- This Weekend: Florida State (6-2) takes on Oakland (1-7) for a three-game series on Mike Martin Field at Dick Howser Stadium Friday-Sunday (4:00 FRI, 1:00 SAT & SUN). The Seminoles are 5-2 at home this season, while all eight of Oakland's games this season have come on the road.
- Last time against Oakland: In 2015, the Seminoles hosted the Golden Grizzlies to open the season, beating OU 7-3, 15-2 and 5-1. Four current Seminoles made the first starts of their FSU careers in the season opener - Dylan Busby (0-4, BB), Quincy Nieporte (1-3), Taylor Walls (0-3, BB) and Hank Truluck (1-3).
- Last time out: The Seminoles won at JU for the first time since 2014 with a 6-5, come-from-behind win against the Dolphins. FSU trailed 5-3 in the 8th, but three JU errors allowed FSU to score three runs. Tyler Daughtry's game-winning single was the only hit in the frame, and Drew Carlton was perfect in earning the six-out save.
- In the Polls: Florida State remains in the Top 10 across all six polls this week, peaking at No. 2 in the Baseball L America poll, where they began the season.
- NCAA Stats: Florida State leads the nation in walks, with 61 in eight games (7.6 per game)...FSU also ranks in the Top 10 nationally with 7 sac flies on the year (7th)...on the mound, FSU is fifth with a 4.53 K-to-BB ratio, fifth in WHIP (0.97) and ninth in BB/9 IP (2.13). Taylor Walls' 14 walks are the most in the country.
- FSU Newcomers: Three newcomers rank among the top four on the team in batting average: Nick Derr (.476 1), Rhett Aplin (.333 - 3) and J.C. Flowers (.320 - 4). Tyler Daughtry had the first RBI of his career on his second career hit when his single in the eighth inning gave FSU a 6-5 lead in Jacksonville on Tuesday.
- FSU Newcomers: On the mound, four freshman have played this season. Drew Parrish threw 6.0 innings against Samford in his first start, allowing just one run. Clayton Kwiatkowski and Grant Stewart allowed no runs in their first FSU action against Samford, and Brandon Reitz allowed one run against the Bulldogs.

Top in the ACC: FSU leads the ACC in walks (61, also No. 1 nationally) and WHIP (0.97). Individually, Taylor Walls (14 R walks, 1.75 BB per game), Jackson Lueck (2 sac flies) and Andrew Karp (17.00 K-to-BB ratio) lead their respective categories.

ACC Player of the Week: With his 11-strikeout performance last week against Samford. Tyler Holton earned ACC g Pitcher of the Week honors on Monday. Holton allowed just two hits in seven innings in FSU's 8-0 win. He is the first Seminole to earn Pitcher of the Week honors since 2015 (Boomer Biegalski).

<u>11 GETS WIN NO. 1,900</u>

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 36 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,581 as head coach (1980-present).

GAME NOTES vs. OU

AGAINST THE GOLDEN GRIZZLIES

- » Florida State and Oakland have played just seven times, most recently in 2015.
- » The Seminoles are 7-0 against the Golden Grizzlies all-time, including a 3-0 record under head coach Mike Martin.
- » The teams first played in 1978, a doubleheader that FSU swept 15-6 and 6-2 in Tallahassee.

- » Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America.
- The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State in 2016 and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
- Walls also earned third team marks from NCBWA and D1Baseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.
- » Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.
