ON WHITE

Next in line to be one of the truly great players in the Atlantic Coast Conference...has displayed his dominating abilities on both the offensive and defensive ends of the basketball court during the first three seasons of his career...one of the nation's most athletic players who has polished his game and who will need to show the shine he has developed during his senior season for the Seminoles' to earn a return trip to the NCAA Tournament...has the strength, size, speed, quickness and ability to play as a power forward and has the athleticism and shooting ability to play as a wing forward while having the necessary basketball acumen to switch back and forth between those positions during each game and during each play...started 12 games during the 2011-12 season in helping lead Florida State to the first ACC Championship in school history...the Seminoles finished in third place in the ACC standings with a 12-4 record and were 3-0 in ACC Tournament play for a school record 15 wins over ACC competition during his sophomore season...has been a member of three postseason tournament teams during the first three seasons of his career - the NCAA Tournament in 2011 and 2012 and the NIT in 2013...the Seminoles advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament during his freshman season with wins over No. 20 Texas A&M and No. 5 Notre Dame... the Seminoles are 4-2 in NCAA Tournament play and 4-2 in ACC Tournament play with wins over two ranked teams (No. 4 North Carolina and No. 6 Duke) during the first three years of White's career in garnet and gold... ranked 23rd in the ACC in scoring with a career-high 12.4 points per game scoring average as a junior...has played in every game of his career at Florida State (103 consecutive games) and enters his senior season well within reach of establishing a new school record for games played...the current school record for career games played is 136 by Luke Loucks (2009-12)...averaged 13.8 points and 4.8 rebounds in being named to the All-Tournament team in helping lead Florida State to the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic

WHITE'S RECORD WATCH

Okaro White enters his senior season with 912 career points and needs only 88 points to become only the 43rd player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points.

Okaro White enters his senior season ranked sixth in school history with a .799 career free throw shooting percentage. He is looking to become one of only six players in school history to have a free throw shooting percentage of 80 percent or better for his career.

Okaro White enters his senior season ranked 19th in school history with 267 career free throws made. He needs only 33 made free throws to become the 14th player in school history with 300 or more career free throws made.

Okaro White enters his senior season ranked 21st in school history with 67 career blocked shots. He needs only 33 blocked shots to become the 13th player in school history with 100 or more blocked shots and needs only 18 to move into the Seminoles' top 15 for career blocked shots.

AS A JUNIOR (2013)

- Averaged a career-high 12.4 points (second on the team), a career-high 5.9 rebounds (first), a career-high 1.1 blocked shots (second), a career-high 1.0 steals per game (second) and made a career-high 32 3-point field goals (tied for second) while ranking as the only Seminole to start all 34 games during the 2012-13 season
- Earned career high statistics for games started (34), minutes played (983), average minutes played per game (28.9), field goals made (138), field goals attempted (270), field goal percentage (.511), 3-point field goals made (25), 3-point field goals attempted (80), free throws made (119), free throws attempted (146), offensive rebounds (74), defensive rebounds (127), total rebounds (201), average rebounds per game (5.9), assists (27), blocked shots (38), steals (33), points scored (420) and average points scored per game (12.4)
- Scored a single-season career-high 420 points as a junior and enters his senior season with 912 points - he is looking to become only the 43rd player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points
- Scored in double figures in a career-high 24 games including a career-high 12 times in 18 games during the regular season ACC series
- Totaled his career high of 24 points to lead Florida State over Clemson in the first round of the ACC Tournament
- His 24 points against Clemson in the ACC Tournament was tied for the second best scoring effort of the season behind Michael Snaer's 30 points against Charlotte (Dec. 22) and tied with Snaer's 24 points against Louisiana Tech (March 19)
- Shot the ball at an exceedingly high rate from all over the court as a junior: a career high .511 from the field, .313 from the 3-point line and .815 from the free throw line
- Led the Seminoles in free throws (119) and free throws attempted (146) while ranking as one of four players to shoot .800 percent or better from the free throw line
- Enters his senior season ranked sixth in school history with a .799 career free throw shooting percentage
- Led the team for a single game in both free throws made with 12 and attempted 13 against Louisiana Monroe (Dec. 17) in Tallahassee
- Tied the school record for free throw perfection in a game with a 10 of 10 performance at Maryland (Jan. 9)

2013-14 MEN'S BASKETBALL

AS A SOPHOMORE (2012)

- Averaged 7.7 points (fifth on the team), 3.3 rebounds (sixth), 0.6 steals (seventh) and 0.4 blocked shots (fifth) while starting 12 of the Seminoles' 35 games and averaging 22.6 minutes played per game
- One of only six players on the team who averaged more than 20 minutes played per game as he helped lead Florida State to the first ACC Championship in school history and to the Seminoles' school record fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament
- He continued to shoot the basketball well from all over the floor as he shot .476 from the field (91 of 191) and .752 from the free throw line (76 of 101) to rank fourth on the team in field goal percentage shooting and fourth on the team in free throw shooting percentage
- Helped Florida State to a 25-10 overall record, a school record tying 12-4 mark in the ACC, a third place finish in the ACC standings and an ACC leading six wins over ranked teams during one of the top seasons in the history of the Florida State basketball program
- The Seminoles were ranked No. 10 in the final Associated Press poll and No. 15 in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll at the end of the 2011-12 season
- Florida State led the ACC with six wins over ranked teams during the season with two wins each coming against nationally ranked Duke (No. 4 and No. 6), North Carolina (No. 3 and No. 4) and Virginia (No. 18 and No. 24)
- Florida State's wins over Duke and North Carolina marked the first time in school history the Seminoles had defeated the Blue Devils and the Tar Heels more than once each in the same season
- Scored in double figures in a career high 10 different games including in a career high seven different ACC games
- Totaled his season high of 20 points on eight of 12 shooting (.750 percent) from the field including two made 3-point field goals in the Seminoles' 76-61 win over the Buccaneers (Dec. 5)
- A career high tying eight field goals made in the Seminoles' win over Charleston Southern
- Totaled 18 points in Florida State's win over Stetson (Nov. 16) and averaged 12.3 points in three consecutive games against Stetson (18 points on eight of 11 shooting from the field), South Alabama (eight points on three of four shooting from the free throw line) and UMass (11 points on seven of nine shooting from the free throw line)

AS A FRESHMAN (2011)

- Averaged 6.6 points (sixth on the team), 3.1 rebounds (fifth), 0.7 steals (sixth) and 0.4 blocked shots (tied for fourth) in leading the Seminoles in free throw shooting with career-high .828 shooting mark from the free throw line
- He was one of only five players on the team who played in all 34 games and was one of only seven players on the team who started at least 13 games
- He started the final 13 games of the season including the Seminoles' final nine ACC games of the season, Florida State's game against Virginia Tech in the ACC Tournament and all three of the Seminoles' games in the NCAA Tournament
- Moved into the starting line-up on Feb. 1 against Wake Forest and held his spot as a starter for the remaining 13 games of the season
- He helped the Seminoles to a 6-3 record in their final nine ACC games of the season and to two victories in the NCAA Tournament
- A defensive standout who helped Florida State continue its tradition as the nation's most feared defensive team
- Florida State finished as the best defense in the ACC for the second consecutive season as it led the league in three defensive statistical categories (field goal percentage defense, 3-point field goal percentage defense and blocked shots) and ranked second in four more important defensive statistical categories (scoring defense, steals, rebound margin and defensive rebounds)
- The Seminoles finished the 2010-11 season as the field goal percentage defense national statistical champion with a .363 mark - the second consecutive season they have led the nation in the most telling defensive statistic kept by the NCAA
- Florida State held its 34 opponents to a .363 combined shooting percentage from the field - a statistic that led the ACC and all of college basketball. The Seminoles are the first ACC team to lead the league statistics in field goal percentage defense in three consecutive seasons since Wake Forest during the 1995, 1996 and 1997 seasons
- Florida State was 8-5 with White as a starter and 15-6 when utilizing White's talents off the bench

SIGNATURE GAME

Okaro White played one of the great games of his career in totaling a near double-double of 20 points and nine rebounds to go along with six blocked shots in 31 minutes of play as Florida State rallied to win, 65-62, at Maryland. His six blocked shots tied the Seminoles' school record for blocked shots in a road ACC game...in pulling down nine rebounds, he tied his career high with six offensive rebounds. He was particularly spectacular with 15 consecutive Florida State points in a span of 6:15 to take the Seminoles from a one point deficit (43-42) to a six point advantage (57-51). Outscored the Terps, 15-8, to help Florida State win the game. One of his 10 rebounds came with one second remaining after Michael Snaer blocked a potential game-winning 3-point shot by Seth Allen. White was fouled on the rebound and made one of two free throws to ice the game and give Florida State its final margin of victory.

AT CLEARWATER

- Graduated from Clearwater High School in 2010
- Averaged 17.0 points, 9.4 rebounds, 2.1 blocked shots and 2.1 steals per game in leading Clearwater to conference and district championships as a senior
- Helped Clearwater advance to the state regional championship game
- Named the Pinellas County Player of the Year by the St. Petersburg Times as a senior...led Clearwater to a 24-7 record and a spot in the regional final during his senior season
- Missed the first five games of the season (all losses for his team) and returned to lead Clearwater to a 22-3 record over the course of the remainder of the season
- A double-double of 19 points and 17 rebounds in a victory over Lakewood in the PCAC Tournament championship game
- Another double-double of 22 points and 16 rebounds in a regular season win over Largo

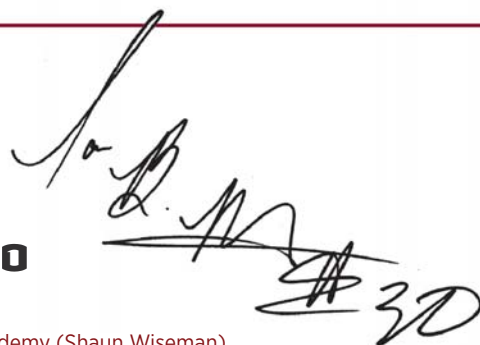

ON MILLER

One of the most reliable scorers and feared shooters in the ACC who will earn an increased role as a ball handler, a distributor and a scorer in his senior season as a Seminole...Florida State's second most experienced player with 75 career games played who has persevered and been successful throughout his career in helping lead the Seminoles to new heights as a basketball team...a member of two NCAA Tournament teams (2011 and 2012), the Seminoles' first ACC Championship team (2012) and one NIT team...one of the top 3-point shooting specialists in the ACC with 81 career 3-point shots made in 75 games for a 1.1 3-point shots made per game average...enters his senior season ranked 25th in school history with 81 3-point field goals made and needs only 19 made shots from the bonusphere to become only the 19th player in school history to reach 100 for his career...only 10 players in school history have made 125 or more 3-point field goals while playing for Florida State...a sensational shooter

who has the ability to score points in bunches and who has proven his ability to create offensively against the best players and best teams in college basketball...Miller's signature scoring event of his first two seasons came as he made an unbelievable, game-winning buzzer-beating shot with 0:8 seconds left in the Seminoles' 63-60 win at Virginia during his sophomore season...his made shot from the bonusphere allowed the Seminoles to take the wildly inconceivable win back to Tallahassee on the strength of a 16-2 game-ending run during which Miller not only scored the game-winning basket but scored nine points in leading the Seminoles to the win...can play either guard position and scores points in bunches...compared by many to former Seminole All-American Toney Douglas because of his explosive scoring ability...has played on two NCAA Tournament teams in his first two seasons at Florida State...helped the Seminoles advance to the Sweet 16 of the 2011 NCAA Tournament and to

the third round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament... the Seminoles played in a school record four consecutive NCAA Tournaments (2009-12) and in the NIT in 2013...helped the Seminoles to the championship of the Coaches' vs. Cancer Classic in 2012 with the final two games of the tournament being played at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. ...helped Florida State defeat four ranked teams during his freshman season including No. 1 ranked Duke (66-61, Jan. 12) for the fourth win in school history over the nation's No. 1 team... the Seminoles also earned victories over No. 5 ranked Notre Dame in the NCAA Tournament (71-57, March 20), No. 15 ranked Baylor (68-61, Dec. 25) and No. 20 ranked Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament (57-50, March 18)...the Seminoles earned two wins over nationally ranked Duke (No. 4 and No. 6 at the time of the games), North Carolina (No. 3 and No. 4 at the time of the games) and Virginia (No. 18 and No. 24 at the time of the games during the 2011-12 season)...

AS A JUNIOR (2013)

- Averaged 5.3 points (seventh on the team), 1.6 rebounds (ninth) and 1.9 assists (third) while making 23 3-point shots (fifth) and playing in 28 games and earning the first five starting assignments of his career (against South Alabama, Buffalo, BYU, Saint Joseph's and Minnesota)
- Was hampered by a foot injury that limited his practice time and forced him to miss six of the Seminoles' 34 games including four straight during the month of December (Maine, Louisiana Monroe, Charlotte and Tulsa) and the Seminoles' NIT game against Louisiana Tech
- Suffered a bone bruise on his right foot in a practice in late November and because of the Seminoles' game schedule he was never able to properly allow it to heal during the season

AS A FRESHMAN (2013)
