Type of Institution...

A premier public university in the state of Florida featuring over undergraduate majors, minors, as well as graduate programs, a world renowned Law school and a state of the art Medical School.

Founded...

Florida State University had its beginning as early as 1823 when the Territorial Legislature began to plan a higher education system.

Campus...

Only 1 mile from downtown Tallahassee FSU is located just east of some of the most beautiful white-sand beaches in Destin, Panama City, and St. George Island. Tallahassee enjoys four distinct seasons with an average temperature of 69 degrees. Summer temperatures are subtropical with an average of 83 degrees while winters average a pleasant 50 degrees.

39,136 Full time students of which 75.7% are undergraduate, 21.4% are graduate and 2.9% are unclassified.

Florida State University is a comprehensive degree granting university, offering baccalaureate degrees in 94 programs, master's degrees in 107 programs, advanced master's/specialist degrees in 28 programs, doctorates in 73 programs and two professional degrees.
