REVAMPED ROTATION HIGHLIGHTS SAMFORD SERIES

Florida State and Samford face off Friday through Sunday, with FSU holding an 18-1 all-time record against the Bulldogs. With the series first game played in 1985, head coach Mike Martin is also 18-1 against Samford. The Bulldogs won the third game of the series, in 1985, and FSU has won 16 consecutive, including the last two in the 2012 Tallahassee Regional by scores of 8-1 and 5-2. All games in the series have been played at Dick Howser Stadium.

Head coach Mike Martin announced Thursday that the weekend rotation and closer roles will be revamped heading into the Samford series. Drew Carlton will become the team's new closer, while freshman Drew Parrish will take over his vacated role in the starting rotation. Sophomores Cole Sands and Tyler Holton round out the Seminole starters.

Last time out: Florida State held a 2-0 lead for much of the game, but USF scored four runs on one hit in the ninth inning to escape Tallahassee with a 4-2 victory. Starting pitcher Andrew Karp was masterful in his third career start, throwing 90 pitches over seven innings while allowing just three hits and no runs. His nine strikeouts matched the most for a Seminole in 2016.

Florida State's starting pitching was masterful opening weekend. All told, Drew Carlton, Cole Sands, and Tyler Holton combined to go 2-1 in 17.1 innings pitched, allowing 16 hits and six runs (three earned runs) while striking out 14 and walking just three (1.56 ERA). Sands finished one out shy of tying his career high of six innings pitched, while Holton was one K away from matching his high of nine.

In Saturday's game against VCU, freshman **Tyler Daughtry** registered four walks against the Rams, just one shy of the school record of five, done three times, most recently by Stephen Drew against Siena in 2003...Martin is the winningest-active coach and has the highest winning percentage among active coaches with at least five years experience.

- » On Sunday, Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 39 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,577 as head coach (1980-present).

GAME NOTES vs. SU

AGAINST THE BULLDOGS

- » Florida State and Samford played annually from 1985-89, with FSU winning 16 of 17 games.
- » The last two games in the series, in 2012, were played in the Tallahassee Regional, with FSU winning 8-1 and 5-2.
- » All-time, FSU leads the series against Samford 18-1. All 19 of the games have been played at Dick Howser Stadium.
- » FSU's most runs in a game was 20 and has scored in double digits 10 times.
- » Samford's lone win in the series was the third game of 1985, a 5-2 Bulldog win. Samford has scored more than five runs just three times against the Noles: in the series first two games (L, 14-7 and 18-10) and a 9-6 FSU win in 1986.
- » Florida State beat Samford 8-1 to advance to the 2012 Regional Championship, and beat the Bulldogs again 5-2 in the championship game. FSU went on to reach the College World Series that season.

AGAINST THE SOCON

- » Samford is the only Southern Conference program FSU will face in 2017, but the Seminoles have quite a history with teams in the league.
- » FSU has faced 8 of the 9 teams in the league and hold a 127-12 all-time record against current membership.

GAME NOTES

PITCHING SHINES TO BEGIN YEAR

- » Florida State pitching was stellar during the opening weekend, allowing just six earned runs and striking out 23 while walking an ACC-low five batters.
- » Starting pitchers Drew Carlton, Cole Sands and Tyler Holton allowed just three earned runs in 17.1 innings (1.56 ERA).
- » Sands (5.2 IP, O ER) finished just one out shy of tying his career high of 6.0 innings pitched.
- » On Sunday, Holton threw 6.0 innings and struck out eight Rams, one shy of his career high of nine from last season.
- » Drew Carlton, a hard luck loser in Friday's season opener, allowed just two earned runs in 5.2 innings. He struck out four and walked zero. It was the second consecutive game Carlton has not walked a batter after last season's 3-0 win in the Super Regionals at Florida.
- » In that game against Florida last season, Carlton threw a complete-game shutout, FSU's first shutout in 15 appearances in the Super Regionals.
- Andrew Karp, the Noles midweek starter, allowed no runs and struck out nine against USF (2/21). It was the most strikeouts for Karp in his career and the longest outing (7.0).

NEWCOMERS IMPRESS

- » Seven Seminoles made the first appearances of their careers in the opening series against VCU.
- Five players Nick Derr (LF), Rhett Aplin (LF), J.C. Flowers (CF), Kyle Cavanaugh (DH) and Tyler Daughtry (DH) made the first starts of their career.
- » Freshman pitcher Drew Parrish and pinch hitter Ryan Mejia appeared as well. A breakdown of each newcomers opening weekend is below:

VETERAN BULLPEN

» With a bevy of newcomers getting a chance to play in the opening weekend against

- VCU, only one of the 11 pitchers was new (Drew Parrish).
- » All four fourth-year players in the bullpen (Will Zirzow, Alec Byrd, Jim and Ed Voyles) saw action against VCU, and Byrd was the only pitcher on the staff to play in more than one game.
- » For the opening weekend, the bullpen allowed just three runs in 9.2 innings of work, giving up seven hits while turning in a 9/2 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- » Beginning this weekend against Samford, junior Drew Carlton will take over the closer role. Parrish will take his place in the weekend rotation.

WALLS NAMED 2016 ALL-AMERICAN

- » Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America.
- » The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
- » Walls also earned thid team marks from NCBWA and D1Baseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.
- » Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.
- » To begin 2017, Walls has a .333 average with three of his four hits going for doubles. He leads FSU with 5 runs scored, 6 RBI and 6 walks. His .556 on-base percentage ranks 10th in the ACC through the opening week.

NOLES SPREAD OUT TO PLAY SUMMER BALL

Thirteen current Seminoles played summer ball throughout the country this season, including shortstop Taylor Walls and pitcher Cole Sands on the Team USA Collegiate National Team.
