STARTING 9: WHAT TO KNOW

- Last time out:** FSU beat Stetson for a 12th straight time Wednesday, beating the Hatters 7-3 in Tallahassee. The Seminoles used three home runs, two from **Dylan Busby** and one from **Cal Raleigh**, and got six of its seven hits from **Taylor Walls** and Busby in the 1- and 2-holes. **Clayton Kwiatkowski** went 3.2 innings for his first win.
- Busby heating up:** **Dylan Busby** hit a pair of home runs in Wednesday's 7-3 win over Stetson, the first FSU player with two home runs in a game this year. Busby homered in consecutive at-bats and notched three RBI. It is the fourth straight game he has had 3 RBI, tying a school record with Jeff Ledbetter (1982) and Jason Stidham (2009).
- Last weekend:** On Monday, FSU played its first national TV game of the year, beating Clemson 7-6. **Cal Raleigh's** HR in the 7th broke a 5-5 tie, and **Alec Byrd** was outstanding in relief, pitching the final 3.0 innings to earn his second win of the year. FSU rallied after allowing a 3-R HR to Seth Beer in the first inning.
- Holton among nation's best:** **Tyler Holton** is the fourth FSU pitcher to earn three ACC Pitcher of the Week honors in one season after throwing seven innings of no-hit ball against No. 7 North Carolina. He is one of 40 players on the Midseason Watch List for the Golden Spikes Award, given to the nation's top player.
- Holton among nation's best 2:** On Sunday, **Holton** pitched a career-high 8.0 innings, allowing three earned runs in FSU's 7-3 win over the Tigers. The sophomore is 16th nationally, allowing 5.37 hits per nine innings, 20th in K's (73), 24th in K's/9 IP (11.87) and 19th in WHIP (0.87).
- Noles lead the country in walks:** Junior **Taylor Walls** is second in the country with 38 walks. As a team, FSU has been walked 238 times, the most in the country and one of just three teams (Mercer 237, South Alabama, 230) over 215 on the year.
- Noles in the Pros:** With the MLB season opening earlier this month, **Buster Posey** (Giants), **Stephen Drew** (Nationals), **Stephen Cardullo** (Rockies), **Robby Scott** (Red Sox), **Devon Travis** (Blue Jays) and **Kevin Cash** (manager of the Rays) opened the year in the pros. **Sean Gilmartin** (Mets) joined the team last week.
- Martin active leader in wins:** Head coach **Mike Martin**, now in his 38th year as head coach at Florida State, is the active wins leader with 1,922. He also is the all-time winningest coach by percentage, with a .737 mark. He needs just 54 wins to pass **Augie Garrido's** all-time wins record (1,975).
- J.D. Drew jersey retired:** Florida State baseball retired the No. 39 jersey of **J.D. Drew** (1995-97) on April 15. Drew, a two-time All-American and the only member of the 30 HR/30 SB club in college (1997), is just the second FSU player to have his jersey/number retired (No. 34 **Dick Howser**).

THE WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN COLLEGE BASEBALL, MARTIN...

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- » was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.737)
- » owns the second-most wins all-time in NCAA Division I baseball history and most among active coaches (1,922)
- » has led Florida State to 37 consecutive NCAA Regional appearances
- » has taken the Noles on 15 trips to the College World Series
- » has overseen 17 conference championships (11 Metro Conference, 6 Atlantic Coast Conference - 95, 97, 02, 04, 10, 15)
- » coached eight consecutive ACC Atlantic Division Championships (2007-2014) including setting the school record for the most conference wins in a season with a 24-6 mark in 2008 & 2012
- » produced 19 first round draft picks with 17 coming since 1990. Overall, Martin has coached 49 of FSU's 69 players that have reached the Major Leagues
- » coached 89 All-Americans, 125 All-ACC selections and a record four Golden Spikes winners
- » is a seven-time ACC Coach of the Year - 1996, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2007, 2009, 2012

MARTIN (CONT.)

11 GETS WIN NO. 1,900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 4 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,612 as head coach (1980-present).
- » Here is a look at the other milestone wins of Martin's illustrious career:

AGAINST THE HURRICANES

- » Florida State leads the all-time series against Miami, 151-126-4, and bring a two-game winning streak into the series.
- » Miami won two-of-three in Tallahassee, but FSU won on a Jackson Lueck walk-off home run to win the series finale and a Dylan Busby walk-off single to beat the Canes 5-4 in the ACC Tournament.
- » In 2015, FSU won two in Miami, including an 8-7 win in 17 innings in the Friday night opener.
- » Since Miami joined the league prior to the 2005 season, Florida State holds a 22-19 advantage.

HOLTON IN ELITE COMPANY

- » Tallahassee native Tyler Holton continues to show why he is one of the top pitchers in college baseball this season, with a 2.60 ERA and 5-1 record in nine starts.
- » **Holton is a three-time ACC Pitcher of the Week, joining Paul Wilson (1993 & 1994), Mike Ziegler (2000) and Sean Gilmartin (2011) as the only FSU pitchers to earn the award three times in one season.**
- » Against No. 4 Clemson (4/16), Holton threw a career-high 8.0 innings, allowing three runs while striking out nine.
- » Holton was stellar against No. 8 North Carolina (4/11), pitching a no-hitter before being pulled after 109 pitches in the eighth inning. He walked only one batter, his final of the game, and struck out 8.
- » Before the walk, all four baserunners that reached were via error, and each runner was stranded.
- » Against Oakland (3/4), Holton struck out 13 batters in just six innings of work without allowing a walk. He set a career-high in strikeouts for the second consecutive week after having 11 against Samford (2/25).
- » Holton also became the first Nole with 13 K since Luke Weaver had 14 against Troy in the 2013 NCAA Regionals. He is the first Seminole with consecutive games of 10+ K's since Sean Gilmartin in 2011.

- » Against the Dolphins, the FSU bullpen allowed just one earned run in 8.1 innings, striking out 8 without walking a batter.
- » Against FGCU on April 4, Jackson Lueck tallied his third hit of the game, an RBI double that scored Taylor Walls in FSU's 7-6 win.

» At UCF (3/8), redshirt junior Will Zirzow pitched a career-high five innings, allowing one hit & striking out a career-high seven in earning the win in a 5-0 shutout.
 » Only two batters reached base against Big Z - a single that was erased on a pickoff, and a strikeout that reached on an error that was then erased on a double play.
 » Zirzow's previous career highs in innings and strikeouts came in last year's ACC Championship Game against Clemson (4.1 innings, 6 strikeouts).

WALLS NAMED ALL-AMERICAN

» Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America in 2016.
 » The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State in 2016 and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
 » Walls also earned third team marks from NCBWA and D1Baseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.
 » Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.
 » To begin 2017, Walls has six doubles, two triples and five home runs, including two that led off games. He is third nationally in walks with 38 and 24th with 41 runs scored.
