- Florida State is making its 52nd NCAA Tournament appearance and 37th in a row.
- The Noles are the all-time leader in NCAA Regional/Super Regional games (222) & wins (149).
- FSU enters the 2014 Tallahassee Regional having won 19 straight regional games.
- The Seminoles snapped a seven-game losing streak at the ACC Tournament with a 7-1 win over North Carolina in the opener. FSU finished the tournament with a 2-1 record.
- The Seminoles clinched their eighth consecutive ACC Atlantic Division title in 2014.
- Florida State boasts a record of 10-2 in one-run games, 3-1 in extra inning contests.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS

Entering his 35th season as head coach at Florida State University, Mike Martin continues to redefine success by any standard of measure. With 1,813 career victories, a .743 winning percentage that sits first among active NCAA Division I coaches, 34 consecutive regional tournament appearances and 15 trips to the College World Series, Martin's place in college baseball history is secure.

Martin was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2007. Since then he has eclipsed the 1,500-, 1,600-, 1,700- and most recently 1,800-win milestones and returned to the College World Series three times in the last six seasons, while continuing to turn out All-Americans, Major League Draft choices and postseason participants. In 2013, Martin led the Seminoles to the NCAA Super Regionals for the sixth year in a row and a seventh straight ACC Atlantic Division title.

The FSU alum has become the face of Florida State baseball having been associated with the Seminoles for 42 of FSU's 67 seasons. Of the 3,720 baseball games played in program history, Martin has been involved in 2,827 as a player, assistant coach and head coach. What is even more impressive is Martin's involvement in 2,080 of the 2,713 all-time victories at Florida State. In one way or another, Martin has been a part of more than 76.7% of FSU's victories.

Martin has won 16 conference championships since taking over as head coach in 1980 with 11 from the Metro Conference and five in the ACC. Since moving to divisional play in 2006, Martin has led the Seminoles to eight consecutive ACC Atlantic Division titles from 2007-2014. Florida State captured the ACC Championship in 2010 defeating NC State in Greensboro, N.C., and has played in the conference title game in three of the last six years. FSU's run to a division title in 2008 was accomplished after Martin led the Noles to a league mark of 24-6, a school record for the most conference wins in team history. The Seminoles matched that record in 2012 becoming the only school in ACC history to reach 24 wins in league play on multiple occasions. Martin is a six-time Metro Conference Coach of the Year and has been recognized as the top coach in the ACC seven times.

Eighty-five Florida State players have earned All-America honors under Martin, while 119 players have garnered first, second and third team All-ACC recognition. He has coached seven players, Mike Fuentes, Mike Loynd, J.D. Drew, Shane Robinson, Tony Thomas, Jr., Buster Posey and James Ramsey, who were named National Players of the Year.

In 2010, Martin was named to Florida State University's list of 100 Distinguished Graduates in celebration of the FSU Alumni Association Centennial.

NOTING FSU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

* This is the 37th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament for the Seminoles and the 52nd appearance overall - both stand as the second most all-time.

* Head Coach Mike Martin has led his team to the NCAA's in each of his 35 years on the bench at Florida State. He has also led FSU to 15 College World Series appearances including three trips in the last five years (2008, 2010 and 2012).

* The Seminoles have posted a record of 99-37 (.728) while playing at home during NCAA Regional and Super Regional action including a mark of 47-19 in the 21st century.

* Thirteen of FSU's 21 trips to the College World Series have started in a regional played in its back yard including 2012 when the Seminoles posted a perfect 5-0 record through the first two rounds of the tournament. In 2008, the Seminoles went 6-2 during both regional and super regional competition. FSU advanced to the CWS in 2010 after sweeping through the Norwich, Conn., Regional and then defeating Vanderbilt in the Super Regionals in Tallahassee.

* Florida State trails only Texas for the most NCAA Tournament appearances. The Longhorns have made 56 appearances all-time to lead the nation followed by FSU with 52.

* Since the NCAA began selecting 16 host sites in 1999, the home team has won the Regional 169 times in 240 opportunities (70.4%) including 14 of the 16 host sites in 2013.

* Florida State ranks first all-time in wins in NCAA Regional and Super Regional play with 149, six ahead of Texas who sits second with 143 all-time wins.

* No team has played more NCAA Tournament games than FSU with 222 in program history.

* Since the bracket expanded to 64 teams in 1999, the top eight national seeds have advanced to the College World Series 72 times out of 120 opportunities. Eight of the last 10 CWS champions have (2004-08, 2010, 2012-13) been unseeded in the tournament. South Carolina (2011) was the last seeded school to win the title. Only three seeded teams reached Omaha last year: #1 North Carolina, #3 Oregon State and #4 LSU. UCLA, the 2013 champions, were unseeded last year.

* Florida State enters the 2014 NCAA Tournament as a top eight national seed for the 10th time since 1999. The Seminoles earned the No. 5 national seed this year for the second time in school history. FSU has advanced to the CWS as a national seed in 1999 (#2), 2000 (#6), 2008 (#4) and 2012 (#3). The Seminoles were unseeded when advancing to the CWS in 2010.

* FSU's all-time national seeds include:

* All eight top seeds have never advanced to the CWS. Seven of the eight top seeds have advanced twice in 1999 and 2001. Six national seeds advanced to the CWS in 2011.

* Florida State has faced seven schools that were selected to this year's field of 64. The Seminoles posted a 12-12 record claiming three series victories. FSU has played three No. 1 seeds - Florida (0-3), Miami (2-1) and Virginia (2-2); one No. 2 seed - Maryland (2-2); and three No. 3 seeds Clemson (2-1), Georgia Tech (1-2) and North Carolina (3-1).

* The Seminoles own a record of 40-11 all-time in the opening game of the NCAA Tournament. FSU has won its last five regional openers. The Seminoles had won 15 straight games to open regional play before falling to Bucknell (7-0) to open the 2008 Tallahassee Regional.

* Since the loss to Bucknell to open the 2008 Tallahassee Regional, the Seminoles have won 19 straight regional games outscoring the opposition 230-76 during the current win streak.

* Georgia Southern earned the Southern Conference's automatic bid. The last appearance for GSU in the postseason was the 2011 Columbia (S.C.) Regional.

* GSU enters the regional fourth in the country in home runs and eighth in runs scored. Eagle reliever Jason Richman is first in the country with 45 appearances and second with a 1.06 ERA. Teammate Matt McCall is tied with FSU's Gage Smith for second in the country with 38 appearances.

* The Seminoles own an all-time record of 142-33 against SoCon schools and 7-1 in the NCAA Tourney. Samford was the last SoCon team FSU faced in the postseason (2012 Regional - FSU won twice).

* The Owls are led by Golden Spikes semifinalist Max Pentecost, who leads the country in hits (104) and ranks in the top-25 in five other offensive categories. He is also a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Award and finalist for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the nation's top catcher.

* Florida State is 6-0 against A-Sun schools in 2014 and 253-70 all-time.

All player and coach interviews must be arranged through the FSU Sports Information Office. Players and coaches should not be contacted directly under any circumstances. On game days, coach Martin and requested players will be available to the media after the game and following a 10-minute cooling off period. Interviews will take place in the Tradition Room at Dick Howser Stadium.

OPENING NCAA TOURNAMENT PLAY

- Florida State is 40-11 all-time in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.
- The Seminoles have won five straight regional openers with their last loss coming to Bucknell in 2008.
- Under head coach Mike Martin, FSU is 30-4 in the opening game of regional play.
- Prior to Martin's arrival, the Seminoles were 10-7.

NCAA TOURNAMENT NOTABLES

- Florida State has won 19 straight regional games since falling to Bucknell in the opening game of the 2008 Tallahassee Regional.
- During the current win streak, the Seminoles have outscored the competition 230-76 reaching double-digit runs 11 times.
- FSU has won by nine or more runs eight times during the streak, while holding the opposition under six runs over the last 12 games.
- Florida State's back-to-back shutouts against Savannah State and Troy in last year's regional marked the first time the Seminoles had blanked opponents in consecutive games since shutting out Arizona (4-0) and Dartmouth (6-0) in the first two games of the 1970 College World Series.
- FSU has registered 15 all-time shutouts in the NCAA Tournament including 11 in regional play and four in the CWS.
- Since the inception of Super Regional play in 1999, Florida State has advanced to the regional final every year - a streak that spans 15 consecutive years.

ALL-ACC HONORS

- Florida State was honored with six student-athletes on the All-ACC first, second and third teams in 2014.
- The Seminoles placed four on the first team extending FSU's streak of landing at least one player on the first team to 21 straight years (1994-2014).
- DJ Stewart was named Player of the Year becoming the seventh Seminole in school history to garner the accolade.
- The sophomore outfielder is the first Seminole to win the award since James Ramsey took home the individual honor in 2012.
- Stewart is the fourth Seminole outfielder to win the award joining J.D. Drew (1997), John Ford-Griffin (2001) and Ramsey (2012).
- John Nogowski (1B), Jose Brizuela (3B) and Luke Weaver (SP) joined Stewart on the All-ACC first team, while junior Josh Delph (DH/UT) and senior Gage Smith (RP) was named to the third team.
- Stewart and Weaver were both recognized on the All-ACC second team in 2013.
- Brizuela, Delph, Nogowski and Smith are all first time all-conference honorees.
- It marked the most all-conference honorees since FSU landed six in 2011.

ACC TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Florida State snapped a seven-game losing streak in the ACC Tournament with an opening round victory over North Carolina, 7-1.
- The Seminoles finished the tournament with a 2-1 record posting victories over UNC and UVA.
- Jose Brizuela and John Nogowski led the offensive charge hitting .333 apiece. Nogowski led all batters

- Justin Gonzalez and Nogowski each hit a home run in the tournament.
- The Seminoles posted a team ERA of 2.08 as Billy Strode led the charge with 6.0 shutout innings in earning the win over the Tar Heels.

DIVISIONAL CROWN

- For the eighth year in a row, Florida State finished atop the ACC Atlantic Division claiming at least a share of the division title.
- Since the move to divisional play in 2006, FSU has captured at least a share of the division title in eight of the nine years.
- Florida State has won the division title outright seven times (2007-09, 2011-14) including a current streak of four straight years, while sharing the title with Clemson in 2010.
- The Seminoles finished atop the Atlantic Division with a 21-9 record, 5.5 games ahead of second place Clemson and Maryland, who both finished at 15-14.
- Florida State reached the 20-win plateau in league play for the seventh time since joining the ACC in 1992.
- FSU tied a league record for victories in ACC play after going 24-6 in 2012, a mark they first established following the 2008 season.
- Florida State is the only school in the league to register 24 wins in ACC play on multiple occasions.
- FSU was picked to finish first in the Atlantic Division ahead of NC State at the start of the 2014 season.

FORTY WIN SEASON

- Following a win over Duke to open the regular season finale on Thursday, May 15, Florida State reached 40 wins for the 37th year in a row.
- The Seminoles have now obtained 40 wins in each

head coach Mike Martin's 35 years at the helm of the Seminole Baseball program.

- FSU has averaged over 51 wins a season since 1980.

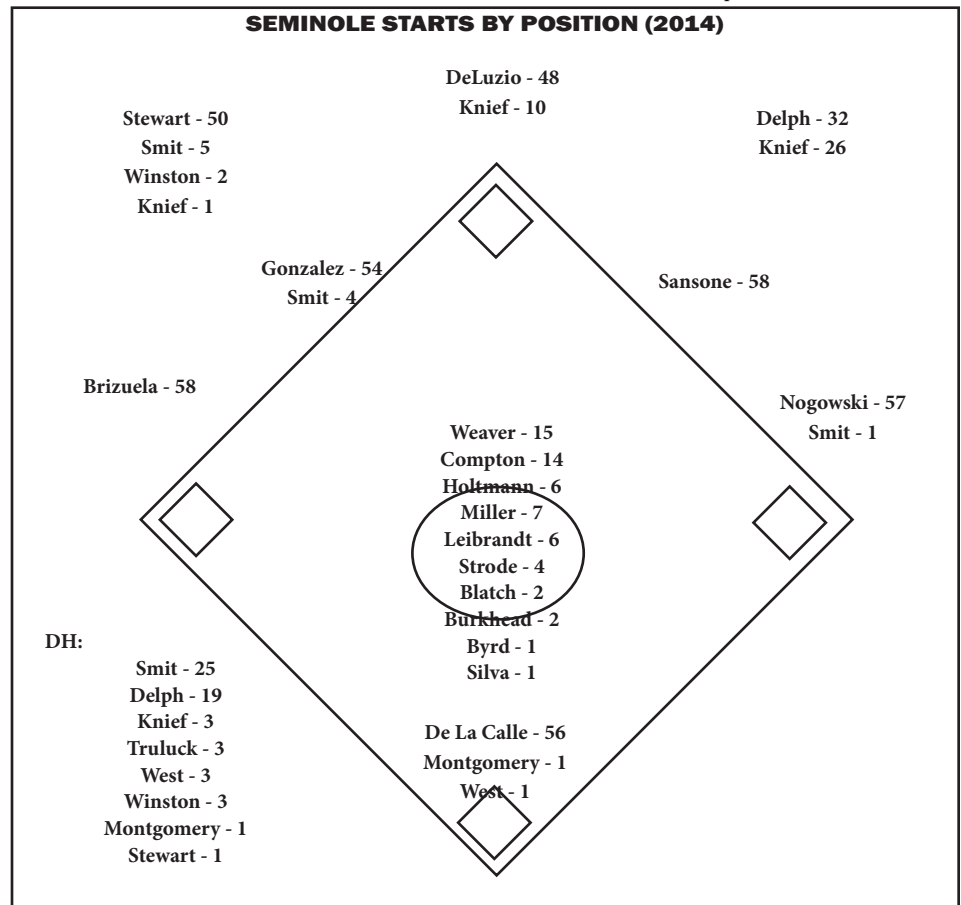
DJ REACHING BASE

- DJ Stewart's streak of reaching base in consecutive games (via base hit, walk or HBP) came to an end in game two of the doubleheader against Minnesota - a streak that stopped at 65 straight games.
- The streak dated back to the 2013 season encompassing the last 27 games of his freshman year and the first 38 games in 2014.
- Stewart needed all 13 innings to keep his streak going in the series finale against NC State (3/15) as the sophomore outfielder got a single in the bottom of the 13 to keep his streak alive.
- Stewart's walk against JU (4/15) in the seventh inning tied the school record for reaching base in consecutive games - a mark set by Shane Robinson over two seasons from 2004 to 2005.
- The Yulee, Fla., native broke Robinson's record with a two-run, two-out ninth inning single at Wake Forest on April 18.
- Stewart has reached base in 50 of the 51 games in which he has played this year.

MARTIN REACHES 1,800

- Head coach Mike Martin reached career win No. 1,800 in a 4-3, 13 inning victory at Wake Forest on April 19.
- In reaching 1,800 wins, Martin became just the fourth coach in all divisions to reach the historic milestone and the third to do so in Division I history.
- The elusive group among all divisions includes Augie Garrido - Texas (1,912), Gordie Gillespie (1,893) and Gene Stephenson - Wichita State (1,837).
- Gillespie and Stephenson are the two non-active coaches on the list. Gillespie retired from St. Francis,

ACC TOURNAMENT WINS LEADER

- With two wins in the 2014 ACC Baseball Tournament, Mike Martin became the all-time wins leader in league tournament history with 65 career victories.
- Martin moved ahead of Clemson's Bill Wilhelm who held the previous record with 64 wins over 21 seasons.
- Martin is already the ACC leader for overall wins, ACC wins and NCAA Tournament victories.

1800 & 2700 ON THE SAME DAY

- When Mike Martin secured career win No. 1,800 on April 19 at Wake Forest, it wasn't the only milestone reached on that day.
- The victory over the Demon Deacons also marked the 2,700th career win in school history.
- The Seminoles reached the mark in only their 67th year of college baseball making Florida State the fastest to reach that mark in NCAA Division I history.
- FSU joins the likes of Fordham, Texas, Southern California, Michigan, Stanford and Arizona State to reach 2,700 career victories in school history.

STEWART TO PLAY FOR TEAM USA

- DJ Stewart accepted an invite to play with the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team this summer.
- Stewart becomes the 18th Seminole to play for Team USA and the second in as many years joining Luke Weaver who played for the team last summer.
- The Collegiate National team begins play June 21.

DIVISIONAL CONFERENCE BREAKDOWN

- Since the ACC adopted divisional play in 2006, the Seminoles have posted a league record of 182-82 (.689) and have captured at least a share of eight straight Atlantic Division titles.
- Now in its ninth season of playing in divisions, FSU has posted a record of 101-35 against teams in the Atlantic Division including a mark of 53-15 at home and 48-20 on the road.
- Against Coastal Division teams, the 'Noles are 81-47 overall, 45-20 at home and 36-27 on the road.
- In the eight seasons (2007-14) that FSU has won the divisional crown, the Seminoles are averaging over 20 wins in the ACC. This includes a school record 24 wins in league action in 2008 & 2012 which ties for the most league wins with Clemson (2006) and Miami (2014).

ACC SERIES VICTORIES

- The Seminoles opened league play on the right foot in 2014 winning their first five series of the season. FSU finished the year taking 8-of-10 series in 2014.
- FSU concluded the 2014 regular season claiming eight of 10 series. The Seminoles registered sweeps over NC State, Boston College and Notre Dame, while taking 2-of-3 from Maryland, Clemson, Wake Forest, North Carolina and Duke.
- The two series losses came to Georgia Tech (in Atlanta) and Virginia (in Tallahassee).
- Dating back to the start of the 2011 season, FSU has

won 32 of 40 league series.

- The Seminoles saw their streak of consecutive ACC series victories at home come to an end at 13 straight after dropping 2-of-3 from Virginia (April 25-27, 2014).
- Prior to the Virginia loss, the last time FSU lost an ACC series at home was May 19-21, 2011 against Clemson when the Tigers took games 2 & 3 (7-4 & 8-5).

ACC SERIES STREAKS

- Florida State has put together quite an impressive streak of winning series against ACC opponents.
- Since joining the league in 1992, the Seminoles have won 155 of a possible 204 league series good for a 76.0% success rate.
- What's even more impressive is that Florida State has never lost more than half of the ACC series they have played in a single season - a span now covering 24 years after sweeping Notre Dame (Apr. 4-6).
- The only year the Seminoles won every ACC series was 1999 when Florida State was a perfect 8-for-8.
- The last time FSU lost an ACC series to a team that did not qualify for the NCAA Tournament was in 1994 when the Seminoles lost 2-of-3 from Duke in Tallahassee (1-4, 11-7, 4-5).

FINE ACC START

- Florida State reached the halfway point of the ACC season with a 13-2 record marking the Seminoles best start in the league since opening the 2012 campaign at 14-1
- The Seminoles went on to finish atop the Atlantic Division standings in 2014 with a 21-9 record marking the second straight year FSU reached 20 wins and the third time in the last four years.
- This season marks the seventh time in school history that Florida State has opened play in the ACC with a record of 13-2 or better since joining the league in 1992.

THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Florida State put together a home record of 25-7 following the 2014 regular season schedule.
- Last year, the Noles went 35-5 on their home turf.
- FSU has reached the 30-win plateau at home 28 times since Mike Martin became head coach in 1980 including 11 times since 1999.
- The most home wins in the Martin era came in 1986 when FSU finished the season 45-4.
- In the NCAA Tournament, FSU is 99-37 at home including a streak of 16 straight regional wins inside the friendly confines of Dick Howser Stadium.

67 & COUNTING

- Florida State first fielded an intercollegiate baseball program in 1948.
- Since that very first team took the field, no Seminole baseball team has ever posted a losing record.
- The Seminoles extended their current streak of consecutive winning seasons to 67 in row in 2014 following an extra inning victory over Wake Forest on April 19.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- Florida State has played in its share of doubleheaders the last two seasons including five in 2014 and five last year.
- The way the Seminoles have responded to playing in those doubleheaders this year is what is impressive sweeping all five including four against ACC foes - NC State, at Clemson, at Boston College and Notre Dame.
- Over the last two years, FSU is 16-4 when playing doubleheaders.

SHUTOUTS ON THE YEAR

- FSU registered its seventh shutout of the season after blanking Duke in Tallahassee 3-0 on May 15.
- Florida State's shutout over Virginia on April 26 snapped the Cavaliers' streak of scoring at least one run in consecutive games at 156.
- FSU has posted shutouts against Niagara, Maryland, at Boston College, Stetson, Virginia, at North Carolina and Duke
- Florida State has now registered seven shutouts in each of the last three seasons and 29 total since 2010.

PITCHING UNDER MARTIN

- Heading into the NCAA Tournament, the 2014 Seminole pitching staff is once again making a push to become one of the bests at Florida State since Mike

Martin became head coach in 1980.

- FSU's 3.02 ERA currently sits tied for the fifth lowest in the Martin era, 10 points higher than last year's club that finished the year with a 2.92 ERA.
- Last year's pitching staff finished with the third lowest ERA in the Martin era and the lowest since the 1995 squad posted a 2.72 ERA.
- In his 35 years of serving as head coach at Florida State, Martin has had four pitching staffs finish a season with an ERA below 3.00.

- FSU has scored three or more runs in an inning from the seventh inning on 29 different times this year.
- The Seminoles are 37-1 when leading a game after seven innings of play

OUTFIELD ASSISTS

- Florida State enters the NCAA Tournament with nine outfield assists including a team-high three from right fielder Josh Delph.
- The Seminoles went through the first three months of the season compiling just three outfield assists.
- Since May, FSU has six outfield assists including five in its last seven games.
- DJ Stewart recorded two assists against Virginia in the ACC Tournament marking the first time a Seminole had two outfield assists in the same game since Seth Miller at two at Miami on April 6, 2013.
- The Seminoles recorded 17 outfield assists last year including 10 from Seth Miller.

A RUN AT NO. 1

- Florida State had a run of four straight weeks of being ranked No. 1 in the nation (March 17 - April 7).
- FSU posted a record of 10-6 when ranked No. 1 this year.
- Before this year, the last time FSU earned the No. 1 ranking was May 21, 2012 when the Seminoles entered the ACC Tournament as the top-ranked team in the nation. FSU went on to play in the College World Series that year.
- FSU made its first appearance at No. 1 in 2012 on April 9 in the USA Today Coaches, Baseball America and NCBWA polls.
- That year the Seminoles held the No. 1 ranking in the Baseball America poll for seven consecutive weeks; a total of six weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll; five total weeks in the NCBWA poll; and one week by Collegiate Baseball.
- UVa is the lone No. 1 team that FSU has played in 2014 as the Noles are 1-2 vs. a top-ranked team this year.

WALK-OFF HITS IN 2014

- **Jose Brizuela** delivered a walk-off base hit down the line in left in the 13th inning to lead Florida State to a 9-8, come-from-behind victory over No. 7 NC State in game two of a doubleheader on March 15.
- With the game tied at eight and the winning run at second base, Brizuela took the first pitch he saw down the line in left for the game-winning single.
- It marked his first career walk-off hit, the first by FSU in 2014 and the first for the Seminoles since Stephen McGee's run scoring single in the bottom of the ninth against UCF at home on May 5, 2013.
- **Casey Smit** registered his first career walk-off hit on April 4 against Notre Dame. With the game tied 7-7 in the bottom of the 12, Smit laced an RBI single to left scoring Gage West from third for the game-winner.
- Smit's walk-off hit was the second by a Seminole hitter in 2014.
- **John Nogowski** joined the ranks of walk-off hits in 2014 with his ninth inning single against Minnesota in game one of a doubleheader. Nogowski drilled a 0-2 pitch through the left side of the infield with the winning run at third and the game tied 4-4 for his first career game-winning hit.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Road wins are always hard to come by and this year Florida State is 18-8 away from the friendly confines of Mike Martin Field at Dick Howser Stadium.
- FSU is outscoring the opposition 168-98 through

26 road games while hitting .264 as a team. On the mound, the Seminoles have posted a team ERA of 3.33, while opponents are hitting .238.

- FSU started the 2014 season winning its first five road contests something they haven't done since 2012 when the Seminoles swept the three game series at Georgia Tech and won the first two games of the series at Boston College.
- What's even more impressive are the fans coming out to see the Seminoles on the road as FSU has set record crowds at Jacksonville, USF and UCF, while the 5,657 out hand in Gainesville tied for the 10th largest crowd in school history.
- A crowd of 10,125 were on hand at the Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville to see game two between Florida State & Florida - the third largest crowd to witness a game at the Grounds between those two schools.
- At Stetson on May 6, FSU played in front of the fourth largest crowd at Conrad Park with 2,883 on hand.
- For the year, FSU's average road attendance is 3,261 through 25 dates. A number that would rank as the 16th highest nationally.

SUNSHINE STATE SUCCESS

- Florida State completed the 2014 regular season with a record of 12-5 against schools from the state of Florida.
- Last year, FSU posted series victories over all seven schools they faced (Jacksonville, Miami, FGCU, UF, USF, UCF & Stetson).
- The Noles finished the regular season 17-2 against schools from the Sunshine State a season ago.
- Dating back to the start of the 2011 season, FSU is 53-16 against its in-state rivals.
- Here is a look at the Florida schools FSU will play this year:

COMPLETE GAMES

- Three different Florida State pitchers have registered a complete game in 2014 including two by shut-outs and two by Luke Weaver.
- **Mike Compton** pitched the first on March 9 against Maryland, followed by **Brandon Leibrandt** on March 22 (G1) at Clemson and then **Luke Weaver** on March 28 (G1) against Boston College in Rhode Island.
- Weaver tossed his second complete game of the season at Wake Forest on April 18 allowing just three hits, a walk and one run as he struck out seven in a 3-1 victory.
- Weaver became the first Seminole to register two complete games in a season since Sean Gilmartin threw two during his freshman campaign in 2009.
- Compton and Weaver each have thrown a complete game shutout in 2014.
- The four total complete games by Florida State are the second most in the ACC trailing only Notre Dame, who has five.
- The last time FSU's pitching staff registered three or more complete games came during the 2002 season as the Seminoles registered four (Matt Lynch - 3; Blair Varnes - 1).
- The last time three different pitchers threw a com-

- Compton scattered just two hits, both two-out singles, and did not walk a batter in 9.0 innings of work. He finished with a career-high 10 strikeouts in his first career complete game.

- The complete game shutout was the first by a Seminole pitcher since Rhett James blanked Virginia 8-0 in Charlottesville back on May 7, 2004.

- Leibrandt's came against Clemson in an 11-1 victory. He allowed an unearned run on four hits as he walked two and struck out one.

- It marked his second career complete game and first covering nine innings. His first came in an eight-inning loss at Virginia back on April 20, 2013.

- Weaver became the third Seminole pitcher to throw a complete game in 2014.

- Weaver's complete game, one-hit shutout was the first of his career in a 6-0 win over Boston College.

NINTH INNING RALLY

- Florida State made the improbable ninth inning comeback in the second game against Boston College at the University of Rhode Island on March 28.

- Trailing 7-2, the Seminoles scored nine runs in the inning capped by John Nogowski's grand slam to break a 7-7 tie.

- It marked the most runs scored by the Seminoles in the ninth inning since plating 11 against Maryland in College Park back on May 11, 2003. Trailing 7-6 in that game, FSU defeated Maryland 17-7.

NICE CROWDS

- The Florida State/Miami series drew 18,094 over its three-game series from Feb. 28 - Mar. 2.

- The mark fell just shy of the three-game attendance record set in 2008 when the FSU/UM series drew 19,062.

- Entering this week, FSU sits sixth nationally in total attendance drawing 163,069 in 32 dates, while its average of 5,095 ranks seventh.

- Florida State set records for total attendance and average attendance in 2008 with 202,132 and 4,930, respectively.

- The Seminoles have already welcomed the eighth, 10th and 15th largest crowds in school history this year - vs. Miami (3/1) - 6,593; vs. Georgia (2/22) - 6,568; vs. Florida (4/8) - 6,514.

- On the road this year, Florida State has set record crowds at Jacksonville (attd-3,000/cap-3,000), USF (3,615/3,211) and UCF (3,953/3,600).

- The Seminoles helped the Knights set a series attendance record as 7,058 was the called attendance for the two-game mid-week series. The previous record was 5,851 when the Seminoles last visited Orlando in 2011.

- For the year, FSU's average road attendance is 3,089 over 22 dates. A number that would rank as the 19th highest nationally.

BIG INNING

- Florida State has scored four or more runs in an inning 33 times in 2014.

- The biggest run producing innings for the Seminoles have come against Boston College (9 runs/9th inning), Niagara (8 runs/5th inning), Miami (7 runs/6th inning), Maryland (7 runs/8th inning) and at UCF (7 runs/7th inning).

- Last year, FSU scored four or more runs in an inning 39 times including a nine-run inning against Stetson (3/20).

ANSWERING THE CALL

- Through 58 games, opponents have scored a run in just 121 of a possible 525 innings (23.0%).

- The Seminoles have answered their opponents call with a run in the next half inning 44 times (36.4%).

- Eighteen times that call has been answered from the sixth inning to the end of the game.

- Florida State answered Niagara's two-run seventh with five runs in the bottom of the inning on opening day (2/14) and then answered Georgia's run scoring fourth (2/21) with six in the bottom of the inning.

- The Seminoles performed the feat three times against Miami including in the series finale breaking a 6-6 tie with seven runs in the bottom of the sixth inning.

- Florida State also answered the call three times on the road at UCF including a pair of three-run innings in the fifth and seventh that evened the game both times with the Seminoles trailing.

- Against NC State in the series finale, the Seminoles scored twice in the bottom of the 13th after NC State scored one to take a 8-7 lead.

WALK IT OUT

- Florida State has finished no lower than third in the nation in drawing walks since 2008.

- The Seminoles have led the nation four times during that six-year span including 2008 (435), 2010 (402), 2011 (381) and 2012 (386).

- Last year, Florida State finished among the nation's best drawing 359 walks to close out the year third nationally. In 2009, the Noles finished second with 386.

- Florida State is once again being patient at the plate in 2014 drawing 319 walks through 58 games.

- The Seminoles currently lead the ACC in walks and on-base percentage at .394.

- Entering the NCAA Tournament, FSU also leads the nation in walks.

- Justin Gonzalez leads the team with 46 walks followed by John Nogowski and DJ Stewart with 42 and 38, respectively. All three rank in the top 10 in the ACC with Gonzalez sitting third.

- Including this year, Florida State has drawn 2668 walks the last seven years.

OUCH! THAT HURTS

- Florida State set the school record for hit-by-pitches posting 104 in 2013 - marking the first time a Seminole team has reached triple digits in the hit-by-pitch category.

- The mark eclipsed the old school record of 97 set in 66 games during the 2001 campaign.

- The 104 HBP led the ACC and ranked eighth nationally.

- Florida State picked up where they left off from last year registering nine hit-by-pitches in the three-game series sweep of Niagara.

- Through 58 games in 2014, FSU has recorded 81 hit-by-pitches.

- John Sansone leads all Seminoles with 17 HBPs followed by Jose Brizuela with 11.

- Justin Gonzalez tied a single-game school record when he was hit three times against Niagara (2/15) in the second game of the season. The previous single-record record was set by Karl Jernigan as he was hit three times against St. Joseph's on March 6, 2001.
- Gonzalez sits in sole possession of fifth place on FSU's all-time with 39 career hit-by-pitches.
- John Sansone is the clubhouse leader with 30 HBPs since the start of the 2013 season.
- The single-season school record for HBP is 24 by Jose Zabala set in 1997. Karl Jernigan holds the all-time school record at 61 (1998-2001).

FSU BASEBALL - AMONG THE ELITE

- Success is synonymous with Florida State Baseball as the program entered its 67th year of existence in 2014.
- In 18 of the last 23 seasons, the Seminoles have claimed the ACC regular season title or finished with the best record in the league, won the ACC Tournament title or advanced to the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.
- All of this is pretty impressive for a school that has the most wins and the highest winning percentage in Division I since 2000 and the second highest winning percentage all-time in Division I history.
- On top of all that, the most impressive stat is the fact that Florida State baseball has never endured a losing season in 66 years.

- The junior southpaw has 20 career pick-offs, the most by a Seminole pitcher dating back to 1996. Tony Richie, who caught for two seasons (2002-03), tallied 14 career pick-offs.

- The Seminoles are one of four schools in Division I where its entire coaching staff graduated from the school they are currently coaching at. That list includes:

 - The Citadel - 4 coaches

ACC PLAYER/PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- **Jose Brizuela** was named ACC Player of the Week on March 3 for the first time in his career as he led the Seminoles to their fifth straight regular season series victory over Miami.
- Brizuela led FSU with a .462 average posting team highs in hits (6) and RBIs (6).
- The junior third baseman tied a career-high with back-to-back three hit games in the second and third games of the series.
- **Luke Weaver** earned his first career ACC Pitcher of the Week honor after taking down Carlos Rodon and the NC State Wolfpack on March 14.
- Weaver picked up his fourth win in five starts working 6.1 innings in a 6-1 FSU victory.
- The DeLand, Fla., native gave up just one run on seven hits as he walked two and struck out seven. He struck out the side in the first and retired the 10 of the first 11 batters that he faced.
- **Weaver** earned the honor for the second time in 2014 on March 31 after tossing a complete game, one-hit shutout against Boston College in Rhode Island.
- Weaver no-hit the Eagles for 7.2 innings. It marked his first career complete game as a Seminole.
- **Casey Smit** was named ACC Player of the Week for the first time in his career on April 7. The senior from Tampa, Fla., hit .471 in four games with a home run and nine RBI.
- Smit recorded the walk-off hit in the bottom of the 12th against Notre Dame in game one of the series, while registering the go-ahead base hit in three of FSU's four games during the week.

FIRST VISIT TO RHODE ISLAND

- Florida State made its first ever visit to the state of Rhode Island when the Seminoles faced Boston College for a three-game conference series.
- The series, originally scheduled to play in Chestnut Hill, was switched to Bill Beck Field on the campus of the University of Rhode Island due to unplayable field conditions at BC.
- Florida State swept the three game series from Boston College outscoring the Eagles 27-8. FSU hit .227 as a team while hold BC to a .191 clip.
- FSU is no stranger to the baseball program at URI having played the Rams in back-to-back three game series in 2012 & 2013 on Mike Martin Field inside Dick Howser Stadium.

SERIES VICTORY AT CLEMSON

- Florida State swept a Saturday doubleheader against Clemson to claim its first series victory inside Doug Kingsmore Stadium since 2008.
- Prior to the three-game series sweep over the Tigers in 2008, FSU was 1-5 at Clemson.
- Florida State is now 21-31 all-time in Clemson.

WOLFPACK SWEEP

- Thanks to a walk-off RBI single by Jose Brizuela in the bottom of the 13th inning, Florida State completed the regular season series sweep of NC State.

- Florida State passed its first road test of the year defeating Jacksonville 12-6 this past Tuesday.
