Kittleston among amateurs playing The Masters

be scheduled by Paul Thomas

One would think the pressure of being a college student and playing in The Masters Tournament would be immense.

Not for Florida State's Drew Kittleston. The way he sees it, when he tees off Thursday morning, he'll be playing with house money.

If he performs well this week at Augusta National, he has a chance to make a name for himself and steal some of the national spotlight. If he struggles, well? It's not like anyone's expecting you to do much anyway.

"No amateur has made the cut since 2005 in the Masters, so there's definitely that lingering failure," Kittleston said. "But you can't fail, because nobody expects you to do well."

Kittleston received an invitation to play in the 2009 Masters, as well as the 2009 U.S. Open, after finishing as the runner-up in the U.S. Amateur tournament last August.

"It's really a dream come true," Kittleston said. "It's something you work for as a golfer and it's the highest level, so it's something I'm really looking forward to."

Kittleston will be one of five amateurs in the field for the 2009 Masters, including New Zealand's Danny Lee, who defeated him in the U.S. Amateur tournament finale; United States Mid-Amateur champion Steve Wilson and British Amateur Champion Walter Sexton of England will also be in the field. As will U.S. Amateur Public Links champion Jack Newham (Michigan State), who is the only participant other than Kittleston currently playing college golf.

Kittleston could have an advantage over the other amateurs in terms of experience. With Augusta only a five-hour drive from Tallahassee, Kittleston has made the trip at least four times to practice. His best round was a 67 that he shot while playing with one of the course pros.

"It's been awesome. One weekend I was there, only seven people played all weekend," Kittleston said. "I really don't even know how to describe it. You're out there and you're all by yourself. I can bring somebody - they can't play, but they can walk, just hang out and eat and watch Lou Holtz and whoever is in the clubhouse. It's just awesome."

Though he will savor the experience, Kittleston is viewing this tournament very much like a business. He plans to block out the distractions, focus on his game, and do everything he can to earn a spot on the Sunday leader board.

"I don't think you should ever go to a tournament and be like, 'Oh, that's Tiger Woods,' and not be competitive the week. While other amateurs might be awestruck by playing with PGA Tour stars and distracted by massive galleries, Jones thinks Kittleston will do a good job of keeping his emotions in check.

"I was nervous when I just went to the Masters [as a fan]," Jones said. "How he'll sleep on Wednesday night, I don't know. I hope he has a late tee time on Thursday so he can rest some sleep."

Seminole Golfers Named All-American

Kittleston and Koepka earn All-American honors.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Florida State University golfers Brooks Koepka and Drew Kittleston, who helped lead the Seminoles golf team to a third place finish in the NCAA Championship last May, have been named to the 2010 All-American team announced by the Golf Coaches Association of America. It marks the first time both Kittleston and Koepka have been honored as All-Americans in their careers.

Koepka earned All-American Third Team honors while Kittleston earned All-American honorable mention honors.

Koepka (Wellington, Fla.) helped lead the Seminoles to a No. 6 national ranking by FSU while in his sophomore year and was named to the ACC Player of the Year, an honor shared with Virginia's Carter. Koepka is the second player in school history to receive ACC Player of the Year during his season. Koepka, a sophomore, finished the season ranked fourth overall in the ACC with a career-low 71.91 stroke average after ranking both in the ACC with a 72.50 stroke average during his first college season.

Kittleston (Scottsdale, Ariz.) led the Seminoles as he finished in a tie for sixth place in the stroke play portion of the 2010 NCAA Championship at The Harbor Course in Chaffeeport, Tenn. In 2009 Kittleston won honors of playing in the 2009 Masters and U.S. Open. Kittleston contributed to the team's success at the U.S. Amateur Championship. With a sixth overall finish at the NCAA Championship, Kittleston contributed to the team's success at the U.S. Amateur Championship.

Kittleston's career earned several honors at the Inaugural Golfweek Challenge in the fall of 2009 and then became the first player in school history to win individual championship honors at the NCAA Central Region in the spring of 2010.

"It couldn't be happier for both Brooks and Drew because I know how hard they both worked this season," said head coach Trey Jones. "The dedication they showed to making themselves as players showed the amount of hard work that's become an All-American caliber player. That's what makes me proud of - the ability to lead our team by example."

Seminole Golfers Play Well at US Am

Kittleston and Koepka now ready themselves for fall season.

CHAMBERS BAY, Wash. - Florida State University golfer Drew Kittleston was among the top 25 finishers during stroke play and fared well during the first round of match play despite falling in 19 holes to Brent Martin at the 2010 US Amateur Championship earlier this week. Kittleston finished in a tie for 24th place during stroke play with a two round total of 145 (71-74) to advance to match play, while his Seminole teammate Brooks Koepka shot a 152 during stroke play and did not advance into match play.

Kittleston was playing in his fourth career US Amateur while Koepka had earned the honor of playing in his first career national championship tournament.

Kittleston, a senior, fell in the first round of match play to Martin, 1 up. Kittleston was one of 64 golfers to qualify through stroke play for the Championship in his fourth appearance. Kittleston came from behind to tie the match in the 17th and 18th holes, only to leave a 10-footer short to end the match, giving Martin the win.

Kittleston has had eight career top ten finishes and seven additional top 20 finishes in his first three seasons. An All American Candidate and team captain, Kittleston will continue to lead the No. 6 Seminoles in his final season with hopes of returning to the NCAA Championship Finals.

Kittleston, Koepka and the Seminoles will start off their season at the Olympia Fields Invitational Sept. 17, 2010 in Olympia Field, Ill.

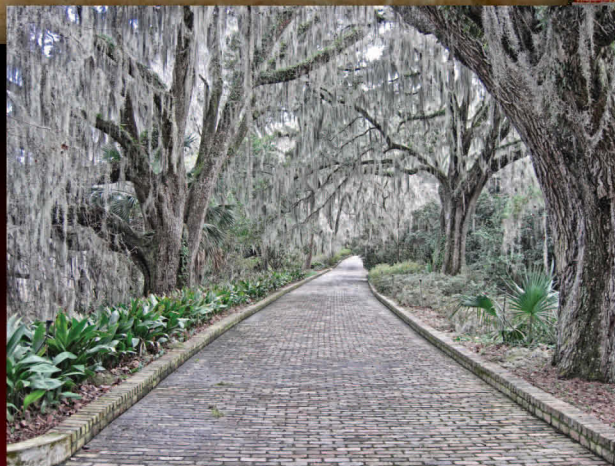

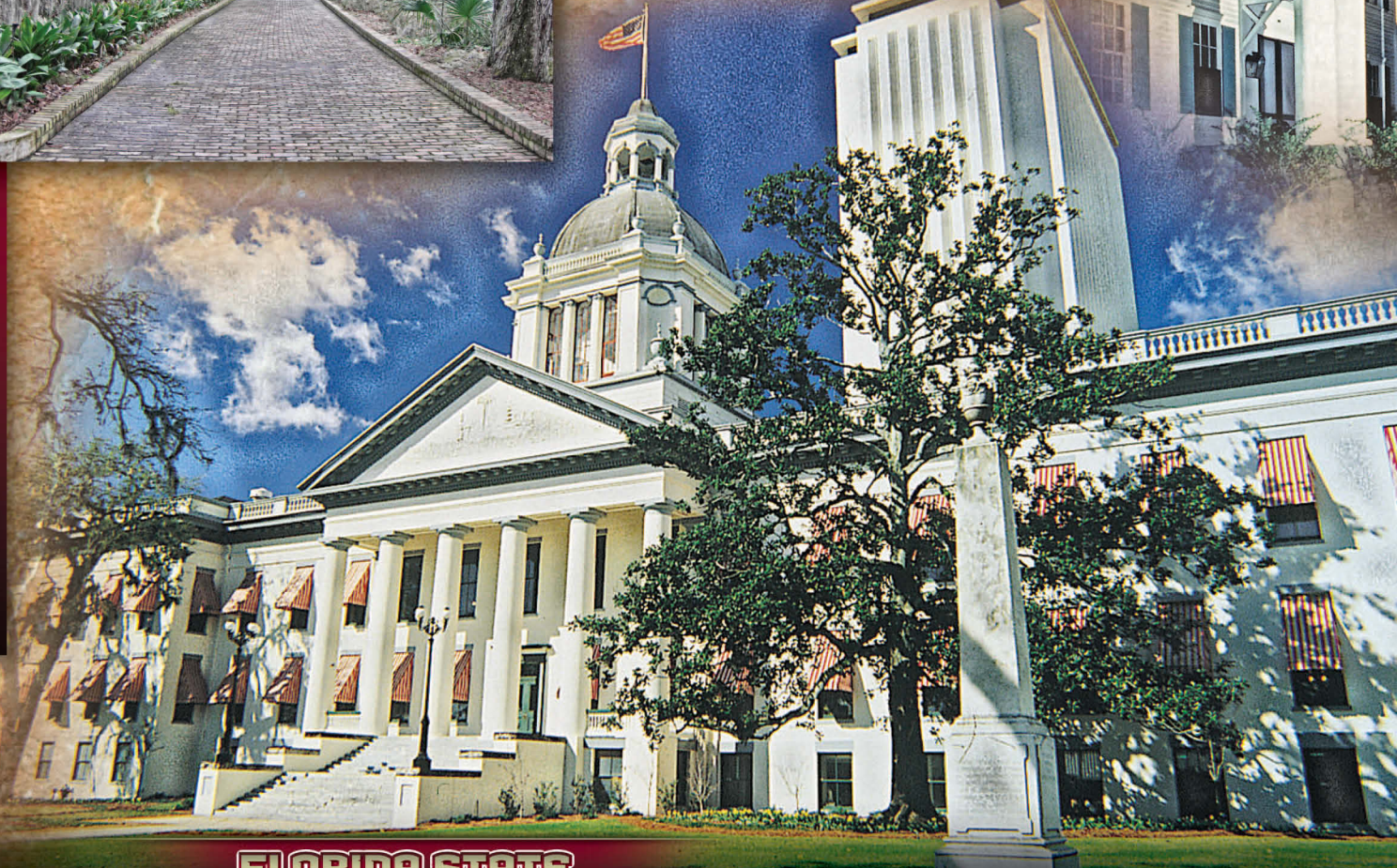

DON VELLER SEMINOLE GOLF COURSE AND CLUB

The par 73, 18-hole championship golf course recently underwent a 1.4 Million-Dollar renovation and reopened September of 2004. The spectacular changes modernized the course with 18 brand new USGA greens featuring the state of the art ultradwarf turf called TiffEagle. The architect for the project was Robert C. Walker of Atlantic Beach, FL. Mr. Walker was the former lead architect for Arnold Palmer Golf Design.



KILLEARN COUNTRY CLUB AND INN

The site of 21 PGA Tour and four LPGA Tour tournaments, Killearn Country Club's three nine-hole layouts offers a challenging yet fun golf experience. Killearn's three nine-hole courses are played in three eighteen hole combinations. These courses are home to several championship events each year and have hosted the PGA Classic and the Sprint Central.



GOLDEN EAGLE COUNTRY CLUB

Golden Eagle Country Club combines gracious Southern Living and championship golf for those who expect the best. Golden Eagle's foremost attraction is its 18-hole golf course, designed by world renowned golf course architect Tom Fazio. It was rated "the most challenging course in Florida" by the United States Golf Association just six months after opening in December 1986. Golfweek Magazine has ranked Golden Eagle among the top 50 real-estate development courses in the Southeast.



CAPITAL CITY COUNTRY CLUB

Capital City Country Club is the oldest and most prestigious private club in Tallahassee. The club is nestled among rolling hills and ancient oak trees. The rolling, tree-lined 6,502 yard 18-hole golf course is as challenging as it is breathtaking. Nine holes of the original design were carved out by famed golf course architect A.W. Tillinghast who designed such American classics as Winged Foot and Medinah.

SOUTHWOOD GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB

SouthWood Golf Club opened its 18-hole golf course in 2003 to the delight of golfers in Tallahassee. The well-planned course was immediately one of the premier golf facilities in the Florida Panhandle and one of the nation's heralded new golf courses. SouthWood was the only club in Florida to be ranked as one of "America's Best New Courses" by *Golf Digest*.

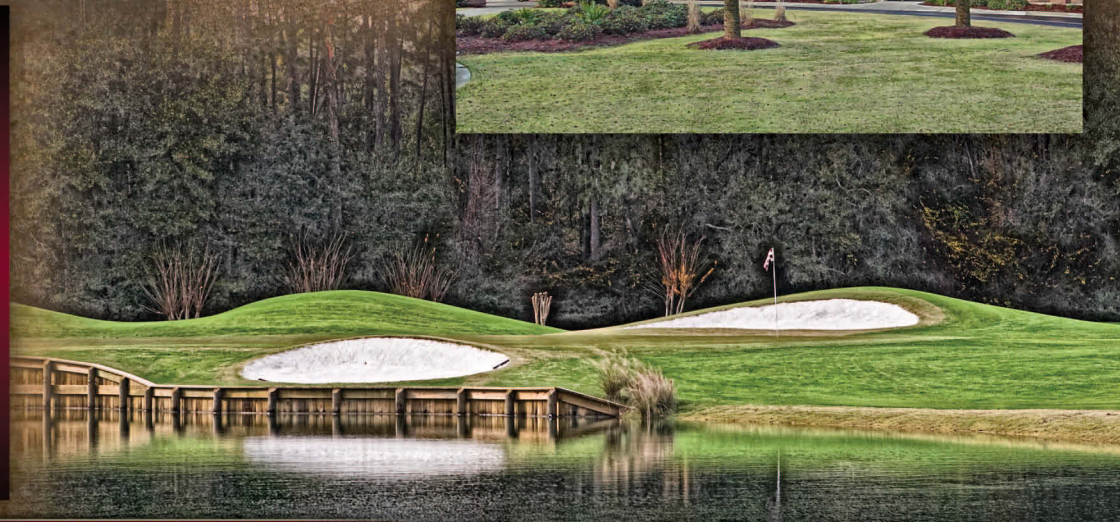
The Dave Middleton Golf Complex and the Don Veller Seminole Golf Course are home to the PGA Golf Management Program, which is one of only a few programs in the country that is accredited by the Professional Golfer's Association of America. A 27,000-square-foot clubhouse, the Dave Middleton Golf Complex boasts private technologically advanced Wi-Fi classrooms, study and teaching labs, an internship library, a fully equipped club repair room, a pro shop, locker rooms and the Renegade Grill. The \$7 million facility is a two-building complex, which also includes a multi-directional driving range, a video analysis instructional center with hitting bays for inclement weather, chipping and putting greens, as well as locker rooms, a team lounge, auditorium and a fitness facility.

The golf course was renovated in 2004 with the reconstruction of all 18 greens complexes, tee boxes and the state-of-the-art TiffEagle Turf was installed on all the putting surfaces. Each year the facility hosts over 60,000 rounds of golf. The golf course was recently recognized as one of the top 10 golf courses in the country by the National Golf Foundation for customer loyalty and satisfaction.

In 2010 Florida State men's golf concluded the season with a third place finish at the NCAA National Championship. This year, team leaders Drew Kittleson and Brooks Koepka have their sights set on taking the next step.

"Everyone wants to get back to the National Championship, this time instead of losing in the semifinals, we want to get to the finals and actually win it."

Coming off of the NCAA run this team made last year, the expectations are even higher for this year's team.

"The expectations are very high and that is good, that is what we want, that is who we fell like we are," said coach Jones. "Whether we live up to the expectations or not, I am more interested in how each player plays and if they continue to develop. If they do those things, the season will take care of its self."

The Seminoles are a well rounded team with nearly a full squad of postseason veterans like Kyle Cobb, Wesley Graham, and Doug Letson, who all will be fighting for a spot in the Seminole line-up. These veterans will be joined by in-coming freshmen Joaquin Lolas and Tyler Sluman.

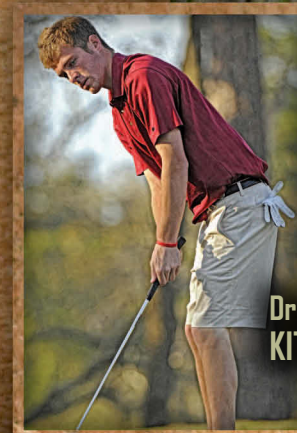

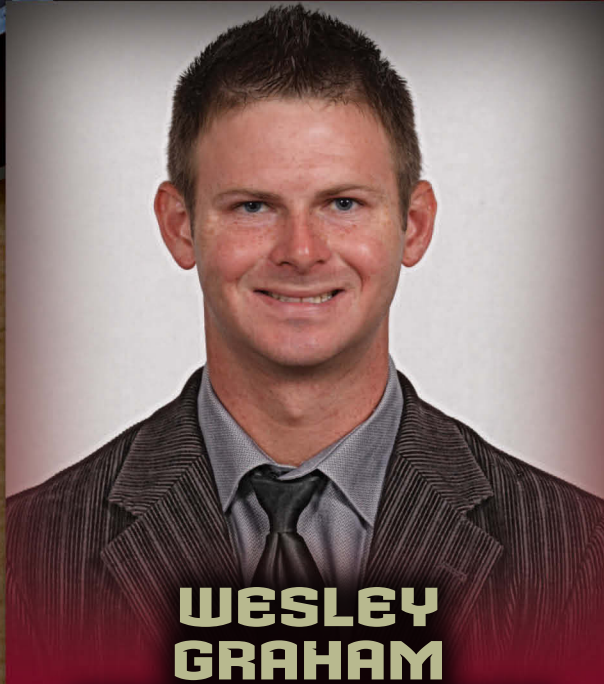

SEMINOLES FINISH IN 3RD PLACE AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

The Florida State men's golf team fell to Augusta State, 4-1, in the semifinals of the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championship at The Honors Course thus ending the Seminoles' run at the first national championship in the sport of men's golf in school history.

FLORIDA STATE RANKED SIXTH IN FINAL GOLFSTAT POLL

Florida State finished the 2009-10 season ranked No. 6 in the final GolfStat poll of the season. The GolfStat poll was released following the Seminoles' third place finish in the NCAA. The Seminoles' national ranking of No. 6 is the highest final ranking since head coach Trey Jones' arrival for the 2004 season.

KOEPKA AND KITTLESON EARN ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

Brooks Koepka and Drew Kittleson were named to the PING All-America team announced by the Golf Coaches Association of America. It marked the first time both golfers had been rewarded with All-American honors during their careers.

KOEPKA NAMED ACC GOLFER OF THE YEAR

Koepka was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year – an award which he shared with Virginia's Ben Kohles. Koepka was the first Seminole since Bobby Cochran in 1994 to be named the ACC Player of the Year.



KOEPKA AND LAUER NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAM

Koepka and Seath Lauer were named to the 2010 All-ACC Men's Golf Team. It marked the fourth consecutive season that two Florida State players have been named to the All-ACC Team. It also marked the first time Koepka and Lauer have earned All-ACC honors during their careers.

CALL KITTLESON MR. POSTSEASON

Junior Drew Kittleson enjoyed the best postseason of his career in the months of May and June as he finished in a tie for fifth at the Golden Ocala Invitational, won the individual honors at the NCAA Central Regional and finished in a tie for sixth at the NCAA Championship finals.

JONES NAMED MID-SEASON COACH OF THE YEAR

After a fall season that included two victories and three top-five finishes, Florida State men's golf coach Trey Jones was named Golf Digest's Mid-Season National Coach of the Year.

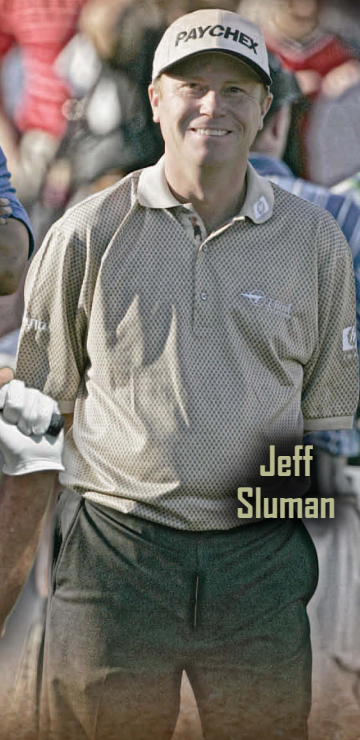

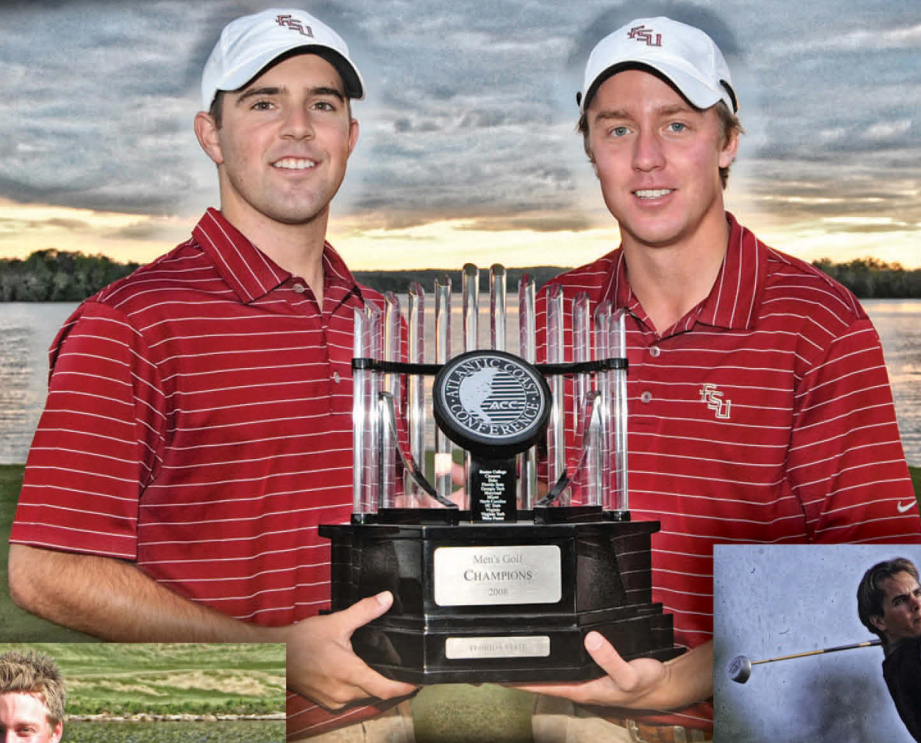

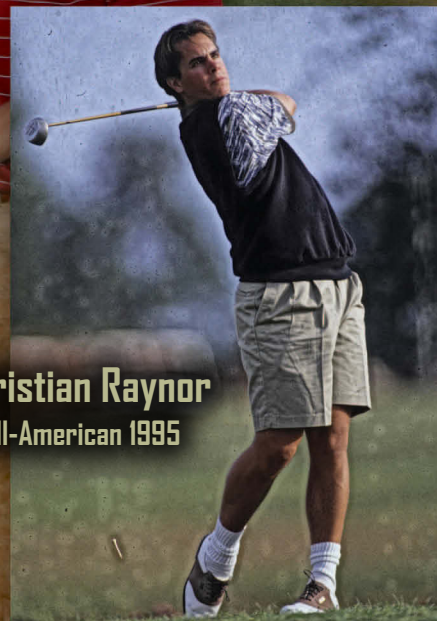

Bob Shave is one of the Florida State's winningest and most decorated golfers. He won the Florida State Amateur in 1961 and 1962, the Florida State Open in 1961 and 1962, and the Florida State Invitational in 1961 and 1962. He also won the Florida State Golf Association's Amateur in 1961 and 1962. He was a member of the Florida State Golf Association's Hall of Fame in 1988.

In 1968, Shave led the Florida State team to the National Championship and the team's first national title. He was named the Most Valuable Player of the team and the Most Outstanding Player of the tournament. He was also named the Most Outstanding Player of the Florida State Golf Association's Amateur in 1968.

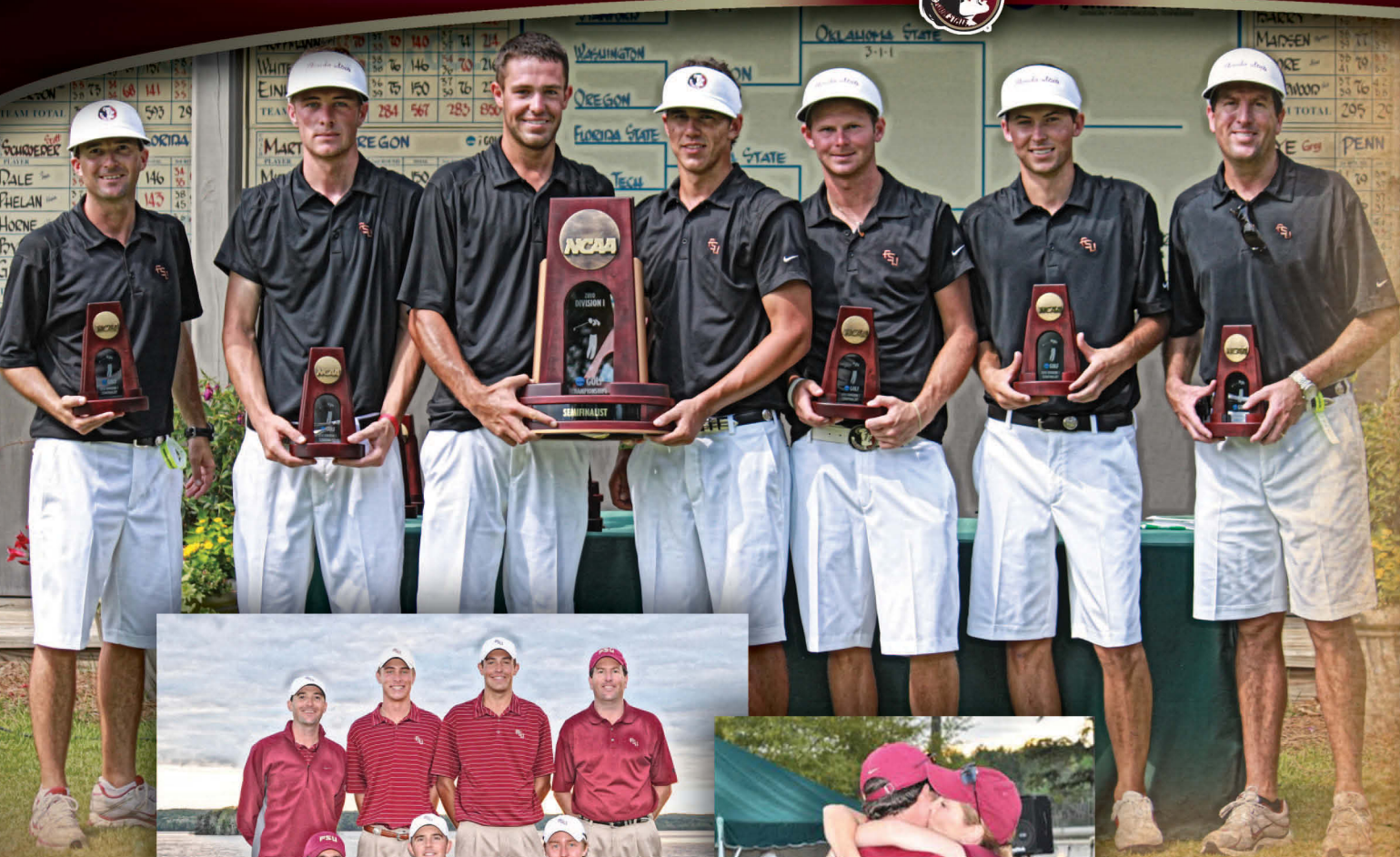

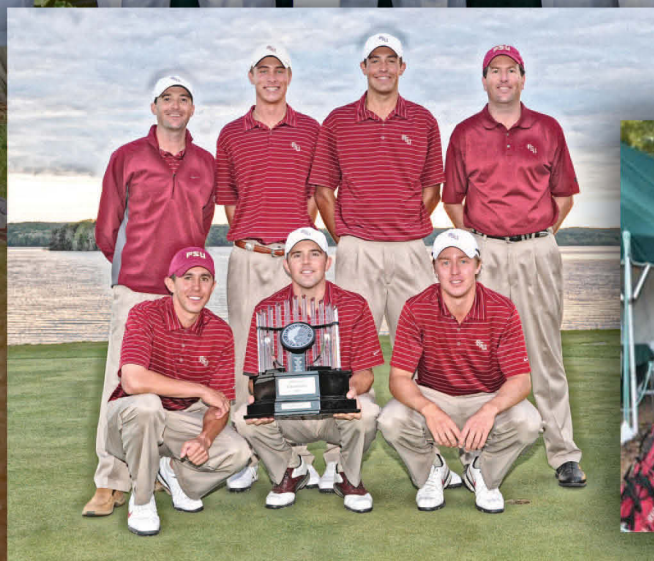
