

ISAIAH SWANN

2007-2008 ALL-ACC CANDIDATE

Scored a career high 31 points against Mississippi State in the quarterfinal round of the 2007 MasterCard NIT, including a NIT and near school record nine 3-point field goals.

In the Mississippi State game, Swann set career highs in field goals attempted and made going 10 for 17, 3-point field goals made and attempted going 9 for 13 from three point range, played a career high 39 minutes, and added five rebounds while going 2 for 2 from the free throw line.

In the 2007 MasterCard NIT, Swann averaged 19.3 points per game, 3.7 rebounds per game, 3.7 assists per game and averaged 31.7 minutes per game. From the field, Swann was 21 for 33 for a .636 field goal percentage, 14 for 22 from the bonusphere, with a .636 3-point field goal percentage and was 2 for 2 from the line in the postseason NIT.

? 771 career points, only 229 shy of becoming the 39th player in FSU history to reach the 1,000 point milestone.

Finished tied for sixth in the ACC with 68 three point field goals made, adding to his career total of 118 from behind the arc, which rank Isaiah eighth in school history. Swann is just the 14th player to top the 100 mark for career three point field goals. Attempting to reach 150, this would make Swann one of only five Seminoles to ever eclipse the 150 mark for three point field goals.

As a junior, set career highs with 10.3 points per game, 3.1 assists per game, 3.0 rebounds per game, 35 games played, 34 games started, shot .462 from the field, 68 for 166 from 3-point land, .410 shooting from three point territory, 39 for 49 on free throws with a .796 average, grabbed 24 offensive rebounds, 81 defensive rebounds, 105 total rebounds, dished out 110 assists and averaged 27.9 minutes played per game.

First Seminole to score 300+ points, grab 100+ rebounds and dish out 100+ assists since Delvon Arrington during the 2001-02 season.

Ranks 20th in school history with 114 career steals, Swann is looking to become one of only ten players ever to reach 150 career steals as a Seminole.

Scored in double-figures in 18 Seminole games this season, led the team in scoring in three games during the season, and led the Seminoles in scoring during the last two games in the NIT.

Averaged 10.9 points per game, shot .844 from the line, .407 from three point land, and averaged 3.6 rebounds per game in ACC play.

One of seven Seminoles to play in all 35 games, and only one of four Seminoles to play in all 35 games during the 2006-07 season. Played 30+ minutes in 13 of the 35 Seminoles games during the season.
