

## Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 83, Lincoln Memorial 75

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Junior Okaro White scored a game-high 19 points and All-American Michael Snaer scored 12 to lead No. 24 Florida State to an 83-75 victory over Lincoln Memorial at the Donald L. Tucker Center in its first of two exhibition games as the Seminoles prepare to defend the ACC Championship they won in 2012. The Seminoles never trailed and led by as many as 17 points in taking the victory over the visiting Railsplitters. White scored the first three points of the game on his first of four made 3-point shots with only 20 seconds expired on the clock. He added two more free throws as the Seminoles scored the first seven points of the game and led by 10 with just over one minute elapsed in the game. White added a second 3-pointer to up the Seminoles' lead to 10-2 at the 18:08 mark. White finished the game making five of six shots from the field, four of five from the 3-point line and finishing a nearly perfect five of six from the free throw line. Florida State upped its lead to as many as 17 with 5:24 remaining before halftime but the visiting Railsplitters refused to go quietly into the Tallahassee night. They cut into the Seminoles' 50-37 halftime lead and were within four points with under two minutes remaining before the Seminoles scored six of the final eight points of the game.

## Exhibition 2 -- Florida State 65, Saint Leo 56

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Junior Okaro White scored a game-high 16 points and pulled down 10 rebounds and senior All-American Michael Snaer scored 11 points and was credited with five assists to lead No. 24 Florida State to a 65-56 win over Saint Leo in the Seminoles' second and final exhibition game at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State took its first lead of the game on a lay-up by junior guard Ian Miller which made the score 8-7; the Seminoles did not trail in the game after Miller's basket. Miller's lay-up began a 13-0 Seminole run which vaulted the Seminoles to a 19-7 lead with 11:53 left in the first half. The Seminoles would stretch their lead to as many as 14 in the first half and led 35-28 at the intermission. White scored 11 first half points to rank as the only player to score in double figures in the first half. Florida State opened the second half on a 13-6 run to push its lead back to 14 points at 48-34 with 14:04 left in the game. Junior Terrance Shannon led the Seminoles with four points on a dunk and a lay-up during the run to open the half. The Seminoles maintained as much as a 12 point lead during the remainder of the game before Saint Leo scored six of the final nine points of the game to cut the final margin to nine points.

## Game 1 -- South Alabama 76, Florida State 71

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Antoine Allen hit four 3-pointers and scored 21 points to lead South Alabama to a 76-71 season-opening upset of No. 24 Florida State. Augustine Rubit added 12 points and Mychal Ammons had 11 points and 11 rebounds for South Alabama, which shot 9 of 15 from 3-point range. Terry Whisnant and Montay Brandon had 11 points apiece for the Seminoles, the defending Atlantic Coast Conference champions. Senior guard Michael Snaer had 10 points at halftime but was held scoreless in the second half. He shot 2 of 11 in the game. Terrance Shannon returned from a shoulder injury to score 10 points for Florida State. Florida State, which had 17 turnovers and just nine assists, had won 11 straight season openers.

## Game 2 -- Florida State 95, Buffalo 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Florida State pulled away with an 8-0 run in the early moments to lead 18-6 and never trailed in the ballgame and defeated Buffalo, 95-68, in the second round of the Coaches vs. Cancer Tournament at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Bulls pulled to within a 66-58 score midway through the second half before a Kiel Turpin fire

throw and Montay Brandon dunk put the 'Noles back on top by double digits. The Seminoles closed out the game on a 31-12 run. Senior leader Michael Snaer led all players with 19 points on 4-of-7 shooting from 3-point range while Okaro White's 2-for-2 shooting from long range was part of a night that saw him finish a perfect 5-for-5 from the field for 13 points. Freshman Aaron Thomas added 10 points for an FSU team that shot 59.6 percent from the field. Terrance Shannon and Terry Whisnant had nine points apiece and Brandon finished with eight. After not playing in the opener, freshman point guard Devon Bookert made his collegiate debut off the bench and finished with three points. Fourteen players competed for the Seminoles and all but two of them scored in the 95-point effort. To put that total in perspective, FSU scored at least 90 points just once a season ago.

**Game 4 -- Florida State 73,  
Saint Joseph's 66**

BROOKLYN, N.Y. - Reserve forward Terrance Shannon scored 15 points - 11 in the final 13:45 - and grabbed 10 rebounds to lead Florida State to a 73-66 victory over Saint Joseph's in the championship game of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic at Barclays Center. After Saint Joseph's got within 63-60, Shannon scored six straight points, two on a goaltending down low, two on a long layup after a missed 3 by the Hawks and on a vicious rebound dunk with 2:14 left that made it 69-61. Okaro White added 16 points for the Seminoles (3-1) while tournament MVP Michael Snaer had 14. Carl Jones, making his first appearance of the season after serving a three-game suspension for a "violation of the University community standards," finished with 13 points. The Hawks' leading scorer he past two seasons had half of their four 3-pointers as they struggled from beyond the arc.

**Game 5 -- Florida State 75,  
North Florida 67**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Michael Snaer scored 17 of his 21 points in the second period as Florida State won its fourth consecutive game with a 75-67 win over North Florida. Florida State led 16-3 in the game's early moments but saw that lead slip to a 32-24 score at halftime. Then midway

through the second half, FSU had its biggest lead of the night -- a 14-point advantage -- but UNF's timely triples from long range kept the game within two possessions throughout much of the contest. Despite that, Snaer still kept UNF at bay with his defense and clutch free-throw shooting. The senior finished the night 9-of-10 from the free-throw line while hitting 50 percent of his field goals and adding eight rebounds and two blocks. Okaro White also missed just one from the charity stripe and scored 15 points to go along with nine rebounds and two steals. Terrance Shannon had 12 points and a team-high four steals and Terry Whisnant, who started in place of the injured Ian Miller added eight points. Freshman Devon Bookert paced the team with four assists but FSU only had eight as a team in that category after excelling at sharing the basketball over the past three games. FSU outscored UNF 34-18 in the paint and registered 18 points off 15 takeaways. The 'Noles had 17 turnovers of their own. Parker Smith's 20 points led North Florida.
