#### NOTES/CLARIFICATIONS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 11 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season). The Seminoles have 233 wins in the last 11 seasons and average 21.2 wins per season. Only Duke and North Carolina have more wins than Florida State during that span of time. Florida State welcomes back its scoring leader (Dwayne Bacon, 15.6 ppg), its rebounding leader (Bacon, 5.6 rpg) and its leader in assists (Xavier Rathan-Mayes, 4.4 apg) from its NIT team in 2016. The Seminoles return two of their top three scorers (All-America candidate Dwayne Bacon and junior Xavier Rathan-Mayes) who combined to average 27.2 points per game and who combined to make 71 3-point field goals. Bacon scored a Florida State freshman record 536 points and averaged a Seminole freshman record 15.6 points scored per game. Rathan-Mayes, who earned All-ACC Freshman Team honors in 2015, averaged 11.8 points per game as a sophomore and needs only 134 points to become only the 45<sup>th</sup> player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points. Rathan-Mayes averaged a career-high 4.4 assists per game and is ranked second in the ACC among the returning assists leaders for the 2016-17 season. Also back for the Seminoles is senior Jarquez Smith who is ranked 16<sup>th</sup> in school history with 93 career blocked shot and Terance Mann who was one of only one of only three Seminoles with at least 175 points (177, 5.2 ppg), at least 125 rebounds (126, 3.7 rpg), at least 30 assists (30, 0.9 apg) and at least 20 steals (21, 0.6 spg) during the 2015-16 season. Also returning for the Seminoles are frontcourt players Michael Ojo (who missed the entire 2015-16 season) and Phil Cofer (who played in only 11 games as a sophomore during the 2015-16 season). Florida State welcomes its second consecutive top-10 recruiting class to Tallahassee. Included in the five-member class are Jonathan Isaac (No. 9 overall high school players), Trent Forrest (the No. 48 overall player in the nation), CJ Walker (the No. 87 ranked player entering college for the 2016-17 season), Mfiondu Kabengele (the No. 65 overall high school player) and Braian Angola-Rodas (who earned All-American First Team Junior College Honors at North Idaho College in 2016).

**ON RATHAN-MAYES:** One of college basketball's most prolific scorers who needs only 134 points to become the 45<sup>th</sup> player in school history to reach 1,000 career points as he plays his third year as a Seminole in 2016-17...averages better than 13 points a game for the first 65 games of his career ...earned Freshman All-American, All-ACC Honorable Mention and All-ACC Freshman Team honors in his first season as a Seminole in 2015...one of only four freshmen who earned mention to the All-ACC First, Second, Third or Honorable Mention Teams in 2015 (Rathan-Mayes, HM; Jahlihl Okafor of Duke, First Team; Tyus Jones of Duke, Third Team; Justise Winslow of Duke, Honorable Mention)...earned Freshman All-American Second Team honors by CBSsports.com in 2015...his 146 assists during the 2015-16 season are tied for 19<sup>th</sup> in a single season in school history while his 137 assists during his freshman season is ranked 25<sup>th</sup> for a single-season in school history...tied for 21<sup>st</sup> in school history with 283 career assists entering the 2016-17 season...needs only four assists to move into the Seminoles' all-time top 20, 73 assists to move into the all-time top-10 and 152 to move into Florida State's all-time top-five...ranked second among returning assists leaders in the ACC from the 2014-15 season behind only Bryant Crawford of Wake Forest...Rathan-Mayes averaged 4.42 assists in 33 games while Crawford averaged 4.43 assists in 30 games...ranked third for career assists in the ACC entering the 2016-17 season behind only London Parrentes of Virginia (441 career assists) and Devin Wilson of Virginia Tech (358 career assists)...Rathan-Mayes begins his junior season with 283 career assists...will look to become one of the top 25 3-point shooters in school history during the 2016-17 season...begins the season ranked 26<sup>th</sup> in school history with 87 career 3-point field goals made...Luke Loucks is ranked 25<sup>th</sup> in school history with 88 career 3-point shots made...needs 17 3-point shots made to move into Florida State's all-time top-20, needs 57 made 3-point shots to move into Florida State's all-time top-10 and 109 made shots from long range to move into the Seminoles' all-time top-five...the first freshman in ACC history to score 30 or more points three times with a career-high 35 points at North Carolina (Jan. 24), 35 points at Miami (Feb. 25) and 30 points against Clemson (March 11) in the first ACC Tournament game of his career...his 35 points against North Carolina and Miami rank as the highest scoring total in Florida State history by a freshman...his 35 points against North Carolina and Miami are tied for the fifth best scoring effort by a freshman in ACC history...his 30 points against Clemson in the ACC Tournament marked the most points by a Seminole in an ACC Tournament game and was the first time a Florida State player scored 30 points or more in an ACC Tournament game...his ACC Tournament game against Clemson was the first ACC Tournament game of his career...named the ACC Rookie of the Week twice during the 2014-15 season - the same number his father, Tharon, wore at Florida State...earned two awards at the Florida State Honors Banquet at the conclusion of the 2014-15 season: The Otto Petty Most Assists Award and the Bob Sura Outstanding Offensive Player Award...earned the Otto Petty Most Assists Award for the second consecutive year at the Seminoles' banquet honoring the 2015-16 season's accomplishments...

**AS A FRESHMAN (2015):** Averaged 14.9 points (first on the team), 4.3 assists (first), 1.1 steals (first) and 3.5 rebounds (fourth) while making 48 3-point shots (second) and 98 free throws (second) during one of the most dynamic freshman seasons in school history... ranked ninth in the ACC in scoring and second among all ACC freshman behind only ACC Player of the Year Jahlil Okafor of Duke... earned Freshman All-American, All-ACC Honorable Mention and All-ACC Freshman Team honors in his first season... in earning All-ACC Honorable Mention and All-ACC Freshman Team honors he ranked second among freshman in scoring (behind only Okafor of Duke), second in assists (behind only Tyus Jones of Duke), fourth in steals (behind only Chris McCullough of Syracuse, Jones and Justise Winslow of Duke) and 11<sup>th</sup> in rebounding... set the Seminoles' school record for freshman in scoring (476 total points), points scored per game (14.9 ppg), field goals made (165), field goals attempted (397), 3-point shots made (48) and 3-point shots attempted (171)... one of only two freshman in the nation (also Melo Trimble of Maryland) to lead his team in scoring, assists and steals during the 2014-15 season... led the Seminoles in 30+ point games (three) and 20+ point scoring games (seven) while leading the Seminoles in games as their leading scorer (16) and in games when scoring in double figures (24)... scored in double figures in 14 of his 18 ACC games and was only 14 points from scoring in double figures in all 18 conference games during his first season as a Seminole... earned his first career double double (12 points and 11 assists) in the Seminoles' victory at Virginia Tech (Feb. 7)... started 30 of Florida State's 32 games and played in 1,110 total minutes (34.7 minutes per game)... one of only two Seminole players to start at least 30 games (Montay Brandon started all 32) and to play more than 1,000 minutes during the season (Montay Brandon played 1,142)... inserted into the starting line-up in the fourth game of the season against UMass (Nov. 23) and started every game after that... scored five game-winning baskets: vs. The Citadel (lay-up, 14:30 first half), at Clemson (two free throws, 17:29 first half), at Clemson (jumper, 0:54 second half), vs. Boston College (lay-up, 9:29 second half) and vs. Pitt (lay-up, 9:32 first half)... scored the first points of the game for Florida State eight times including all three games against Clemson, against Florida, against North Carolina and against Virginia in the ACC Tournament... scored/averaged in double figures against 12 of the Seminoles' 14 ACC opponents: North Carolina (35 points in one game to lead the team), Wake Forest (21 points in one game to lead the team), Clemson (20.7 ppg in three games to lead the team), Georgia Tech (20.0 points in one game to lead the team), Miami (20.0 ppg to lead the team), Virginia Tech (17.0 ppg to lead the team), NC State (15 points in one game against the Wolfpack), Syracuse (14 points in one game to lead the team), Pitt (13.5 ppg in two games to lead the team), Virginia (13.0 ppg in two games to lead the team), Louisville (12 points in one game against Cardinals) and Boston College (13.0 points in one game)... also averaged in double figures in two ACC Tournament games and led the team in scoring in the ACC Tournament (21.0 ppg), in the Seminoles' 17 victories (15.4 ppg), in the Seminoles' 18 ACC games (16.1 ppg) and in Florida State's 15 non-conference games (13.3 ppg)... was Florida State's leading scorer and the only Seminole to score in double figures in both of its games against Virginia during the 2014-15 season... scored 26 points in the Seminoles' 66-55 win over The Citadel (Nov. 25) and in the process, wrote his name beside his father in the Seminoles' record book... was a perfect five of five from the 3-point line... his father, Tharon Mayes, who played for the Seminoles from 1988-90, was a perfect five of five from the 3-point line on February 2, 1988 against Monmouth... Tharon scored 21 points in the Seminoles' 82-68 victory over the Hawks... Rathan-Mayes became the seventh player in school history to shoot perfectly from the 3-point line on at least five attempts in a single game in school history... a four-game stretch early in his freshman season as he scored 22 points against UMass (Nov. 23), 26 against The Citadel (Nov. 25), 16 against Charleston Southern (Nov. 28) and 17 against Nebraska in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (Dec. 1) to average 20.3 points in the first four starts of his career... a freshman season-long eight-game streak of double figure scoring to close out the season as he averaged 19.4 points scored per game from February 14 against Georgia Tech through March 12 against Virginia in the ACC Tournament... **(vs. Boston College):** Scored 13 points and was credited with a team-high five assists in Florida State's only game of the season against Boston College... was six of eight from the free throw line (.750 percent) and earned two steals in the Seminoles 69-60 win over the Eagles at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Feb. 18)... scored eight of his 13 points in the second half against Boston College as the Seminoles rallied from a 32-27 halftime deficit... the Seminoles outscored the Eagles 42-28 in the second half to gain the victory... scored what proved to be the game-winning basket on a lay-up at the 9:29 mark of the second half... he lay-up made the score 49-48 and was the beginning of a game-ending and game-winning 22-12 run to close the game and the win... scored five points in the final 10 minutes of the game including two free throws with 22 seconds left to play to close out Florida State's scoring... **(vs. Clemson):** Averaged a team-leading 20.7 points, 4.3 rebounds and a team-leading 4.3 assists in three games against Clemson – two during the regular season and one in the second round of the ACC Tournament... the Seminoles won two of the three games with victories at Clemson and in the ACC Tournament... Clemson won in Tallahassee... led the Seminoles with 23 field goals made, eight 3-point field goals made, 12 defensive rebounds, 13 assists and five steals and a 36.7 minutes played per game average in the three games against the Tigers... led the Seminoles in scoring in all three games against the Tigers – 17 in the Seminoles win at Clemson, 15 in the Tigers win in Tallahassee and 30 in the Seminoles win in the ACC Tournament... led Florida State with 17 points and five rebounds in the Seminoles' 59-55 victory over Clemson at Littlejohn Coliseum (Jan. 19)... totaled 12 first half points to boost Florida State to a 28-22 lead at halftime... scored the first two points of the game on two free throws at the 17:29 mark to give the Seminoles a 2-0 lead... gave Florida State the lead for good on a lay-up (7-5 at the 15:20 mark) -- a lead they would not surrender as they led wire-to-wire in gaining the victory... totaled seven second half points as Florida State increased its lead to as many as 12 points in gaining their second ACC win and first ACC road win of the season... totaled a team-high 15 points, four rebounds and two assists as Clemson rallied from a six-point second half deficit to take a 62-56 win at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Feb. 4)... scored 10 of his 15 points in the second half but the Tigers took the win on Florida State's home court... reached the 30-point plateau as he scored 30 points in Florida State's 76-73 victory over Clemson in the second round of the ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C. (March 11)... became the first freshmen in ACC history to score 30 points in three different games with his record setting performance in his first career ACC game... his 30 points was the most by a Florida State player in an ACC Tournament game... made 11 of 19 field goal attempts, five of nine 3-point field goal attempts and three of five free throw attempts in reaching the 30-point plateau for the third time... totaled 12 first half points and 18 in the second half as the Seminoles gained the victory... scored Florida State's first basket of the game – a 3-point shot at the 18:37 mark of the first half – and he was off and running to lead the Seminoles to a 20-point lead and the victory that advanced them to the quarterfinal round of the tournament for the eighth consecutive season... totaled nine points in the first nine minutes of the first half on an array of shots to lead Florida State to a 33-26 advantage... on fire in the second half as he scored 18 of Florida State's 43 points to lead his team to the victory... back to back 3-point field goals to begin the second half at the 16:26 and 15:37 marks gave the Seminoles a 44-33 lead... a third 3-point field goal in the half at the 12:29 mark gave him 21 points and boosted the Seminoles to a 50-35 lead... four points on two free throws at the 9:51 mark and a jumper at the 9:09 mark gave Florida State a 57-37 lead and gave him 25 points in the game... an important free throw with 30 seconds remaining gave Florida State a 75-71 lead as the Tigers came most of the way back to their 20 point deficit to trail by a little as two in the closing seconds of the game... **(vs. Duke):** Scored five points and pulled down two rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against NCAA Tournament participant and National Champion Duke... the Seminoles gave the Blue Devils all they could handle before falling 73-70 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Feb. 9)... five total points with three in the first half and his most important two in the second half on a lay-up with 11 seconds remaining to be played to bring the Seminoles to within one at 70-69... his basket allowed the Seminoles to come nearly all the way back from a 14-point second half deficit... his basket was part of a near game-winning 29-20 run in the final 11 minutes of the game... Duke outscored the Seminoles 3-1 following Rathan-Mayes' lay-up to gain the win... **(vs. Georgia Tech):** Led the Seminoles with 20 points and six rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against Georgia Tech... was his fourth of five times to score 20 points or more in an ACC game in his first season as a Seminole... made a game-high nine field goals and was credited with two assists and one steal as Florida State earned the come-from-behind 57-53 win at McCamish Pavilion in Atlanta, Ga. (Feb. 14)... was the most productive Seminole with 15 first half points to give Florida State 32-23 halftime lead... scored Florida State's first basket of the game on a 3-point shot to give the Seminoles a 3-2 lead at the 17:07 mark... scored his eighth and ninth points on a jumper at the 7:53 mark of the first half to give the Seminoles a 16-12 advantage... scored Florida State's final six points of the half on a lay-up at the 2:01 mark to put the Seminoles up 28-23, a jumper at the 1:34 mark to give the Seminoles a 30-23 lead and closed out the scoring in the half with another jumper at the 0:47 mark to put Florida State up 32-23... his most important basket of the game proved to be the game-winning



basket at the 0:54 mark to give Florida State back the lead a 54-53...his jumper was part of a 9-0 game-ending and game-winning run by the Seminoles...**(vs. Louisville):** Totaled 12 points, two rebounds and two steals in Florida State's only game of the season against NCAA Tournament participant Louisville...the Cardinals defeated the Seminoles, 81-59, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee, Fla. (Feb. 28)...his 12 points placed him as one of five Seminoles to score in double figures as the Seminoles and Cardinals met for the first time as members of the ACC...scored 10 second half points as Florida State worked to get back into the game after trailing by a 36-26 margin at halftime...**(vs. Miami):** Averaged a team-leading 20.0 points, a team-leading 5.0 rebounds and a team-leading 4.0 assists in two games against NIT participant Miami...shot the ball well from the field (12 of 26, .462 percent) and from the free throw line (seven of 15, .467 percent) in totaling 40 points in the two-game regular season series against the Hurricanes as the two teams split the regular season series with both teams winning on their home court...one of the greatest performances of any collegiate player during the 2014-15 season in the second game as he scored 30 points in a span of 4:38 in a 81-77 win by the Hurricanes in Coral Gables...scored five points, pulled down a team-high tying six rebounds and was credited with three assists in the Seminoles' 55-54 win over the Hurricanes at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Feb. 1)...three first half points on a 3-point shot at the buzzer of the first half helped bring Florida State to within 11 at 36-25 at the break...most important points of the game on a lay-up with 4:32 remaining in the game gave Florida State a 53-52 lead...the Seminoles won the game on a jumper by Kiel Turpin at the 1:41 mark to give the Seminoles the 55-54 victory...the Seminoles held the Hurricanes to 18 total points and outscored Miami, 30-18 in the second half to gain the win...scored a career-high tying 35 points – including an incredible 30 points in a span of 4:38 – in the Seminoles' game against Miami on the road...despite the heroics by Rathan-Mayes, the Seminoles fell at the BankUnited Center in Coral Gables by a score of 81-77 (Feb. 25)...Rathan-Mayes totaled five first half points and 30 in the second as Florida State nearly recovered from an 18-point second half deficit...with the Seminoles down 62-44 with 4:38 remaining in the games, he went to work offensively...in the final 4:38 he outscored Miami (by himself) 30-17 in almost single-handedly bring the Seminoles back from the 18-point (62-44) deficit...in the final 4:38 of the game he was eight of 10 from the field, six of 8 from the 3-point line, eight of nine from the line (with one intentional miss), he and his teammates brought Florida State from a 60-44 deficit (-16) to within two in the last 10 seconds, he scored 26 consecutive points (by himself) from the 4:38 mark (his 3-point shot made the score 62-47) and a four-point play at the 1:30 mark made the score 73-70, he assisted on a Robbie Berwick 3-point shot at the 0:20 second mark to make the score 76-73, he then scored Florida State's final four points of the game on three of four made free throws (he intentionally missed the final shot with the score 79-77)...during the incredible run he was called for his fourth foul of the game at the 2:51 mark and was substituted in and out four times in the final 2:51...even with four fouls and being substituted for on defense and offense he scored 16 points and he added two rebounds...said Rathan-Mayes after the game: It was just a crazy feeling to be locked into a zone like that."...said Miami Coach Jim Larranaga: "I've never coached in a game like that before. That is outrageous. I've seen guys in the NBA go off. I think Klay Thompson did it and he scored like 37 points in a quarter -- their quarter is a heck of a lot longer than four minutes. That's in 12 minutes. This kid did it in less than five. One of the greatest on-court performances I've ever seen. I've never seen that before in my college coaching career."...his scoring performance in the final 4:38 against the Hurricanes has spoken about in the same breath as Wilt Chamberlain's 100 point scoring performance during the 1962 NBA season, Kobe Bryant's 81-point performance in 2006 and Pistol Pete Maravich's 69-point performance for LSU at Alabama in February of 1970...**(vs. North Carolina):** Scored 35 points and pulled down five rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against NCAA Tournament participant North Carolina...made 14 of 26 shots from the field (.528 percent) and five of 11 3-point shots (.455 percent) as he set (for the first time) the Florida State record for points in a single game by a freshman...his total was tied for the fifth best single game performance by a freshman in ACC history...his heroics nearly led the Seminoles to the win, but the Tar Heels hung on late for the 78-74 victory at the Dean E. Smith Center in Chapel Hill (Jan. 24)...Rathan-Mayes' 35 points were the most points by an opponent in the Smith Center since J.J. Redick had 35 for Duke on Feb. 7, 2006...he became only the third opposing player to have scored 35 or more points in the Smith Center against UNC: Lionel Simmons of La Salle had 37 on Jan. 9, 1988 and Len Bias of Maryland had 35 on Feb. 20, 1986... Rathan-Mayes scored his career-high of 35 points against North Carolina – more points in a single game than were scored by J.J. Reddick of Duke (freshman high of 34 points), Kenny Anderson of Georgia Tech (freshman high of 32), Ralph Sampson of Virginia (freshman high of 32 points) or T.J. Warren of NC State (freshman high of 31 points) when they were freshmen...his performance against the Tar Heels earned him ACC Co-Rookie of the Week honors...**(vs. NC State):** Totaled 15 points, five rebounds and five assists in Florida State's only game of the season against NCAA Tournament participant NC State...the Wolfpack defeated the Seminoles, 72-63, in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Jan. 17)...scored seven first half points and eight in the second half as Florida State worked its way back into the game after falling down by 19 in the first half...his eight second half points helped Florida State rally to tie the game at 60-60 with 4:00 remaining to be played...the Wolfpack outscored the Seminoles by a 12-3 margin to close the game and gain the victory...**(vs. Notre Dame):** Totaled nine points and three rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against ACC Champion and NCAA Tournament participant Notre Dame...was Florida State's third leading scorer in his first career ACC game...Notre Dame defeated the Seminoles, 83-63, in their first game as members of the ACC at Purcell Pavilion in Notre Dame, Ind. (Dec. 13)...**(vs. Pitt):** Averaged a team-leading 13.5 points and a team-leading 4.0 assists in two games against NIT participant Pitt...led the Seminoles with nine free throws made, eight assists and three steals as the Seminoles and the Panthers split their two-game regular season series with both teams winning on their home courts...scored eight points and was credited with three assists as Florida State traveled to play at Pitt...the Panthers took the 73-64 win over the Seminoles at the Peterson Events Center (Jan. 14)...totaled six second half points as the Seminoles worked to get back into the game after trailing by 13 in the second half...led Florida State with 19 points and five assists as Florida State defeated Pitt, 61-52, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee to close out the regular season with a victory (March 7)...of his 19 points, he scored what proved to be the game-winning basket at the 9:32 mark on a lay-up to give the Seminoles a 14-13 lead...the Seminoles did not trail after that basket by the freshman...totaled 12 second half points as Florida State stretched its lead to 11 in taking the victory going away...**(vs. Syracuse):** Led Florida State with 14 points and totaled four rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against Syracuse...the Orange defeated the Seminoles, 70-57, at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, N.Y. (Jan. 11)...scored 12 of his 14 points in the second half of the game as the Seminoles played the Orange to a 35-35 tie in the second half to pull back in to the game...**(vs. Virginia):** Averaged a team-leading 13.0 points and a team-leading 2.5 assists in two games against ACC regular season champion and NCAA Tournament participant Virginia...led the Seminoles in scoring, field goals made, 3-point field goals made, assists and steals against the Cavaliers...scored a team-high 13 points in the Seminoles' regular season game against Virginia – a game won by the Cavaliers, 51-41, at the John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville (Feb. 22)...the only Seminole in double figure scoring as he made an game high three 3-point field goals...totaled 10 points in the first half as Florida State took a lead late in the first half and threatened the No. 2 ranked Cavaliers in their home arena...gave the Seminoles the lead on three different occasions during the first half...a jumper at the 4:41 mark put Florida State up 15-13...a lay-up at the 1:46 mark put the Seminoles ahead 18-17...a 3-pointer put the Seminoles ahead again at the 1:04 mark by a score of 21-20...the Cavaliers took a 22-21 lead at the intermission...the Cavaliers outscored the Seminoles by a 29-20 mark in the second half to take the victory...totaled a team leading 13 points in the Seminoles quarterfinal round game I the ACC Tournament...the Cavaliers gained the 58-44 win over the Seminoles at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C. (March 12)...scored eight of his 13 points as the Seminoles outscored the Cavaliers, 27-24, to play their way back into the game late in the second half...**(vs. Virginia Tech):** Averaged a team-leading 17.0 points and a team-leading 7.0 assists in the Seminoles' two games during the regular season against Virginia Tech...led the team in field goals made (11), field goals attempted (22), free throws made (10), free throws attempted (13), assists (14) and minutes played (73 / 36.5 mpg) as the Seminoles to both games of the regular season series with wins in both Tallahassee and Blacksburg...led Florida State with 22 points and three assists in the Seminoles' 86-75 win over the Hokies at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Jan. 6)...was the Seminoles' leading scorer and the only Florida State player to score 20 or more in the victory...did his offensive damage in the first half as he scored 18 points on six made field goals as the Seminoles enjoyed their best scoring half of the season and held a 53-45 lead at the intermission...his 18 points in the first half helped the Seminoles score the first three points of the game and never trail to gain their first ACC victory of the season...totaled 12 points and was one of three Seminoles in double figure scoring as Florida State defeated Virginia Tech, 73-65, at Cassell Coliseum in Blacksburg, Va. (Feb. 7)...eight of his 12 points came in the decisive second half as the Seminoles held the lead, lost the lead and regained the lead in gaining the ACC road victory...an important basket came at the 16:09 mark of the second half as he made a lay-up to increase Florida State's lead to three after the Hokies had cut a once five-point lead by the Seminoles down to just one at the 16:26 mark...helped the Seminoles increase their lead to as much

as 17 in the second half in winning by eight on the road in the ACC...**(vs. Wake Forest):** Scored a team-high 21 points and was credited with a team-high five assists in Florida State's only game of the season against Wake Forest...the Seminoles rallied to defeat the Demon Deacons in double overtime by a score of 82-76 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee in the second game of the event (Nov. 18)...earned 16 minutes of playing time in his first career game for the Seminoles...**(vs. Providence):** Scored five points and was credited with five assists in Florida State's game against NCAA Tournament participant Providence in the second round of the Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off Classic...the Friars took the 80-54 decision at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. (Nov. 22)...all five of his points came in the second half with his first career points as a Seminole coming on two free throws with 33 seconds remaining to be played in the game...made his first career 3-point shot with 15 seconds remaining in the game to close out the scoring for the game...**(vs. UMass):** Scored 22 points and was credited with three assists in the Seminoles game against UMass in the final round in the Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off Classic...led the Seminoles in scoring for the first time and scored 20 or more points for the first of five times as a freshman...scored 11 points in both halves of the game as Florida state took a 35-34 lead at the intermission and worked its way back from a six point deficit in the second half...**(In Two Games During The ACC Tournament):** Averaged a team-leading 21.5 points and 3.5 rebounds in two games in his first career ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C...led the Seminoles in scoring (43 total points), field goals made (17), 3-point field goals made (six), assists (five) and minutes played (78 / 39.0)...**(vs. Clemson):** Scored 30 points and pulled down four rebounds in Florida State game against Clemson in the ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C...became the first Seminole in school history to score 30 points in an ACC Tournament and became the first freshman in ACC history to score 30 or more points in three different games...tied his season high for points in a half with 18 in helping the Seminoles to the 76-73 win (March 11)...scored nine points in the final nine minutes of the game as Florida State held on to win the game and advance to the quarterfinals of the tournament...**(vs. Virginia):** Led Florida State with 13 points in the Seminoles' game against Virginia in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament...the Cavaliers defeated the Seminoles, 58-44, at the Greensboro Coliseum (March 12)...

**AS A FRESHMAN (2014):** Sat out the 2013-14 season as per NCAA regulations...earned his eligibility and was cleared to participate in practice with the Seminoles on May 13, 2014...
