# **QUICK KICKS**

- Florida State is ranked No. 1 in the National Soccer Coaches
   Association poll and ranked No. 2 by TopDrawerSoccer for the week
   of August 30. It marks the third consecutive week and 16th time
   overall that FSU has been ranked No. 1 by the NSCAA.
- The Seminoles have been ranked in the Top 5 of the NSCAA poll for 46 consecutive weeks and in the Top 25 for 149 straight weeks.
- FSU trails in the all-time series to the Gators, 10-13, including dropping each of the last two matchups in 2014 and 2015.
- Florida State is 59-1-2 in its last 62 home matches, dating back to 2011. The only loss during that span was to Florida on September 5, 2014 (2-1). The Noles are currently on a 24-match unbeaten streak at the Seminole Soccer Complex.
- The Seminoles are undefeated in their eight previous meetings against South Alabama. It marks the first time the Noles and Jags will meet in the regular season since 2009, though the schools have met in each of the last three NCAA Tournaments with Florida State posting identical 5-0 victories in each match.

# STRONG START

The Seminoles have opened the 2016 season with an undefeated 3-0-0 record, marking the fifth consecutive year that the Noles have not lost in their first three matches of the season.

Overall, the feat has been accomplished 13 times in program history, with the 2013 squad opening the year with a 14-0-3 record, going unbeaten in its first 17 matches.

# **NO GOALS FOR YOU!!**

The Florida State defense has stood strong so far in 2016, recording a shutout in all three matches and allowing opponents to record just 16 total shots and six shots on goal for the year.

It is just the third time in program history that the Noles have posted a shutout in each of their first three matches of the season, tying the mark set by the teams in 2009 and 2010.

# THREE'S COMPANY

Freshman forward Deyna Castellanos has three goals so far this season, scoring one each in the first three matches of 2016.

She matches Selin Kuralay (2005) as the only first-year players in program history to record a goal in each of their first three matches for the Garnet and Gold.

In all, scoring a goal in each of the first three games of the season has happened just four times, adding in Tiffany McCarty (2009) and Erin Grimsley (1997).

# **RARE HOME LOSSES**

The Noles bring a 24-match home unbeaten streak to Friday night's game against No. 5 Florida. It is so rare to lose at home that only five of the 24 players on the 2016 roster have ever lost a game at the Seminole Soccer Complex, a 2-1 defeat against Florida on September 5, 2014.

That is the only loss any active FSU player has surrendered at home as the next home loss occurred on October 13, 2011.

# PAIR OF ASSISTS

Sophomore Macayla Edwards has moved into the midfield this season after featuring primarily on the defensive backline during her 2015 freshman season.

She has made an impact in her new rol already, setting a career high with two assists at Vanderbilt on August 25, aiding the Noles to a 3-0 victory by finding scoring opportunities for Megan Connolly and Haylie Grant.

# **VERSUS THE SEC**

Playing against the Southeastern conference for the third time in four games to open the 2016 season, Florida State looks to continue its overall success against the SEC.

In their last 16 matches against SEC opponents, dating back to 2010, the Seminoles have posted a 14-2 record, including a 9-1 mark in home matches. However, Friday's opponent is the only school to defeat the Noles during that span as Florida earned a 2-1 victory in Tallahassee in 2014 and a 3-2 win in Gainesville in 2015.

# **ACC STANDINGS**

Playing just three games so far this season, Florida State enters the third weekend of 2016 in a tie for fourth place in the conference standings with a 3-0-0 record.

A total of five Noles are in the top 10 of the conference in 14 different statistical categories, including goalkeeper **Cassie Miller** tied for the ACC lead in goals against average and save percentage.

# **OPENING DAY RECORDS**

After a 1-0 win at Texas A&M on August 19, Florida State improved to 16-5-1 all-time on opening day, including a mark of 7-4-0 when opening the season away from Tallahassee.

The Noles are 11-1-0 on opening day under head coach **Mark Krikorian**, including a mark of 6-1-0 on the road.

FSU has won nine straight season openers, outscoring the opposition 23-3.

# **ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

After helping the Noles post a 1-0 shutout on the road at No. 8 Texas A&M on August 19, redshirt junior goalkeeper **Cassie Miller** was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on August 23.

It is the second time in her career that Miller had received the weekly honor from the conference, adding to the accolade she earned on October 13, 2015 after defeating No. 1 North Carolina, 1-0, and assisting on the game-winning goal by Berglind Thorvaldsdottir.

# TDS TEAM OF THE WEEK

Freshman forward **Deyna Castellanos** wasted no time making an impact for the Garnet and Gold, finding the back of the net on her first shot of the game, giving FSU a 1-0 lead in the second minute at No. 8 Texas A&M. The quick goal earned Castellanos a spot on TopDrawerSoccer's Team of the Week for August 23.

# **HOME SWEET HOME**

Florida State is 127-9-5 at home since 2005 when **Mark Krikorian** became head coach at Florida State.

The Noles are 59-1-2 in their last 62 matches played at home, dating back to 2011. FSU has 23 wins over ranked opponents over that time and the only loss during that span was a 2-1 defeat to Florida on September 5, 2014.

FSU has allowed just four goals at home over the last 1628:04 of game time – a goal in the 22' against No. 3 Texas A&M on September 4, 2015, an own goal versus No. 7 Clemson on September 24, 2015 and two goals against Boston College on Nov. 1, 2015.

# **ROAD SWEET ROAD**

The Seminoles are also impressive away from the friendly confines of the Seminole Soccer complex, posting a true road record of 18-3-5 since 2013, as well as a neutral site mark of 9-2-1.

FSU has lost just twice in its last 19 road games, a 3-2 defeat at No. 14 UF on August 30, 2015 and a 1-0 loss at No. 2 UVA on October 25, 2015.

# **DEFENDING ACC CHAMPS**

Florida State opened the 2016 season as the defending ACC champion for the fourth time in school history and the third year in a row. The Seminoles are the only school other than North Carolina to win back-to-back ACC titles.

The Noles earned their fourth conference title in 2015 and now own four of the eight ACC championships not earned by UNC.

# **HEAD COACH MARK KRIKORIAN**



2014 NSCAA National Coach of the Year 2005, '14 Soccer America Nat'l Coach of the Year 2005, '09, '12, '14 ACC Coach of the Year Eight-time Regional Coach of the Year

- Florida State head coach Mark Krikorian took over the Seminole women's soccer program in 2005 and has proven to the nation that FSU soccer will be a national title contender on an annual basis.
- In his first 10 seasons in Tallahassee, Krikorian has led FSU to a 2014 National Championshp, eight College Cup appearances, including a recent string of four straight trips (2011-14), three appearances in the national championship game (2007, 2013 and 2014) and three ACC titles (2011, 2013 & 2014).
- Under Krikorian, FSU is the only school in the nation that has ranked in the top 10 of the final NSCAA poll over the last 11 years.
- Krikorian recorded career college win No. 300 with a 1-0 win at Arkansas in 2012 becoming the 25th coach across all NCAA divisions to reach that milestone.

# **AUGUST SUCCESS**

The Seminoles continued their early season success with three games in the month of August during the 2016 season. FSU owns an all-time record of 40-7-1 and has won 33 of its last 35 matches played during the month of August. The Noles are 31-2-0 in August under head coach **Mark Krikorian** and have outscored their opponents 118-37 all-time in August with 26 shutouts.

# **MAC HERMANN TROPHY**

The Seminoles placed two student athletes on the preseason watch list for the 2016 MAC Hermann Trophy. Redshirt senior **Kirsten Crowley** and sophomore **Megan Connolly** were two of 36 players recognized on the preseason list.

Florida State is one of eight teams with multiple student-athletes on the Watch List, joining UConn, Duke, Florida, USC, Stanford, Virginia and West Virginia.

It is the 13th straight season that the Seminoles have had a student-athlete named to the preseason Watch List and FSU has had two players selected nine times in the last 11 seasons.

In 2007, **Mami Yamaguchi** won the MAC Hermann Trophy, the first and only player in school history to win the award. Yamaguchi led the country in points that season with 66, while finishing second in goals (24) and assists (18).

# PRESEASON NO. 1

Florida State entered the 2016 season as the No. 1 ranked team by the National Soccer Coaches Association. It marks the second time - and second straight season - that FSU had received a preseason No. 1 ranking and the 14th time overall that the Noles were No. 1 in the NSCAA poll.

In 2012, Florida State earned the program's first No. 1 ranking on August 28 after opening the season with a 2-0 record. The Noles held on to the No. 1 spot for eight consecutive weeks in 2012. FSU regained the No. 1 spot in the final poll of the 2014 season after winning the national championship and ranked as the top team four times during the 2015 season.

# **CHALLENGING SCHEDULE**

Florida State has assembled an impressive schedule as they look to compete for another national championship in 2016.

Eight of Florida State's 18 regular season opponents – including four conference foes – received votes in the 2016 NSCAA Preseason Top 25. The Noles will also face six teams in the top 15 and five of the top nine squads in the preseason poll.

The Noles open the season at No. 8 Texas A&M and will take on No. 7 Florida and No. 15 UConn in nonconference play. FSU will host ACC foes No. 4 Virginia and No. 3 Duke, while wrapping up the season at No. 9 North Carolina.

Boston College and South Alabama also received votes in the 2016 preseason poll.

# NATION'S BEST FRESHMEN IN '15

The Seminoles bring back an impressive sophomore class that shined as the top group of freshmen in the country in 2015.

The eight-member group of Megan Connolly, Elin Jensen, Natalia Kuikka, Kaycie Tillman, Dallas Dorosy, Olivia Bergau, Macayla Edwards and Holly Fritz tallied 89 of Florida State's 197 points last season and were four of the top six point producers on the team.

Among true freshman on teams that finished the 2015 season in the top 25, Florida State was far and away the nation's leader in production from freshmen.

Connolly was named the TopDrawerSoccer National Freshman of the Year and an NSCAA First Team All-American. She became the first Seminole to earn First Team All-America honors as a freshman.

# POSTSEASON RECORDS

Florida State set a pair of NCAA Tournament shutout records over the course of the 2014 and 2015 postseasons as the Noles earned their first national championship in 2014.

From the 2013 College Cup until the 2015 College Cup, FSU recorded 10 consecutive shutouts during postseason play. The streak ranks as the longest in the nation, breaking North Carolina's streak of eight games from 2003-04.
