
Scrimmage No. 1 -- Gold 71, Garnet 68 TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Senior guard Antwuan Dixon scored 23 points on 10-of-16 shooting from the field to lead the Gold team to a 71-68 victory over the Garnet squad in Florida State's annual intra-squad scrimmage at the Leon County Civic Center. Dixon was on fire in the first half as he made three of four 3-point shot attempts and eight of ten shots overall. Dixon helped the Gold bolt to an early lead with his 19 first half points as his team led by as many as 10 points with five minutes elapsed in the first half. Dixon scored seven consecutive points on a dunk, a 3-pointer and a mid-range jump shot within a 56 second span to send the Gold on what seemed to be its way. He later added five consecutive points on a 3-point shot and a jumper to put the Gold team up, 31-28, with 6:26 remaining in the first half. The Garnet squad, led by Monte Cummings' 10 first half points, did not back down and surged back to a trail by on seven, 54-47, at halftime. Cummings scored 21 points during the game on an array of twisting and turning jump shots and two key 3-pointers to lead the Garnet squad. Cummings was nine-of-14 from the field, grabbed four rebounds and added three assists to lead three of his Garnet teammates in double-figure scoring. The Gold team held the lead for the most of the second half until a Cummings jumper put the Garnet up 66-64 with 6:14 remaining. A basket by junior Nigel Dixon (14 points and five rebounds), a dunk by Antwuan Dixon and a 3pointer by sophomore Michael Joiner (13 points and three rebounds) led the Gold on a 7-2 run to close of the game and take the victory. Sophomore Andrew Wilson was the fourth member of the Gold team in double figures with 10 points. Wilson, Nigel Dixon and junior Trevor Harvey led the team with five rebounds each. Cummings paced the Garnet team and was followed by freshman Anthony Richardson's 11 points and sophomore J.D. Bracy's 10 points. Junior Mike Mathews led the Garnet with a game -high six rebounds. Delvon Arrington had seven points and six assists.




Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 62, Nike Elite 61

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Senior Antwuan Dixon hit a 3-point shot with 10 seconds remaining in the second half to lead the Florida State men's basketball team to a 62-61 victory over the Nike Elite All-Stars in an exhibition game at the Leon County Civic Center. Dixon's basket from the left of the top of the key came after Nike's Darnell Haskins had put his team ahead with a short jumper and a free throw in the final 35 seconds of the game. The game was the first exhibition of the pre-season for Florida State and the third for the Nike All-Stars. The Seminoles close their exhibition Saturday at home against the EA All-Stars while Nike falls to 0-3 on its eightgame tour of the ACC, SEC and Big East. Dixon finished with a team-high tying 13 points with none more important that his final shot of the game. Dixon received a pass from senior point guard Delvon Arrington who had penetrated into the lane before kicking the ball out to Dixon. Dixon hit the bottom of the net to give the Seminoles the victory. Nike missed on a chance at the buzzer to win the game when Haskins, who had seven points, was off the mark on the final shot of the game. 

Exhibition 2 -- Florida State 110, EA Sports Southeast All-Stars 92

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Senior Antwuan Dixon scored a gamehigh 22 points to lead the Florida State men's basketball team to a 110-92 victory over the EA All-Stars in an exhibition men's basketball game at the Leon County Civic Center this afternoon. It was the final exhibition game of the preseason for the Seminoles who open their season at No. 5-ranked Florida Friday night. Florida State shot 69 percent from the field and scored 70 points in the second half. After making only 12 of 34 shots in the first half, the Seminoles made 29 of 42 shots and outrebounded the All-Stars 22-7 to gain the victory. Florida State made 46 field goals and had a 46-26 rebounding advantage for the game. Dixon scored 18 second-half points on a variety of dunks, short jumpers and 3-point shots. He was seven-of eight from the field including three of four from beyond the 3-point arc in the second half. Dixon's brilliant second half allowed the Seminoles erase as much as a 13-point first half deficit to win the game going away. Dixon was one of four Seminoles who scored in double figures. Also in double figure scoring were senior guards $\bar{\text{Monte}}$ Cummings and Delvon Arrington, with 17 and 15 respectively and junior forward Nigel Dixon who scored 10 points. Arrington recorded a double-double of 15 points and 12 rebounds while Nigel Dixon had a double-double of 10 points and 14 rebounds. Florida State head coach Steve Robinson played all 16 players in his roster and 14 found the scoring column. Florida State scored the first six points of the second half to take a 48-42 lead with only 1:26 elapsed in the half. Antwuan Dixon scored six points and Arrington added two during the surge. A 3-point shot by Andrew Wilson stretched the Seminoles lead to 66-53 with 14:11 remaining. Florida State lead by as many as 19 in the second half and won the game by 18. Former University of Virginia star Curtis Staples led the All-Stars with 20 points on six-of-12 shooting from the 3-point arc. The All-Stars made 15-of-29 shots from beyond the arc for the game. Staples scored 11 first-half points as the traveling team of former collegians led by as many as 13 in the second half and held a 42-40 halftime lead. Florida State travels to Florida to open the regular season Friday night at 7:00. The Seminoles play their home opener against Savannah State on Nov. 20.



Game No. 2-- Florida State 93, Savannah State 41

TALLAHASSEE -- Freshmen Anthony Richardson and Adam Waleskowski led a group of six players in double figures Tuesday night as Florida State routed Savannah State 93-41 to match its biggest margin in 33 years. The Seminoles (1-1) took a 42-17 halftime lead over the cold shooting visitors and led 93-39 on Richardson's last of three 3-point baskets. He finished with 12 points, Waleskowski added 11 while four players - Michael Joiner, Antwuan Dixon, Monte Cummings and J.D. Bracy each scored 10 points. Savannah State (0-2) was led by Armond Burnett's 14 points. No other Tiger player scored more than four points. Florida State shot 51.5 percent for the game, including 50 percent from 3-point distance, hitting a dozen of 24 attempts. It was the Seminoles largest margin of victory since a 104-52 win over New Hampshire, Dec. 30, 1968. Savannah State, which finished 4-21 a year ago, made only 23.8 percent of its shots and was only 1 of 14 from 3-point distance. The Tigers didn't score for the first 5:50 of the game and didn't reach double figures until there was 5:54 left in the half and they were behind 28-9.



TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Nigel Dixon, Florida State's 335pound junior center, scored a career-high 28 points to lead the Seminoles to an 89-59 victory over Elon (N.C.) College at the Leon County Civic Center. Dixon scored Florida State's first seven points in the game and finished with 17 in the second half. He shot 13-of-18 from the field and grabbed a game-high eight rebounds. Dixon's previous career-high was 23 points last year against Rhode Island. Florida State led 43-30 at halftime and opened its biggest lead at 86-54 with 1:54 left in the game. Steven Harvin and Quinton McCleod, who each scored 10 points, led Elon. 

EVANSTON, III. — Winston Blake scored 18 points Wednesday, including a 3-pointer with 11 seconds left, as Northwestern held off Florida State 57-50 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Jitim Young added 19 points for Northwestern, which beat Florida State for the first time in three tries. and Monte Cummings each had 10 points for Florida State. Blake made a 3-pointer to give Northwestern a 50-44 lead with 7:51 left to play. But Cummings and Mike Mathews made back-to-back baskets to pull Florida State within 52-49 with 3:43 left. The Seminoles and Wildcats traded airballs on their next few possessions, before Florida State got a break. With 1:28 left, Tavaras Hardy fouled Mathews. But Mathews could only make the second shot, and Blake's 3 with 11 seconds left gave the Wildcats a small cushion. Young then stole the inbounds pass and scored on a layup to seal the win. Northwestern got off to a sluggish start, rarely venturing inside. That might have been a good move, considering that's where Nigel Dixon, Florida State's 350-pound center, was lurking. But the Wildcats didn't have much better luck outside, shooting just 29 percent (4of-14) from 3-point range. The Seminoles also outrebounded Northwestern 21-18, including an 8-4 advantage on the offensive glass. Still, the Wildcats only trailed 28-27 at half. 





WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- Darius Songaila scored 29 points and Jamaal Levy added 15, both career-highs, to lead No. 19 Wake Forest to a 93-72 victory over Florida State in an Atlantic Coast Conference opener. Josh Howard added 14 points and Antwan Scott had 13 for Wake Forest. Monte Cummings scored 16 points for Florida State while Delvon Arrington added 14 and Nigel Dixon had 12.
