STARTING 9: WHAT TO KNOW

- Last time out: After a perfect 4-0 week, No. 12 Florida State fell to No. 9 Florida, 4-1, in Jacksonville on Tuesday evening. Junior Rhett Aplin singled in Quincy Nieporte for FSU's only run, and the Seminole pitching staff did not allow a run after the first inning.
- Parrish shines at Notre Dame: Last Saturday, freshman Drew Parrish threw a complete game, three-hitter in Florida State's 5-1 win over Notre Dame. Only twice, in the 4th and 9th innings, did Parrish face more than one batter, and the Irish's lone run came on an error in the 4th inning. It was FSU's first complete game of the season.
- Noles record second seven-run comeback win: On March 21, FSU trailed Jacksonville 7-0 before having an at-bat, and slowly chipped away at the JU lead until freshman J.C. Flowers' walk-off, two-run single with two outs in the ninth inning. Against Oakland (3/3), FSU also trailed 7-0 before winning 18-10.
- Walls leads country in walks: After notching seven walks in the final two games at Notre Dame last week and one on Tuesday, junior Taylor Walls leads the country with 34 on the season. As a team, the Seminoles have been walked 171 times, 16 more than the next closest school, South Alabama.
- **Q among nation's leaders:** Senior first baseman/designated hitter Quincy Nieporte is fourth in the country with 36 RBI. He hit his third and fourth grand slams of the year at Virginia Tech, and he is now the single-season record holder for grand slams in a season at FSU. His four grand slams are the most in the country.
- **Holton among nation's best:** Two-time ACC Pitcher of the Week Tyler Holton is 4-0 with a 2.31 ERA in six starts this season. At Notre Dame last Friday, the sophomore from Tallahassee pitched 6.1 innings, allowing five runs, and FSU rallied to win in the 13th inning.
- **Noles on the basepaths:** Florida State opened the season a perfect 27-for-27 in stolen bases and is currently 30-34 on the year. The Seminoles had the most stolen bases without being caught in the country. Freshman Nick Derr and junior Dylan Busby are both a perfect 5-for-5 on the year.
- **Martin active leader in wins:** Head coach Mike Martin, now in his 38th year as head coach at Florida State, is the active wins leader with 1,916. He also is the all-time winningest coach by percentage, with a .738 mark. He needs iust 60 wins to pass Augie Garrido's all-time wins record (1,975).
- **1.D. Drew jersey to be retired:** On Monday, Florida State announced that former outfielder J.D. Drew (1995-97) will have his No. 39 jersey retired prior to the game against Clemson on Saturday, April 15. One of the most decorated players in college baseball history, he remains the only player with a 30 HR/30 stolen base season.

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.738)

11 GETS WIN NO. 1.900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 34 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,599 as head coach (1980-present).
- » Here is a look at the other milestone wins of Martin's illustrious career:

AGAINST THE TAR HEELS

- » No. 8 North Carolina is the first ranked team that FSU will host this season. All three of FSU's previous games against ranked teams have come on the road or neutral sites.
- » The Seminoles won the last meeting between the teams in 2015, when they met in the ACC Tournament. FSU's 8-4 win in Durham was the second of four straight, culminating in the ACC Championship.
- » North Carolina has won each of the first three ACC series this season, posting 2-0 records against Virginia, Georgia Tech, and Miami.
- » Under head coach Mike Martin, Florida State is 53-25 against the Tar Heels.

- » FSU head coach Mike Martin is the winningest active coach in Division I baseball, with 1,916 wins in 38 years.
- » North Carolina head coach Mike Fox ranks fourth on the active wins list with 1,355 wins in 34 seasons.
- » Martin (1st .738) and Fox (2nd .732) are the active leaders in career win percentage. All 38 of Martin's seasons have come at Florida State, while Fox was at North Carolina Wesleyan (1983-94; 96-98) before joining the Tar Heels in 1999.
- » Against each other, Martin leads Fox, 32-19.
- » In Tallahassee, Martin is 16-5 against Fox-led Tar Heel teams.
- » In the ACC Tournament, Florida State holds a 10-1 all-time advantage, and a 7-1 record against Mike Fox.

- Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America.
- » The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State in 2016 and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
