#### **STARTING 9: WHAT TO KNOW**

- Against WF: Florida State and Wake Forest meet for three games beginning Friday, May 12. It represents the final home series of the year for FSU, and Senior Day will be celebrated on Friday, honoring Quincy Nieporte, Hank Truluck, Bryan Bussey, Jim Voyles, Alec Byrd, and Matt Henderson.
- **Last time out:** FSU beat Jacksonville, 21-2, beating the Dolphins for the third time this season. It was FSU's first 20+ run game since Rhode Island 2016, and **Drew Mendoza**'s two HR and six RBI led the way for the Noles. Mendoza is the first Seminole freshman with six RBI since **DJ Stewart** against Georgia Tech in 2013.
- **3** Holton 10+ K: Tyler Holton recorded 10 of 16 outs via strikeout in Saturday's 18-5 win over Pacific. It was the third time in 2017 that Holton has had 10+ K's (11 vs. Samford, 13 vs. Oakland). **Sean Gilmartin** (four times) is the last Seminole to have at least three 10+ K-games in a season.
- **Busby National POTW: Dylan Busby** was named the NCBWA National Hitter of the Week (4/25) after going 8-for-18 with three HR, two doubles and 10 RBI in four games. Busby hit two home runs against Stetson (4/18) and had three RBI in five straight games, the first player in FSU history to do so. He is hitting .382 since April 1.
- Hendo on fire: Second baseman Matt Henderson is hitting .351 since April 1 after hitting just .190 through February and March. He has reached base in a career-high 17 consecutive games entering the Wake Forest series. He leads the Seminoles with a .463 on-base percentage, including a .536 mark since April 1.
- Holton among nation's best: Tyler Holton is the fourth FSU pitcher to earn three ACC Pitcher of the Week honors in one season after throwing seven innings of no-hit ball against No. 7 North Carolina. He is one of 40 players on the Midseason Watch List for the Golden Spikes Award, given to the nation's top player.
- **Toleration**Stopper of the Year: Reliever Drew Carlton was named one of 40 players on the midseason Stopper of the Year list, the NCBWA announced. Carlton has a 1.53 ERA in 35.1 relief innings, with 34 strikeouts and just 9 walks. The junior also has four of FSU's six saves on the season and three wins.
- Martin's 3,000th game: Game 1 against Virginia (4/28) was head coach Mike Martin's 3,000th as a member of Florida State (Player 96 1965-66; Asst. Coach 288 1975-79; Head Coach 2,623 1980-Present). Martin is the NCAA active leader in wins (1,930) & pct. (.736) and just 46 wins from the all-time mark (Augie Garrido, 1,975).
- J.D. Drew jersey retired: Florida State baseball retired the No. 39 jersey of J.D. Drew (1995-97) on April 15. Drew, a two-time All-American and the only member of the 30 HR/30 SB club in college (1997), is just the second FSU player to have his jersey/number retired (No. 34 Dick Howser).

#### THE WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN COLLEGE BASEBALL. MARTIN...

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.736)
- » owns the second-most wins all-time in NCAA Division I baseball history and most among active coaches (1,930)

### MARTIN (CONT.)

#### 11 GETS WIN NO. 1.900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program.
- » Martin participated in his 3,000th game against as a Seminole vs. Virginia on April 28 - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,623 as head coach (1980-present).

### OPP. NOTES vs. WF

#### AGAINST THE DEMON DEACONS

- » Florida State holds a 87-25 all-time record with Wake Forest, including a 46-10 record in Tallahassee.
- » Last season, the Demon Deacons won two of three games in Winston-Salem, the first time FSU has dropped the series against Wake since 2002.

- » On the mound, brothers Jim and Ed Voyles combined to throw 7.1 innings of scoreless ball, with Jim getting the win in Saturday's game.
- Wake Forest leads the country in both home runs (82) and home runs per game (1.71), while also leading the ACC in doubles per game (2.27), hits (541), runs (389) and slugging percentage (.523).
- » Individually, Gavin Sheets' 70 RBI and 1.46 RBI per game are the most in the nation.

### GAME NOTES vs. WAKE FOREST

#### MENDOZA'S BIG DAY LEADS NOLES

- First baseman Drew Mendoza hit two home runs and had four RBI in FSU's 21-2 rout of Jacksonville (5/9).
- The Minneola, Fla., native is the first FSU freshman with six RBI since DJ Stewart had six against Georgia Tech in 2013. He is the first Seminole with two HR and six RBI in a game since Quincy Nieporte did it against UCF in 2015 (7 RBI).
- For the Seminoles, the 21 runs are the most since scoring 23 against Rhode Island in 2016. The 17 hits tied a season high (17 vs. Pacific, 5/6), and Mendoza's two HR were FSU's only extra-base hits.

#### HENDERSON SEES AVG JUMP

- Senior second baseman Matt Henderson is hitting .351 in April/May, second-best on the team. For the season, the Chico, Calif., native is hitting .270 after hitting just .190 in February/March.
- Henderson set a career high with four RBI against No. 3 Clemson (4/15), including a three-run double. He also had a season-high three hits in that game.
- The senior is also getting on base at a .536 clip since April 1 after reaching at a .385 clip before. His 36 walks are second on the team.

#### **BUSBY NATIONAL POTW**

- Junior third baseman Dylan Busby became the first FSU player ever with at least three RBI in five straight games after hitting a three-run homer against Miami
- Since April 1. Busby is hitting .382 with 6 doubles and 7 home runs.
- Busby now has 34 career home runs, the most among active players in the ACC, three ahead of Kel Johnson (Georgia Tech).
- For his efforts, Busby was named the NCBWA National Hitter of the Week (FSU's first since DJ Stewart in 2015) and the ACC Player of the Week.
- Entering Friday's game against Wake Forest, Busby has safely reached base in seven consecutive at-bats (five hits, two walks).

#### NOLES USING LONG BALL

- Before scoring 11 runs without a home run on Tuesday at Stetson, Florida State had hit a home run in nine straight games.
- The nine-game streak is FSU's longest since 2010 (May 27-June 131.
- FSU has hit a home run in 31 of 50 games this year.

#### RALEIGH DURABLE BEHIND HOME

- Sophomore catcher Cal Raleigh is the only Seminole to play in every game this season, starting all 50 games behind home plate.
- Centerfielder J.C. Flowers missed the first game of the Pacific series, yielding to Tyler Holton, snapping his games started streak at 45. Rhett Aplin had played every game prior to the Stetson game on April 25.
- Dating back to a relief appearance against Villanova on March 2 last season, Raleigh has started 100 consecutive games at catcher.

#### WALLS' LEADOFF HR vs. UF & CU

- Taylor Walls led off the game against Florida (4/11) with his fourth home run of the season.
- In doing so, he became the first FSU player to lead off a first inning with a home run since Sherman Johnson
- In 2011, FSU hit five leadoff homeruns three by current Blue Jays second baseman Devon Travis, and two by current Blue Jays minor leaguer Raffy Lopez.
- Walls hit another leadoff home run against Clemson

#### APLIN LEADS OUTFIELD IN ASSTS

- Before being sidelined for the season with a broken foot, Rhett Aplin had four of Florida State's seven outfield assists this season after throwing a runner out at the plate to preserve a tie game vs. No. 3 Clemson (4/17).
- FSU entered the NC State (4/9) game with three outfield assists on the season. In the 5th inning

against the Wolfpack, Aplin and J.C. Flowers each had an assist.
