QUICK HITS

- The Seminoles are ranked No. 3 in both the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and USA Today/NFCA poll. It marks the highest ranking of 2014 and the highest since coming in at No. 3 in the week nine NFCA poll of 2004.
- Florida State is currently ranked No. 7 in the NCAA RPI.
- The Seminoles are the No. 8 seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Women's College World Series for the eighth time in program history.
- FSU won its 12th ACC Championship with a 3-1 win vs. Notre Dame on May 10.
- The Seminoles have eight wins versus ranked teams in 2014 at No. 6 Florida, vs. No. 9 Nebraska, at No. 11 Alabama, vs. No. 13 Michigan (twice), vs. Notre Dame (No. 20 and No. 23) and at No. 25 Auburn
- Florida State has started the season 55-6 which has included a pair of 17-game winning streaks (Feb. 7 to March 1 and March 12 to April 6) as well as a 15-game streak (April 13 to May 18).
- The FSU pitching staff has combined to allow only 296 hits and 121 runs (84 earned) through 408.2 innings this year. Seminoles in the circle are second in the NCAA with a 1.44 ERA, have recorded 424 strikeouts on the season and are allowing a .195 average.
- Redshirt junior Maddie O'Brien leads the FSU offense with a .431 average (72-for-167), 17 doubles, 24 home runs, 83 RBI, 61 runs scored and 54 walks. She currently has a .964 slugging percentage and a .568 on-base percentage.

FLORIDA STATE WCWS HISTORY

- Florida State softball comes to Oklahoma City making its eighth Women's College World Series appearance. Its last trip to the biggest stage in collegiate softball came in 2004.
- Florida State is making its first NCAA WCWS appearance under the updated NCAA Tournament format that includes the institution of super regionals in 2005.
- The 2014 WCWS marks the second straight time Florida State has entered the final field of eight with a USA Softball National Player of the Year finalist. In its last trip in 2004, FSU garnered the player of the year in Jessica van der Linden (now Jessica Boulware). This year, junior pitcher Lacey Waldrop is one of three finalists for the national honor.

- Florida State's eight WCWS appearances are the 10th-most by a Division I school.
- The 2014 Noles have been compared to its 2004 team that last made the WCWS in many ways. The 2014 squad enters the field hitting .309, while the 2004 team finished the year batting .288. In the circle, FSU's current team shows a 1.44 team ERA while the 2004 Noles ended their season with a 0.62 ERA to represent a statistical trend in the rise of offenses over the last decade.
- In an era of more parity in collegiate softball, Florida State enters the WCWS with not only the most wins amongst the field, but also the most wins in the nation. The Noles have 55 wins this season, their most since winning 62 in 2004.
- Florida State head coach Lonni Alameda is very familiar with the Sooner State. She attended the University of Oklahoma from 1989-1993 and was a two-time all-Big Eight selection as a softball player for the Sooners. Alameda also played volleyball for OU, earned her bachelor's degree in communications from there, and even worked in the athletic department's sports information office for a little while.
- As an assistant or head coach, Alameda is making her second appearance at the WCWS but her first as a head coach.
 As an assistant coach at Stanford from 1996-2003, Alameda helped the Cardinal tie for a third-place finish in the 2001
 WCWS. She was the pitching coach for the Cardinal, guiding All-America pitcher Dana Sorensen to a 27-5 season.
 ESPN's Jessica Mendoza also finished that year with a .405 average, 14 HRs and 46 RBI.
- The Seminoles' 55 overall wins are their fourth-most in school history when entering the WCWS. Their current win total through the super regionals is only surpassed by the 1991 and 2004 team's 61 victories, and the 1992 team's 63 wins entering the WCWS.
- FSU is one of only two teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference to have ever reached the WCWS. Virginia Tech advanced to the 2008 WCWS. Six of Florida State's eight appearances have been as members of the ACC.
- Florida State Athletics is vying for its 14th national championship in its collective history, including its first since the Seminole football team defeated Auburn, 34-31, in the 2014 BCS Championship Game. Included in that are 10 NCAA championships, with three going to men's outdoor track and field (2006, 2007*, 2008), two to men's gymnastics (1951, 1952), one to women's outdoor track and field (1985), one to women's indoor track and field (1985) and three to FSU football (1993, 1999, 2013).
- FSU softball holds two AIAW national championships under legendary head coach JoAnne Graf in 1981 and 1982. Graf, who retired in the summer 2013 after teaching at Florida State, holds 1,437 all-time wins including 1,186 NCAA wins (1984-2008).
- FSU freshman Ryann Day has some Seminole WCWS bloodlines. Her mother, the former Lori Crouse, played at FSU as a standout first baseman from 1986-89. Lori participated in the 1987 WCWS, which was the first appearance by the Seminoles. Ryann also came to Oklahoma City in 1987 and was a bat girl for the team.
- Several current Noles including top talents Lacey Waldrop, Maddie O'Brien and Tiffani Brown have attended the WCWS in recent years to help conduct clinics and take in the experience. Brown and Waldrop have blogged about their hope of one day reaching the biggest stage in college softball and now have fulfilled their next goal.
- The Noles hope to reverse their trend of slow starts in the WCWS. In their seven appearances, FSU has won its opening game only in 1990 (1-0 vs. Fresno State) and 2002 (2-1 vs. UCLA). Those are also the only two years FSU has won two games in the WCWS.




Ryann Day (in gold helmet) at 1987 WCWS

'NOLES FOR NATIONAL AWARDS

On April 9, Maddie O'Brien and Lacey Waldrop were announced to be Top 25 Finalists for the 2014 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year by The Amateur Softball Association (ASA) of America and USA Softball. The pair of juniors have been among the best in the country at their positions this season and were chosen as two of the top 10 finalists for the award on May 7. Waldrop was named one of the top three finalists on May 21 and looks to be the first Seminole to win the award since Jessica van der Linden in 2004.

Redshirt freshman Jessica Burroughs was named as one of the top 25 finalists for the inaugural NFCA Division I National Freshman of the Year trophy on April 17.




Maddie O'Brien - Shortstop - Junior - Palm Harbor, Fla.

- Leads the NCAA in slugging (.964) and RBI (83), second in RBI/game (1.34) and home runs (24), and third in the nation in HR/game (0.39) and on base pct (.568)
- Top-30 in the country in five other categories walks (0.87 5th), batting average (.431 – 24th), runs (0.98 – 30th) and sacrifice flies (4 – 30th)
- 2014 ACC Player of the Year 2014 ACC All-Tournament Team
- Reached base in 18 consecutive plate appearances over five games from April 16-20. She went 5-for-5 with two 2B, two HR, seven RBI, 12 BB (five IBB) and an HBP
- Batting .431 (72-for-167) on the season with over 56% of her hits going for extra bases – 17 doubles and 24 home runs
- Has 26 multi-RBI and 21 multi-hit games in 2014
- Leads the ACC in six statistical categories including HR, RBI, slugging and walks
- FSU record holder for single season home runs (24) and RBI (83); Career home run leader (42) and career RBI leader (173)
- Batting .389 (14-for-36) with six home runs, 14 walks, 14 RBI and eight runs scored in games against ranked opponents this season

Lacey Waldrop - Pitcher - Junior - Chester, Va.

- 2014 ACC Pitcher of the Year 2014 ACC All-Tournament Team
- Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I National Player of the Week (March 4)
- Named ACC Pitcher of the Week seven times in 2014 and 12 times in her career
- Leads the NCAA lead with 38 victories and is third in the country with a 1.01 ERA 37 earned runs on 257.1 innings pitched
- Allowed more than one earned run in only eight of her 46 appearances in 2014
- · Has thrown three no-hitters this season and five in her career
- Lowest batting average allowed in the ACC (.184)
- Ranks 14th in the NCAA with 282 strikeouts, 26th in hits per 7 inn (4.73), 43rd in strikeouts per 7 inn (7.7)
- Has allowed more than three hits just 12 times in her last 34 appearances
- Eight wins against Top 25 teams in 2014, including two vs. top 10 teams; 1.71 ERA, 77.2 IP, 65 strikeouts and 26 walks against ranked opponents
- Pitched all 14.0 innings of both games against Michigan on May 23, allowing just two runs and recorded six strikeouts to avoid elimination and send FSU to the WCWS





Jessica Burroughs - Pitcher - Freshman - Warner Robins, Ga.

- Top-5 in the ACC in nine different categories and is second in the conference in ERA (2.02), runs allowed (34) and opponent batting average (.192)
- Has a 17-1 record, 2.02 ERA with 120 strikeouts over 110.2 innings in 2014
- Retired 19 in a row en route to a complete game victory over NC State on March 16, recording 10 strikeouts, allowing only two base runners in the entire game.
- Recorded at least eight strikeouts in seven starts and has 18 appearances of giving up one earned run or fewer
- Tossed 5.0 innings, posted nine strikeouts and allowed two hits without giving up an earned run at Pitt on April 16
- Pitched a one-hit shutout at Virginia on March 8 while recording eight strikeouts.
- Came in and pitched 5.0 innings of relief and allowed just one run on four hits to earn the win in the ACC Quarterfinal against Georgia Tech on May 8.
- Recorded four strikeouts in 2.0 innings in an NCAA Regional game against Fordham on May 16

NO. 8 NCAA SEED

Florida State was named the No. 8 seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament and hosted a regional for the first time since 2009. The Seminoles were NCAA Regional hosts three other times – 2001, 2002 and 2004.

This is the 15th straight season that FSU has made the NCAA Tournament and is just one of nine schools to play in the post-season every year since 2000. The other schools are Alabama, Arizona, Louisiana-Lafayette, Michigan, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, UCLA and Washington.

FSU has an overall record of 58-58 in the NCAA Tournament over 27 appearances. The Seminoles are 50-39 in the regional rounds with six wins at the Women's College World Series. Florida State finished in a tie for third place at the WCWS in both 1990 and 2002.

AGAINST THE 2014 WCWS

The Seminoles played against both Florida and Alabama earlier this season and split the two-game series with each team.

Historically, Florida State is 39-48 all-time against the other seven school in the 2014 WCWS – Alabama (3-5), Baylor (2-4), Florida (14-19), Kentucky (1-1), Louisiana (9-9), Oklahoma (6-6) and Oregon (4-4).

SUPER REGIONAL HISTORY

Florida State played in its third Super Regional in program history and it was the first time that the Seminoles were Super Regional hosts.

Florida State is 2-5 in the Super Regional round as it was swept by Arizona State in 2006 and Texas in 2013 before taking two of three from Michigan in 2014.

NCAA ALL-REGIONAL TEAM

Three Florida State players were named to the NCAA Tallahassee All-Regional Team for their performances on May 16-18.

Lacey Waldrop was named the MVP after posting a 3-0 record, throwing two complete games, allowing just one run over 23.0 innings and striking out 18 batters.

Joining Waldrop on the All-Tournament team was Alex Kossoff who lead the team in hitting and her three hits against USF on May 17 were key in FSU's 11-inning 2-0 victory over the Bulls. Maddie O'Brien also received recognition for her offense, batting .400 with five walks and thee runs scored, but her amazing defense kept runners off the base paths and the scoreboard all weekend.

TOUGHEST REGIONAL

According to the NCAA RPI, the Tallahassee Regional was the most-talented set of teams out of the 16 regionals in the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

The average RPI of FSU, USF, South Carolina and Fordham was 32.5, lowest of all of the regionals. The next closest would be the Tuscaloosa Regional with an average RPI of 35 for its teams – Alabama, South Alabama, USC Upstate and SIU Edwardsville.

No. 1 overall seed Oregon had the highest RPI average in its regional with a score of 88.5 for the Ducks, Wisconsin, Albany and Utah Valley.

AGAINST THE FIELD OF 64

The Seminoles played against 12 teams that made the 2014 NCAA Tournament and posted a record of 17-5 against them during the regular season. Three teams – North Dakota State, Florida A&M and Charleston Southern – won their respective conferences this year.

NFCA ALL-REGION TEAM

Lacey Waldrop, Maddie O'Brien and Courtney Senas each were named to the NFCA All-Region First Team for the Southeast on May 15.

It was the first time that Florida State placed three members on the first team since 2004 when Jessica van der Linden, Casey Hunter, Veronica Wootson and Elisa Vasquez earned first team All-Region honors.

FSU tied Georgia for the most 2014 first team honorees with three, followed by Auburn with two.

NCAA LEADERS

Florida State has been dominating the opposition from the plate and from the circle. The Seminoles are among the best in collegiate softball in a number of team categories and as well as having seven individuals near the top of several categories, including Maddie O'Brien leading the NCAA with a .964 slugging percentage and 83 RBI. Lacey Waldrop is tied for the most victories in the country with 38.

ALL OVER THE ALL-ACC

The 2014 regular season champions of the ACC placed six players on the three teams of the All-ACC. Maddie O'Brien was named ACC Player of the Year and Lacey Waldrop earned ACC Pitcher of the Year honors.

O'Brien and Waldrop were joined on the All-ACC First Team by Courtney Senas.

Redshirt freshman Jessica Burroughs was the lone FSU selection to the All-ACC Second Team.

Victoria East and Briana Hamilton were both named to the All-ACC Third Team.

Head Coach Lonni Alameda also earned ACC Coach of the Year honors for the second straight season.

MADDIE AND LACEY ACC POYS

Lacey Waldrop and Maddie O'Brien earned two of the highest individual accolades the ACC can award by being named 2014 ACC Pitcher and Player of the Year, respectively.

It marked the first time in conference history that two different players from the same school have won both awards in the same season.

ALL-TIME ACC LISTS

Seniors Tiffani Brown and Courtney Senas, along with junior Maddie O'Brien have had such great careers at Florida State that they are among the best ever in ACC history.

Brown is fourth all-time in the ACC in runs (207), fifth in hits (284), seventh in stolen bases (109) and T-seventh in triples (22).

Senas has scored 180 runs which is ninth in ACC history.

O'Brien is fifth in ACC history in RBI (173), sixth all-time in walks (117) and eighth in home runs (42).

ALL-ACC TOURNAMENT TEAM

Celeste Gomez batted .667 (6-for-9) with five RBI, including the go-ahead RBI in the ACC Champiobship game, to earn MVP honors of the 2014 ACC Tournament

Joining her on the ACC All-Tournament Team were Lacey Waldrop, Kelly Hensley, Tiffani Brown and Maddie O'Brien. The five Seminoles are the most FSU has placed on the ACC All-Tournament Team since 2004. O'Brien tied ACC Tournament single-game records with two home runs and five RBI in the quarterfinal versus Georgia Tech and with her third home run against Notre Dame tied an overall tournament record with three home runs.

Brown earned three walks against GT to tie an ACC Tournament single game record. The 12 walks issued to Florida State by Georgia Tech on May 8 set a new ACC Tournament single-game record.

ACEY LACEY

Junior pitcher Lacey Waldrop has continued to be dominant in the circle for the Seminoles. She has won ACC Pitcher of the Week honors an ACC-record seven times this season and 12 times total in her career.

After surrendering four runs against No. 9 Nebraska on opening day, Waldrop allowed only 18 earned runs over her next 161.0 innings. She has only eight appearances this season where she has allowed more than one earned run.

She has 12 starts of allowing two or fewer hits, including a combined no-hitter against North Dakota State and two solo no-hitters at Virginia and against Florida A&M. She is allowing a .184 batting average which is the lowest in the ACC. Waldrop has posted 10 or more strikeouts in seven starts this season, including a season-high 14 strikeouts against UCF (2/19) and Florida A&M (3/26).

NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Lacey Waldrop was named Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I National Player of the Week on March 4 for helping FSU to two road wins over No. 25 Auburn and No. 11 Alabama. It marked the first time a Seminole had been awarded the national honor since Monica Perry in 2012. She joined Jessica van der Linden (2003, 2004), Brandi Stuart (2001) and Jennifer White-Cody (1998).

SENAS - SEE YA LATER

Senior centerfielder Courtney Senas is having a great season in her final campaign. She is batting .349 (67-for-192) with 12 doubles, four triples, 15 home runs, 57 RBI, 65 runs scored and 42 walks. She has posted multiple hits 20 times, scored multiple runs 19 times, driven in multiple RBI 14 times and drawn multiple walks eight times in 2014.

Senas has also shined in the outfield and has started each game in center field. She has four outfield assists this season including gunning down Michigan's Brandi Virgil at the plate on May 23 in the fifth inning of game three of the Tallahassee Super Regional and a nice double play after catching a line drive on April 27 to retire Georgia Tech's Ashley Thomas at first.

SHOT HEARD 'ROUND THE WORLD

Fans at the game in Tallahassee, back in her hometown of Wahiawa, Hawaii, and everywhere in between will remember the Courtney Senas home run on May 23 that sent Florida State to the 2014 Women's College World Series.

Senas came to the plate with game three of the Super Regional against No. 13 Michigan tied at 2-2 with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning. With Tiffani Brown on first base, Senas blasted a 1-1 pitch deep to left for a walk-off two-run home run to give FSU a 4-2 win and its first trip to the WCWS since 2004.

TERRIFIC TIFFANI

Redshirt senior Tiffani Brown has been explosive for Florida State in 2014. She leads the team with 25 stolen bases and five triples and is tied for the team lead with 65 runs scored. Against No. 9 Nebraska, Brown was a home run shy of the cycle as she went 3-for-5 with three RBI, including a bases-clearing triple to help lead FSU to a 5-1 victory.

Brown posted a 14-game hitting streak from February 28 to March 16. During the streak she batted .420 (21-for-50) with two doubles, one triple, 17 runs scored, six RBI, four walks and five stolen bases.

18 STRAIGHT

Maddie O'Brien was impossible for opposing pitchers to retire from April 16-20. Over the span of five games against both Pitt and Syracuse, O'Brien reached base in 18 straight plate appearances.

She was 5-for-5 with two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, 12 walks (five intentional) and was hit by a pitch in those 18 plate appearances. She tied an NCAA record with four intentional walks in a game at Pitt on April 16, and her eight consecutive walks ties an ACC record and is the third-longest streak in NCAA history.

FOOL ME ONCE....

Florida State is putting together one of the best seasons in recent memory and it is notable how even with seven losses the Seminoles can claim that they have defeated everyone they have played. All seven losses have been to seven different teams.

Five of the seven losses came against a team in the first meeting of the season – Nebraska, Alabama, Virginia, Notre Dame and Michigan. The Noles went on to win the very next game versus all five of those teams.

The other two losses – Florida and Virginia Tech – came after FSU had already defeated them earlier in the season.

AK IS OK!

Sophomore outfielder Alex Kossoff has been slapping her way to success this season. Playing in 59 games in 2014 with 50 starts, Kossoff is hitting an impressive .330 (35-for-106) with two doubles, 12 walks and 28 runs scored. She has reached base on 40.3 percent of her plate appearances.

She had the biggest game of her career on May 17 against USF in the NCAA Regional. She set a career high with three hits, including the go-ahead 2-run single in the top of the 11th inning to give FSU a 2-0 win and advance to the regional final.

ALWAYS A CLOSE GAME

Florida State leads the nation with 55 wins so far in 2014, and that total could have easily been higher as six of its losses this year have been in a close game.

The Seminoles have lost six games by a total of 10 runs – three 1-run games, two 2-run games and one 3-run game. FSU had the winning run to the plate in four of the six losses and the tying run in another.

CLUTCH HITTING

Celeste Gomez and Bailey Schinella have been great run producers with two outs. Gomez has driven in 34 RBI this season with 12 coming with two outs in an inning, and 12 of Schinella's 29 RBI have come in the same situation.

Back-to-back two-out hits by Schinella and Gomez brought in the go-ahead run as FSU went on to defeat Notre Dame 3-1 and win the 2014 ACC Championship.

As a team, the Seminoles have driven in 132 RBI with two outs this season. Maddie O'Brien is currently batting .396 (19-for-48) with two outs to lead the team.

NO HITS FOR YOU!

Starter Lacey Waldrop and reliever Bailey Schinella combined to throw a no-hitter against North Dakota State on February 15 in a five-inning 9-0 victory. Three walks given up by the duo were the only blemishes on their record.

Lacey Waldrop added a solo no-hitter at Virginia on March 9 as the Seminoles defeated the Cavaliers, 15-0. Waldrop posted another no-hitter on March 26 against Florida A&M in FSU's 8-0 win over the Rattlers.

The Seminoles have thrown three no-hitters in 2014 and there have been 14 total no-hitters recorded by a Lonni Alamedaled staff at Florida State.

KELLY'S BACK!

Senior Kelly Hensley returned to the Seminole lineup on March 15 after missing 25 games with an injury. She has played as the designated player and in the outfield and is batting .309 with eight doubles, two home runs, 23 walks, 21 RBI and 16 runs scored this season.

MASHING MADDIE

Redshirt junior Maddie O'Brien has been creating nightmares for opposing pitchers all year long. She has been named ACC Player of the Week three times this season.

Currently, the shortstop is batting a teamleading .431 (72-for-167) with 17 doubles, 24 home runs and 83 RBI. She is slugging .964 and gets on base in 56.8 percent of her plate appearances. The junior has recorded 26 multi-RBI games in 2014.

The shortstop has been almost equally as productive in ten games against ranked team as she is batting .389 with six home runs, 14 RBI, eight runs scored and 14 walks. She is slugging .889 and has on OBP of .558 against teams ranked in the top 25 this season.

O'Brien leads the team and the ACC in six statistical categories including home runs, slugging, on base percentage and RBI.

O'Brien reached base in each of the first 50 games this season and has been walked 54 times, including 13 intentional walks.

BEST SEASON EVER?

Junior Maddie O'Brien is putting together one of the best offensive seasons in Florida State history.

Even with more games to come in the Women's College World Series, O'Brien has already surpassed several categories through the first 62 games of 2014.

She has set the single-season RBI record by driving in 83 RBI so far in 2014, passing Yuruby Alicart's 56 set in 2007. O'Brien has hit also 24 home runs which is a new single-season record. In fact, her 24 home runs in 2014 would sit tied for seventh for a career at FSU. She also has 17 doubles, which is tied for third-most in a season.

DOUBLE DUTY SCHINELLA

Junior Bailey Schinella has been having a great year in many phases of the game. She is a relief pitcher and has also played offensively as the designated player or as an outfielder.

As a pitcher, Schinella has pitched 3.2 innings on four appearances and has yet to give up a run. She has allowed only two hits and one walk and has been a part of three shutouts including a no-hitter with Lacey Waldrop against North Dakota State on February 15.

As a hitter, Schinella has been excellent. In 54 games at the plate, she is batting .289 (37-for-128) with eight doubles, three home runs, 29 RBI, 36 walks and 22 runs scored. Her bases-clearing double against North Dakota State capped a five-run inning which propelled FSU to a 9-0 mercyrule victory.

Schinella dominated at the plate against Virginia in Charlottesville, Va. She finished the weekend batting .625 (5-for-8) with two doubles, one home run, three walks, seven RBI and five runs scored.

YOU SHALL NOT SCORE!

The Seminoles are second in the country with a 1.44 ERA and lead the eight teams in the WCWS with 41 games of allowing one or fewer runs.

FSU has recorded 19 shutouts and 22 games of allowing just one run to the opposition. In fact, the Seminoles have allowed more than one run just three times in their last 15 games, dating back to April 19.

BURROUGHS' BREAKOUT

Jessica Burroughs has not let her youth influence her performance in the circle. The redshirt freshman is 17-1 with a 2.02 ERA over 110.2 innings on the season with 120 strikeouts. Opposing batters average only .198 against her this year which is second-lowest in the ACC.

On April 17, Burroughs was named as one of the top 25 finalists for the inaugural NFCA Division I National Freshman of the Year trophy.

In the first start of her career against New Mexico State, she threw 4.0 scoreless innings and only surrendered one hit – a single to left in the fourth inning. It marked the first time that an FSU pitcher won the first start of their career since 2011.

Burroughs had a career game to wrap up a series sweep of NC State on March 16. She retired 19 in a row from the first inning until the seventh inning, recorded a career-high 10 strikeouts and allowed only two base runners (a single and a home run) in her complete game victory over the Wolfpack.

FRESH PRODUCE

Many freshman have made key contributions to Florida State's success in 2014. Ellie Cooper has played in 52 games with 23 starts for the 'Noles in a variety of positions. She has two doubles, 14 walks, nine RBI and 21 runs scored this season.

Stephanie Hartness has made 20 starts and played in 51 total games and is currently batting .306 (19-for-62) with three doubles, one home run, 11 walks, 13 runs scored and 18 RBI.

Victoria Daddis has eight hits, two doubles, two RBI and six walks in 29 games with six starts. Lauren Harris made her first career start against the UCSB Gauchos and in her first at bat of the game took a 1-1 pitch deep over the left field wall for a home run.

Alex Powers has played in 39 games including her first career start on April 6. She is batting .320 with 16 hits, three doubles, nine walks, 12 RBI and three runs scored.

Bella D'Errico has entered 44 games as a pinch runner and has 11 runs scored and two stolen bases.

Corey Hendrickson has played in 11 games and is 2-for-5 from the plate with a home run, three RBI and has scored four runs, including two as a pinch runner.

ACC SWEEP

Florida State posted a sweep over seven ACC opponents this year: NC State (March 15-16), at Boston College (March 22-23), at North Carolina (March 30-31), Maryland (April 5-6), Pitt (April 16), Syracuse (April 19-20) and Georgia Tech (April 26-27). The Seminoles have won 24 of their last 25 games against ACC opponents, and 44 of their last 48. They have swept the regular season series against 11 of their last 14 ACC opponents.

TAKING DOWN RANKED FOES

FSU is 8-5 versus ranked teams in 2014. The Seminoles defeated No. 9 Nebraska, 5-1, on Feb. 9, took down No. 25 Auburn, 5-4, on Feb. 26, beat No. 11 Alabama, 5-1, on March 2, defeated No. 6 Florida, 3-2, on April 2 and came from behind to beat No. 23 Notre Dame, 9-7 in nine innings, on April 13. Florida State faced Notre Dame again in the ACC Championship Game on May 10, this time when they were ranked No. 20, and defeated the Irish, 3-1, to win its 12th ACC title.

FSU also needed wins in the final two games against No. 13 Michigan in the NCAA Super Regional to avoid elimination and took game two, 6-0, and game three, 4-2.

The win over the Huskers marked the first time that the Seminoles have defeated a top-10 opponent since taking down No. 6 Georgia Tech on April 24, 2010. FSU added another top-10 victory with its win at No. 6 Florida on April 2.

Lonni Alameda now has 26 victories over a ranked opponent as head coach of Florida State. The 'Noles now have eight ranked wins in 2014 after having four in both 2013 and 2012. Florida State could add more ranked wins against the entire WCWS field.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Florida State has been been successful as a team, but Maddie O'Brien, Bailey Schinella, Lacey Waldrop and Jessica Burroughs have been recognized by the ACC for their individual performances by earning conference Player of the Week honors. Waldrop has won ACC Pitcher of the Week honors seven times this season (Feb. 10, Feb. 24, March 3 and March 17, March 24, March 31 and April 7), including NFCA National Player of the Week honors on March 4. Interestingly, she failed to win the award in two different weeks in which she threw a no-hitter - Week 2 vs. NDSU (combined with Bailey Schinella) and Week 5 at Virginia (solo).

O'Brien was an offensive force in Las Cruces, N.M., earning her ACC Player of the Week honors for Feb. 10. She also won the weekly award on April 7 after helping FSU to five wins, including a 3-2 victory in eight innings over Florida for the Seminoles' first in Gainesville since 2003. Maddie earned the conference award on April 21 after her nearly perfect week at the plate against Pitt and Syracuse. She finished with an .857 batting average, 2.143 slugging and .950 on base percentage as she was only

retired once in 20 plate appearances over five games.

Schinella was impressive both at the plate and in the circle against North Florida and Boston College to earn ACC Player of the Week on March 24. She batted .545 (6-for-11) with one home run, four runs scored, four RBI and five walks. Schinella posted a slugging percentage of .818 and reached base in .688 percent of her plate appearances in the five FSU victories. Schinella was brought in to pitch the final 0.2 innings against North Florida on March 19 and recorded two strikeouts as the Seminoles won 8-0.

Burroughs earned her first conference accolade on April 21 as she posted a 2-0 record and a 0.00 ERA over three starts against Pitt and Syracuse, recording 22 strikeouts over 14.0 innings against only five total walks.

NORI SAYS NO!

It hasn't mattered how the opposition has trained or schemed to be successful against redshirt senior pitcher Jessica Nori, she has shut them all down every time.

In 19 appearances in 2014, Nori has pitched 37.0 innings allowing seven walks and recording 20 strikeouts. She has an ERA of 2.84 on the season and has aided in five FSU shutouts.

She pitched the final 3.0 innings of relief against No. 11 Alabama to earn her fourth save of the season. Her four saves in 2014 ties a single-season record and her nine total career saves are the most in FSU history.

EYE FOR THE ZONE

The 2014 Seminoles have made opposing pitchers earn their outs as FSU has committed just 228 strikeouts so far this season for a 3.67 per game average.

That is the lowest K/game average for an FSU team since 2003 and second-lowest since 1998. Last season, the Seminoles struck out 290 times in 63 games, a 4.60 per game average.

ZERO STRIKEOUTS

The Seminoles made 30 plate appearances in their 4-2 win over No. 13 Michigan on May 23, but none of them resulted in a strikeout.

It marked the eighth time that Florida State has not committed a strikeout in a game in 2014.

BREAKING TEAM RECORDS

The 2014 Florida State team is putting together one of the greatest seasons in history as all-time records are already starting to fall.

With nine walks against Syracuse on April 20, the Noles surpassed the mark from 2004 of 252. Victoria East's solo HR on April 27 gave FSU 317 RBI for the season to break the all-time mark set in 2013.

Bailey Schinella's run in the fifth inning against North Carolina on May 9 gave FSU 370 runs and broke the record from 2004.

Celeste Gomez hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning against Michigan on May 23, FSU's 61st of the season, to set a new single-season record.

The Noles are also on the verge of breaking the all-time marks in a few other categories this season.

30/30 CAREERS

After hitting a two-run home run at Boston College on March 22 to give her 30 career home runs, Maddie O'Brien became the first FSU player to hit 30 doubles and 30 home runs in a career. O'Brien currently has 38 doubles and 42 home runs in her career.

Courtney Senas joined the list with her 30th career HR on April 16. She currently has 36 HR and 37 doubles in her career.

SHUT IT DOWN, LET'S GO HOME

Florida State has won 17 games by mercy rule this season, including five games where the Seminoles had walk-off hits to reach the eight-run advantage in the bottom of the fifth or sixth inning.

The Seminoles had their first walk-off in the seventh inning or later on May 23 as Courtney Senas blasted a two-run home run with two outs in the bottom of the seventh of game three of the NCAA Super Regional against Michigan on May 23.

WATCHIN' WALDROP & O'BRIEN

Pitcher Lacey Waldrop was selected to the Watch List for the 2014 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award and also made it into the group Top 25 finalists announced on April 9.

Shortstop Maddie O'Brien did not garner the preseason attention as Waldrop, but her play on the field in 2014 cannot be ignored. The leads the NCAA in several categories and the ACC in numerous others. O'Brien joined Waldrop on the Top 25 list for the Player of the Year award.

Both O'Brien and Waldrop remained eligible when the list was pared down to 10 finalists on May 7. Oregon and Alabama are the only schools to also had two players remaining for the award.

Waldrop was named one of the three finalists and the 2014 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year will be announced on May 27 prior to the start of the WCWS in Oklahoma City, Okla.

LUCK OF THE IRISH

Maddie O'Brien sure makes the most of St. Patrick's Day weekend while on the softball field.

On March 17, 2012, she blasted a solo home run in the fourth against Fairfield as the 'Noles won 2-0.

FSU played Georgia Southern on March 16, 2013 and O'Brien powered a two-run shot in the fifth to help the 'Noles win, 4-0. On March 15, 2014 with Florida State trailing NC State 2-0 in the bottom of the fifth and with the bases loaded, Maddie O'Brien worked a full count and blasted an Emily Weiman pitch deep into the Tallahassee night for a grand slam as the Seminoles went on to win 4-2.

LUCK AGAINST THE IRISH

Maddie O'Brien has also played phenomenally against Notre Dame in 2014. In the three games against the Irish, O'Brien is batting .444 (4-for-9) with three solo home runs, four RBI, three walks and a sacrifice fly. She is also slugging 1.444 vs. the Irish.

GO DIRECTLY TO FIRST

Pitchers have been doing their best to try and pitch around Maddie O'Brien as evidenced by her 54 walks so far in 2014. She has been given first base on four straight pitches 29 times this season, which includes 11 intentional walks.

She was intentionally given first base in four of her five plate appearances in game two of a doubleheader at Pitt on April 16 to match an NCAA record, and laced a 3-run double to the wall in the other.

TAKING DOWN THE GATORS

Florida State had lost its last 11 games overall to the University of Florida (dating back to 2006) and hadn't defeated the Gators in Gainesville since 2003.

On April 2, FSU snapped both of those streaks as the No. 8 Seminoles took down the No. 6 Gators in a dramatic 3-2 win, in eight innings, at KSP Stadium.

Maddie O'Brien and Lacey Waldrop were MVPs of the game as O'Brien's great defensive play sent the game to extra innings and added a home run as well as the game-winning RBI in the eighth. Waldrop tied a career high with 8.0 IP and struck out nine, allowing only six hits and two runs.

MOVING UP ALL-TIME LISTS

Seniors Tiffani Brown, Courtney Senas, Briana Hamilton, Jessica Nori, Kelly Hensley and Celeste Gomez as well as juniors Maddie O'Brien and Lacey Waldrop have definitely made their impact on the Florida State softball program in recent years, but now they are etching their names onto several historical lists.

Brown is currently second all-time in runs scored (207), tied for second in triples (22), third in hits (284), fourth in stolen bases (109), and eighth in assists with 383.

Senas presently sits second in home runs (36), third in RBI (158), fifth in runs scored (180), seventh in walks (97) and seventh in doubles (37) and T-eighth in stolen bases (69). She also currently has a .551 career slugging percentage which would place her third in FSU history.

Hamilton has nine home runs in 2014 and 28 for her career which is fourth-best all-time. She has also been great with the glove and has amassed 357 assists which is ninth in program history. She currently has a career slugging percentage of .497 which would be ninth-best in FSU history.

Nori has posted four saves so far in 2014 which ties an FSU single-season record that has been done five other times. She now has an FSU-record nine career saves.

Kelly Hensley has hit several memorable home runs for FSU, including her grand slam as part of 2013's 'Miracle In Mobile', and has 18 career blasts which is just one away from the all-time top-10.

Gomez has been a solid catcher in her four years and has been on the receiving end of numerous strikeouts by the FSU pitching staff. She ranks eighth all-time in putouts with 888. Gomez also is nearing the top-10 in home runs, as her 18 HR is only one away from 10th place all-time.

O'Brien is only in her third year of competition, but already has the FSU program record for home runs (42) and RBI (173) in a career. She is also third in walks (123) and tied for fifth all-time in doubles (38).

Waldrop's 680 career strikeouts through her first three seasons are ninth all-time in FSU history. She also has five career saves which sits as the sixth-most all time. Waldrop has 81 career wins (fifth) and her 127 games pitched are seventh-most all-time.

MOST ACC WINS BY ANY SCHOOL

With a 5-0 win over Syracuse on April 19, the Seminoles won their 20th ACC game of the season to set a new record for conference wins by any school. They broke the previous record of 19 set by Georgia Tech in 2010. Florida State ended the regular season with a 24-3 record against conference opponents.

SWINGING THE BATS

The Seminoles have put up some great offensive numbers and lead the conference in several categories. They have had double digit hits in 18 games and have scored double digit runs in 11 games so far in 2014.

LEADOFF SUCCESS

Florida State wastes no time to get runners on base and get its offense going. Leadoff batters reach base in nearly half of the innings this season (187-for-385 – .486) and several players are successful more than 50 percent of the time the inning starts with them.

MARATHON ARM

Lacey Waldrop was unstoppable on March 15 against NC State as she pitched all 14.0 innings of a doubleheader as FSU grabbed two wins over the Wolfpack.

Over both games, Waldrop allowed only five hits, three runs, two earned and recorded 14 strikeouts. She faced 51 batters which was just nine more than the 42 minimum in 14.0 innings.

Waldrop also pitched all 11.0 innings of a 2-0 thriller against USF in the NCAA Tallahassee Regional on May 17. Her previous career high for innings pitched was 8.0 innings and she was able to toss a completegame shutout with seven strikeouts to give FSU the win to advance to the regional final.

TOPS IN THE ACC

Florida State's strong start to the season has shown the ACC why it was voted as the favorite to win the conference in 2014. As a team, FSU leads or has a share of the ACC lead in 19 statistical categories leading into the ACC Championships while seven different Seminoles have combined to lead or tie for the conference lead in 19 different individual categories.

QUICK STRIKE

The 'Noles have scored early and often in 2014, noted by 68 runs scored in the first inning. Florida State has scored at least one run in the first inning in 32 games this season and have plated three or more runs in the opening frame 12 times this year.

WE CAN REBUILD THEM, WE HAVE THE TECHNOLOGY

It may not have cost six million dollars but the Seminoles have several players who have come back from injuries faster and stronger than before. Redshirt seniors Briana Hamilton and Tiffani Brown, as well as redshirt freshmen Stephanie Hartness and Alex Powers had their 2013 campaigns cut short early in the season but were off to terrific starts.

So far in 2014, this group is playing very well and have combined to post a batting average of .308 (144-for-471) with 108 runs scored, 38 extra base hits, 85 RBI, 75 walks and 31 stolen bases.

EVERYBODY LOVES FREE BASES

The 'Noles have been impressive at the plate by putting the ball in play with their bats, but FSU has also learned to excel in producing runs without even taking a swing.

Florida State has drawn 311 walks on the season to set a new single-season record and is averaging over 5.0 walks per game in 2014. Eight players have at least 20 walks this year, led by Maddie O'Brien with 54. Eight players that have played the majority of FSU's games in 2014 currently have an on-base percentage of at least .400, led by Maddie O'Brien's .567.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST

The Seminoles scored 11 runs in the third inning on their way to a 15-0 win at Virginia on March 9.

The first nine batters to the plate all reached base and also scored. In a four-pitch sequence by UVa starter Aimee Chapdelaine, the Seminoles had RBI singles by Victoria East, Stephanie Hartness and Briana Hamilton and culminated by a towering three-run HR by Celeste Gomez. Maddie O'Brien and Hartness each had an RBI single and an RBI double in the inning.

MIRROR, MIRROR

Florida State faced No. 9 Nebraska and No. 11 Alabama twice this year and each series went in eerily similar fashion.

In both series, FSU narrowly lost the first game by only one run, falling to Nebraska, 4-3, and Alabama, 1-0. In the rematch, FSU would take revenge and win each game by the same 5-1 score.

LOCKED DOWN

Since allowing 11 runs and 12 hits in the first game of a doubleheader at Virginia on March 8, FSU pitchers have shut down opposing batters in impressive fashion over the past 41 games.

The Seminoles have allowed three hits or fewer in 21 of the 41 contests, including no-hitters by Lacey Waldrop over UVa on March 9 and against Florida A&M on March 26. FSU pitchers have tossed 291 strikeouts in 274.0 innings while allowing only 64 earned runs.

POWER SURGE

Through the first 35 games of 2014, Florida State only had hit 29 total home runs but were able to bring the big bats to North Carolina where the Seminoles crushed seven home runs in the three-game series against the Tar Heels.

In fact, in their last 27 games the Seminoles have hit 36 round-trippers and their total of 65 home runs in 2014 sets a new single-season record at Florida State.

BACK-TO-BACK JACKS

Maddie O'Brien and Bailey Schinella hit consecutive home runs in the fifth inning of FSU's 8-0 win at Virginia on March 8. It marked the first time a pair of Seminoles have hit back-to-back home runs since Schinella and Celeste Gomez went deep in the fourth inning against Virginia Tech on April 20, 2013.

Corey Hendrickson and Briana Hamilton joined the club as well with consecutive bombs on April 5 against Maryland as each took a 3-2 pitch over the wall of JoAnne Graf Field in a four-run fourth inning to propel the Seminoles to a 14-6 win over the Terrapins.

40-WIN MILESTONE

With a win in game one of a doubleheader at Pitt on April 16, Florida State won its 40th game of the year and surpassed the 40-win milestone for the 27th time in program history. It marks the fifth time in six seasons under head coach Lonni Alameda that the 'Noles have won 40 games in a season.

50-WIN MILESTONE

Defeating Notre Dame, 3-1, to win the 2014 ACC Championship, Florida won 50 games in a season for the first time under Lonni Alameda and first since 2004. This is the 14th season that Florida State has amassed 50 wins.

CONFERENCE DOMINATION

The Florida State softball team was chosen as the preseason favorite to win the 2014 Atlantic Coast Conference softball regular season, as voted by the league's 11 head coaches. FSU received 98 points and eight first-place votes. It was the first time that the Seminoles had been picked to win the conference since 2010.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

The Seminoles went 4-1 at the Easton Crimson Classic in Tuscaloosa, Ala., from Feb. 28 to March 2, including a road win over No. 11 Alabama. The pitching performances of Lacey Waldrop and Jessica Nori earned them a spot on thiis year's all-tournament team.

Waldrop posted a 2-1 record over the weekend with 15.0 innings and allowing two runs, one earned, two walks and recording 21 strikeouts.

Nori was an anchor out of the bullpen for Florida State as she made four appearances and pitched 10.1 innings and allowed nine hits, one run, one walk and struck out six. She recorded three saves for the Seminoles, which brought her career total up to nine and set a new FSU all-time record.

BOMBS IN THE DESERT

While the team was in Las Cruces, N.M. for the Hotel Encanto Invitational from Feb. 7-9, they wanted to go to the nearby White Sands National Monument. However, it was closed due to missile testing in the area.

Local authorities should have also shut down the NMSU Softball Complex as redshirt junior Maddie O'Brien dropped four home run bombs over the course of the three-day tournament. She hit a home run in each game on Friday (Nebraska and New Mexico State) and hit two against Saint Mary's on Saturday, including a grand slam in the sixth that ended the game. It was the second time in her career that she hit two home runs in the same game (UC Santa Barbara, March 4, 2012).


OFFENSIVE SHOW IN NEW MEXICO

Florida State got out to a hot start at the plate out in Las Cruces, N.M. The team is batted .372 with 19 extra base hits and 34 RBI. Four players batted over .400 in the tournament – Alex Kossoff (.625), Tiffani Brown (.533), Maddie O'Brien (.500) and Courtney Senas (.412).

HUMAN INTEREST STORIES

FSU SOFTBALL & COVENANT HOSPICE REMEMBER TAYLOR

For Taylor Foster, softball wasn't just a sport, it was a way of life. She started playing the game at the tender age of seven and continued through middle school. When she was 12, Taylor's leg started to suddenly weaken and cause her to fall. An x-ray showed that the bone inside one of her legs was hollow. Taylor was diagnosed with osteosarcoma (bone cancer), and although the cancer didn't scare her the fact that she couldn't play softball anymore was what made it real. Taylor did rounds of chemotherapy. Since it was evident that she would require a knee transplant, she was never allowed back to the diamond.



Through the efforts of a friend, Taylor's story reached the Florida State softball team. Taylor did not think that the team would ever take an interest in her, but she was completely wrong. The team ended up adopting her as a Seminole sister and on her sweet sixteen birthday they gave Taylor her very own FSU jersey.

The FSU softball team quickly became a strong source of encouragement for Taylor and vice versa. The Seminoles would call and text her sharing special times so that she could share in them. The team would visit Taylor when they played in her home state of North Carolina and Taylor would even come to Tallahassee when possible. The team dedicated "The Gate" section of the field to Taylor, which reminds and encourages the team to play for those who can't as they walk onto the field.

Unfortunately, Taylor's four-year fight with osteosarcoma ended on April 27, 2014 at 17 years old. The team was able to visit her in North Carolina while she was under hospice care, giving Taylor that one last push of encouragement to fight. Her parents believed she would have given up a long time ago if it hadn't been for the team's friendship, phone calls, text messages, packages and never-ending encouragement. In this way, they helped Taylor live out her dream of being a Florida State Seminole.

With the help of Covenant Hospice, a Remembrance Ceremony was held at JoAnne Graf Field on May 5, 2014 to honor Taylor's dream. Covenant Hospice had members of their team at the field to assist with the grief and loss the players were experiencing. A special biodegradable balloon release ceremony was held by Covenant Hospice for the team to send messages to Taylor and as a symbol of her free and amazing spirit that she so willingly shared. The team signed a 'Commitment to Taylor' that will be in the locker room for years to come stating that they play for Taylor, fellow Seminole Sisters and the many others who wish they could be a part of the team.





During Taylor's fight, her family raised money by selling tie-dyed T-shirts which were purchased by many, even those that hadn't met Taylor but were touched by her story. As the Florida State softball team has moved into the postseason, portions of the T-shirts have been repurposed into headbands, bracelets, necklaces and many other accessories that the players, coaches and staff will wear during the games to have a tangible reminder of Taylor with them at all times

A BOND BEYOND THE DIAMOND - BY TIFFANI BROWN

No collegiate athlete goes into their last season, their senior season, playing cautious. They play without fear, leaving nothing, risking everything, knowing their final game is fast approaching. I was no different. My team, Florida State softball started the 2013 season hot. We were on a roll, bursting with talent and hopeful for the future. Pre-conference we traveled to California to face solid competition. What I didn't know then was my first game of the tournament would be my last of the season.

We were playing Long Island University, Brooklyn. In my fourth at bat I laid down a sacrifice bunt. I was the speed for the team and my role was to get on base. Out of the box I realized it would be close and, determined to beat the throw, I stretched to hit the base. I had missed the bag and hit the foot of the first baseman. My teammates and coaches watched in stunned silence as our athletic trainer came to my aid. I was hurt, bad. My knee had hyperextended. I was carted off to face a very emotional realization with my team and family. I watched as we struggled in California and came home to a painful diagnosis. I had torn my PCL or Posterior Cruciate Ligament and was out for the season. Devastated, angry, in pain and confused, I tried to wrap my head around the prospect of the 2013 season ending when it had only just begun. But our game has a way of shining light into those moments filled with darkness and what happened next is why softball has impacted my life in ways that are hard to describe.

Following my injury, pre-diagnosis, while still in California and still devastated Coacha handed me a card. The card was from Brooklynn York, the first baseman from LIU Brooklyn. I was shocked, of course on crutches, but taken aback. I couldn't believe this stranger had the heart to go out of her way to tell me how sad she was about what happened. I mean, it's softball, people get banged up all the time. It is just part of the game. Sure I was upset I was hurt but this girl did not owe me anything. The card was a simple yet lovely gesture and it made me smile. The next day I looked for Brooklynn to let her know how much I appreciated the gesture. I found her, said thank you probably a million and one times, and thought our paths would never cross again. Boy was I wrong.

Fast-forward past a year of rehabilitation, college graduation, a great 2013 regular season and productive fall, to the spring of 2014. I was awarded a redshirt and geared up to say goodbye to softball all over again. Early this season our team played Virginia Tech and FCGU in Ft. Myers at Florida Gulf Coast University. During our first game I was walking toward the end of the dugout, when our athletic trainer Eunice Hernandez came running over to me. "Tiff, the first baseman from Long Island University is here, she wants to see you." I believe my exact words were, "Whaaaat? What is she doing here? "I was flabbergasted by her presence and I could do nothing but embrace her with a huge hug and an even bigger smile. She was so concerned about how I was doing, and expressed how happy she was that I had recovered and was back on the field playing.

I later found out that she was from the Ft. Myers area, and upon graduating had returned home to teach. I couldn't believe it! Here she was again, the same kind-hearted person who went out of her way to get me a card after our collision had gone out of her way again to see me in south Florida. The conversation was brief, yet so meaningful. Brooklynn seemed as excited to see me as I was to see her, and I could not do anything but smile. My heart warming on the inside, as Coacha ran over with the great idea to snap a couple of photos which will last for a lifetime. There she was again, Brooklynn York, with the same tender smile and loving gesture.

The actions of Brooklynn York have impacted me in many ways. It makes me smile to know there are still great, selfless individuals in the world. Brooklynn epitomizes what sportsmanship truly means, and her demonstration of that sportsmanship speaks to her character. Her actions show the magnitude of respect she has for the game and showed me just how fortunate I am to be a part of the softball community.



Florida State ace Lacey Waldrop walked into the postgame press conference Sunday afternoon and quickly took notice of the placards identifying where she, head softball coach Lonni Alameda and outfielder Kelly Hensley were expected to sit.

Alameda was on the far left. Hensley was on the right.

Waldrop was front and center.

"Why am I always in the middle?" she asked no one in particular.

"Because you're the most important," Hensley said with a smile, and maybe a hint of sarcasm.

"Because you have to be strong for your teammates," interjected Alameda.

Waldrop nodded with approval; she liked hearing that. It is a message Alameda has been delivering loud and clear for the past three years.

And on the day that Waldrop established a new school record for single-season victories and helped lift her No. 3-ranked Seminoles to an NCAA regional championship, she knew full well it was her ability to embrace that mindset that has taken her game to another level.

"If you look back to my freshman year, I was very emotional in those moments after I'd give up big hits and things like that," the Virginia native said. "I'd like freak out a little bit. Through just learning myself as a pitcher and working with the same defense the past two years, it's helped me come into my confidence and really learn how to throw in those pressure situations and not let it get to me.

"It definitely wasn't there all the time. I had to develop it. But today, I think it showed up big."

In truth, it has showed up all season. It's a large reason why Waldrop sports an incredible 36-4 record with a 0.90 ERA.

While those gaudy numbers reflect the junior's great talent and competitiveness, as well as the backing of an exceptional team, they also represent a maturity that Alameda says is rare in the college game. And perhaps never was that on display quite like it was Sunday afternoon against USF.

Playing before a spirited crowd of more than 1,000 spectators at JoAnne Graf Field as well a national television audience via ESPN2, Waldrop found herself in a big-time predicament in the top of the seventh inning.

Since allowing one run to the Bulls in the top of the first, Waldrop had essentially cruised through the next five frames. She surrendered a hit here or there, but she and her teammates came up with a slew of impressive defensive plays to keep USF at bay.

Then came the seventh. With only three outs separating them from earning the right to host an NCAA super regional for the first time in school history, the Seminoles allowed USF's first two batters to reach base.

Bulls outfielder Courtney Goff recorded an infield single when third baseman Briana Hamilton failed to make a diving catch and was a hair late with her throw to first. USF senior Kristen Wyckoff then tried to lay down a sacrifice bunt, but she reached as well when FSU first baseman Victoria East mishandled a tough throw as Wyckoff approached the bag.

Suddenly, after limiting the Bulls to one run in 17 innings (including an 11-inning shutout on Saturday), Waldrop appeared to be in real trouble. USF had runners at first and second base, no outs and the top of its order coming to the plate.

But after a brief visit from Alameda — during which the veteran coach brought her entire infield in around Waldrop and instructed them to take a deep breath together — the pitcher unleashed the same wide smile that she reveals countless times each game.

Sticky situation or not, Waldrop clearly was elated to be front and center.

"That's what you pitch for, to be in those pressure situations," she said. "So it is that — it's pressure — but it's something that you train for. You have to be confident in your stuff in that moment."

Waldrop was quick to add that she maintained confidence in her defense as well, although she hardly needed it.

First, she struck out USF leadoff batter Juli Webber.

Then she struck out two-hole hitter Ashli Goff.

Then, after getting ahead in the count once again, she coaxed a routine ground ball from USF's top power hitter, Kourtney Salvarola, to end the threat, the game and the Bulls' season.

Tears flowed freely in USF's locker room following Florida State's 2-1 victory, but longtime Bulls coach Ken Eriksen made a point to give Waldrop a hug and tell her how impressive she was.

"How do you not respect Lacey Waldrop and what she just did?" Eriksen said to reporters.

Just a few minutes later, Waldrop and Alameda were able to reflect upon how far the talented pitcher has come. From the feisty freshman who so desperately wanted to succeed that she sometimes let her emotions get the best of her, to the 21-year-old junior who now sees adversity as nothing more than a greater opportunity.

A chance to rise to a new challenge. A stage to show how much she has grown.

There was a time when a defensive miscue or a poor pitch would get under Waldrop's skin. Two consecutive bad breaks, like the ones that made things interesting Sunday, might have pushed her over the edge.

"Now," she said, "I'm just like, 'All right, let's bring it on. Let's get this next girl."

And that right there is why Lacey Waldrop is front and center.

Being strong for her teammates.

Senas melancholy as she nears her final at-bat

She's second on Florida State's career home run list and in the top 10 all-time in hits, doubles, RBIs and stolen bases.

She leads the Atlantic Coast Conference in triples and runs scored and is the starting center fielder on a team that is 44-6 and ranked sixth in the country.

Florida State's 21-3 record in conference is the first time in

the history of the ACC that a team has won at least 20 regular-season conference games.

Yet, when asked to look back on her career at Florida State, Courtney Senas had a surprising answer.

"It's really sad that I have no more time to live up to the expectations for me," the 2010 Mililani alumna said in a phone interview on Tuesday.

"When I first came in as a freshman, a lot of people expected a lot from me and I expected a lot from myself, and honestly as OK as I am doing right now, it's not anywhere close to what was expected."

It's hard to believe a career .315 hitter who will likely earn first team all-conference honors for the second straight season could feel that way.

But that's the chip Senas has always played with. Her desire to be the best is why she grew up wanting to play baseball against the boys instead of softball.

It's why she's nervous about playing her final collegiate home series this weekend against Georgia Tech.

It's why she's every bit as worried as she is excited about playing in the NCAA tournament one more time.

Because when it's over, it really is over.

"Pretty soon something I've worked at for 20 years of my life is going to be over," Senas said.

"It sucks because it's a sport not big enough like MLB that you can make a living off, probably.

"It's why I wish I took school more seriously. Everybody always told me that softball would only take me so

far and they're right because now it's about to be pau. I don't know what I'm going to do with my life."

Fortunately, it's not over just yet.

After this weekend's series against the Yellow Jackets, Florida State will compete in the ACC tournament next month.

With 44 wins, the Seminoles have locked up Senas' fourth straight trip to a regional. FSU was bounced in the opening weekend of the NCAA tournament her first two years before advancing to a super regional last season.

Now the goal is breaking through and playing in the College World Series.

"I'm hoping this is the year because this is probably one of the best all-around teams that we've ever had at Florida State," Senas said. "We have all of the tools to win the title. We've played Alabama and all of the high-ranked teams and easily could have won all of those games.

"We definitely have the talent and all of the tools to win that title. We've just got to play good at the right time."

Senas will take part in the senior game festivities on Sunday with her mother in the crowd at JoAnne Graf Field.

Janette Senas is making the 10-hour flight and drive to Tallahassee, Fla., for the first time.

"You never know how it's going to be or how sad you will feel, but when I see my mom I probably will cry," Senas said. "It's sad to think about how fast the season went by and how much I'll miss the game when it's finally over.

"I've worked 20 years of my life at this and I don't know anything else."

Palm Harbor's Maddie O'Brien sets softball records at FSU

Florida State shortstop Maddie O'Brien stepped to the plate Wednesday and did what she does best: turn two pitches into majestic fly balls that sailed over the fence.

Those home runs gave her 20 on the season, which already is a school record and tied Texas-San Antonio's Megan Low for the Division I lead.

That's not all. O'Brien, a former standout at Palm Harbor University High, leads the nation with 74 RBIs, which also are a school record.

Add ACC highs of 16 doubles, .464 batting average and 1.014 slugging percentage, and the redshirt junior is among 25 finalists for the USA Softball player of the year.

"I always knew I could put up those kinds of numbers," said O'Brien, who turned 22 last month. "It was just a matter of putting a lot more trust and belief in myself."

Her emergence as one of the game's preeminent power hitters comes after two seasons that were substandard by the lofty expectations she put upon herself.

As a senior at PHU, O'Brien hit .658 with 53 RBIs and was named first-team all-state.

After taking a medical redshirt for her first season at FSU because of a nagging ankle injury, she hit .260 as a freshman in 2012 and .271 last season with a combined 18 homers.

The reasons for O'Brien's struggles are myriad, covering mind and body. Entering college as a touted recruit, she put pressure on herself to produce right away. Much like in high school, O'Brien spent marathon sessions in



the batting cage, taking one mighty swing after another.

"I think for whatever reason, I was trying too hard to do everything," said O'Brien, who is majoring in editing, writing and media.

Then came the injury, which threw off her rhythm. The power and ability to drive in runs were still there. But her batting average was not even close to what she was accustomed to.

"Maddie has been a good player ever since she got here," FSU coach Lonni Alameda said. "She's starting to excel because she's starting to put more trust in the things we're trying to get her to do."

Just as there were contributing factors to O'Brien's fall from her high school numbers, there are reasons for her rebound. The biggest, she said, was changing her routine.

Instead of spending hours in the cage, she spent about 15 minutes taking batting practice.

"I'm starting to learn about quality over quantity," O'Brien said.

In addition, O'Brien had not spent much time on the mechanics of the game. She did not pour over video of her swing or opposing pitchers.

"When I was in high school, it was just see-the-ball, hit-the-ball," O'Brien said. "You could do that then because there were only so many good pitchers. Now, every pitcher is phenomenal. There's more to hitting at this level.

"You have to come to the plate with a game plan for each pitcher."

This season, O'Brien has put her lessons to use.

On Wednesday, she had a career day.

She reached base in all nine plate appearances and drove in seven runs as FSU (41-6), ranked No. 9 in the coaches' poll, swept a doubleheader from Pitt. She had two homers (both in Game 1), two doubles, four walks (all in Game 2) and one hit-by-pitch.

"This season has been amazing," O'Brien said. "Not just for myself, but for the team."

MADDIE O'BRIEN INFLUENCED BY IDOLS

If Maddie O'Brien has any say in the matter, and surely one of the best college softball players in the nation wields at least that much influence, expect Florida State to make a stop at Mickey Mantle's Steakhouse should the Seminoles reach the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

In the heart of the Bricktown district, the restaurant is an institution for visitors to Oklahoma's capital.

For O'Brien, a shortstop for the eighth-seeded Seminoles in the NCAA tournament and a player who holds or shares NCAA leads in home runs and slugging percentage this season, it would be something of a pilgrimage.

Not yet old enough to have been aware of the news when the Yankees legend and Oklahoman died in 1995, and born nearly a quarter of a century after he played his final game, O'Brien is nonetheless a fan of Mantle in the same way many of her peers are of more contemporary bat-and-ball stars such as Mike Trout or Jessica Mendoza. She watched the movie "61*" and listened to her dad tell Mantle stories. When it came time to choose a biography to read for a middle school assignment, she chose one about Mantle. To this day, the respect for her idol makes it easy to spot her on the field.

The jersey is garnet and gold instead of blue and white pinstripes, but it is still No. 7.

"I just loved his swing and his passion for the game," O'Brien explained. "Obviously he wasn't the greatest guy off the field, but on the field, as far as the injuries and stuff, there was never any quit from him. I kind of idolized that."

Idolized and eventually emulated. O'Brien is the player she is because she stopped worrying about the player she could have been.

Mention Mantle's name and the drain in the Yankee Stadium outfield in the same sentence and a wry laugh escapes from the other end of the phone before the question is even complete. She knows how it will end.

In Game 2 of the 1951 World Series, The New York Times one of baseball's legendary moments when Mantle caught a cleat on a drain as he tried to avoid crashing into Joe DiMaggio while pursuing a fly ball. Still days shy of his 20th birthday, Mantle blew out his knee. For all the greatness that followed in a Hall of Fame career, he was never the same physically. There was always a question of what could have been if not for a freakish accident.

Not quite six decades later, on a less grand stage in her final physical education class of her senior year of high school, O'Brien stepped awkwardly playing volleyball and rolled her ankle painfully. It should have been a temporary inconvenience. Instead, it was where the story began for each of three ankle surgeries that followed in the subsequent three years. The first, an arthroscopic procedure to remove damaged tissue, wiped out what would have been her freshman season at Florida State. The second, a more invasive procedure to restore blood supply to cartilage, had her on crutches or in a walking boot for the summer after her second year and most of the fall softball season. The most recent, to address tarsal tunnel syndrome in the same ankle, again put her on crutches this past summer.

She creaks, crackles and suffers through cold weather less like a 22-year-old than someone who watched Mantle in person.

"I wake up and I always am going to have that stiffness and pain in my ankle, just because it's gone through a lot," O'Brien said.

It's typically pitchers who transform college programs, their position single-handedly capable of taking a program to new heights or returning to former ones. Position players are the ones who then push those teams over the top. Yet for Florida State, long the class of the ACC but a program that never seemed to have the power hitters required to contend for national championships in the contemporary era, O'Brien appeared to be that transformational player. She represented something new.

Everything came naturally to her on a softball field.

"She makes fielding look so easy and so smooth it's just ridiculous," Seminoles coach Lonni Alameda said. "When we saw her play in high school, I think the fielding really stood out. Obviously you see her swing and it's an outstanding swing, but she was just a hoover at shortstop pre-ankle injury."

Even as she struggled with the pain of an undiagnosed injury through the fall of her freshman

year (the first surgery was in December of that year), she made an impression.

"I've never seen someone go after it as much as she did," teammate Celeste Gomez said. "She loved the game, knew so much about it. You know, as freshmen you go in, and I don't want to say you're dumbfounded, but it's just so overwhelming. And she knew so much. I was impressed with how much she knew already as a freshman."

O'Brien wasn't unproductive when she did get on the field in Tallahassee. She didn't hit .300 in either of her first two seasons, but her on-base percentage revealed a good eye at the plate and she showed power. She committed just 14 errors in 118 games, a total a lot of shortstops would take for a single season. All of that despite missing time in her first season with concussion-like symptoms and working through a bad back in her second season, brought on by compensating for her ankle.

She was good. She just wasn't what she thought she could have been. Her range in the field wasn't what it used to be. It was a struggle to find a comfortable position in the batter's box because of the ankle's limited flexibility. In a dozen small ways, she knew what wasn't there, a frustration she shared with her coach even after last season.

"She wanted to be this kid she is right now, but she didn't know how to get there, she didn't know what approach to take at the plate," Alameda said.

Much of what we see this season, a player who both in the field and at the plate deserves her place as one of 10 finalists for USA Softball Player of the Year, is the product of technical tweaks and alterations. She studies scouting reports along with the pitchers, eager to know exactly what pitches an opposing batter is likely to face so she can better position herself where the ball is likely to go. She tries to stay relaxed in the box, pick the spot where she wants the ball and either wait for it or take the walk. She does yoga and, for the most part, obediently follows the dictates of the team trainer when it comes to icing, taping and all the work of managing a body.

All of these are ways in a which a good player becomes a great one.

The desire to do those things is less tangible. To have it required that she appreciate what she had rather than think about what she did not. It came in part from someone whose effect on O'Brien's life was far more profound than any major leaguer.

Along with her teammates, O'Brien first learned the story of and then befriended Taylor Foster a season ago. A high school softball player in North Carolina who wanted to play for Florida State, Foster was diagnosed with bone cancer in 2010. When the team traveled to North Carolina for a series in Chapel Hill, they stopped first at Foster's house.

In the O'Brien writes for the Florida State site, she included these thoughts from the visit in March.

"Taylor truly is the epitome of a fighter. She may not always feel good, but she would never let anyone know. The entire time we were there she was in pain and fighting falling asleep, but she kept her spirits up and kept talking with us. She kept saying that she did not want to fall asleep on us, and it was so cute watching her try to stay awake just because we were there. ...

"Getting to know Taylor has allowed us to appreciate the moments with her and with each other. Taylor has taught us all to embrace each other and to love every moment of life, though the ups and the downs. She has such an optimistic and brave charisma about her that each of us feed off of. It really is amazing how much she has changed all of our lives, as well as inspired us to love life."

Foster passed away at the age of 17 on April 27. It was the day of Florida State's final home game and its accompanying tribute to the senior class that would have included O'Brien but for the ankle injury that forced her to sit out her first year. Alameda told the players the news after the game.

"We had kind of been a little prepared, but obviously you're never prepared enough for those moments," O'Brien said.

There are few tragedies in sports, perhaps fewer heroes. We borrow the words to describe games and athletes, but they rarely fit. An athlete denied a chance to reach his or her full potential, even by something as random as an outfield drain or a high school gym class, isn't tragedy. It is misfortune. Perhaps profound misfortune when it is applied to a passion, but misfortune all the same. What was taken from O'Brien was nothing compared to what was taken from Foster.

So, no, she doesn't spend much time these days thinking about what might have been if her Mantle moment never happened. She is here and playing a game.

That isn't something to take for granted.

"In the past couple of years, since the ankle injury, that's been like a constant struggle for me, thinking about where it could have been if I didn't roll my ankle," O'Brien said. "But I can't get stuck in thinking in that mentality because that's when I'm going to limit myself. I've just tried this year to not even think about it. I think about it like the ankle injury never happened. ... I can't think about where I could have been."

Lonni Alameda leads FSU softball to great heights

Pressure has always been an integral part of sports.

How players and coaches react to those moments often decide outcomes.

When tensions are running high, and the Florida State softball team needs a reminder to exhale and relax — or a nudge to rise to the challenge — the message is usually delivered by its head coach, Lonni Alameda.

Players say Alameda's coaching style, personality and attention to detail helps shape their success.

"The game already creates pressure, and we know it's a game of failure," FSU senior second baseman Tiffani Brown said.

"With her being relaxed and emphasizing having fun — and the game should be fun — it helps us to stay relaxed and calm. I think she does a great job of not only teaching us the fundamentals, but also teaching us the game within the game."

Alameda's approach during her six seasons at FSU is certainly paying dividends.

The third-ranked Seminoles (53-6) open their first home NCAA Super Regional on Thursday against Michigan (46-13). The winner of the best-of-three series advances to the Women's College World Series, where Florida State last appeared a decade ago.

Alameda was hired at FSU in July 2008 to replace JoAnne Graf, who retired after 30 seasons and was the first collegiate coach to surpass 1,400 wins.

While Alameda, a transplant from California, was viewed as one of the country's top young coaches when hired away from UNLV after five seasons, Graf crafted the Seminoles' storied tradition.

She won a pair of slow-pitch national championships (1981 and 1982) and made seven trips to the Women's College World Series.

Former Chiles High pitcher Sarah Hamilton played for both Graf (one season) and Alameda (three seasons) during her Seminole career (2008-11).

Hamilton departed FSU as one of the best pitchers in school history, becoming the first to finish with at least 1,000 career strikeouts in addition to being named the Atlantic Coast Conference Pitcher of the Year (2011).

Hamilton credited Alameda, who recruited her while at UNLV and also doubles as the Seminoles' pitching coach, for playing a large role in her success. She said Alameda's upbeat approach and teaching methods helped bring the Seminoles together.

"I think she really relates well with the players," Hamilton said.

"Coach Graf was more old school, everything was more traditional. I felt like we went from a team where all of us played the same sport ... to one that was playing together rather than each of us just playing. We were like a family, with a team dynamic to it."

Travis Wilson was teaching lessons in Chattanooga, Tenn., three years ago when Alameda was in need of an an assistant coach and telephoned.

Wilson, a native of New Zealand whose background includes professional baseball and softball, huddled with Alameda a few days later in Tennessee and quickly accepted the position.

"We sat down for lunch and talked softball and life — it was really easy and I felt really comfortable," Wilson said.

"I could tell she genuinely cared about the program and she was really a nice person. Three years into it, those first impressions I had have shined through and them some. To me, she's a fantastic communicator and always has the best interest of her players foremost."

While Alameda is known for her enthusiasm and positive energy — she greets most folks with a hug — Wilson said his boss is a fierce competitor, too.

Alameda played softball, volleyball and basketball at Oak Ridge High School in El Dorado Hills, Calif., graduating in 1988.

She pitched one season at St. Mary's University in San Antonio and was a two-time second-team All-Big Eight selection at Oklahoma. An all-around athlete, Alameda also was a defensive specialist on the Oklahoma volleyball team.

"Sometimes in big games as a staff you might get a little uptight, but looking out on the field you never see that (with Alameda)," Wilson said.

"Her demeanor is calm and she's really relaxed. But, at the same time, when your players need a kick in the rear end, she's capable of doing that just as well. If they don't play the game the right way, they are going to hear about it."

The Seminoles' success this season has made national noise.

On a 15-game win streak, FSU enters its Super Regional with the nation's best earned-run average at 1.26 behind the combined efforts of Lacey Waldrop (36-4) and Jessica Burroughs (17-1). Shortstop Maddie O'Brien leads the country in RBIs (81) and shares the lead in home runs (23). The team's winning percentage (.898) tops the country.

Alameda's coaching formula is not magic, but a collaborative effort.

"Chemistry starts from the top," Alameda said.

"It's a family atmosphere and you have to appreciate that part. From the top, when we took care of that, if we had a good flow and chemistry, it was going to carry down to the team."

The Seminoles have responded.

They are winning. They are having fun. They are handling pressure situations and supporting each other.

"I think it's her passion for the game and also her passion for wanting to learn more that makes (a difference)," said Brown, a former standout at Godby High.

"We have a lot of fun, and I think that has helped us out with where we are today as far as being successful."
