FLORIDA STATE PLAYS IN SCHOOL RECORD EIGHTH-CONSECUTIVE POST SEASON TOURNAMENT; WINS PRESTIGIOUS COACHES VS. CANCER CLASSIC SNAER EARNS ALL-ACC HONORS FOR THIRD TIME IN CAREER

FLORIDA STATE MAKES EIGHTH CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON APPEARANCE

Florida State made its eighth consecutive postseason appearance, won the championship of the prestigious Coaches vs. Cancer Classic and finished with at least nine ACC wins for the school record fifth consecutive season as it finished with an 18-16 overall record and a 9-9 mark (sixth place) in ACC play. The Seminoles advanced to the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament for the seventh consecutive season -- the longest ongoing streak among the current 12 teams in the ACC and continued to play as the third winningest team in the ACC since the start of the 2005-06 season. The Seminoles were led by senior Michael Snaer, who averaged a team-leading and career-high 14.8 points, a team-leading and career-high 2.5 assists per game and a team leading 1.0 steals in leading the Seminoles to the postseason for the fourth time in his career.

SNAER EARNS ALL-ACC THIRD TEAM HONORS

Senior Michael Snaer was named to the All-ACC Third Team in 2013 by a vote of the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association – marking the second consecutive season he has earned All-ACC honors. Snaer was an All-ACC Second Team selection in 2012 and was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team in 2010. Snaer averaged a career-high 14.8 points scored per game, ranked sixth in the ACC in free throw percentage, 10th in 3-point field goals made per game and 10th in the ACC in scoring.

SNAER NAMED TO ALL-ACC DEFENSIVE TEAM

Two-time All-ACC selection Michael Snaer was named to the All-ACC Third Team and to the All-ACC Defensive Team in a vote by the league's 12 coaches. He was also named to the All-ACC Third Team by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. This is the first season the ACC coaches have selected an All-ACC team.

SNAER NAMED TO DEFENSIVE ALL-AMERICAN TEAM

Florida State senior Michael Snaer, who led the Seminoles to three NCAA Tournament appearances during his career, has been named to the 2013 Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American team sponsored by CollegeInsider.com. It marks the fourth consecutive season that at least one Seminole has been named to the prestigious All-American team; Snaer joins 2012 honoree Bernard James, 2010 and 2011 honoree Chris Singleton, and 2010 honoree Solomon Alabi as honorees, and makes Florida State the only program in the nation to have at least one player named to the Defensive All-American team in 2012, third team in 2013, was named to the All-ACC befensive team for the second consecutive season in 2013. He finished tied for the team lead with 33 steals and fourth on the team with 15 blocked shots and was one of two Seminoles with at least 30 steals and at least 15 blocked shots this past season.

FLORIDA STATE WINS COACHES VS. CANCER CLASSIC

Florida State won the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic with wins over BYU and St. Joseph's at the newly opened and spectacular Barclays Center in New York (Nov. 16 and 17, 2012). BYU advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament and finished the season with a 26-9 overall record and a 12-4 finish in the WCC. Saint Joseph's finshed the season with an 18-14 overall record and an 8-8 record in Atlantic 10 play. The Hawks played in the NIT where they lost to St. John's in the first round of the tournament.

SEMINOLES' TITLE IN COACHES VS. CANCER IS FOURTH IN LAST FIVE SEASONS

Florida State's championship in the 2012 Coaches' vs. Cancer Classic marked the third regular season tournament (and fourth overall) in the last five seasons for Leonard Hamilton's Seminoles. Hamilton guided the Seminoles to the titles at the 2008 Las Vegas Global Sports Classic Tournament and the 2009 Old Spice Classic along with the 2012 ACC Tournament championship. A total of three players – Joey Moreau, Terrence Shannon, and Michael Snaer – were members of three tournament championship teams during their careers (Old Spice, ACC and Coaches vs. Cancer).

SEMINOLES FINISH AS ACC LEADERS IN BLOCKED SHOTS

Florida State led the ACC in blocked shots with a 5.1 blocked shots per game average marking the near-ACC record fourth consecutive season the Seminoles have led the ACC in blocked shots. Junior Kiel Turpin led the Seminoles and ranked eighth in the ACC with a career-high 1.3 blocked shots per game average – the fifth consecutive season at least one Florida State player has finished in the top 10 in blocked shots in the ACC statistics. The Seminoles have finished in the top two of the ACC team statistics in blocked shots in each of the last five seasons – first in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013 and second in 2009.

The Seminoles average 21.8 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12) and 18-16 (2012-13).

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY IN THE LAST FIVE SEASONS

In the last five seasons, Florida State is 52-30 (.634 winning percentage) and has finished in third place in the league standings three times in regular season ACC play. The Seminoles average 10.4 ACC regular season wins per season and have finished in the top four of the ACC standings four times in the last five seasons. Florida State is third in the ACC in conference wins with 52, third in winning percentage at .634 and tied for second (with North Carolina) with four top-four league standing finishes in the last five seasons.

SEMINOLES STARTED SEASON IN BOTH NATIONAL POLLS

Florida State was ranked No. 25 in the AP Poll and was tied for 24th in the USA Today Coaches' Poll prior to the 2012-13 season. It marked the first time in school history the Seminoles were included in the preseason polls by both the writers and the coaches in the same season.

SNAER NAMED MVP AT COACHES VS. CANCER

Senior All-American Michael Snaer – who was called the most well-rounded guard in the nation by Jeff Goodman of CBSSports.com – was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2012 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic after averaging 15.0 points and 7.0 rebounds in the semifinal and championship rounds of the tournament. For Snaer it was his second MVP award in as many tournaments after earning the honor in leading the Seminoles to the ACC Championship in 2012.

SNAER AND WHITE NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM AT COACHES VS. CANCER

Senior All-American Michael Snaer and junior Okaro White were both named to the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic All-Tournament team. For Snaer it marked his second All-Tournament team (also the 2012 ACC Tournament) – for White it was the first All-Tournament honor of his career. Snaer and White were named to the Coaches vs. Cancer All-Tournament team along with Tyler Hawes (BYU), Jack Cooley (Notre Dame) and Ronald Roberts (Saint Joseph's).

SEMINOLES PLAY IN SCHOOL RECORD EIGHTH CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON TOURNAMENT

Florida State played in the 2013 NIT marking the eighth consecutive season the Seminoles had played in the postseason. Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton is the first coach to lead Florida State to eight consecutive postseason appearances as the Seminoles have participated in the 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012 NCAA Tournaments and played in the NIT in 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2013. Hamilton has guided nine of his first 11 Seminole teams into postseason play including a school record eight straight since the Seminoles played in the 2006 NIT.

ALL-AMERICAN SNAER HITS THE TRIFECTA

All-American Michael Snaer was named the Most Valuable Player of the Seminoles' win over Tulsa in the Orange Bowl Classic on December 29. The Seminole senior scored a game-high tying 19 points, pulled down six rebounds, was credited with four assists and three steals in 37 minutes played as the Seminoles topped the Golden Hurricane, 82-63, at the BB&T Center in Sunrise, Fla.

SNAER NAMED TO DEFENSIVE ALL-AMERICAN TEAM

Michael Snaer, was named to the 2013 Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American team sponsored by CollegeInsider.com. He was a two time ACC All-Defensive team selection and finished tied for the team lead with 33 steals and fourth on the team with 15 blocked shots and was one of two Seminoles with at least 30 steals and at least 15 blocked shots this past season. It marks the fourth consecutive season that at least one Seminole has earned the award to the Lefty Driesell All-American Defensive Team.

SNAER SCORES 30 IN WIN OVER CHARLOTTE

Three-time All-ACC selection Michael Snaer scored his career high of 30 points to lead Florida State to its 79-76 win over Charlotte at the Time Warner Cable Arena on December 22. Snaer scored his career high 30 points as he tied his career high with five made 3-point field goals, made eight total field goals and was nine of 10 from the free throw line. Snaer became the first Seminole to score 30 points since Chris Singleton scored 30 in the Seminoles' 78-53 win over Gardner Webb in Tallahassee on November 16, 2010.

SNAER NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Three-time All-ACC selection Michael Snaer, who was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2012 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, was named the ACC Basketball Player of the Week by the ACC Office on Nov. 19, 2012. Snaer averaged 16.3 points, 5.6 rebounds and 3.3 assists while making nine of 16 shots from the 3-point line as he led Florida State to a 3-0 record and to the championship of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic. He recorded his second career double-double in the Seminoles' win over BYU and averaged 28.3 minutes played in the Seminoles' three wins during the week. It marked the second time in his career that he has earned the award.

THOMAS NAMED ACC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Florida State freshman guard Aaron Thomas, who averaged 17.0 points and 4.5 rebounds while shooting .500 from the field (11 of 22) and .857 from the free throw line (12 of 14) as he played 68 total minutes (34.0 mpg) in two Seminole wins in December was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on December 24, 2012 -- an award he shared with Oliver Hanlan of Boston College. Thomas made the first start of his career (in Florida State's win over Louisiana Monroe), made seven consecutive free throws and scored 22 of his 34 points (65 percent) in the second halves of the Florida State's' two wins.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

1 Junior Okaro White – one of the top defensive players in the ACC – finished his junior season with a career high 38 blocked shots and a career high 33 steals. Only White and Clemson's K.J. McDaniels totaled 30 or more blocked shots AND 30 or more steals in the ACC during the 2012-13 season.

1 Freshman Devon Bookert led the nation and was one of only eight players in college basketball who shot 50 percent or better from the 3-point line during the 2012-13 season. He shot .529 percent from the bonusphere during his first season as a Seminole.

1 Florida State ranked first in the ACC and 26th nationally in blocked shots with a 5.1 blocked shots per game average during the 2012-13 season.

1 Junior Okaro White was the only Seminole to start each of the Seminoles' 34 games during the 2012-13 season.

2 Florida State finished second in the ACC and 45^{th} nationally with a .735 free throw shooting percentage.

4 Two-time ACC All-Defensive team selection Michael Snaer was named to the Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American team in 2013. It marked the fourth consecutive season that at least one Seminole has earned the award; Snaer joined 2012 honoree Bernard James, 2010 and 2011 honoree Chris Singleton and 2010 honoree Solomon Alabi and makes Florida State the only program in the nation to have at least one player named to the Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American team in each of the last four seasons.

4 Devon Bookert finished fourth among freshmen in the ACC with a 2.4 assists per game average.

6 Three-time All-ACC selection Michael Snaer is recognized as the all-time NCAA leader with six career buzzer-beating, gamewinning shots during his career – two during his junior season (Jan. 21, 2102 at Duke and Feb. 16, 2012 at home against Virginia Tech) and four during his senior season (Jan. 24, 2013 at home against Clemson, Jan. 30, 2013 at home against Maryland, Feb. 5, 2013 at Georgia Tech and March 7, 2013 at home against Virginia).

6 Florida State was 6-1 during the 2012-13 season when it made 20 or more free throws in a game. The Seminoles made 24 free throws in their ACC Tournament win over Clemson, made 26 free throws in their 76-62 win over Wake Forest (February 26) and made 22 in their win over 71-67 win over NC State (March 9).

7 Three-time All-ACC selection Michael Snaer scored in double figures in each of the final seven games of his career and averaged 18.0 points per game from February 26 through the end of the 2012-13 season.

FLORIDA STATE LEADS ACC IN BLOCKED SHOTS IN LAST FIVE SEASONS

Led by junior Kiel Turpin, who ranked eighth in the ACC in blocked shots, the Seminoles led the ACC in blocked shots for the school record fourth consecutive season during the 2012-13 season. The Seminoles have led the ACC in blocked shots each season since 2010 and are the overall blocked shots leaders in the ACC in the last five seasons. Florida State has totaled 990 blocked shots since the beginning of the 2008-09 season and average nearly 6.0 blocked shots per game in their 170 games since the start of that season. Florida State leads the ACC in total blocked shots (990 / 44 more than North Carolina) and is only of only two schools (also North Carolina) that averages more than five blocked shots per game in each of the last five seasons.

SEMINOLES APPROACHING ACC RECORD

Florida State has led the ACC in blocked shots in each of the last four seasons. The ACC record for consecutive seasons leading the ACC in blocked shots is five by Maryland from 2000 through 2004. Only Florida State (four consecutive years, 2010-13) and Maryland (five consecutive years, 2000-04) have led the ACC in blocked shots in at least four consecutive seasons.

AN INCREDIBLE DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCE BY THE SEMINOLES

Florida State recorded a season-high 13 blocked shots (nine in the second half) and 10 steals (five in the second half) in its 65-62 win over Maryland on January 9, 2012. The Seminoles' 13 blocked shots were their most since sending back 15 shots in their win over Virginia Tech on January 10, 2012 and was the third highest total in an ACC game in school history. The Seminoles' 10 steals marked the fourth time in the last two seasons that the Seminoles had earned at least 10 steals in an ACC game. It also marked the second time in the Seminoles' now illustrious ACC history that they had earned double figures in blocked shots and steals. Florida State totaled 11 blocked shots and 10 steals in an 88-63 win over Virginia on February 28, 1998 in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE FINISHES SECOND IN ACC IN FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Florida State finished second in the ACC in free throw shooting percentage with a .735 mark during the 2012-13 season. The Seminoles were one of only five teams in the ACC to shoot better than .500 percent from the line for the season and led the ACC until the Blue Devils' 24 of 26 performance (.923 percent) from the free throw line against Michigan State in the Sweet 16 of the 2013 NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles finished third in the ACC in free throws made (behind only Duke, 588, and NC State, 554) and were one of only three teams in the ACC that made 500 or more free throws during the season. The Seminoles finished fifth in the ACC in free throws attempted (behind only NC State, 813, Duke, 796, Maryland, 732 and Wake Forest, 722) and were one of only five teams in the league that attempted 700 or more free throws during the season.

SEMINOLES RANKED SECOND IN ACC IN FREE THROW SHOOTING IN LAST FIVE SEASONS

Florida State is ranked second in the ACC with a .715 free throw shooting percentage over the course of the last five seasons. The Seminoles are one of only three ACC teams (also Duke and Maryland) who have shot better than .700 percent from the free throw line since the start of the 2008-09 season and rank behind only the Blue Devils (by less than two percentage points) in combined free throw shooting percentage in the last five seasons.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO WIN THE CLOSE ONES

Florida State led the ACC with 10 of their 18 wins coming by five points or less. The Seminoles are an ACC-leading 17-3 (.850 winning percentage) in the last two seasons when winning by five points or less. Florida State earned eight of its nine ACC wins during the 2012-13 regular season by five points or less – with its only win by more than five points coming against Wake Forest (76-62, +14) on February 26 in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE QUARTERFINALS OF THE ACC TOURNAMENT

Florida State advanced to the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament for the seventh consecutive season – every season since 2007. The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC that has played in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament each year since 2007. Florida State has finished in the top four of the ACC standings in four of the last five seasons including each year from 2009-12 and automatically earned a spot in the quarterfinals of the event.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

7 Florida State is the only team in the ACC that has advanced to the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament in each of the last seven seasons.

8 Florida State has made a school record eight consecutive postseason tournament appearances.

8 Florida State won 18 games during the 2012-13 season – the school record eighth consecutive season the Seminoles had won at least 18 games.

8 Redshirt junior Kiel Turpin finshed eighth in the ACC in blocked shots during the 2012-13 season as he helped Florida State lead the ACC in blocked shots for the school record fourth consecutive season. He averaged a team-high 1.3 blocked shots per game.

8 Three-time All-ACC selection Michael Snaer finished his career with 1,560 points as he became only the 10^{th} player in school history to score 1,500 or more career points.

9 Leonard Hamilton has guided nine of his last 13 teams – including six of his last eight at Florida State – to at least 20 wins.

9 Leonard Hamilton has taken nine of his 11 teams at Florida State to the postseason including four straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 2009-12.

9 Led by junior Okaro White, who started all of the Seminoles 34 games during the 2012-13 season, a total of nine different Seminoles started at least five games and seven Seminoles started at least 10 games. Florida State was one of only five teams in the ACC that had at least nine different players start at least one game and the only team that had at least seven players start at least 10 games.

10 Florida State was 10-5 in games decided by five points or less with eight of those wins coming in ACC regular season play.

12 Junior Kiel Turpin blocked at least one shot in 12 of the Seminoles' final 15 games of the season with a career-high tying four blocked shots coming in the Seminoles' win over Wake Forest on February 26, 2013.

13 Florida State's 13 blocked shots in its win over Maryland on January 9 were the most in a single game by any ACC team during the 2012-13 season.

18 Florida State was undefeated, 18-0, when it outscored its opponent during the 2012-13 season.

24 Junior Okaro White led the Seminoles as he scored in double figures in a careerhigh 24 games during the 2012-13 season. He scored in double figures 12 times in 18 regular season ACC games.

26 Three-time All-ACC selection Michael Snaer made 26 of his last 27 free throw attempts (.963 percent) in the final eight games of his career.

THREE MORE PLAYERS GRADUATE

Three more Seminoles under Leonard Hamilton – Michael Snaer, Joey Moreau and Ralfi Portuondo all earned their degrees from Florida State in May of 2013. Of the 40 players who have played under Hamilton at Florida State through their senior seasons, 98 percent (39 of 40) have earned their degrees since the 2002-03 season.

SEMINOLES RALLY FROM HALFTIME DEFICIT TO WIN SIX TIMES DURING 2012-13 SEASON

Florida State rallied from a five point halftime deficit (35-30, -5) to win for the sixth time this season when it trailed at halftime in defeating Clemson in the first round of the ACC Tournament on March 14, 2013. Included in those six wins were come-from-behind victories over Maryland (January 9, down 36-27 at halftime, won 65-62), against Clemson (January 24, down 29-21 at halftime, won 60-57 on a buzzer beating 3-point shot by Michael Snaer), at Georgia Tech (February 5, down 27-26 at halftime, won 56-54 on a buzzer beating lay-up by Snaer), against NC State (March 9, down 35-34 at halftime, won 71-67) and against Clemson in the ACC Tournament (down 35-30 at halftime, won 73-69 on four late game free throws by Michael Snaer). The Seminoles also defeated Charlotte (down 40-35 at halftime, won 79-76 at the Time Warner Cable Arena in Charlotte on December 22, 2012).

SEMINOLES SWEEP CLEMSON

Florida State defeated Clemson three times during the 2012-13 season – at Clemson (January 5, 71-66), at Florida State (January 24, 60-57) and in the ACC Tournament (March 14, 73-69) to mark the first time the Seminoles had defeated the Tigers in three games during a single season.

SNAER SURPASSES 1,500 CAREER POINTS MARK

Senior Michael Snaer closed his 134-game career with 1,560 points and an 11.6 points per game scoring average. He became only the 10th player in school history to score 1,500 or more career points when he surpassed the milestone on March 9, 2013 in the Seminoles' win over NC State in the final game of the regular season. Snaer surpassed Seminole great and NBA legend, Dave Cowens, to move into 10th place on FSU's all-time scoring list on March 7, 2013 vs. Virginia.

All-ACC Third Team selection Michael Snaer was one of only eight players in the ACC who earned All-ACC honors in both 2012 and 2013. SNAER ADDS TO HIS LEGACY AGAINST VIRGINIA

Three-time All-ACC selection Michael Snaer added to his growing legacy at Florida State as he made a game-winning, driving lay-up with 4.4 seconds left in regulation on March 7 to lead the Seminoles to a 53-51 win over Virginia. His driving lay-up and ensuing free throw gave him six buzzer-beating, game winning shots over six of the Seminoles' 11 ACC opponents during the 2012 and 2013 seasons – Duke, Virginia Tech, Clemson, Maryland, Georgia Tech and Virginia.

SNAER FINISHES HIS CAREER RANKED AMONG FLORIDA STATE'S ALL-TIME LEADERS

Three-time All-ACC selection Michael Snaer finshed his illustrious career as a Seminole ranked in the top 25 of 12 different statistical categories in the Florida State record book. He finshed his career ranked eighth in school history in scoring (1,560 career points), second in games played (134), third in games started (110), fifth in career 3-point field goals made (196), fifth in career 3-point field goals attempted (513), seventh in career field goals attempted (1,243), seventh in career 3-point field goal shooting percentage (.382), 12^{th} in career free throw shooting percentage (.783), 13^{th} in career free throws made (306), tied for 15^{th} in career field goals made (529), 16^{th} in career free throws attempted (391) and 23^{rd} in career assists (268).

WHITE INCREASES HIS SCORING THIS SEASON

Junior Okaro White was Florida State's second-leading scorer with a career-high 420 points and a career high 12.4 points per game average. He has amassed his scoring total with a career-high 24 double figures scoring games including 13 points in nine of the last 12 games of the 2012-13 season.

WHITE GOES FOR A CAREER HIGH 24 AGAINST CLEMSON

Junior Okaro White scored his career high of 24 points – including 17 in the second half -- in Florida State's 73-69 win over Clemson in the first round of the 2013 ACC Tournament on March 14. It marked the second time during his junior season (he also scored 20 against Maryland on January 9) and the third time in his career he scored at least 20 points in a single game. White was eight of 11 from the field (.727 percent) and a perfect seven of seven (1.000 percent) from the free throw line to score his career high and game high total of 24 against the Tigers.

OKARO WHITE FINISHED THE SEASON AS FLORIDA STATE'S LEADER IN...

...Free throws made with 119, free throws attempted with 146, offensive rebounds with 74, defensive rebounds with 127, total rebounds with 201, rebounds per game with a 5.9 average, blocked shots with 38 and steals with 33. All of those statistics are career highs for the junior who was the only Seminole to start all 34 games for the Seminoles during the 2012-13 season.

WHITE LEADS SEMINOLES IN FREE THROW SHOOTING

Junior Okaro White finished the 2013 season with a .815 free throw shooting percentage. He made a single season career high 119 free throws and attempted a career high 146 free throws as he raised his career free throw shooting percentage to .799. White averaged a career high 3.5 free throws made per game during the 2012-13 season.

WHITE SCORED 15 CONSECUTIVE POINTS AT MARYLAND

Junior played one of the great games of his career in totaling a near double-double of 20 points and nine rebounds to go along with six blocked shots in 31 minutes of play as Florida State rallied to win, 65-62, at Maryland on January 9, 2013. He was particularly spectacular with 15 consecutive Florida State points in a span of 6:15 to take the Seminoles from a one point deficit (43-42) to a six point advantage (57-51). He scored his first basket of the stretch on a jumper to put Florida State up 44-43 at the 8:45 mark of the second half and closed his incredible string with two free throws at the 2:30 mark to increase Florida State's lead to 57-51. White outscored the Terps, 15-8, to help Florida State win the game and win the game.

BOOKERT NATIONALLY FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Freshman Devon Bookert finished the 2012-13 season with the highest 3-point field goal shooting percentage in the nation at .525 percent. He was one of only four players nationally who shot better than 50 percent from the bonusphere and was one of only seven player nationally who shot 50 percent or better for the entire season.

BOOKERT FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Freshman Devon Bookert finished the 2012-13 season as the only ACC player who earned extended minutes to shoot better than .500 percent from the 3-point arc (.525) and better than .800 percent from the free throw line (.818). His 32 3-point shots made rank as the fifth highest total by a freshman in school history while his 61 3-point field goal attempts is tied as the eighth highest total by a freshman in school history. Bookert the first player in school history to shoot above .500 percent from the 3-point line in a single season (32 of 61, .525 percent) and only the second player in school history to shoot at least .500 percent from the 3-point line in a single season in school history (Andrew Wilson, 41 of 82, .500 percent, 2006).

BOOKERT INTO THE SEMINOLES STARTING LINE-UP

Freshman Devon Bookert moved into the starting line-up on February 13, 2013 against No. 3 Miami and averaged 28.9 minutes, 9.4 points and 2.8 assists as a starter in the final 11 games of the season – all of which he was the starter at the point guard position for the Seminoles.

TURPIN -- LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Junior center Kiel Turpin takes after his father Mel, who played for Kentucky from 1981-84. Kiel finished the 2013 season as the Seminoles' leader and ranked eighth in the ACC with a 1.3 blocked shots per game average. Mel is second in career blocked shots at Kentucky with 123 career blocked shots and a 1.8 blocked shots per game average during his career. Mel led the Wildcats in blocked shots with 67 in 1982 and 83 in 1983. Kiel led Lincoln College in Illinois in blocked shots as a freshman (2.0 bpg) and as a sophomore (2.3 bpg). Besides the father-son relationship, both Kiel and Mel were recruited by and coached by Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton in college.

NOTING TURPIN'S BLOCKED SHOTS

Junior Kiel Turpin blocked multiple shots in 14 different games including three in three different games and a career high four in wins over Clemson (January 24) and Wake Forest (February 26) during the 2013 season.

BOJANOVSKY AMONG FRESHMAN BLOCKED SHOTS LEADERS IN THE ACC

Freshman Boris Bojanovsky finished the 2013 season ranked third on the team and fifth among freshmen in the ACC in total blocked shots with 25. He played in 33 of the Seminoles' 34 games and blocked multiple shots in eight different. Bojanovsky's career high of four blocked shots came in the Seminoles' victory at Maryland (January 9) while three each coming against Wake Forest (February 26) and North Carolina (March 3).

MORE ON BOJANOVSKY'S BLOCKED SHOTS

Boris Bojanovsky's 25 blocked shots during the 2013 season are the ninth most by a freshman in school history. Only nine freshman in school history have blocked 25 or more shots in their first season at Florida State.

BRANDON PLAYS WELL AS A FRESHMAN

Freshman Montay Brandon, who played in 33 of the Seminoles' 34 games with 22 starting assignments, was one of four Seminoles who started at least 22 games in 2013. After having started 22 consecutive games at the point guard position, Brandon became an effective player coming off the bench. His play against Virginia in the Seminoles' victory over the Cavaliers on March 7 was a clear illustration that Brandon grew comfortable with the Seminoles' offensive and defensive philosophies by the end of the season. Against the Cavaliers, he played 27 minutes as a wing guard and was credited with one assist and more importantly – zero turnovers. He performed well with his extensive ball handling responsibilities as head coach Leonard Hamilton remarked that Brandon's ability to effectively move the basketball and hound Virginia's Joe Harris on defense (he scored only 14 points) were two of the primary reasons for the extended playing time earned by the freshman.

THOMAS PLAYS WELL IN HIS FIRST CAREER ACC TOURNAMENT

Freshman Aaron Thomas scored 13 points (6.5 points per game) on .500 percent shooting from the field (five of 10) and a perfect 1.000 shooting from the free throw line (two of two) in his first career ACC Tournament in 2013. He scored eight points against North Carolina in the quarterfinals and five points in the Seminoles' win over Clemson in the first round of the tournament.

MILLER NOT A FULL SPEED

Junior Ian Miller player in 30 of the Seminoles' 34 games but was never rally at full speed during the season because of an injury to his right foot. He missed virtually the entire month of December and did not practice with the Seminoles during the final three months of the season before having a cast placed on his foot and not playing in Florida State's game against Louisiana Tech in the NIT. He is fully healed and will be ready for the 2013-14 season. Miller suffered a bone bruise on his right foot in a practice in late November and because of the Seminoles' game schedule he was never able to properly allow it to heal during the season. He had the foot placed in a cast on March 18 and wore the cast until April 16 when he immediately began daily workouts.

SHANNON RETURNS AFTER MISSING 11 GAMES WITH AN INJURY

Junior Terrance Shannon, who missed 11 games during the 2013 season with a neck injury (January 24 against Clemson through February 26 against Wake Forest), scored 12 points and earned 29 minutes of playing time in the Seminoles' win over Clemson in the first round of the ACC Tournament on March 14. His 12 points marked the eighth time this season he had scored in double figures and the first time since opening night against South Alabama (November 9) that he had earned 29 minutes or more of playing time. Shannon tied his career high against South Alabama with 30 minutes played – meaning he came only one minute short of tying his career high for minutes played against Clemson.

WHISNANT'S INCREASED NUMBERS

Sophomore Terry Whisnant averaged a career-high 5.2 points while making a career-high 32 3-point field goals and shooting a career-high .356 from the 3-point line while playing in a career-high 30 games and earning a career-high 19 starting assignments in his second and final season with the Seminoles. He was a starter in Florida State's season opener against South Alabama and the fifth game of the season against North Florida then started 17 consecutive games from December 2 against Mercer through February 19 against Wake Forest. Whishant more than doubled his scoring average as a sophomore (5.2 ppg) as compared to his freshman season (2.1 ppg) as he more than doubled his playing time from 7.2 mpg as a freshman to 17.2 mpg as a sophomore.

Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 83, Lincoln Memorial 75

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Junior Okaro White scored a gamehigh 19 points and All-American Michael Snaer scored 12 to lead No. 24 Florida State to an 83-75 victory over Lincoln Memorial at the Donald L. Tucker Center in its first of two exhibition games as the Seminoles prepare to defend the ACC Championship they won in 2012. The Seminoles never trailed and led by as many as 17 points in taking the victory over the visiting Railsplitters. SUNRISE, Fla. - Junior Terrance Shannon scored a careerhigh 16 points to help Florida State beat Tulsa 82-63 in the Orange Bowl Basketball Classic. Michael Snaer scored 19 points and was chosen the game's most valuable player. Florida State extended its winning streak to four games and remained unbeaten in four games against Tulsa. Tulsa's Scott Haralson scored 17 points, all in the second half. Tulsa junior Pat Swilling, Jr. had a career-high 19 points and five assists, but he scored only two points in the second half. The Golden Hurricane's leading scorer this season, James Woodard, went 2 for 10 and scored eight points. Tulsa couldn't avert a blowout despite shooting 11 for 24 from 3-point range. Game 13 -- Auburn 78, Florida State 72

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn's Frankie Sullivan scored 24 points to lead the Tigers to a 78-72 win over Florida State at Auburn Arena. Florida State generated a 12-point first-half advantage but Auburn clawed back to within one at 36-35 by halftime. The Tigers then grabbed the lead back less than two minutes into the second half. It was a lead the hosts wouldn't relinquish primarily because of a huge discrepancy in free throw opportunities. The Tigers went to the free-throw line 41 times and made 28 of those attempts while the Seminoles managed just 15 trips to the charity stripe and connected on only seven of them. Michael Snaer led the way offensively for Florida State with 18 points to go along with his 12 rebounds and Terry Whisnant had a strong game with a career-high 16 points on 4-of-8 shooting from 3-point range. Okaro White and Devon Bookert added eight points apiece. The Seminoles started the game 10-of-16 shooting from the field but made just 18 of their next 42 shots over the course of the game. Still, Florida State shot a respectable 48.3 percent from the field compared to Auburn's 34.9 percent. The Tigers' ability to generate offense at the free-throw ultimately proved to be the difference. Auburn finished with 42 rebounds and Florida State grabbed 40.

Game 14 -- Florida State 71, Clemson 66

CLEMSON, S.C. - Okaro White scored 15 points, including two on a highlight reel dunk for the ages in the second half, to lead Florida State to a 71-66 victory over Clemson in the ACC opener for both teams. The victory gave the Seminoles a much-needed ACC win to start the conference slate of games and put them back in the win column. It was White's defensive play at the end of the ballgame that will be the lasting memory of his performance. Florida State led 38-25 at halftime but Clemson battled back to within a 66-63 score thanks to a strong second half. Down by just three and in possession of the basketball, White stole the inbounds pass from the corner with 16.9 seconds on the game clock before quickly being fouled and hitting two free throws. Then, after White's free throws had pushed FSU's lead to 68-63, Ian Miller nabbed the ensuing inbounds pass and sank 1-of-2 free throws before Clemson's Milton Jennings drilled a 3-pointer with four seconds left to cut FSU's lead back to just three at 69-66. Terrance Shannon, who led the Seminoles with eight rebounds and was 5-of-7 from the line, then sank two game-sealing free throws for the FSU victory. Shannon finished the game with 11 points and Miller added seven. Michael Snaer didn't score in the first half despite FSU's strong start to the game but finished with eight points, including a 3-pointer to start the second half that had given FSU a 16-point lead at the time. Terry Whisnant was 3-for-5 from 3-point range and had 11 points of his own.

After Snaer converted one of two foul shots, Seth Allen had a jumper blocked by Snaer and White, appropriately, finished the scoring with a free throw.

Wells then hit a 3-pointer to put the Terps up before White grabbed a defensive rebound and Snaer's hook hit nothing but net and cut Maryland's advantage to 71-70 with 45 seconds left on the clock. The 'Noles then called a timeout to set up the game-winning play after White and Alex Len forced a jump-ball after the latter missed an alley-oop dunk attempt with the possession arrow facing the Florida State bench.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Michael Snaer scored 21 points and Okaro White added 13 as Florida State earned a 69-66 win over Boston College. The Eagles had a chance to tie at the buzzer, but Ryan Anderson's 3-point try bounced off the front rim. It was the first time that Snaer, who has three game-winning buzzer beaters in Atlantic Coast Conference play this year, scored 20 or more points against a league opponent. He made 8 of 10 shots and was perfect on four free throws. Snaer's two free throws with 2:05 left gave Florida State a 66-60 lead. Florida State led by as many as 12 points in the opening half on its way to a 31-26 lead at the break. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Michael Snaer scored 19 of his game-high 24 points in the second half to lead Florida State to a 76-62 win over Wake Forest. Snaer scored 13 points during a 23-3 run midway through the second half that put the game out of reach for the visitors. Okaro White added 13 points and 7-3 freshman Boris Bojanovsky matched his career best with 10 points for the Seminoles, who avenged a 25-point loss to the Demon Deacons just 17 days earlier. C.J. Harris' lone field goal of the game, a 3-point basket with 15:56 left, pulled Wake Forest to within 44-43 before Snaer ignited the run that gave Florida State a 67-46 lead. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Florida State's Michael Snaer did it again. Snaer's left-handed runner in heavy traffic with 4 seconds left Thursday lifted the Seminoles to a 53-51 win over Virginia after the Cavaliers had fought back from an 11-point deficit to take the lead in the game's final seconds. It was the fourth game-winning shot by Snaer in Atlantic Coast Conference play this season and his sixth over the past two years. Okaro White led the Seminoles with 17 points while Snaer finished with 14 and Kiel Turpin 11. Akil Mitchell led Virginia with 15 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, but missed a layup with 21 seconds left with the Cavaliers leading 51-50. Harris finished with 13 points. Freshman Mike Tobey had 10 of his 12 points at the half for Virginia, which shot just 38.6 percent (22 of 57), but made all five of its free throws. Virginia, which has lost four of its last six games, trailed 47-36 before Justin Anderson's dunk ignited a 15-3 run with 6:01 remaining.
