aided on a pair of goals against Pitt on Oct. 3, 2015.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

After graduating a class of six seniors in 2015, the 2016 Seminoles only have six total upperclassmen on their roster.

Eighteen of the 24 players on the team this year are either freshmen (10) or sophomores (8). That matches the 2007 team for the highest amount of underclassmen on a team (18 of 26) since Mark Krikorian's arrival in 2005.

That the team is comprised of 75% underclassmen is the highest ratio of first and second-year players under Krikorian.

Each of the top four scorers on the team - Kristen McFarland, Deyna Casetllanos, Megan Connolly and Kaycie Tillman - are either freshmen or sophomores.

RARE HOME LOSSES

The Noles currently hold a 32-match home unbeaten streak and are 7-0-1 at the Seminole Soccer Complex so far in 2016. It is so rare to lose at home that only five of the 24 players on the 2016 roster have ever lost a game at the Seminole Soccer Complex, a 2-1 defeat against Florida on September 5, 2014.

That is the only loss any active FSU player has surrendered at home as the next home loss was on Oct. 13, 2011.

HOME SWEET HOME

Florida State is 134-9-6 at home since 2005 when **Mark Krikorian** became head coach at Florida State.

The Noles are 66-1-3 in their last 70 matches played at home, dating back to 2011. FSU has 25 wins over ranked opponents over that time and the only loss during that span was a 2-1 defeat to Florida on September 5, 2014.

FSU has allowed just five goals at home over the last 2365:05 of game time – a goal in the 22' against No. 3 Texas A&M on September 4, 2015, an own goal versus No. 7 Clemson on September 24, 2015, two goals vs. Boston College on Nov. 1, 2015 and a goal versus No. 2 Virginia on September 25, 2016.

ROAD SWEET ROAD

The Seminoles are also impressive away from the friendly confines of the Seminole Soccer Complex, posting a true road record of 20-6-6 since 2013, as well as a neutral site mark of 9-2-1.

FSU has lost just five times in its last 25 road games - all one-goal matches - a 3-2 defeat at No. 14 UF on August 30, 2015, a 1-0 loss at No. 2 UVA on October 25, 2015, a 1-0 defeat at South Alabama on September 5, 2016, a 2-1 loss at Boston College on October 6, 2016 and a 1-0 defeat at No. 16 North Carolina on October 27, 2016.

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After helping the Noles post a 1-0 shutout on the road at No. 8 Texas A&M on August 19, redshirt junior goalkeeper **Cassie Miller** was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on August 23.

It is the second time in her career that Miller had received the weekly honor from the conference, adding to the accolade she earned on October 13, 2015 after defeating No. 1 North Carolina, 1-0, and assisting on the game-winning goal by **Berglind Thorvaldsdotti**r.

Kirsten Crowley earned her first ACC Defensive Player of the Week award, and fourth of her career, on September 13 after helping lead the Noles to a pair of shutouts over No. 17 UConn (3-0) and Troy (1-0 OT). Each team managed just one shot on goal, and Crowley made two impressive defensive plays near the end of the match with the Huskies to preserve the clean sheet. She also assisted on the game-winning goal against Troy, heading a pass for Kristen McFarland to score in the 91st minute.

Miller added another weekly conference accolade on October 25 after leading the Noles to a perfect weekend with shutout victories over No. 4 Duke and Louisville. Against the Blue Devils, she made a save on a Christina Gibbons PK in the 85th and two saves in the 90th minute to force overtime and allow the Noles to win in overtime.

TDS TEAM OF THE WEEK

Freshman forward **Deyna Castellanos** wasted no time making an impact for the Garnet and Gold, finding the back of the net on her first shot of the game, giving FSU a 1-0 lead in the second minute at No. 8 Texas A&M. The quick goal earned Castellanos a spot on TopDrawerSoccer's Team of the Week for August 23.

Kirsten Crowley was named to the TDS Team of the Week on October 25 after FSU earned home shutout wins over No. 4 Duke and and Louisville. Crowley and the FSU defense stymied the Blue Devil attack, forcing overtime to allow FSU to score the golden goal. On Sunday, the Cardinals were held without a shot for the final 55:33 of the match. It was the third time in Crowley's career that she had been recognized by TopDrawerSoccer.

QUICK IMPACT

Freshman **Kristen McFarland** had played in 15 games this season, but has made eight starts.

However, she has made the most of her appearances, scoring five goals, including two game-winners, and adding three assists in her 843 minutes played.

She scored the first goal of her career just 2:47 after she subbed into the game against Middle Tennessee on August 28, and only needed 3:14 of match time after coming off the bench against Mercer on September 15 before putting the ball into the back of the net. McFarland only needed 52 seconds of overtime to find the back of the net against Troy on September 11, scoring the golden goal to give FSU the victory.

THREE'S COMPANY

Freshman forward **Deyna Castellanos** opened her career in impressive fashion, scoring one goal in each of the first three matches of 2016. She now has four goals for the season.

Castellanos matched **Selin Kuralay** (2005) as the only first-year players in program history to record a goal in each of their first three matches for the Garnet and Gold.

In all, scoring a goal in each of the first three games of the season has happened just four times, adding in **Tiffany McCarty** (2009) and **Erin Grimsley** (1997).

YAMAGUCHI JERSEY RETIREMENT

Former Seminole Mami Yamaguchi was honored prior to the Duke match on October 20 and became the first FSU soccer player to have her jersey retired.

A recipient of the 2007 MAC Hermann Trophy winner, given to the top player in collegiate soccer, Yamaguchi led the country in points (66) and finished second in goals (24) and assists (18). She concluded the season as the only student-athlete in the nation to rank in the top 10 in three major offensive categories including points per game, goals per game and assists per game.

Yamaguchi finished her three-year Seminole career with 94 points, 32 goals and 30 assists, ranking in the top-five all-time in FSU history in each category.

POSTSEASON RECORDS

Florida State set a pair of NCAA Tournament shutout records over the course of the 2014 and 2015 postseasons as the Noles earned their first national championship in 2014.

From the 2013 College Cup until the 2015 College Cup, FSU recorded 10 consecutive shutouts during postseason play. The streak ranks as the longest in the nation, breaking North Carolina's streak of eight games from 2003-04. The Seminoles also own the NCAA Tournament record for consecutive scoreless minutes at 931:47, surpassing UNC's mark of 829:21.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY

The Seminoles placed two student athletes on the preseason watch list for the 2016 MAC Hermann Trophy. Redshirt senior **Kirsten Crowley** and sophomore **Megan Connolly** were two of 36 players recognized on the preseason list.

Florida State is one of eight teams with multiple student-athletes on the Watch List, joining UConn, Duke, Florida, USC, Stanford, Virginia and West Virginia.

It is the 13th straight season that the Seminoles have had a student-athlete named to the preseason Watch List and FSU has had two players selected nine times in the last 11 seasons.

In 2007, **Mami Yamaguchi** won the MAC Hermann Trophy, the first and only player in school history to win the award. Yamaguchi led the country in points that season with 66, while finishing second in goals (24) and assists (18).

ACC PRESEASON POLL

Florida State was chosen as the favorite to win the ACC in 2016, earning 191 points and nine of the 14 first place votes from the league's coaches prior to the season. The Seminoles secured the ACC Tournament championship in 2015, earning FSU's third consecutive league title and fourth overall.

The Noles also placed two studentathletes on the 2016 Preseason All-ACC Team - redshirt senior **Kirsten Crowley** and sophomore **Megan Connolly**. Connolly is the only nonsenior to receive preseason accolades from the league.

FRESH FACES

The Seminoles welcome 11 newcomers to the squad in 2016, including 10 freshman and a graduate transfer.

Three freshmen - **Briana Alston** (Ashburn, Va.), **Taylor Hallmon** (Panama City, Fla.) and **Julia Phillips** (Ashburn, Va.) enrolled at Florida State for the Spring 2016 semester, joining the team in January and training with the Seminoles throughout the spring.

Seven others arrived for the fall, with four Americans and three international players. **Malia Berkely** (Liberty Township, Ohio), **Kristen McFarland** (Powell, Ohio), **Doriana Moul** (San Diego, Calif.) and **Clara Robbins** (Stafford, Va.) represent the newcomers from the United States.

The trio of international players that will compete for the Noles this fall are **Deyna Castellanos** (Maracay, Venezuela), **Heidi Kollanen** (Tampere, Finland) and **Yo Tachibana** (Nisshin, Japan). **Amanda Kopale** (Cape Coral, Fla.) comes to FSU after competing for three seasons at Nova Southeastern.
