STARTING 9: WHAT TO KNOW

- J.D. Drew jersey to be retired:** Florida State announced that former outfielder **J.D. Drew** (1995-97) will have his No. 39 jersey retired prior to the game against Clemson on Saturday, April 15. He will join **Dick Howser** (No. 34) as the only Seminoles to have a jersey retired.
- Holton among nation's best:** **Tyler Holton** is the fourth FSU pitcher to earn three ACC Pitcher of the Week honors in one season after throwing seven innings of no-hit ball against No. 7 North Carolina. He is one of 40 players on the Midseason Watch List for the Golden Spikes Award, given to the nation's top player.
- Last time out:** **Taylor Walls** hit a leadoff home run and freshman **Drew Mendoza** had a pair of doubles and 3 RBI, but No. 12 Florida topped the Seminoles, 10-7, in Tallahassee. **Jim Voyles**, **Clayton Kwiatkowski**, **Drew Carlton** and **Alec Byrd** combined to close the game with 5.1 scoreless innings.
- Noles lead the country in walks:** Junior **Taylor Walls** is tied with Clemson's Seth Beer for the national lead in walks with 37. As a team, FSU has been walked 219 times, one of just three teams (Mercer, 211; South Alabama, 202) that over 200 on the season.
- Q among nation's leaders:** Senior first baseman/designated hitter **Quincy Nieporte** is 15th in the country with 41 RBI. He hit his third and fourth grand slams of the year at Virginia Tech, and he is now the single-season record holder for grand slams in a season at FSU. His four grand slams are the most in the country.
- ACC Sportsmanship Week:** This week marks the 2017 Spring Sportsmanship Week in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Now in its 7th season, it is a campaign to emphasize and promote sportsmanship. A pregame handshake will take place between the teams on Sunday, April 16.
- Noles in the Pros:** With the Major League Baseball season opening earlier this month, Florida State had six former players with MLB clubs - **Buster Posey** (Giants), **Stephen Drew** (Nationals), **Stephen Cardullo** (Rockies), **Robby Scott** (Red Sox), **Devon Travis** (Blue Jays) and **Kevin Cash** (manager of the Rays).
- Martin active leader in wins:** Head coach **Mike Martin**, now in his 38th year as head coach at Florida State, is the active wins leader with 1,919. He also is the all-time winningest coach by percentage, with a .737 mark. He needs just 57 wins to pass Augie Garrido's all-time wins record (1,975).
- Miscellaneous:** **Cole Sands** earned his team-high fifth win last week against NC State...**Donovan Petrey** and **Bryan Bussey** picked up their first hits of the season last Friday against NC State...FSU outthit Florida, 12-10, on Tuesday, the first time this season FSU had more hits and lost a game (18-1).

THE WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN COLLEGE BASEBALL, MARTIN...

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- » was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.737)
- » owns the second-most wins all-time in NCAA Division I baseball history and most among active coaches (1,919)
- » has led Florida State to 37 consecutive NCAA Regional appearances
- » has taken the Noles on 15 trips to the College World Series
- » has overseen 17 conference championships (11 Metro Conference, 6 Atlantic Coast Conference - 95, 97, 02, 04, 10, 15)
- » coached eight consecutive ACC Atlantic Division Championships (2007-2014) including setting the school record for the most conference wins in a season with a 24-6 mark in 2008 & 2012
- » produced 19 first round draft picks with 17 coming since 1990. Overall, Martin has coached 49 of FSU's 69 players that have reached the Major Leagues
- » coached 89 All-Americans, 125 All-ACC selections and a record four Golden Spikes winners
- » is a seven-time ACC Coach of the Year - 1996, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2007, 2009, 2012

MARTIN (CONT.)

11 GETS WIN NO. 1,900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 8 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,608 as head coach (1980-present).
- » Here is a look at the other milestone wins of Martin's illustrious career:

AGAINST THE TIGERS

- » Florida State leads the all-time series against Clemson, 72-66-1.
- » Clemson has won the season series each of the past two years, including a 3-0 sweep in Tallahassee in 2015.
- » The teams have met the past two years in the ACC Tournament - in 2015, FSU avenged the sweep in the regular season finale with a 3-1 win in Durham. In 2016, Clemson beat FSU 18-13 in the ACC Championship Game. The 31 combined runs are the most in a single game in series history.
- » FSU leads 37-19-1 in Tallahassee.
- » Head coach Mike Martin is 53-52-1 against the Tigers. Against current Clemson head coach Monte Lee, Martin is 3-3 - 2-0 in the 2015 NCAA Regionals when Lee was at College of Charleston, and 1-3 against the Tigers last year.

- » FSU has played every school in the SEC except Missouri and holds a 313-224-1 record against current teams in the league.

HOLTON IN ELITE COMPANY

- » Tallahassee native Tyler Holton continues to show why he is one of the top pitchers in college baseball this season, with a 2.47 ERA and 4-1 record in eight starts.
- » **Holton is a three-time ACC Pitcher of the Week, joining Paul Wilson (1993 & 1994), Mike Ziegler (2000) and Sean Gilmartin (2011) as the only FSU pitchers to earn the award three times in one season.**
- » Holton was stellar against No. 8 North Carolina (4/1), pitching a no-hitter before being pulled after 109 pitches in the eighth inning. He walked only one batter, his final of the game, and struck out 8.
- » Before the walk, all four baserunners that reached were via error, and each runner was stranded.
- » Against Oakland (3/4), Holton struck out 13 batters in just six innings of work without allowing a walk. He set a career-high in strikeouts for the second consecutive week after having 11 against Samford (2/25).
- » Holton also became the first Nole with 13 K since Luke Weaver had 14 against Troy in the 2013 NCAA Regionals. He is the first Seminole with consecutive games of 10+ K's since Sean Gilmartin in 2011.
- » Andrew Karp also struck out 11 batters at Florida (3/14). A look at the last five times a Seminole reached double-digit strikeouts:

- » Freshman Drew Parrish allowed just three hits and one unearned run in FSU's 5-1 win over Notre Dame (3/25), throwing the first complete game of his young career.
- » The complete game was the first for FSU this season, and the first since Drew Carlton threw a two-hit shutout at No. 1 Florida in last season's Super Regionals.
- » Luke Weaver was the last FSU player with more than one complete game in a season, when he accomplished the feat against Wake Forest and Boston College in 2014.
- » **Parrish is the first FSU freshman to throw a complete game since Sean Gilmartin had two in 2009.**

NOLES SWEEP IRISH

- » When FSU swept Notre Dame on March 24 and 25, it was the first three-game road sweep for Florida State since winning three times at Boston College in 2014.
- » It was FSU's first time winning a game at Frank Eck Stadium after the Noles were swept in 2015. Notre Dame joined the ACC prior to the 2014 season.
- » The sweep was the fifth for the Seminoles since 2010, and only once in that span has FSU swept two opponents on the road in one season:

- » For the first time this season, FSU won on a walk-off hit when freshman J.C. Flowers' two-run single capped FSU's 10-9 comeback win vs. Jacksonville (3/21).
- » The Seminoles trailed 7-0 after the top of the first inning, the second time this year that FSU rallied from a 7-0 deficit (Oakland, 3/3).
- » Against the Dolphins, the FSU bullpen allowed just one earned run in 8.1 innings, striking out 8 without walking a batter.
- » Against FGCU on April 4, Jackson Lueck tallied his third hit of the game, an RBI double that scored Taylor Walls in FSU's 7-6 win.

- » The Jacksonville game (3/21) was the fifth time in school history that FSU has allowed seven runs in the first inning, and the Noles are amazingly 3-2 in those games.

- » The national record for grand slams in a season is 6, by Kyle Bryan of Alabama in 1984.
- » Nieporte also had six RBI in one game at Virginia Tech (3/18), a new season high and one shy of his career high of 7 at UCF in 2015, when he hit his only grand slam prior to this season.

- » He joins Tyler Holton (13 vs. Oakland, 11 vs. Samford) with 10+ strikeouts in a game this season.
- » Before this year, the last time an FSU player had double-digit strikeouts was Mike Compton against Coastal Carolina in 2015.

- » The Seminoles had a nine-game winning streak snapped against Boston College (3/10).
- » It was FSU's longest winning streak since an 11-game stretch early in the 2015 season.

ZIRZOW WOVES VS. KNIGHTS

- » At UCF (3/8), redshirt junior Will Zirzow pitched a career-high five innings, allowing one hit & striking out a career-high seven in earning the win in a 5-0 shutout.
- » Only two batters reached base against Big Z - a single that was erased on a pickoff, and a strikeout that reached on an error that was then erased on a double play.
- » Zirzow's previous career highs in innings and strikeouts came in last year's ACC Championship Game against Clemson (4.1 innings, 6 strikeouts).

NOLES SCORE 44 vs. OAKLAND

- » In three games against Oakland (3/3-5), the Seminoles outscored the Golden Grizzlies 44-17 and scored 10+ runs in each game of the series.
- » It was the first time since 2010 against Hofstra that FSU scored in double-digits in each game of a three-game series. That season, FSU accomplished the feat each of the first two weekends of the season, against Georgia State and Hofstra.
- » Against Samford (2/24-26), FSU scored 37 runs in a three-game sweep.

CARLTON MOVES TO BULLPEN

- » Florida State's Opening Day starter, junior Drew Carlton, was named the team's closer after four games in 2017.
- » Carlton made his first relief appearance of the year against Samford (2/26) in a non-save situation.
- » Against Jacksonville (2/28), the Lakeland native was perfect for the final two innings in picking up his first career save in FSU's 6-5 win over the Dolphins.
- » The game against Jacksonville was Carlton's 38th career appearance, but just his eighth out of the bullpen.
- » At UCF (3/7), Carlton again entered in the eighth inning and was perfect against all six batters faced, closing out FSU's 5-2 win.
- » In 13 relief appearances in 2017, Carlton is 2-1 with a 0.79 ERA in 22.2 innings, with 23 strikeouts against just five walks.
- » Carlton was the winner in both of FSU's walkoff wins - vs. Jacksonville (3/21) and Florida Gulf Coast (4/4).

- » Freshman Drew Parrish allowed just two hits and a run while striking out six in six innings in his first career start vs. Samford (2/26).

- » Five players - Nick Derr (LF), Rhett Aplin (LF), J.C. Flowers (CF), Kyle Cavanaugh (DH), Tyler Daughtry (DH) made the first starts of their career in the opening series against VCU.
- » After battling injuries, Drew Mendoza made his first start against North Carolina (3/31).

NOLES ON THE ROAD

- » The Seminoles won at Jacksonville, 6-5, in its first road game of the season before sweeping UCF (3/7-8).

WALLS NAMED ALL-AMERICAN

- » Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America in 2016.
- » The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State in 2016 and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
- » Walls also earned third team marks from NCBWA and D1Baseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.
- » Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.
- » To begin 2017, Walls has four doubles, two triples and four home runs. He ranks 31st nationally with 37 runs scored and leads the nation in walks with 37.
