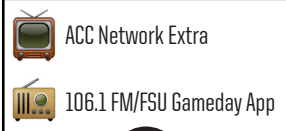

STARTING 9: WHAT TO KNOW

- Q among nation's leaders:** Senior first baseman/designated hitter Quincy Nieporte leads the country with 34 RBI's in 21 games played. He hit his third and fourth grand slams of the year last weekend at Virginia Tech, and he is now the single-season record holder for grand slams in a season at FSU. He has six home runs on the year.
- Grand Slams:** Nieporte hit grand slams in consecutive games against Virginia Tech (3/17-18). His grand slam on Saturday was his fourth this year. He leads the country in grand slams and is one of only three players with more than one this season - Jordan Glover (Delaware) and Michael DeRenzi (Georgetown) each have two.
- Noles record second seven-run comeback win:** Last time out, FSU trailed Jacksonville 7-0 before having an at-bat, and slowly chipped away at the JU lead until freshman J.C. Flowers' walk-off, two-run single with two outs in the ninth inning. Against Oakland (3/3), FSU trailed 7-0 before winning 18-10.
- Daughtry, Walls lead country in walks:** After recording seven walks last weekend at Virginia Tech, infielder Tyler Daughtry has 26 walks on the season, tying shortstop Taylor Walls for the national lead. As a team, FSU's 153 walks are 14 more than the next closest team (Missouri, 139).
- Last week:** After reaching the No. 1 ranking for the first time since 2014, Florida State went 1-4 on the road against No. 5 Florida (0-1), No. 22 Florida Gulf Coast (2-5) and Virginia Tech (9-2, 12-13, 0-17). The game at FGCU was Florida State's first game against the Eagles away from Tallahassee.
- Holton among nation's best:** Two-time ACC Pitcher of the Week Tyler Holton is 4-0 with a 2.20 ERA in five starts this season. Before pitching just 3.2 innings at Virginia Tech before a 90-minute lightning delay, the sophomore from Tallahassee had a 0.36 ERA and 40 strikeouts.
- Noles on the basepaths:** Florida State opened the season a perfect 27-for-27 in stolen bases before going just 1-for-3 at Virginia Tech. The Seminoles had the most stolen bases without being caught in the country. Freshman Nick Derr and junior Dylan Busby are both a perfect 5-for-5 on the year.
- Martin active leader in wins:** Head coach Mike Martin, now in his 38th year as head coach at Florida State, is the active wins leader with 1,913. He also is the all-time winningest coach by percentage, with a .738 mark. He needs just 63 wins to pass Augie Garrido's all-time wins record (1,975).
- Miscellaneous:** Quincy Nieporte needs just two more grand slams to tie the national single-season record of six, by Alabama's Kyle Bryan in 1984... junior Taylor Walls was 4-for-5 with a home run, double and two singles against Jacksonville, tying his career high in hits (twice previously, last at Duke 2016).

THE WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN COLLEGE BASEBALL, MARTIN...

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- » was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.738)
- » owns the second-most wins all-time in NCAA Division I baseball history and most among active coaches (1,913)
- » has led Florida State to 37 consecutive NCAA Regional appearances
- » has taken the Noles on 15 trips to the College World Series
- » has overseen 17 conference championships (11 Metro Conference, 6 Atlantic Coast Conference - 95, 97, 02, 04, 10, 15)
- » coached eight consecutive ACC Atlantic Division Championships (2007-2014) including setting the school record for the most conference wins in a season with a 24-6 mark in 2008 & 2012
- » produced 19 first round draft picks with 17 coming since 1990. Overall, Martin has coached 49 of FSU's 69 players that have reached the Major Leagues
- » coached 89 All-Americans, 125 All-ACC selections and a record four Golden Spikes winners
- » is a seven-time ACC Coach of the Year - 1996, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2007, 2009, 2012

MARTIN (CONT.)

11 GETS WIN NO. 1,900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 34 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,595 as head coach (1980-present).
- » Here is a look at the other milestone wins of Martin's illustrious career:

AGAINST THE FIGHTING IRISH

- » Florida State and Notre Dame have met 18 times, with FSU holding an 11-7 advantage.
- » Since Notre Dame joined the ACC prior to the 2014 season, the home team has won every game of the series.
- » In 2014, FSU won all three games in Tallahassee - 8-7 (12) on Friday and 11-2 and 4-3 in a Sunday doubleheader.
- » In 2015 in South Bend, Notre Dame swept the Seminoles and held FSU to four total runs in three games - 5-2, 4-1, 2-1.
- » Those were the first three games of the series played at Notre Dame.
- » Last year, FSU again swept the Fighting Irish in Tallahassee in April - 12-6, 7-6 (12) and 11-6.
- » Prior to Notre Dame joining the ACC, the teams had met nine times, including five in the postseason.
- » The teams split a pair of regional games in Tallahassee in 1993, and Notre Dame won two of three games in Tallahassee in the 2002 Super Regionals.

- » The Seminoles had a nine-game winning streak snapped against Boston College (3/10).
- » It was FSU's longest winning streak since an 11-game stretch early in the 2015 season.

HOLTON IN ELITE COMPANY

- » Tallahassee native Tyler Holton continues to show why he is one of the top pitchers in college baseball this season, with a 2.20 ERA and 4-0 record in five starts.
- » Against Oakland (3/4), Holton struck out 13 batters in just six innings of work without allowing a walk. He set a career-high in strikeouts for the second consecutive week after having 11 against Samford (2/25).
- » Holton also became the first Nole with 13 K since Luke Weaver had 14 against Troy in the 2013 NCAA Regionals. He is the first Seminole with consecutive games of 10+ K's since Sean Gilmartin in 2011.

- » At UCF (3/8), redshirt junior Will Zirzow pitched a career-high five innings, allowing just one hit while striking out a career-high seven in earning the win in a 5-0 shutout.
- » Only two batters reached base against Big Z - a single that was erased on a pickoff, and a strikeout that reached on an error that was then erased on a double play.
- » Zirzow's previous career highs in innings and strikeouts came in last year's ACC Championship Game against Clemson (4.1 innings, 6 strikeouts).

- » In three games against Oakland (3/3-5), the Seminoles outscored the Golden Grizzlies 44-17 and scored 10+ runs in each game of the series.

- » Against Samford (2/24-26), FSU scored 37 runs in a three-game sweep.

CARLTON MOVES TO BULLPEN - 2-for-2 on SAVES

- » Florida State's Opening Day starter, junior Drew Carlton, was named the team's closer after four games in 2017.
- » Carlton made his first relief appearance of the year against Samford (2/26) in a non-save situation.
- » Against Jacksonville (2/28), the Lakeland native was perfect for the final two innings in picking up his first career save in FSU's 6-5 win over the Dolphins.
- » The game against Jacksonville was Carlton's 38th career appearance, but just his eighth out of the bullpen.
- » At UCF (3/7), Carlton again entered in the eighth inning and was perfect against all six batters faced, closing out FSU's 5-2 win. In two save situations this year, he has yet to allow a baserunner.
- » In 2016, Carlton started all 17 of his appearances, finishing with an 8-3 record and 3.94 ERA.
- » Carlton got his first win of 2017 by pitching a perfect ninth inning against Jacksonville (3/21), and FSU rallied to win in the bottom of the 9th.

» Five players - Nick Derr (LF), Rhett Aplin (LF), J.C. Flowers (CF), Kyle Cavanaugh (DH), Tyler Daughtry (DH) made the first starts of their career in the opening series against VCU.

NOLES ON THE ROAD

WALLS NAMED ALL-AMERICAN

» Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America.

» The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State in 2016 and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).

» Walls also earned third team marks from NCBWA and D1Baseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.

» Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.

» To begin 2017, Walls has four doubles, a triple and three home runs. He ranks fifth nationally with 30 runs scored and leads the nation in walks with 26.

NOLES PLAY SUMMER BALL

» Thirteen current Seminoles played summer ball throughout the country this season, including shortstop Taylor Walls and pitcher Cole Sands on the Team USA Collegiate National Team. » With major league rosters reporting for spring training in Florida and Arizona, a number of former Seminole stars are trying to make major league rosters.

» At the end of 2016, 10 Seminoles were playing in the major leagues, including three who made their first appearance in 2016: P Luke Weaver for the Cardinals, P Robby Scott for the Red Sox, and OF Stephen Cardullo for the Rockies.

» In the minor leagues, 20 former Seminoles were on active rosters at the end of 2016, including John Sansone, an eighth round pick in last year's draft by the Cincinnati Reds.

» Free agent Ben DeLuzio is with the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

» In total, 69 players in Florida State history have played in the Major League's, including 49 under head coach Mike Martin.

» The first player to reach the major's from Florida State was Dick Howser, the 1961 American League Rookie of the Year.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

» Florida State entered the 2017 season as a consensus Top 5 program, ranking anywhere from second (Baseball America) to ninth (Collegiate Baseball). Collegiate Baseball is the only poll of the six where FSU is not ranked in the top five.
