ALL-AMERICAN CANDIDATE MICHAEL SNAER LEADS DEFENDING ACC CHAMPION SEMINOLES INTO 2012-13 SEASON AS FLORIDA STATE AIMS TO PLAY IN SCHOOL RECORD FIFTH CONSECUTIVE NCAA TOURNAMENT

"After losing six players in their rotation, it would be easy to overlook the chances of the Seminoles, who won their first ACC Championship last season. But Don't. The Noles return four of their top five scorers, including guards Michael Snaer and Ian Miller, who both buried game-winners last season. Plus, Coach Leonard Hamilton has proven that defense wins."

SNAER LEADS DEFENDING ACC CHAMPION SEMINOLES INTO 2012-13 SEASON

All-American and ACC Player of the Year candidate Michael Snaer, the Most Valuable Player in the 2012 ACC Tournament and top candidate to earn ACC Player of the Year honors during the upcoming season, heads a group of seven very experienced letter winners as Florida State enters the 2013 season looking to play in its school record fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles won the ACC Championship defeating Miami, No. 6 ranked Duke (62-59) and No. 4 ranked North Carolina (85-82) to win the ACC Tournament title, after finishing in third place in the ACC standings with a 12-4 record. The Seminoles earned the No. 3 seed in the East Region of the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the third round of the tournament in 2012.

ALL-AMERICAN CANDIDATE SNAER LEADS RETURNING SEMINOLES

All-American and ACC Player of the Year candidate Michael Snaer, who led Florida State with a career-high 14.0 points per game scoring average in 2012, is the Seminoles' returning leader in five different statistical categories including scoring, steals, assists and minutes played. Snaer led the Seminoles in both scoring (489 points / 14.0 ppg) and minutes played (1,065 minutes played / 30.4 MPG). He finished in 10th place in the 2012 ACC statistics in scoring and is the fifth leading returning scorer in the ACC for the 2013 season. Junior Okaro White, who averaged a career high 4.4 rebounds in 35 games played as a sophomore, is Florida State's leading returning rebounder from the Seminoles' 2011-12 team that won 25 games and advanced to the third round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

SNAER LEADS VETERAN GROUP OF SEMINOLES

All-American and ACC Player of the Year candidate Michael Snaer, who has started 77 of the Seminoles' last 79 games, has played in a team high 101 career games and has started a team high 77 games entering the 2012-13 season. The Seminoles' seven returning letter winners have played in a total of 327 games with a total of 107 career starting assignments spread out among three players - Snaer (77), Okaro White (25) and Terrance Shannon (five). The Seminoles are 70-31 overall (.693 winning percentage), 33-15 in the ACC (.688 winning percentage) and have played in three consecutive NCAA Tournaments with its current group of veterans on the roster.

...Play in its school record fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles advanced to the Sweet 16 of the 2011 NCAA Tournament and the third round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament. Florida State is one of only two teams in the ACC (also Duke) that enters the 2012-12 season having played in four consecutive NCAA Tournaments;

...Win at least 10 ACC games and finish in the top four of the ACC standings for the school record fifth consecutive season. The Seminoles average 10.8 ACC wins in each of the last four years and have earned a bye through the first round of the ACC Tournament in four consecutive seasons. The Seminoles finished with a school record tying 12 wins and a 12-4 record during the 2011-12 season;

...Earn at least 20 overall wins and at least 10 ACC wins for the school record fifth consecutive year. The Seminoles average of 23.8 overall wins and an average of 10.8 ACC wins in each of the last four years.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST SEVEN YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last seven years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played with 156 wins. The Seminoles average 22.3 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09) and 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11) and 25-9 (2011-12) in the last seven seasons.

FLORIDA STATE WINS THE CLOSE ONES

Florida State totaled an ACC leading nine wins in games decided by 1-2-3-4-5 points and in overtime during the 2011-12 season and leads the ACC in the last four seasons with 45 wins in close games. Florida State leads the ACC with 30 wins (30-17, .638 winning percentage) in conference play and is tied for second in non-conference wins in close games (15-11, .577 winning percentage) in the last four seasons.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO PLAY WELL ON THE ROAD

With wins at Duke, NC State, Virginia, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest during the 2012 ACC season, Florida State continued to play as one of the conference's top road teams. The Seminoles and Duke are the only two ACC teams who have finished with winning (or even) records on the road in ACC play since the start of the 2008-09 season. The Seminoles' 18 ACC road wins in the last four seasons are ranked third in the league behind only Duke (22 ACC road wins) and North Carolina (21 road wins).

.667 Florida State had an ACC leading six wins and a league leading .667 (6-3) winning percentage against ranked teams during the 2011-12 season.

.800 Florida State won 16 of its final 20 games of the 2011-12 season (.800 winning percentage) with six of those wins coming against ranked teams.

1 Florida State won its first ACC Championship in school history in 2012.

1 Leonard Hamilton is Florida State's all-time winningest coach in ACC play with 80 conference wins in his first 10 seasons at Florida State. Florida State totaled 70 wins in its first 12 seasons as a member of the ACC.

1 Florida State won its 25th game of the season with its victory over St. Bonaventure in the third round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament. Leonard Hamilton is the first coach in school history to lead the Seminoles to 25 wins in multiple seasons.

1 Florida State was the only team in the ACC to defeat a team ranked in the nation's top three at the time of the game during the 2011-12 season. The Seminoles defeated No. 3 North Carolina, 90-57, on Jan. 14, 2012 in Tallahassee.

1 Leonard Hamilton is Florida State's all-time winningest coach in the ACC Tournament with eight wins. He is 5-3 in ACC Tournament play in the last four seasons with two appearances in the championship game.

2 Florida State has played in the championship game of the ACC Tournament twice in school history (2009 and 2012) – both under Leonard Hamilton and both in the last four seasons.

3 Florida State led each of its games in the 2012 ACC Tournament by at least 10 points in winning the first ACC Championship in school history. The Seminoles led Miami by 13 in the quarterfinals (FSU won 82-71), led Duke by 10 in the semifinals (FSU won, 62-59) and led North Carolina by 16 in the championship game (FSU won 85-82).

3 Florida State enters the 2012-13 season having won three consecutive games against nationally ranked teams. The Seminoles defeated No. 24 Virginia during the final week of the ACC regular season and topped No. 6 Duke and No. 4 North Carolina to win the ACC Championship.

4 Florida State has four victories of 25 points or more since joining the ACC in 1992 – with its second largest margin of victory in an ACC game in school history coming against North Carolina (90-57, +25 points) on Jan. 14, 2011.

4 Leonard Hamilton has led Florida State to 20 or more in wins in a school record four consecutive seasons. The Seminoles average 23.8 wins in the last four years.

PICKED TO ... AND FINISHED UNDER HEAD COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

"It's not where you start, it's where you finish," says two-time ACC Coach of the Year Leonard Hamilton. The evidence certainly backs up Hamilton's assertion. Florida State's run to its first ACC Championship in school history in 2012 marked the fifth consecutive season the Seminoles had finished better in the ACC standings than they had been predicted to in the league race at the league's annual ACC media day. The Seminoles' current streak of four consecutive top four ACC finishes comes on the heels of being picked to finish above fifth only once, in the bottom half of the standings twice and as low as 10th heading into the 2008-09 season. After being selected to finish in 10th place in the ACC race in prior to the 2008-09 season, the Seminoles finished in fourth place and played in the championship game of the ACC Tournament for the first time in school history.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

On the strength of its first ACC Tournament championship and second 25 win season in the last four seasons, the Florida State men's basketball team was ranked in the top 15 of both major national polls to end the 2012 season - No. 10 by the Associated Press and No. 15 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' polls. It marks the first time since the 1992-93 season - and only the second time in school history -- that the Seminoles were ranked in the top 15 in the final polls from both ranking services. The Seminoles' 10th place finish in the AP Poll ties their highest ever in the writers' poll as they also finished in 10th in the final poll of the 1971-72 season - the year they played UCLA in the NCAA National Championship game. Florida State's No. 15 ranking in the final ESPN poll marked their third highest national finish ever according to the coaches' poll - the Seminoles finished 14th at the conclusion of the 1991-92 season and seventh at the end of the 1992-93 season.

SEMINOLES PLAYING FOR FINAL NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters the 2012-13 season having earned national rankings during each of the last four years and have been included in the final national polls in two of the last four seasons by the Associated Press and in three of the last four seasons by ESPN/USA Today.

Florida State led the ACC with six wins over nationally ranked teams during the 2011-12 season. Those six wins came in its last seven games against ranked teams during the season. The Seminoles defeated (in succession) No. 3 North Carolina (Jan. 14, 2012; 90-57), No. 4 Duke (Jan. 21, 2012; 76-73) and No. 16 Virginia (Feb. 4, 2012; 58-55) before losing to No. 5 Duke (Feb. 23, 2012; 74-66) and then closing the season with three consecutive wins over ranked teams (all on the road): at No. 24 Virginia (March 1, 2012, 63-60) and against No. 6 Duke (March 10, 2012; 62-59) and No. 4 North Carolina (March 11, 2012; 85-82) in the ACC Tournament.

4 Florida State was 4-1 against Duke and North Carolina with two wins each of ranked Blue Devil and Tar Heel teams during the 2011-12 season. The Seminoles became the first ACC team since 1985 to defeat Duke and North Carolina twice in the same season.

5 Florida State enters the 2012-13 season looking to play in its school record fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament.

6 Florida State was 6-1 (.857 winning percentage) during the month of March including a winning streak of six games to close the 2012 season.

7 Florida State won a school record seven consecutive ACC games from Jan. 10, 2012 through Feb. 4, 2012 with wins over Virginia Tech, No. 3 North Carolina, Maryland, No. 4 Duke, Wake Forest, Georgia Tech and Virginia.

8 Leonard Hamilton has led eight of his last 12 teams to 20 win seasons and averages 20.6 wins per season since the start of the 1998-99 season when he was the head coach at Miami.

9 Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton is looking to take Florida State to the postseason for the ninth time during the 2012-13 season. He has taken eight different teams to the postseason in his first 10 years at Florida State. He is the only coach in school history to take at least eight teams to the postseason.

10 All-America candidate Michael Snaer was named to the ACC All-Defensive team in 2012. A total of 10 Seminoles have been named to the ACC All Defensive team in the first 10 years of the Leonard Hamilton era at Florida State.

11 Florida State held a double digit lead in 11 of its 16 regular season ACC games including a 33 point lead over North Carolina in the Seminoles' 90-57 win over the Tar Heels on Jan. 14, 2012 in Tallahassee. The Seminoles were 10-1 in ACC games in which they lead by at least 10 points.

23 Florida State led by at least 10 points in 23 of its 35 games during the 2011-12 season. The Seminoles' largest lead of the season came against South Alabama (+43, 78-35 and 80-37) in an 80-39 win over the Jaguars.

25 Florida State was undefeated, 25-0, when it outscored its opponents during the 2011-12 season.

43 Leonard Hamilton has won 43 games and has a .671 winning percentage in ACC play in the last four years. The Seminoles had 37 wins and a .386 winning percentage in his first six seasons in Tallahassee.

80 Leonard Hamilton has 80 wins and a .500 record in ACC play in his first 10 seasons at Florida State – the Seminoles had 70 wins and a .398 winning percentage in its first 12 seasons in the ACC.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL DEFENSIVE STATISTICS

Florida State finished the 2011-12 season ranked fifth in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.381) and seventh in the nation in blocked shots (6.1 bpg). The Seminoles finished No. 1 nationally in field goal percentage defense in both 2009-10 and 2010-11 and are the only team in the nation to finish in the top five in the field goal defense

APPROACHING THE RECORD FOR MOST WINS BY A SENIOR CLASS

Florida State's four-year seniors (Michael Snaer and Joey Moreau) enter the 2012-13 season looking to become the winningest senior class in school history. The Seminoles' 2011-12 senior class (Deividas Dulkys, Xavier Gibson and Luke Loucks) set the school record for wins by a senior class with 95. Florida State's 2012 senior class, which became the first senior class in school history to play in four consecutive NCAA Tournaments, averaged 23.8 wins per season while this 2013 senior class averages 22.3 wins per season. The current senior class of Snaer and Moreau has tied the school record for most wins in a three-year period – 70 by the 2012 senior classes.

SNAER AMONG ACC'S RETURNING LEADERS IN GAMES PLAYED

All-American and ACC Player of the Year candidate Michael Snaer enters his senior season ranked fourth in the ACC with 101 career games played and 77 career games started. He is one of only two returning ACC players who has played in at least 100 career games and started at least 75 career games. SNAER IN THE SEMINOLES' STARTING LINE-UP

All-American and ACC Player of the Year candidate Michael Snaer returns as a starter in Florida State's starting line-up for the four consecutive season in 2012-13. He started the final 10 games of his freshman season (2009-10), 33 of 34 games as a sophomore (2010-11) and 34 of 35 games as a junior (2011-12). Snaer has started 77 of the Seminoles' last 79 games since earning his first career start on February 6, 2010 in a 71-65 win over Miami in Tallahassee. He is ranked 23rd in school history for career starts and needs only 23 starts as a senior to become one of only seven players in school history to start 100 or more games during his Florida State career.

WHITE ON SEMINOLES ALL-TIME TOP 10 FREE THROW SHOOTING LIST

Junior Okaro White enters the 2012-13 season ranked 10th in school history with a .7872 career free throw shooting percentage. He is looking to become one of only 13 players in school history to shoot better than 78 percent from the line and one of only six players in school history to shoot 80 percent or better from the free throw line for his career. The school record for career free throw shooting percentage is .824 (75 of 91) by Ken Leakey (1964-66).

SHANNON BACK IN LINE-UP

Junior Terrance Shannon, who missed all but the first seven games of the 2011-12 season because of a dislocated left shoulder which he suffered against UConn in the final game of the Battle 4 Atlantis, will return to the Seminoles line-up in 2013. After he was injured against UConn, underwent surgery on January 4, 2012 and was granted a medical redshirt by the NCAA and the ACC in June of 2012. Shannon has two years of eligibility remaining at the start of the 2012-13 with an incredible amount of potential waiting to be tapped during the remainder of his Seminole career.

MILLER TIME

Sophomore guard Ian Miller enters the 2012-13 season as one of the top scorers in the ACC after averaging a career-high 10.3 points per game. He played just one game more as a sophomore (24) than he did as a freshman (23) but worked to significantly increase his statistics. Miller averaged nearly 10 minutes more played per game, nearly five points more scored per game and nearly one steal more per game in helping the Seminoles to the 2012 ACC Championship and into the NCAA Tournament for the second time in his two years as a Seminole. Miller is Florida State's second leading returning scorer (10.3 points per game) and one of two returning Seminoles who scored in double figures last season (also Michael Snaer who averaged a team leading 14.0 points per game).

Certainly, Florida State led the nation in game-winning buzzer beating shots in 2012. Beginning with Michael Snaer's shot hear around the basketball world on January 21 at Duke and his backbreaker against Virginia Tech on Feb. 16 and culminating with Ian Miller's nothing but the bottom of the net shot at Virginia on March 1, the Seminoles won three games with a total of 3.2 seconds remaining on the clock in 2012. Snaer's shot against Duke (at the buzzer) and Miller's shot against Virginia (with 0:00.8 left) both came on the road in ACC play. Snaer's game-winner against Virginia Tech in Tallahassee came after the Seminoles trailed by as many as 15 points with just over 14 minutes left to play.

SEMINOLES BRING ACC CHAMPIONSHIP TO TALLAHASSEE

Florida State's ACC Championship in 2012 marked the first time since 2004 and only the second time since 1993 that a team outside of the state of North Carolina won the league championship. The Seminoles became the first team not named Duke or North Carolina to win the championship since Maryland in 2004. Prior to Maryland winning their third league championship in 2004, Georgia Tech was the last non-North Carolina team to win the championship in 1993.
