NOTING THE COLLEGE CUP

- Florida State earned the ACC's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament after claiming its third league title in the last four years. This year's berth marks FSU's 15th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. Virginia received an at-large bid out of the ACC. The Cavaliers are making their 27th all-time appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 21st trip in a row in 2014.
- The Seminoles return to the College Cup for the fourth year in a row and eighth time in school history. The eight College Cup appearances are tied for the fifth most in tournament history (Portland). Since 2003, FSU's eight College Cup appearances are tied with UCLA for the most by any school.
- Florida State and Virginia are making Sunday's national championship game an all-ACC final for the third time in NCAA history and first since 1992 when North Carolina faced Duke. In 1988, UNC played NC State. It's just the fourth time ever that two teams from the same conference will play for it all in the Women's College Cup with the last coming in 2002 when Portland defeated Santa Clara, 2-1 in overtime.

KEY NOTES VS. VIRGINIA

- Florida State and Virginia are squaring off for the third time in 2014 but just the second time in the NCAA Tournament.
- The Seminoles are responsible for both of the Cavaliers' losses this year as FSU defeated UVa by identical 1-0 scores first in Tallahassee (Sept. 28) and then in the ACC finals in Greensboro (11/9).
- Sunday's match marks the second time these two schools will meet in the NCAA Tournament and first time in the College Cup. In 2011, FSU defeated UVa 3-0 in the quarterfinals marking the last time the two teams squared off three times in one season as FSU took 2-of-3 from UVa that year.
- Florida State has won five of the last seven meetings against Virginia outscoring the Cavaliers 10-6 over that seven-game stretch.

Florida State sits at 48-13-2 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, good for a .778 winning percentage. It is the second-best postseason winning percentage of all time (trailing only North Carolina). Making their 15th straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2014, FSU's 48 wins are tied for the fourth most in NCAA history. Only one other school in NCAA history has averaged more wins per NCAA Tournament trips than FSU with that being North Carolina.

For the 10th straight season and 11th time overall, Florida State received a national seed in the NCAA Tournament. After claiming their third ACC championship in four years and finishing with an unbeaten record in the league for the first time in school history, the Seminoles were recognized as one of four No. 1 national seeds for the fourth year in a row and fifth time overall (2009, 2011, 2012, 2013 & 2014). Florida State has been a No. 2 seed four times (2005, 2006, 2008 & 2010), while entering the NCAA Tournament as a No. 3 seed in 2007. The only other time the Seminoles received a national seed was in 2003 and in that year the team was seeded 11th. The Seminoles are 21-4-0 all-time in the NCAA Tournament as a No. 1 seed. FSU has played in the national championship game as a No. 1 seed in 2013 and 2014.

With eight College Cup appearances (2003, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2011, 2012, 2013 & 2014) since 2003, Florida State is one of only two programs in the nation, and the only school in the ACC, to play in soccer's version of the 'Final Four' eight times over the last 12 seasons. FSU is now tied with UCLA with the most appearances since 2003. Florida State, Duke, North Carolina, Notre Dame and Virginia are the only teams in the ACC to play in multiple College Cups since 1991.

Following Florida State's quarterfinal victory over South Carolina, the Seminoles' streak of consecutive College Cup appearances grew to four straight years. FSU is one of just three schools all-time to make three or more consecutive College Cups on two different occasions. The Seminoles (2005-07 & 2011-14) join Notre Dame (1994-97 & 2006-10) and Portland (1994-96 & 2000-02).

Of the three schools joining Florida State in Boca Raton for the 2014 College Cup, the Seminoles have faced all three previously in the NCAA Tournament. FSU met Stanford on Friday for the third time in the postseason and second time in the College Cup semifinals. The Seminoles have faced Texas A&M twice (2-0-0 - last: 2012 Third Round) and Virginia once (1-0-0 - last: 2011 Quarterfinals).

Florida State is 13-12-2 away from home in the NCAA Tournament including a record of 9-7-1 on neutral soil. This year marks the first time the Seminoles are playing in a College Cup hosted in the state of Florida. FSU owns an all-time record of 208-50-11 when playing in the state of Florida, including 127-12-6 under head coach Mark Krikorian and a 15-1-0 mark this year. Florida State is 3-5-0 all-time in the NCAA Tournament semifinals with its three wins coming against Notre Dame (2007), Virginia Tech (2013) and Stanford (2014).

FSU has registered at least two or more wins in 13 of its 15 postseason appearances including at least three wins in 10 straight seasons - all since head coach Mark Krikorian arrived on campus. The only time FSU did not secure at least two wins in the NCAA Tournament was in 2001 (1-1) and 2004 (0-0-1). The Seminoles have reached at least four wins in the postseason seven times.

Since 2000, the Seminoles have now made 15 straight NCAA Tournament appearances, played in 13 'Sweet 16's' and have advanced to the quarterfinal round 10 years in a row - the longest active streak in the nation. All three appearances in the national title game in (2007, 2013, 2014) have come under head coach Mark Krikorian.

NOTES FOLLOWING NATIONAL SEMIFINAL

Florida State advanced to its second straight national championship game and third all-time in school history following Friday's victory over Stanford. The Seminoles' first appearance in the national finals came in 2007 as FSU fell to Southern California 2-0 in College Station, Texas.

Sunday's winner between Florida State and Virginia will mark the first women's soccer national championship for either team and the 11th different team to capture a women's soccer national title in NCAA history. Two of the last three champions (2011 - Stanford & 2013- UCLA) have been first time winners.

A Florida State win on Sunday would give head coach Mark Krikorian his first national title as a head coach at the Division I level and third overall. Krikorian led Franklin Pierce to back-to-back Division II titles in 1994 and 1995. He would become only the second coach to win a national title at two different divisions. Brian McManus led UC San Diego to seven national championships including two as a Division II member (2000 & 2001) and five as a Division III member (1989, 1995-97 & 1999). Krikorian would become the first coach to perform the feat at two different schools.

Florida State has outscored the opposition 16-0 in the 2014 NCAA Tournament. It marks the seventh time in 15 NCAA Tournament appearances that FSU has reached double figures in goals. FSU scored a school-record 19 goals during the 2013 NCAA Tournament - two more than the previous record of 17 set in 2007.

On Sunday, Florida State will look to become just the third school in NCAA history to complete a run to the national finals without conceding a goal (North Carolina 3x - 1987, 1989, 2003; Notre Dame in 1995). If FSU is able to perform the feat against Virginia on Sunday, it would mark just the second time in NCAA history that a school has performed the feat over a six-game stretch in the postseason.

For the second time in as many years, Florida State will face a familiar opponent at the College Cup. Last year, the Seminoles squared-off against Virginia Tech three times winning all three matches. The first meeting came in Blacksburg during the regular season (2-1), followed by a date in the ACC Championship game (1-0) and concluding with a 3-2 victory in the national semifinals. It marked the first time in school history FSU defeated a team three times in one season.

Virginia is the fifth ACC opponent the Seminoles will face in the NCAA Tournament all-time and the first in 2014. Along with facing the Cavaliers (1-0-0) just once before, the Seminoles have also played Boston College (2-0-1), Clemson (1-2-0), North Carolina (0-0-1) and Virginia Tech (1-0-0) in prior postseason games. Sunday's match against UVa marks the first time FSU will face an opponent outside the Pac-12 in the national title game. FSU has played Notre Dame five times in the postseason but never as conference foes.

Florida State has won two straight over Virginia while all five wins in the series have come in last seven games. Twenty-one of the 27 contests in the series have been decided by one goal or less including 19 of the last 22 games. Four of the last nine meetings have been decided in overtime (FSU: 1-2-1). Sunday's game marks the ninth time in the last 10 meetings that both teams will face each other ranked in the top 10. FSU is 5-3-0 during that span.

Noting FSU's two wins over Virginia in 2014...

- Florida State's 1-0 victory over No. 2 Virginia on Sept. 28 was FSU's third straight win over UVa at home.
- The shutout in Tallahassee snapped UVa's streak of scoring a goal in a game at 44 consecutive games. The last time the Cavaliers were shutout came in a 1-0 overtime loss to the Seminoles in 2012.
- FSU's win also snapped Virginia's school-record 17-match ACC regular season win streak and school-record 31 straight regular season win streak.
- Over the last 86 games UVa has played, the Cavaliers have been shutout four times with all four shutouts coming at the hands of Florida State.

THE SEMINOLES IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Cheyna Williams enters the College Cup finals leading all Seminoles with 12 points on six goals. The junior transfer is making her first postseason appearance in 2014 after spending her first two seasons at Vanderbilt. Williams has scored a goal in four of FSU's first five matches including the game-winner against Northeastern and Stanford. She also tallied a two-goal effort in back-to-back games against South Carolina and Stanford for her second and third multi-goal games of the season. Williams has scored on six of 12 shots during the postseason.

Senior midfielder Dagny Brynjarsdottir became FSU's all-time leader for career points in the postseason with 28 on 10 goals and eight assists. Brynjarsdottir moved past Tiffany McCarty on the list after her two-assist effort against South Carolina in the NCAA Quarterfinals. Brynjarsdottir, who enters the College Cup Finals with two goals and three assists, is tied for first in game-winning goals (4), tied for second in goals (10) and tied for second in assists (8).

There are 13 Seminoles on the active roster that have registered at least one point in the NCAA Tournament including 12 players that have scored at least one goal. Brynjarsdottir is joined by Jamia Fields (18 points - 6G, 6A), Megan Campbell (12 pts - 1G, 10A), Cheyna Williams (12 pts - 6G), Marta Bakowska-Mathews (11 pts - 4G, 3A), Kristin Grubka (11 pts - 4G, 3A) and Carson Pickett (10 pts - 3G, 4A) as current double-digit scorers all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

A year after Dagny Brynjarsdottir finished the NCAA Tournament with 10 points, Cheyna Williams has tallied 12 points in 2014 the fourth most in a single-postseason in school history. Williams became the sixth Seminole to reach double-digit points during the postseason in a single year: Sanna Talonen - 2007, 17 pts (8G, 1A); Tiffany McCarty - 2012, 15 pts (7G, 1A); Mami Yamaguchi - 2007, 14 pts (3G, 8A); Cheyna Williams - 2014, 12 pts (6G); India Trotter - 2005, 10 pts (5G); **Dagny Brynjarsdottir - 2013, 10 pts (4G, 2A).**

The six goals scored by Cheyna Williams in the 2014 NCAA Tournament are the third most in a single-postseason in the FSU record books. Finland's Sanna Talonen set the school record with eight goals during the 2007 NCAA Tournament.

Cheyna Williams added to her postseason lore in 2014 after recording her second two-goal effort in as many games this postseason. The junior midfielder became the fifth Seminole to register at least two multi-goal games during the postseason (South Carolina & Stanford). She joins Sanna Talonen (3), Dagny Brynjarsdottir (2), Jamia Fields (2) and Tiffany McCarty (2). Fields has two career multi-goal games with both coming in the NCAA Tournament - vs. Virginia Tech (2013 College Cup) and South Carolina (2014 Quarterfinals).

With two-assist efforts by both Dagny Brynjarsdottir and Carson Pickett in FSU's 5-0 victory over South Carolina in the NCAA Quarterfinals, the Seminole duo became the fourth and fifth players in school history to record both a multi-goal and multi-assist game in the NCAA Tournament. Brynjarsdottir and Pickett join an exclusive list that include current teammate Jamia Fields, Jessica Price and Katrin Schmidt.

In 63 all-time NCAA Tournament games, Florida State has recorded 30 shutouts and has been shut out 12 times. For the first time in school history, FSU has opened postseason play with five consecutive shutouts. The Seminoles have recorded at least three shutouts during the NCAA Tournament six times including a current streak of four straight years.

Florida State is one of 12 schools all-time at the Division I level to post a streak of 15 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. Nine of those schools are on active streaks including four from the ACC. Here is a look at the schools who have qualified for 15 or more consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances: **denotes active streak*

The Seminoles have played 14 games against 13 schools participating in the 2014 NCAA Tournament. Six of those schools received a national seed. The Seminoles are 12-1-1 against these schools posting five wins against schools receiving a national seed. The lone loss for FSU came at the hands of Florida back on Sept. 5 in Tallahassee.

Megan Campbell and Emma Koivisto became the first pair of Seminoles to register three assists in the same game in school history when the duo picked up three assists each in a first round victory over South Alabama. Florida State has now had seven players record three assists in one game in school history and it's the third time the feat has been performed this year. Four players on the active roster have notched three assists in one game including Marta Bakowska-Mathews, Campbell, Koivisto and Carson Pickett.

With her three-assist performance against South Alabama, Megan Campbell became FSU's all-time assist leader in the NCAA Tournament. She surpassed Mami Yamaguchi (2005-07) who held the previous record of eight. In just two years, Campbell has accumulated 10 assists in postseason play.

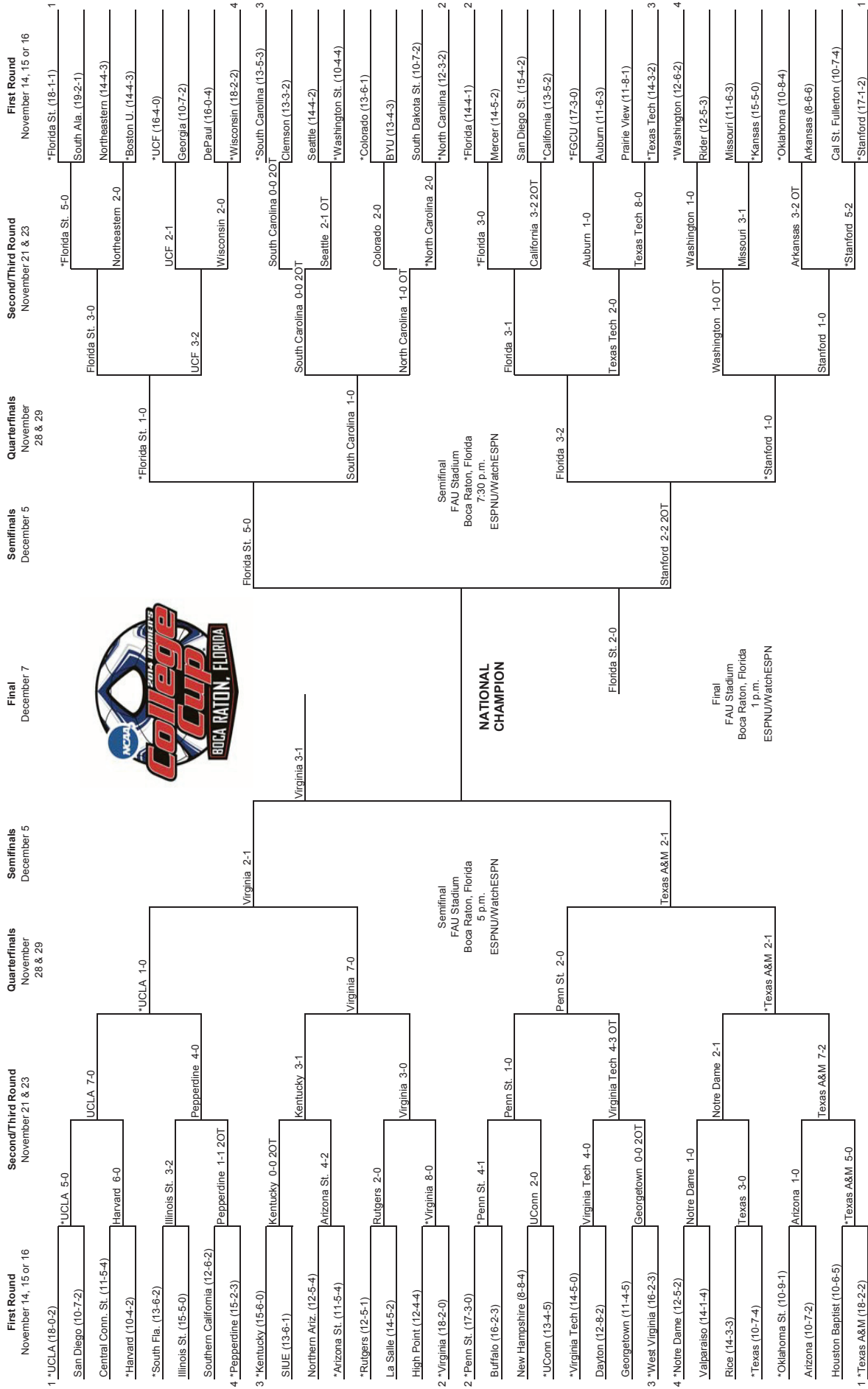
