An All-American candidate and the top candidate for ACC Player of the Year honors as one of the top players in the ACC for the 2012-13 season after winning the Everett Case Award as the Most Valuable Player of the 2012 ACC Tournament in leading the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history / Earned All-ACC Second Team, ACC All-Defensive Team (Coaches and Media) and ACC All-Tournament First Team honors in leading the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history / Only the fifth freshman in school history to be named to the ACC All Freshmen team in 2010 joining Corey Louis (1995), Michael Joiner (2001), Alexander Johnson (2004) and Solomon Alabi (2009) / Named to the All-District IV Team (Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Florida) by the US Basketball Writers Association in 2012 / A three-year returning starter and the Seminoles' leading returning scorer for the second consecutive season heading into the 2012-13 season / The national leader in 3-point buzzer beating baskets with three during his junior season / Made buzzer beating 3-point shots in the Seminoles' victory over then No. 4 Duke on Jan. 21, 2012 as the Seminoles defeated the Blue Devils, 76-73, and stopped Duke's 45-game home winning streak and made a third in the Seminoles' win at home against Virginia Tech which rallied Florida State to a 48-47 win / Actually made two buzzer beating 3-point shots against Duke with his first coming at the end of the first half to make the score 34-28 and then won the game at the buzzer of the second half to give the Seminoles the monumental win on the road / Beat the Hokies at home on Feb. 16 as he beat the buzzer with 2.4 seconds left on the clock to give Florida State the win at home / Has helped lead Florida State to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and to the Sweet 16 of the 2011 NCAA Tournament / Will look to lead Florida State to its school record fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament in 2013

SNAER'S RECORD WATCH

Michael Snaer enters his senior season ranked ninth in school history with 133 career made 3-point shots. He needs only 123 made 3-point field goals to surpass James Collins (school record 255 career 3-point shots made) for the all-time Seminole lead and needs 62 to move into Florida State's all-time top five with 195.

Michael Snaer enters his senior season ranked 11th in school history with 349 career 3-point field goal attempts. He is six attempts from moving into top 10, 125 attempts from moving into the top five and 338 attempts away becoming Florida State's all-time leader and surpassing James Collins (686 career 3-point shot attempts).

Michael Snaer enters his senior season ranked seventh in school history with a .381 career free throw shooting percentage. He is looking to become one of only six players in school history to shoot .400 percent or better from the 3-point line for his career.

Michael Snaer enters his senior season ranked 24th in school history with a .736 career free throw shooting percentage. He is looking to become one of only six players in school history to shoot .800 percent or better from the free throw line for his career.

Michael Snaer enters his senior season having played in 101 career games and having started 77 times during his career. He needs to play in 36 games to set the all-time school record for games played and needs to start 23 games to move into Florida State's all-time top five for career games started.

AS A JUNIOR

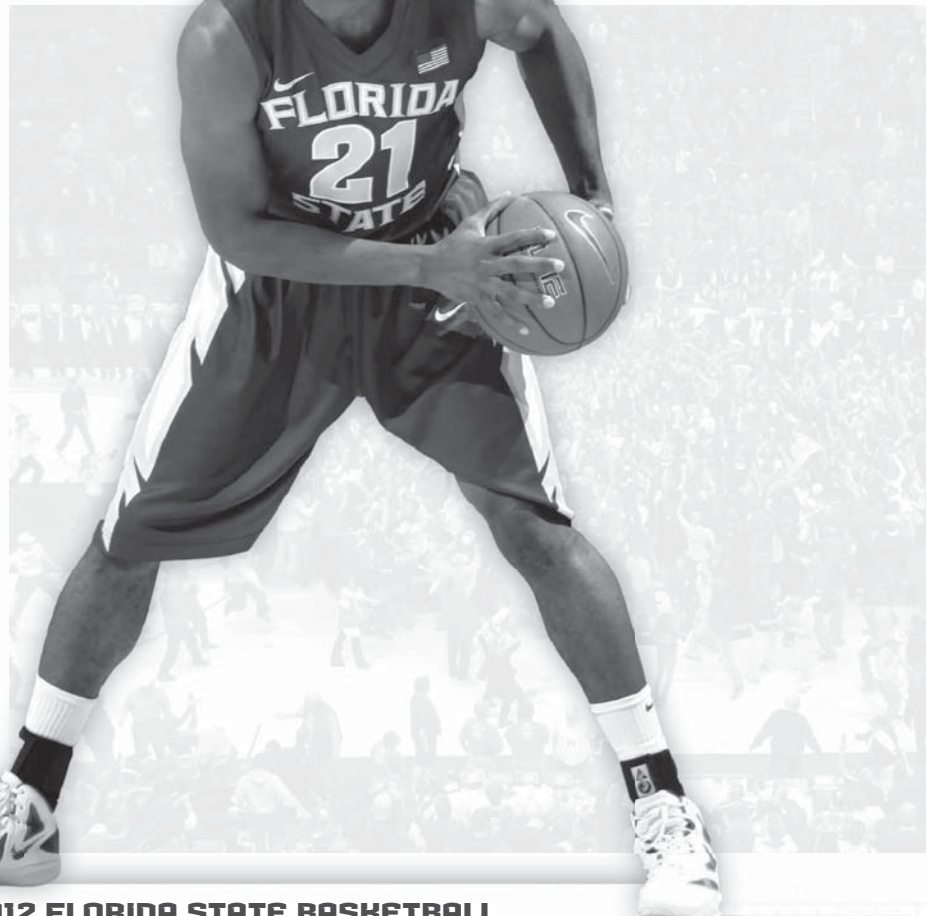
- Averaged a career-high and team leading 14.0 points (first on the team), a career-high 3.8 rebounds (fifth), a career high 1.1 steals (third), 1.9 assists (second) and made a career-high and team leading 67 3-point shots
- Named The ACC Tournament MVP and earned All-ACC Second Team, ACC All-Defensive Team (Coaches and Media) and ACC All-Tournament First Team honors in leading the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history
- The second player since 1997 not from Duke or North Carolina to be named the ACC Tournament MVP
- Named to the All-District IV Team (Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Florida) by the US Basketball Writers Association

MICHAEL SNAER

AS A SOPHOMORE

- Averaged 8.8 points (third on the team), 2.7 rebounds (tied for seventh), a career high 2.2 assists (third) and 0.9 steals (fourth) while starting 33 of the Seminoles' 34 games and helping lead them to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1993
- Florida State finished the 2010-11 season with a 23-11 record, an 11-5 mark and in third place in the ACC standings, a school record tying third consecutive NCAA Tournament berth and a trip to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for only the fourth time in the history of the program
- Averaged in double figure scoring against four different ACC teams: Virginia (16.0 ppg), Georgia Tech (15.0 ppg), Boston College (13.0 ppg) and NC State (13.0 ppg)
- Ranked second on the team with 43 3-point shots made
- His 43 3-point shots made rank as the seventh highest single season total by a Seminole sophomore
- Made his career high of five 3-point field goals against nationally ranked Florida and made multiple 3-point field goals in 12 of the Seminoles' 33 games
- Shot .500 percent from the bonusphere (six of 12) in three games during the 2011 NCAA Tournament
- Including the Seminoles' games against Notre Dame and VCU in the NCAA Tournament, he also made at least three shots from long range in wins over Florida International (Nov. 18) and Boston College (Jan. 22)
- Was Florida State's second leading scorer during the NCAA Tournament in the Seminoles' run to the Sweet 16 as he averaged 11.3 points as a starter in all three games
- Finished his season with a .776 free throw shooting percentage - the fourth highest on the team and third highest among the Seminoles' season long rotation

MICHAEL SNAER

AS A FRESHMAN (2010)

- Averaged 8.8 points (third on the team), 2.7 rebounds (sixth) and 1.3 assists (fourth) while making 23 3-point field goals (fourth) and 57 free throws (tied for third)
- Became only the fifth player in school history to be named to the ACC All-Freshman Team
- Finished fifth among all freshmen in the ACC with an 8.8 points per game scoring average and 11th among all league freshmen with a 2.7 rebounds per game average
- Was Florida State's third leading scorer in conference games with a 9.1 points per game average
- He scored in double figures in seven of 16 ACC games and in 14 of 32 games (both 44%) in his first season
- Was Florida State's leading free throw shooter in ACC games only with a team leading .765 shooting percentage
- He shot .765 from the free throw line in 16 ACC games as compared to .554 in 16 non conference games - an improvement of more than 20 percentage points in helping the Seminoles to a 10-6 mark in the ACC standings
- Named the ACC Rookie of the Week on Feb. 15, 2010 for his performances against Clemson (10 points and four rebounds) and Boston College (18 points and two assists) as he averaged 14.0 points in the two games

ON MILLER

After two extremely productive seasons in which he has helped lead Florida State to the 2012 ACC Championship and to two appearances in the NCAA Tournament, he is on his way to becoming the next star in the ACC and in all of college basketball / already known for his ability to create instant offense and with future promise as a prolific scorer, Miller will look to take on the added responsibilities as one of Florida State's point guards as a junior and a senior / Miller's signature scoring event of his first two seasons came as he made an unbelievable, game-winning buzzer-beating shot with 0:08 seconds left in the Seminoles' 63-60 win at Virginia during his sophomore season / his made shot from the bonusphere allowed the Seminoles to take the wildly inconceivable win back to Tallahassee on the strength of a 16-2 game-ending run during which Miller not only scored the game-winning basket but scored nine points in leading the Seminoles to the win / averaged a career high 10.3 points per game as a sophomore and displayed his shooting touch as well as his ability to score the basketball as one of the Seminoles' best shooters / can play either guard position and scores points in bunches / compared by many to former Seminole All-American Toney Douglas because of his explosive scoring ability / is Florida State's second leading scorer entering the 2012-13 season after averaging a career-high 10.3 points per game as a sophomore to rank third on the team / he ranked third on the team with a single season career-high 34 3-point shots made including his buzzer-beating game-winner at Virginia / an exceedingly accurate shooter who enters his junior season ranked 20th in school history for a career with a .356 career 3-point field goal shooting percentage and is shooting .803 from the free throw line for his career during the first two years of his career / also a top-notch defensive player who ranked second on the team with a career-high 1.3 steals per game as efforts on the defensive end of the court have

ON SHANNON

Considered by Florida State's coaching staff to be the toughest player on the team who has begun to grow as a basketball player and whose best basketball is in his immediate future... was showing his extreme promise in the first seven games of the 2011-12 season when he was injured and forced to miss the remainder of the season because of a dislocated left shoulder suffered against UConn in the third round of the Battle4Atlants on Nov. 26...underwent surgery on January 4, 2012 and was granted a medical redshirt by the NCAA and the ACC in June of 2012...he has two years of eligibility remaining at the start of the 2012-13 season with an incredible amount of potential waiting to be tapped during the remainder of his Seminole career... has switched his jersey number from 15 (during the first three seasons of his career) to 2 for his redshirt junior season as he looks to get a fresh start after playing in only seven games after a left shoulder injury cut his 2011-12 season short... a spiritual and emotional leader for Florida State who is one of the Seminoles most excitable yet serious players...has started five games during his career (all during his sophomore season) including the Seminoles' victory over No. 1 Duke on Jan. 12, 2011 in helping the Seminoles to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1993 and for only the fourth time in school history... played in a career high 27 games as a sophomore in helping lead Florida State to a 23-11 overall record, an 11-5 record in ACC play, a third place finish in the ACC standings and an appearance in the school record tying third consecutive NCAA Tournament... Shannon has known nothing but winning during the first three years of his Florida State career... has played as a member of three NCAA Tournament teams, the Seminoles' 2011 team that advanced to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament, the Seminoles' 2012 ACC Championship team, three teams that have finished in the top three of the ACC standings, three teams that have won a total of 70 games and three teams

AS A JUNIOR (2012)

- Averaged 8.3 points (fourth), 4.4 rebounds (tied for second) and shot .543 from the field (second) despite playing in only seven games because of an injury suffered in the seventh game of the season
- Was granted a medical redshirt after playing in only the first seven games of the season. Was injured in the second half of the Seminoles' game against No. 4 UConn in the final game of the Battle4Atlantis on Paradise Island in the Bahamas (Nov. 26)
- Suffered a dislocated left shoulder at the 7:17 mark of the second half when UConn's Tyler Olander jumped on top of him as the two players dove back across the mid court line for a loose ball. Olander landed awkwardly on top of Shannon, and despite Shannon being called for the foul, he was the injured player who left the game and saw his season come to an end
- Had surgery on Jan. 4, 2012 to repair the injury and began rehabilitation during the spring semester

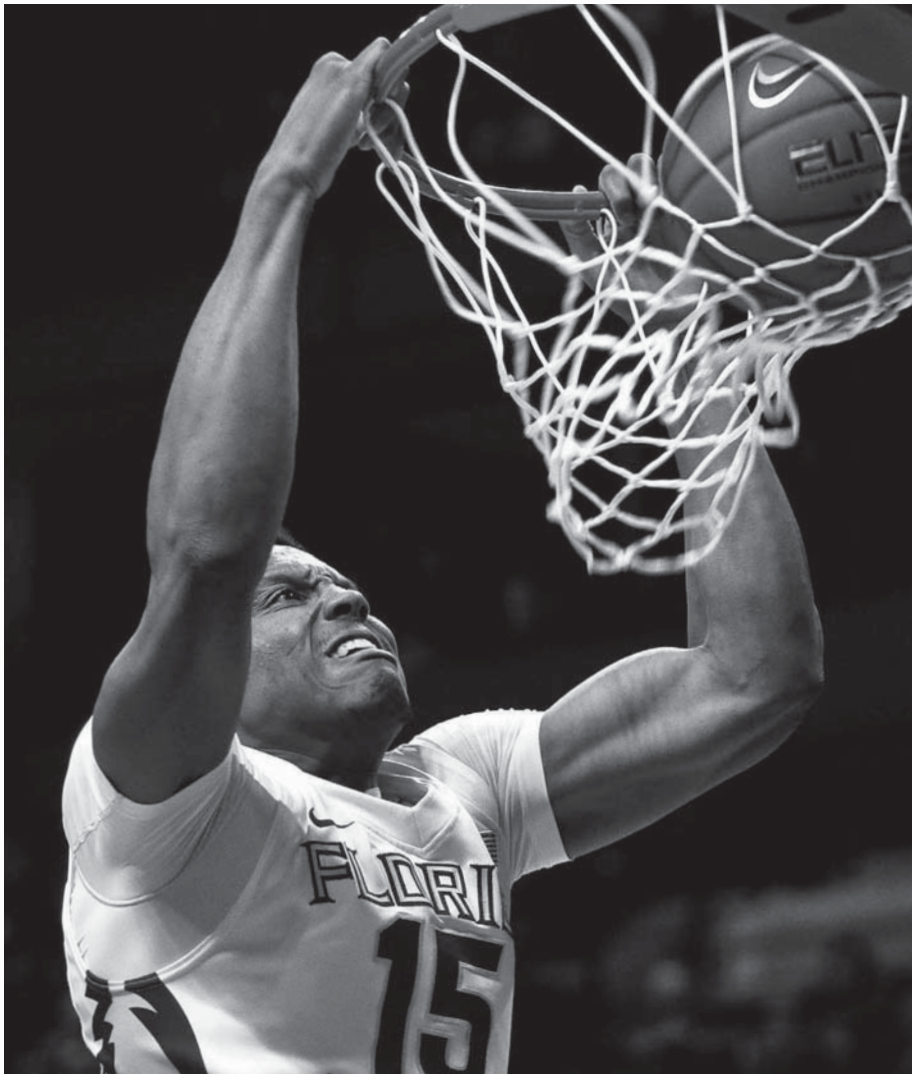

AS A SOPHOMORE (2011)

- Averaged 4.7 points (tied for eighth on the team) and 2.7 rebounds (tied for seventh) while playing in a career-high 27 games in 2010-11
- He started a career high five games (Duke, NC State, at Miami, Boston College and at Clemson) before a knee injury kept him out of the line-up for five games
- Shannon underwent successful arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on Feb. 4 following the Seminoles' game at Clemson and missed only five games before returning to the line-up on Feb. 19 at Wake Forest

RAFAEL PORTUONDO

AS A JUNIOR (2012)

- Averaged 1.0 point (12th on the team) and 0.0 rebounds (14th) as he played in five games including a career high three in ACC play
- As prepared and hard- working a member of the Seminoles roster as there is, he helped the Seminoles to its school record fourth consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the first ACC Championship in school history, a near school 25-10 overall record and a school record tying 12-4 record in ACC play
- In Portuondo's two seasons at Florida State, the Seminoles are 23-9 in ACC play (.718 winning percentage) – a mark that ties the best two year record in ACC play in school history
- The 1991-92 and 1992-93 Seminole teams were a combined 23-9 in ACC play
- Missed seven of the first nine games of the season after suffering from concussion like symptoms after a collision at midcourt with a UCF with one a Knight player during the Seminoles' 73-50 win in Tallahassee
- Established career high statistics for points scored (three vs. Wake Forest), 3-point field goals made (one vs. Wake Forest), 3-point field goal percentage (1.000 vs. Wake Forest), free throws made (two against UCF) and free throw percentage (1.000 vs. UCF) while tying his career highs for field goals made (one vs. Wake Forest), 3-point field goals attempted (one vs. Wake Forest) and free throws attempted (two vs. UCF) during his junior season
- One minute played in each of five games during the season: UCF (Nov. 14) and Auburn (Jan. 4) during the non-conference portion of the schedule and against No. 3 ranked North Carolina (Jan. 14), at Wake Forest (Jan. 25) and at NC State (Feb. 18)
- Scored the first two points of his junior season on two free throws against UCF with 23 seconds left in the game to put the Seminoles up 73-50...also earned one minute of playing time in the Seminoles' win over SEC for Auburn in Tallahassee (Jan. 4)
- Earned one minute of playing time against NCAA Tournament participant North Carolina in one of the two meetings between the Seminoles and the Tar Heels during the season
- Played the final minute of the game in the Seminoles' 90-57 win over the Tar Heels...was his first career appearance against a nationally ranked team
- The Seminoles 90-57 victory (+33 points) was the largest margin of victory by the Seminoles

over a ranked team in school history...(vs. Wake Forest): Scored his only field goal of the season in one minute of play in the Seminoles only game of the season against Wake Forest

- His field goal against the Demon Deacons was the first made 3-point shot of his career and gave the Seminoles a 75-52 lead with 23 seconds remaining in the game
- 3-point field goal was the first of his career and allowed him to set a career high for points scored in a game for his career
- His basket gave the Seminoles their largest lead of the game -- +25 points – en route to their 23 point victory over the Deacons
- His playing time against Wake Forest marked the third time in his career that he had earned playing time in an ACC game against the Deacons

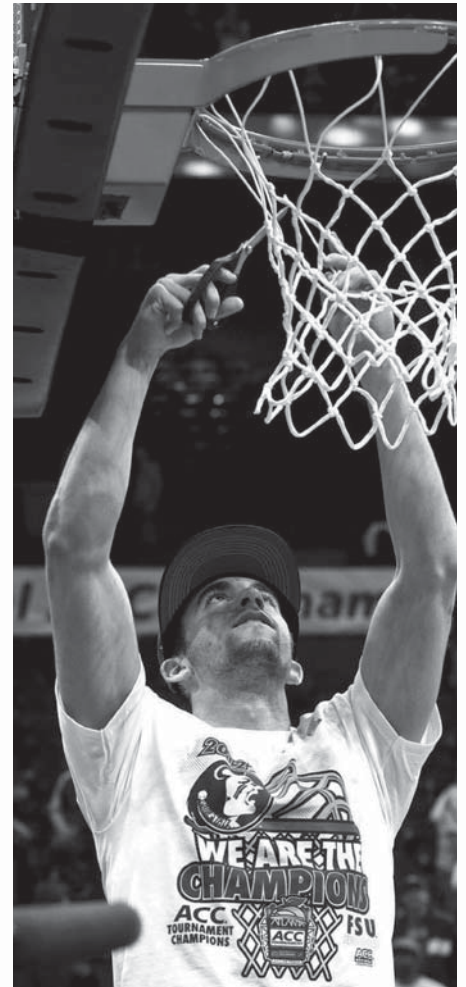
AS A SOPHOMORE (2011)

- Averaged 0.6 points (13th on the team) and 0.4 rebounds (14th) as he played in five games during the first season of his Seminole career
- Helped the Seminoles advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the 1993 season and for the fourth time in school history
- Played in three non-conference wins and in two ACC victories over Wake Forest
- Playing time came for the first time in his Seminole career in Florida State's victory over UNC Greensboro (Nov. 18)
- Earned one minute of playing time in the Seminoles' 97-73 win over the Spartans at the Greensboro Coliseum - the storied home of numerous ACC Tournaments

- His one minute of playing time against Wake Forest in Winston Salem stands as his first game played on the road in ACC play

- His career high of three minutes of playing time came in Florida State's 97-63 win over Stetson in Tallahassee (Dec. 15)
- (vs. Wake Forest): Averaged 0.5 points and 0.5 rebounds in two games against Wake Forest during the regular season
- Scored one point as he made one of two free throws in Florida State's win over Wake Forest at home (Feb. 1)
- He made one of two free throws against the Deacons with 24 seconds remaining in the game to give the Seminoles an 83-61 advantage..
