QUICK KICKS

- Florida State is a No. 1 seed in the 2015 NCAA Women's Soccer Championship and is ranked No. 2 in the country by the NSCAA.
- It is the sixth time - and fifth in a row - that the Seminoles have earned a No. 1 seed for the NCAA Tournament.
- The Noles have reached the College Cup for the fifth consecutive season and the ninth time overall. The nine appearances since 2003 are the most in the country.
- The Seminoles have been ranked in the Top 5 of the NSCAA poll for 42 consecutive weeks and in the Top 25 for 145 straight weeks.
- The Noles are 53-13-2 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, including a 39-1-0 mark at home at the Seminole Soccer Complex.
- Florida State has recorded 15 shutouts this season and a pair of consecutive scoreless streaks of over 400 minutes - 503:39 (from September 4 to October 17) and 472:40 (from September 4 to 24).
- The Seminoles have not allowed a goal in their last 10 NCAA Tournament games, earning a clean sheet in every game of the 2014 postseason as well as the first four of 2015. The 10 shutouts and the postseason scoreless streak of 900:00 are NCAA records, surpassing the marks from North Carolina in 2003-04 (eight SHO and 829:31).
- Freshman Megan Connolly was selected as one of 15 semifinalists for the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy, given to the top player in collegiate soccer.
- FSU is one of 12 schools, and one of eight programs on an active streak, to make the NCAA postseason 16 times - led by North Carolina's 34 straight, dating back to 1982. The Noles have made the tournament every season since 2000.

NCAA SUCCESS

Florida State sits at 53-13-2 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, good for a .794 winning percentage. It is the second-best postseason winning percentage of all time (trailing only North Carolina).

Making their 16th straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015, FSU's 53 wins are the fourth most in NCAA history. Only North Carolina has averaged more wins per NCAA Tournament trip than FSU.

NATIONAL SEED

For the 11th straight season and 12th time overall, Florida State received a national seed in the NCAA Tournament. After claiming their fourth ACC championship in five years, the Seminoles were recognized as one of four No. 1 national seeds for the fifth year in a row and sixth time overall (2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015).

Florida State has been a No. 2 seed four times (2005, 2006, 2008 & 2010), while entering the NCAA Tournament as a No. 3 seed in 2007. The only other time the Seminoles received a national seed was in 2003 and in that year the team was seeded 11th. The Seminoles are 26-4-0 all-time in the NCAA Tournament as a No. 1 seed.

SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE

Since 2000, the Seminoles have now made 16 straight NCAA Tournament appearances, played in 14 'Sweet 16s' and have advanced to the quarterfinal round 11 years in a row - the longest active streak in the nation.

All three appearances in the national title game (2007, 2013 and 2014) have come under head coach **Mark Krikorian**.

FSU has registered at least two or more wins in 14 of its 16 postseason appearances including at least three wins in 11 straight seasons - all since head coach **Mark Krikorian** arrived on campus.

The only time FSU did not secure at least two wins in the NCAA Tournament was in 2001 (1-1) and 2004 (0-0-1). The Seminoles have reached at least four wins in the postseason seven times.

TEN IN A ROW!

Florida State has currently won 10 consecutive NCAA tournament games, including every game of the 2014 and 2015 postseason.

The 10-game winning streak is tied with Stanford (2011-12) for the longest since 2010 and sits in a tie for seventh all-time in NCAA history.

North Carolina owns seven of the top 11 streaks in NCAA history, including a stretch of 29 straight NCAA tournament wins from 1986-1995.

NINE COLLEGE CUPS

FSU has reached the NCAA Women's College Cup for the ninth time in school history and the fifth time in a row. The Noles have been among the final four teams to play for a national championship eight times in the 11 seasons under head coach **Mark Krikorian**.

The nine semifinal appearances is tied with UCLA for the fourth-most in NCAA history, trailing North Carolina (26), Notre Dame (12) and Santa Clara (10).

The five straight trips ranks in a tie for third on the all-time NCAA lists.

ATTACKING FROM ALL ANGLES

The Seminole offense was active from all over the field in FSU's 5-0 victory over Texas A&M in the NCAA Quarterfinals on November 27.

In all, 10 different Florida State players registered a goal or an assist, including eight starters and two reserves.

Freshman **Elin Jensen** led all scorers with two goals off the bench and classmate **Kaycie Tillman** matched an FSU record with three assists in the game.

Cheyne Williams added a goal and an assist, while the remaining goals were scored by **Megan Connolly** and **Michaela Hahn**.

Five players registered one assist each on the afternoon to help send FSU back to the College Cup - **Natalia Kuikka, Emma Koivisto, Isabella Schmid, Berglind Thorvaldsdottir** and **Megan Campbell**.

NO CHANCE

FSU goalkeepers, Cassie Miller and Caroline Brockmeier, have kept each opponent in the 2015 NCAA postseason scoreless, but they have only had to combine for three saves in 360:00 of match time as teams have struggled to find shots or put balls on frame.

Each of the first three opponents this postseason - Evansville, South Alabama and Auburn - finished the match with just one shot on goal, while zero of Texas A&M's three shots were on target.

CONSECUTIVE APPEARANCES

Florida State is one of 12 schools all-time at the Division I level to post a streak of 16 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. Eight of those schools are on active streaks, including four from the ACC.

AGAINST THE FIELD OF 64

The Seminoles played a total of 13 games against 11 schools that made the 2015 NCAA Women's Soccer Championship, including eight national seeds and seven schools from the ACC. FSU posted a record of 7-2-4 against those in the tournament with five wins over nationally-seeded teams.

VERSUS THE FINAL 32

Florida State has played 12 matches against 10 of the teams that reached the second weekend of the NCAA Tournament.

The Noles earned a record of 7-2-3 against the final 32 teams in the 2015 postseason, with five wins over nationally seeded teams.

AGAINST THE ELITE

The Noles are a combined 1-1-2 against the seven other schools that reached the NCAA quarterfinals in 2015. FSU defeated Texas A&M (3-1), drew with Duke (0-0), lost to Virginia (0-1) and earned the ACC Championship, 7-6 on PKs, after a 2-2 draw with Virginia.

NCAA SHUTOUT STREAK

Florida State has recorded a shutout in each of its last 10 NCAA tournament games, dating back to the 2013 College Cup. The streak ranks as the longest in the nation, breaking North Carolina's streak of eight games from 2003-04.

The Seminoles also own the NCAA record for consecutive scoreless minutes at 900:00, surpassing UNC's mark of 829:21.

FSU has not allowed a goal since an overtime goal to UCLA in the 2013 National Championship game.

WE MEET AGAIN

Florida State and Duke will face each other for the second time in 2015. The Noles and Blue Devils battled to a 0-0 draw after two overtimes on September 20 in Durham, N.C.

It marks the 16th time overall, and the second time in 2015, that the Noles will see a team in the NCAA Tournament that they faced in the regular season. FSU is 13-2-1 all-time in those games, and are unbeaten in such matchups under **Mark Krikorian**, posting a 9-0-1 record since 2005.

FSU VERSUS THE ACC

The Seminoles wrapped up the 2015 regular season with an all-time ACC record of 100-65-10.

Florida State is 79-20-14 in league play under head coach **Mark Krikorian** as more than three-quarters of FSU's all-time wins in the ACC have come with Krikorian at the helm. Under Krikorian, FSU is 48-5-4 against league opponents at home and 31-15-10 on the road.

FSU has finished no lower than second place (including ties) in the ACC 10 times (2005-10, 2012-15) over the last 11 years, claiming three regular season titles (2009, 2012 and 2014).

VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

Florida State is 7-2-3 against opponents ranked in the NSCAA this season, earning victories over No. 1 North Carolina (1-0), No. 3 Texas A&M (3-1), No. 7 Clemson (3-1), No. 8 North Carolina, at No. 16 Notre Dame (1-0), No. 19 Auburn (2-0) and No. 21 Texas A&M (5-0)

The Noles fell on the road at No. 14 Florida (3-2) and at No. 2 Virginia (1-0). FSU also earned a pair of 0-0 draws at No. 22 Duke and No. 7 Virginia Tech, and triumphed over No. 1 Virginia 7-6 in penalty kicks after the game ended with a 2-2 draw.

The Seminoles have played 14 total matches against teams ranked by TopDrawerSoccer, with a combined record of 10-2-3, adding wins over No. 22 UCF (4-0), No. 23 USC (1-0) and No. 24 South Alabama (5-0).

Under **Coach Krikorian**, FSU has a combined record of 88-38-13 against opponents ranked by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America since 2005.

HOME SWEET HOME

Florida State is 127-9-5 at home since 2005 when **Mark Krikorian** became head coach at Florida State.

The Noles are 59-1-2 in their last 62 matches played at home, dating back to 2011. FSU has 23 wins over ranked opponents over that time and the only loss during that span was a 2-1 defeat to Florida on September 5, 2014.

FSU has allowed just four goals at home over the last 1628:04 of game time – a goal in the 22' against No. 3 Texas A&M on September 4, 2015, an own goal versus No. 7 Clemson on September 24, 2015 and two goals against Boston College on Nov. 1.

ROAD SWEET ROAD

The Seminoles are also impressive away from the friendly confines of the Seminole Soccer complex, posting a true road record of 15-3-5 since 2013, as well as a neutral site mark of 9-1-1.

Florida State has four shutouts on the road this year - 0-0 at Virginia Tech, 1-0 at Notre Dame, 0-0 at Duke and 6-0 at UNC Greensboro.

FSU has lost just twice in its last 16 road games, a 3-2 defeat at No. 14 UF on 8/30/15 and a 1-0 loss at No. 2 UVA on 10/25/15.

SELF-INFLICTED WOUND

The Florida State defense has been impressive this season, recording 15 shutouts in 24 games – six against ACC opponents – and allowing just 13 goals on the year.

From September 4 to October 17, a span covering 10 games and 976:01 of game time, the only goal that the Seminoles allowed was against Clemson on September 24 from an own goal on a cross that bounced off FSU defender Megan Campbell.

Three times in 2015 – a 3-2 defeat at Florida, a 1-0 loss at Virginia and a 2-2 draw vs. BC – the Noles gave their opponents a penalty shot, which were converted and proved to be the difference in all three games.

TILLMAN MATCHES RECORDS

Against Pitt on October 3, freshman **Kaycie Tillman** had a record-setting performance, tallying three assists - all in the first half - in a 6-0 win over the Panthers.

Working down the right side, Tillman made excellent passes into the box for goals in the ninth minute (Cheyna Williams), 38th minute (Dallas Dorosy) and 39th minute (Berglind Thorvaldsdottir).

Tillman equaled that performance on November 27 in the NCAA quarterfinal match against No. 21 Texas A&M. She was part of goals by Michaela Hahn (35th minute), Cheyna Williams (52nd minute) and Elin Jensen (75th minute).

It was the ninth time an FSU player had recorded three assists in a game and the first time that a player had done it twice in her career, let alone in the same season.

Tillman's three assists against Pitt marked just the second time all three assists came in the first half, matching Mami Yamaguchi's performance against Kennesaw State in 2007.

LET ME HELP YOU!

The Seminoles return their top two and six of their top eight assist leaders from 2014, led by seniors **Carson Pickett** and **Megan Campbell** who had 13 and 12 assists respectively. The team produced a school-record 90 assists in 2014, surpassing the total of 71 set in 2007.

In 2015, the Seminoles have totaled 69 assists, to lead the ACC, with at least one assist recorded by 16 different players. **Megan Connolly** leads the team with 10 assists, while Pickett is close behind with nine assists.

The duo not only are second and third, respectively, in the conference for assists, but Connolly is No. 14 and Pickett is No. 27 in the NCAA this season for assists.

TAKING DOWN NO. 1

Florida State earned its second all-time victory over the No. 1 team in the country on October 11 with a 1-0 win against North Carolina. The Seminoles had defeated No. 1 Portland, 2-1, at home in 2006.

It was just the second time that Florida State was involved in a matchup of the two top-ranked teams in the country. As the No. 1 team in 2012, FSU defeated No. 2 Duke, 1-0 in Tallahassee. The Noles made it three times as No. 2 FSU played at No. 1 Virginia on October 25, 2015 and was defeated 1-0

While it wasn't a statistical victory, as the match ended in a 2-2 draw, the Noles won their third straight ACC Championship over No. 1 Virginia on November 8, 2015 securing the title 7-6 on penalty kicks.

GOALKEEPER ASSIST

The Seminoles lead the nation with 69 assists and rank second in the country with 2.88 assists/gm, and one of the biggest assists of the season came from an unlikely source - GK **Cassie Miller**.

Miller started the scoring chance in FSU's 1-0 win over No. 1 UNC on Oct. 11 with a drop kick that landed about 20 yards beyond midfield. The ball bounced over the UNC backline and found Berglind Thorvaldsdottir who finished it on her first touch for the only goal of the game.

It was Miller's first career assist and the first assist from an FSU goalkeeper since Kelsey Wys was involved on a goal by Thorvaldsdottir at Duke in a 2-1 win on September 15, 2013.

CROWLEY: STRONG CANDIDATE

Redshirt junior **Kirsten Crowley** has put together an impressive season, earning two ACC Defensive Player of the Week honors and tallying nine points on two goals and five assists.

TopDrawerSoccer recently released a list of eight players that they felt were strong candidates for Player of the Year, and Crowley was listed among them. Here's what they had to say:

"Another strong season for FSU, another dominant defense. Part of that comes down to the team's ability to possess the ball and kill out games, but Crowley continues in the recent tradition of quality, tough central defenders after Kassey Kallman and Kristin Grubka bossed back lines for the Seminoles for the past four years. Excellent in the air and in the tackle, Crowley leads a defense that's conceded six goals, all while coping with the loss of some of its best players to injuries and international duty."

STRONG FINISH

Florida State has been excellent in the second half this season and has allowed just six goals in the second half and overtime of 2015.

FSU surrendered a goal to New Mexico in the 54th minute of the season-opener on August 21, Louisville found the back of the net in the 78th minute on October 17 and Boston College scored in the 48th and 87th minutes on November 1.

In the ACC Tournament, Virginia (67') and North Carolina (49') each tallied a goal following the halftime intermission.

Those are the only second half goals allowed by the Seminoles in their last 31 games, dating back to a 90th minute goal by Notre Dame in the ACC Tournament semifinals on November 7, 2014.

Prior to the UNC goal, the Noles had not allowed a second-half score to a ranked team in over 628 minutes – a span of 13 games.

TOPDRAWERSOCCER HONORS

On October 16, TopDrawerSoccer released a pair of Top 100 lists to recognize the best freshmen in the country, as well as the most elite players from among the sophomores, juniors and seniors.

The Seminoles were well represented on both lists, placing five student-athletes on each of the Freshmen and Midseason Top 100 Lists. FSU tied with Penn State for the most athletes placed on the Top 100 list, while the Noles trailed only Stanford (6) in the Top 100 Freshman list.

Midfielder **Megan Connolly** topped the TDS Freshmen list as the Cork, Ireland native was named the No. 1 freshman in the country. She was followed closely by **Kaycie Tillman**, who ranked in at No. 4.

Natalia Kuikka (No. 26), **Elin Jensen** (No. 32) and **Dallas Dorosy** (No. 49) were the remaining Seminole freshmen on the list.

Among non-freshmen, senior **Cheyne Williams** was the highest ranked Seminole, placing No. 12 on the Midseason Top 100. The future looks bright for Florida State as the Noles have a group of newcomers that are producing like seasoned veterans and are statistically the best group of true freshmen in the country.

The eight-member group of **Megan Connolly, Elin Jensen, Natalia Kuikka, Kaycie Tillman, Dallas Dorosy, Olivia Bergau, Macayla Edwards** and **Holly Fritz** has tallied 89 of Florida State's 197 points this season, including four of the top six point producers on the team.

Among true freshman on teams in the top 25, Florida State is far and away the nation's leader in production from freshmen as the Noles have more than twice the production of third-place teams - Stanford and Duke (44).

NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State is not only near the top of the national rankings in the polls, but also in many statistical categories.

The Noles lead the nation with 69 assists and are in the top five of six other categories – 2.88 assists per game (2nd), 8.21 points per game (3rd), 197 total points (3rd), 2.67 goals per game (4th), 64 total goals (4th), .833 winning percentage (5th). FSU is also in the top 16 of four other statistical categories as of Nov. 30.

Individually, five Seminoles are among the top 100 of the nation in nine different categories.

Megan Connolly is 17th overall with 10 assists while **Carson Pickett's** nine assists are 27th-best in the nation. **Kaycie Tillman** has eight assists this year, good for No. 40 in the NCAA.

Cheyne Williams has five game-winning goals this season to place No. 31 in the NCAA.

Redshirt sophomore goalkeeper **Cassie Miller** is 13th in the country with a goals-against average of 0.550.

DON'T WASTE TIME

Redshirt junior forward **Berglind Thorvaldsdottir** has been an impressive goal scorer for the Seminoles - scoring 20 goals since the start of the 2014 season - but what is most noteworthy is how she takes advantage of her limited playing time.

Making just two starts in her last 45 appearances, Thorvaldsdottir averages 40.7 minutes of playing time per game. Her 20 goals in the last 1,833 minutes gives her an average of one goal every 91.7 minutes.

Mami Yamaguchi set the school record for goals in a season with 24 in 2,296 minutes in 2007 - an average of one goal every 96 minutes.

MOST WINS OVER TAR HEELS

Florida State defeated North Carolina 1-0 on October 11 and 2-1 on November 6 in the ACC Tournament, improving to 8-24-3 all-time against the Tar Heels.

The eight victories are the most of any school against UNC in the country. Notre Dame is second on the list and currently has six wins over North Carolina.

NOLES HAND UNC 2X LOSS

Florida State's defeat of UNC on October 11 was just the sixth time since 1983 that the Tar Heels have lost back-to-back games.

UNC also lost to Duke on October 16 to mark the seventh time that it has happened since 1983.

The Seminoles have been involved in six of those seven back-to-back losses for the Tar Heels - 2015 (FSU and Duke), 2015 (Louisville and FSU), 2013 (Notre Dame and FSU), 2011 (Maryland and FSU), 2009 (Miami and FSU) and 2000 (FSU and Wake Forest).

UNDEFEATED VERSUS UNC

The Seminoles are undefeated in their last seven matches against North Carolina (6-0-1), and have not lost to the Tar Heels since a 2-0 defeat on September 29, 2011 in Tallahassee. There is no one on the 2015 FSU roster that has lost to UNC in their collegiate career.

NO. 200 FOR KRIKORIAN

In just his 11th season at the helm of the Florida State soccer program, **Mark Krikorian** earned win No. 200 at FSU with a 6-0 victory at UNC Greensboro on September 17.

His career mark at Florida State is 211-44-22 for a winning percentage of .801. He has led the Noles to four 20-win seasons and his lowest win total came in 2010 when Florida State finished with a 16-6-1 record.

PRODUCTION FROM THE TOP

Senior forward **Cheyne Williams** was all over the field and the box scores in FSU's pair of wins at the Lobo Invitational on August 21-23, tallying a goal and two assists.

Williams picked up right where she left off in 2014 as she has either scored a goal or recorded an assist in 19 of the last 31 games she has played, dating back to the ACC semifinal game against Notre Dame in 2014. She has totaled 16 goals and 10 assists over that span.

In 2015, she leads the team with 10 goals and is second on the squad with 27 points.

STEADY OFFENSE

The Florida State offense has been difficult to stop by opponents as the Seminoles recorded a school-record streak of 34 straight matches with at least one goal from August 22, 2014 to September 17, 2015.

During the 34-game streak without being shutout offensively, the Noles recorded 24 shutouts defensively.

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Redshirt junior defender **Kirsten Crowley** was key in FSU's two wins at the Lobo Invitational on August 21-23 and was selected as the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on August 25.

Crowley captained the Florida State defense as the Noles gave up just five shots against New Mexico, defeating the Lobos, 3-1. Against RV/No. 23 USC on Sunday, Crowley and the FSU defense did not allow a shot on goal in a shutout of the Trojans. Crowley had an impressive tackle on a breakaway opportunity by USC in the first half that set up an FSU scoring chance.

On September 8, freshman midfielder **Megan Connolly** was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week after FSU's 3-1 victory over No. 3 Texas A&M on September 4.

A native of Cork, Ireland, Connolly assisted on Natalia Kuikka's equalizer in the 67th minute and scored her first career goal in the 77th minute. It was Connolly's first multi-point performance of her career and also her first weekly ACC honor.

Connolly (Co-Offensive) and Crowley (Defensive) were each honored as an ACC Player of the Week on September 29 as the Noles earned conference wins over No. 7/6 Clemson (3-1) and No. 16/7 Notre Dame (1-0).

Connolly was involved in all four goals on the weekend, tallying three assists and a goal scored as she leads the team with 15 points. Crowley and the FSU defense earned its seventh shutout of the season, including the second against a ranked opponent.

Redshirt sophomore goalkeeper **Cassie Miller** earned ACC Co-Defensive player of the week honors on October 13 after posting shutouts over NC State and No. 1 UNC. Miller recorded five saves over two games and registered her first career assist against the Tar Heels as her drop kick found Berglind Thorvaldsdottir for the game-winner.

EVERYONE CONTRIBUTES

It takes an entire team to succeed, and that is definitely the case with the 2015 Seminoles as 17 of the 20 players on the roster have recorded at least one point this season.

One of the three players is a goalkeeper and the other two have contributed with three combined starts. Thirteen different players have scored a goal and 16 players have registered at least one assist this season.

In 2014, Florida State had 19 of 20 players score at least one point during the season. The only one without a goal or an assist was goalkeeper Cassie Miller, as every single field player contributed on a goal en route to the 2014 NCAA Championship.

NO GOALS FOR YOU!

The Florida State defense was nearly impenetrable in 2014, as the Noles surrendered only nine goals on the season and recorded two separate streaks of over 500 scoreless minutes - **683:07** from November 7, 2014 to August 21, 2015 and also **589:00** from September 18 to October 12.

So far in 2015, the Noles nearly matched that output and have recorded two separate scoreless streaks of over 400 minutes. FSU recently ended a streak of **503:39** from September 24 to October 17 and also earned a scoreless streak of **472:40** from September 4 to September 24.

Those four streaks are the third-through sixth-longest consecutive scoreless streaks in Florida State soccer history.

IMAIZUMI RETURNS

Back on the sideline for Florida State this season will be assistant coach **Morinao Imaizumi**. He initially joined the Seminole staff as a volunteer assistant in 2011, helping lead Florida State to an 18-win season, its first ACC Championship and a berth in the College Cup.

In 2012, Imaizumi stayed on as an assistant coach as the Seminoles opened the season with a program-record 14 consecutive wins and earned their sixth overall appearance in the College Cup.

A native of Japan, Imaizumi returned home in 2013 and resumed work with the Japan Football Association, coaching a JFA Academy U-15 team to a runner-up finish in both the 2014 and 2015 All-Japan Tournament.

MULTI-POINT PERFORMANCE

Scoring 197 points through 24 games on the season (8.21 per game) results in numerous goals and assists for the Garnet and Gold.

Elin Jensen and Isabella Schmid have each recorded a team-high five points in a game this season, registering two goals and an assist against UNC Greensboro and South Alabama, respectively.

In all, 12 student-athletes have earned multiple points in a game this season for a total of 25 performances, led by Megan Connolly and Cheyna Williams with four apiece.

Elin Jensen (3), Berglind Thorvaldsdottir (2), Isabella Schmid (2), Kaycie Tillman (2), Kirsten Crowley (2), Megan Campbell (1), Dallas Dorosy (1), Michaela Hahn (1) and Carson Pickett (1) round out the remaining group.

PRESEASON NO. 1

Florida State entered the 2015 season as the No. 1 ranked team by both the National Soccer Coaches Association and TopDrawerSoccer. It was the first time that FSU had received a preseason No. 1 ranking and the 10th time overall that the Noles were No. 1 in the NSCAA poll. In 2012, Florida State earned the program's first No. 1 ranking on August 28 after opening the season with a 2-0 record. The Noles held on to the No. 1 spot for eight consecutive weeks in 2012. FSU regained the No. 1 spot in the final poll of the 2014 season after winning the national championship.

DEFENDING ACC CHAMPS

Florida State opened the season as the defending ACC champion for the third time in school history and the second year in a row. The Seminoles are the only school other than North Carolina to win back-to-back ACC titles.

The Noles earned their fourth conference title in 2015 and now own four of the eight ACC championships not earned by UNC.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY

The Seminoles placed two student athletes on the preseason watch list for the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy. Seniors **Isabella Schmid** and **Cheyna Williams** were two of 28 players recognized on the preseason list.

FSU is one of five teams with two student-athletes on the Watch List, joining Florida, Stanford, Virginia and West Virginia. It is the 12th straight season that the Seminoles have had a student-athlete named to the preseason Watch List and Florida State has had two players chosen eight times in the last 10 seasons.

In 2007, Mami Yamaguchi won the MAC Hermann Trophy, the first and only player in school history to win the award. Yamaguchi led the country in points that season with 66, while finishing second in goals (24) and assists (18).

Megan Connolly was selected as one of 15 semifinalists for the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy and is the only freshman semifinalist.

FRESH FACES

The Seminoles welcome eight freshmen to the squad in 2015, including two who had already enrolled at Florida State for the Spring 2015 semester. Midfielder **Holly Fritz** (Cape Coral, Fla.) and defender **Macayla Edwards** (Palm Beach Gardens, Fla.) each got an early start at Florida State, joining the team in January and training with the Seminoles throughout the spring.

Six others arrived for the fall, with three Americans and three international players. Midfielders **Kaycie Tillman** (Rowlett, Texas) and **Dallas Dorosy** (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) along with defender **Olivia Bergau** (Merritt Island, Fla.) represent the newcomers from the United States.

The trio of European players that have been competing for the Noles this fall are midfielders **Megan Connolly** (Cork, Ireland), **Natalia Kuikka** (Kemi, Finland) and forward **Elin Jensen** (Reykjavik, Iceland).
