In Memoriam

The Florida State family lost Colleen Walker - a friend to the Seminole program, a mentor to countless student-athletes, a mother to Tyler, a wife to Ron Bakich, and a member of the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame - to

cancer on December 11, 2012. She will be remembered as a person who gave everything she could to her alma mater and to a generation of Seminole golfers.

When Amy Bond returned to Florida State as its head coach in 2010, she had some very specific goals in mind for her tenure at her alma mater.

"We want to play well throughout the fall and spring seasons, improve with each tournament, make it to NCAA Regionals, advance to the NCAA Championship East site and win the National Championship," said Bond.

For Bond it has been mission accomplished in her first two seasons. The Seminoles were ranked among

the nation's top 25 throughout the 2010-11 and 2011-12 seasons, they played in the NCAA East Regional Championship in 2011 and the NCAA Central Regional Championship in 2012 and had a player advance to the NCAA Championship Finals in both 2011 and 2012.

"I am happy with the growth of our team in my first two years," said Bond. "Our players have made really great progress and have represented Florida State very well on the national stage. We have had players win tournaments, earn All-ACC and All-American honors and play in the NCAA Finals, but I think this team is ready to take their accomplishments to another level."

With three members of her line-up returning for the 2013 season, Bond has many reasons for her optimism. She will look to seniors Jessica Negron and Malin Jansson and sophomore Laure Castelain – her most experienced players – for leadership and to senior Mary Beth Ramsay and sophomores Carlton Kuhlo and Alex Milan for depth. The Seminoles' only newcomer – Olivia Hullert – will challenge for a spot in the line-up as well as add to the team's depth in her first season as a Seminole.

"I like the make-up of our team and am excited about the season," said Bond. "We have five players who played a lot of golf for us last season and who all helped us play in the NCAA Tournament for the school record seventh consecutive season. We are counting on those five players and their ability to improve and make us a better team. For us to move up in the ACC standings and deeper into the NCAA Finals, they must all play more consistently on not only each hole they play but in each tournament they participate in for our team."

Consistency will be important for the Seminoles as they utilized nine different lineups in their 10 events and played consecutive tournaments with the same line-up only once during the fall 2012 and spring 2013 seasons.

Negron, who earned All-ACC honors and who played in the 2011 NCAA Championship Finals, has been Florida State's most consistent player throughout her career. She is in her fourth season as a member of the Seminoles' line-up, has played in 32 career events and has earned six top 10 career individual finishes. Negron enters her senior season having played in three ACC Championships, three NCAA Regional Championships and the NCAA Championship finals in 2010 and 2011.

"I am really excited about Jess as a senior because she is excited about playing golf in her senior season," said Bond. "She had a great summer as she qualified to play in her second career U.S. Amateur which really helped her confidence. She played well late during her junior season and I see that momentum carrying her into her senior season."

Negron finished in the top 10 of two of her last three tournaments in 2012 with a tied for fifth place finish at the Bryan National Collegiate and a tied for seven place finish at the ACC Championship.

Jansson, who suffered through a painful back injury during the spring of 2012, is healthy and looking very much forward to her second season as a Seminole after transferring to Florida State from Western Carolina. When she was healthy she earned a fourth place finish at the spring 2012 Sugar Bowl Classic and a pair of top 25 finishes during the fall 2011 season. Her back injury forced her to miss two of Florida State's final three matches

of her junior season including the ACC Championship.

"Malin is healthy and that's a very good thing for our team," said Bond. "Malin's availability will make us a much more consistent team and will allow us to utilize the best combination of five players. She is one of our top golfers and we need her to play well for our team to be successful."

Jansson is the Seminoles' second leading returning golfer who finished with a 75.76 stroke average as she played in seven of Florida State's 10 tournaments in 2012. She was the Seminoles' top finisher in two of her seven appearances and finished with the team's low scoring average during the fall 2011 season.

Castelain, who is the Seminoles' leading returning golfer with a 75.74 stroke average during her freshman season, was Florida State's biggest surprise in 2012. She played in all but one event, finished as the Seminoles'

leading golfer twice, totaled nearly half of her rounds scored at 75 or better and finished with the fourth best scoring average among the strong crop of freshmen in the ACC.

"Laure did everything we could have hoped from her during her freshman season," said Bond. "She was one of our most consistent players who helped put us in position for our numerous strong finishes during the year. The experience she gained as a freshman is going to prove extremely valuable not only this season but during the remainder of her career. Laure will certainly be one of our leaders moving forward."

Castelain helped Florida State to a tie for third place finish in the Susie Berning Classic at the University of Oklahoma and to a fourth place finish at the ACC Championship. The Seminoles' fourth place finish at the ACC Championship was their fourth top four finish in the event in the last six seasons.

Kuhlo and Milan will both look to play expanded roles as sophomores. Kuhlo played in four events

including Florida State's third place finish at the Bryan National Collegiate while Milan played in seven events including her first career ACC Championship.

"I think both Carlton and Alex are two of the biggest keys to our success in 2013," said Bond. "They both earned a taste of collegiate golf last year and will need to play like veterans this year. For us to be good both of those players have to play at a high level. It's that simple.

Kuhlo began her Seminole career quickly as she earned a place in Florida State's line-up in its first event of the year and helped lead the Seminoles to a fifth place finish at the Mo Morial Tournament at Texas A&M University. She was in the starting line-up twice more during her freshman season with appearances in the Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge and at the Bryan National Collegiate.

"Carlton has all of the skills needed to be a great golfer," said Bond. "She was able to get acclimated to our system and learned what it takes to be successful at this level as a freshman. She needs to continue to grow and to continue to work hard because we need her in our line-up. As she progresses, she can push her teammates to become better golfers."

Milan played in seven of Florida State's 10 events as she helped the Seminoles earn five top five finishes during the year. She was at her best in the Susie Maxwell Berning Classic as she earned the first top 30 individual finish of her career. Milan earned her best single round score of her freshman season – a 72 – in the third round of the event.

"Alex played well for us last season and was in our line-up during the ACC Championship," said Bond. "She also has an immense amount of talent and promise. The experience she gained last season in playing in seven of our 10 events is going to help her in 2013. She also got used to being a student-athlete at Florida State as a freshman and that will certainly help her as a sophomore.

Ramsay is one of three seniors on the roster who has played in eight events during the first three years of her career. Her experience will be a factor for Florida State with only seven players on the roster.

"Mary Beth will play a key role for our team this year," said Bond. "She has learned how to practice and what it takes to be successful.

Hullert, Florida State's only freshman in 2013, has a tremendous opportunity ahead of her in her first season as a Seminole. As Florida State's tallest player (6-0) she

could very well be the Seminoles' most powerful player who will certainly challenge for a spot in the line-up. She is the No. 1 ranked golfer on the Norwegian Titelist Tour. She has played internationally throughout the world and may be as ready to play immediately for the Seminoles as any freshman in the recent history of the program.

"Olivia brings an incredible amount of international experience to our team," said Bond. "I am really excited about what she brings to our team. She is a great ball striker, putts well, and is very mentally tough. I am looking forward to her having an outstanding career at Florida State."

With many experienced golfers to choose from to form a consistent starting line-up, Bond and the Seminoles will work to earn their school record eighth consecutive NCAA Championship appearance. As Florida State closes the gap between themselves and the top teams in the country, it will continue to move up the ladder in the ACC rankings and the national rankings.

One way Bond has worked to help the Seminoles become more of a power team across the nation has been the addition of a home tournament to mark the first time Florida State has hosted an event since the 2004-05 season.

"It's something that I have wanted to do since coming back to Florida State," said Bond. "It's going to be a great tournament with a number of nationally ranked teams playing at Southwood Golf Club in Tallahassee. We hope it becomes one of the premier events in the early part of the spring season in all of college golf."

The Seminoles' home tournament, which will be one of the toughest in all of college golf in its first season, only adds to the strength of the Seminoles' schedule. The Seminoles will also play at the GolfWeek Challenge to open the fall season and the Mercedes Benz Collegiate Challenge and the Landfall Tradition during the fall

season. In addition to hosting its own event in the spring, Florida State will play at the Lady Gator Invitational, the LSU Golf Classic and the Bryan National Collegiate among others as they work to play in their school record eighth consecutive NCAA Championship tournament.

"Our goals are never going to change," said Bond. "We are going to continue to work hard to achieve all of our team goals and continue to coach all of our players to help them achieve all of their goals. As always, our goals for the 2013 season are formidable but I am excited about the abilities our players possess and look forward to watching the season unfold."

Amy Bond, who is in her third season as Florida State's head coach, is one of the cornerstones of the Seminole women's golf program. First as a player, then an assistant coach and now as its head coach, Bond's commitment to the success of the program at her alma mater is unmatched. As a player she earned a spot on the ACC's 50th Anniversary team, as an assistant coach she helped the Seminoles to three NCAA Tournament appearances and now, as the fifth head coach in the history of the program, she has led Florida State to two NCAA Tournament appearances in two years.

Throughout her career at Florida State, she has played as one of the Seminoles top players (she was named Florida State's team MVP in 1999), played with a number of touring professionals (including two-time LPGA major winner Karen Stupples) and has coached many of Florida State's recent greats including the only four-time golf All-American in school history (Caroline Westrup). While achieving success during her career as a player and a coach, Bond has never lost sight of her ultimate goal: the success and achievements of her student-athletes.

In the first seven seasons as a Seminole coach (five as an assistant, two as the head coach), every studentathlete who has played golf at Florida State has earned her bachelor's degree and every one played on at least two NCAA Tournament teams during their careers.

In Bond's first two seasons as Florida State's head coach, the Seminoles have played in two NCAA Regional Championships, have had two players (Jessica Negron in 2011 and Maria Salinas in 2012) play in the NCAA Championship Finals, finished in the top five of two consecutive ACC Tournaments, earned two NCAA Regional All-American selections, two All-ACC selections and had five players earn their degrees from Florida State.

RETURNING HOME

Amy Bond joined the long and illustrious list of Florida State alumni who have returned to their alma mater when she was named the Seminoles' head coach on June 25, 2010. She returned to her Seminole roots after an outstanding playing career at Florida State (1995-99) during which she finished in 30th place in the 1999 NCAA Championship Finals and a five-year career as an assistant coach (2002-06) when she helped lead the Seminoles to the NCAA Championships three times. Bond is one of three Florida State alumni who are current head coaches at Florida State joining Jennifer Hyde (women's tennis) and Mike Martin (baseball).



SUCCESS AT PRINCETON

Bond was successful in her first head coaching position at Princeton (2006-10) as she guided the Tigers to eight tournament victories and top four finishes in four Ivy League championship tournaments. The Tigers finished in second place in the Ivy league championship in 2007. Bond coached Susannah Aboff to consecutive Ivy League individual championships in 2008 and 2009 to mark only the third time in league history that a player had won consecutive individual conference championships. Aboff earned All-Ivy League honors three times during her career becoming just the second player in school history to be named to the all-league team three times in her career. During her four seasons at Princeton, only the Tigers and Harvard performed consistently in the conference championship by finishing in the top four of the team championship from 2007-10.

RECRUITING SUCCESS

During her four seasons at Princeton, Bond coached/ recruited two players (Susannah Aboff and Kelly Shon)



who qualified to play in an NCAA Championship East site. and five players who earned All-Ivy League honors a total of 10 times. Aboff won eight individual tournament championships during her career and finished in a tie for 23rd place at the NCAA East Regional Championship in 2009 - the third highest NCAA regional finish in school history. Shon played in the 2011 and 2012 US Women's Open. Shon was ranked No. 4 nationally among junior golfers and is the highest ranked junior recruit to ever attend an Ivy League institution. In five years as an assistant coach at Florida State, Bond helped recruit four players who earned All-ACC honors a total of eight times and formed the nucleus of two top 20 ranked teams. The Seminoles finished in a tie for 16th nationally in 2006 and in a tie for 19th nationally in 2004. She was also instrumental in recruiting Caroline Westrup - the only four-time All-American and four time All-ACC selection in school history.

PROFESSIONAL PLAYERS

Bond has recruited and coached seven players who have played, or who are currently playing professional golf. She recruited and coached Kristin Tamulis (Florida State) who is currently playing on the LPGA Tour. She also recruited and coached four-time All-American Caroline Westrup (Florida State) who is currently playing on the European Tour, one player who is currently playing on the LPGA Tour (Lacey Agnew), three players (Macarena Silva, Whitney Wright, Marlowe Boukis) who are currently playing on the Futures Tour and two players (Susannah Aboff and Michelle Grilli) who began their professional careers on the LPGA Futures Tour.

BOND ON THE NATIONAL SCENE

Bond is the vice-president of the Women's Golf Coaches Association Board of Directors; she was elevated to the position at the 2012 NCAA Championship Finals in Franklin, Tenn. As her first duty as the vice president of the organization, she had the honor of announcing Seminole senior Maria Salinas as an All-American at the WGCA Honors Banquet. Bond has risen steadily through the ranks of the national governing board after serving the organization as its treasurer. Bond began on the WGCA Board as its treasurer (2009-12), is currently its vice



president (2012-14) and will serve as its president during a two-year term beginning in 2014. The WGCA was formed in 1983 as an organization to promote participation in women's collegiate golf. The vision of WGCA since its inception has been to encourage the playing of intercollegiate golf for women in correlation with a general objective of education and in accordance with the highest

tradition of intercollegiate competition.

ACADEMIC ACCOLADES

Bond has made it part of her coaching philosophy to demand outstanding academic achievement from every one of her players. She began developing that philosophy as a player at Florida State when she was named an Academic All-American in 1998 and 1999 and earned ACC Academic Honor Roll accolades three times during her playing career (1996, 98, 99). A total of 35 players have been named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll during her Seminole career. Four players (for a total of five awards) have earned the honor have been named to the All-ACC Women's Golf Team in her first two seasons as the Seminoles' head coach. She has also seen nine different players named to the All-America Scholar Team and eight players named to the ACC Academic team during her first two years as the Seminoles' head coach.

TOP 50 PLAYER IN ACC HISTORY

Bond was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th Anniversary team in 2002 along with Seminole greats Karen Stupples and Louise Wright. Bond was a 1998 All-ACC selection and the Seminoles' top player from 1996-99. She earned ten top-10 finishes during her career and was named the Seminoles' Most Valuable Player each year during her career. Bond competed in the NCAA ChampionshipFinalst in 1999 and played in three NCAA Championship Regional Tournaments while finishing in the top 20 in four consecutive ACC Championship tournaments. She was an All Region selection in 1999 and was the medalist at the 1998 Ryder/Florida State Championship tournament.



COMMUNITY SERVICE CHAMPIONS

The Seminoles women's golf team won its 11th consecutive Athletic Director's Cup for Service at the annual Golden Nole Banquet 2012. The Athletic Director's Cup for Service presented annually and is the most prestigious award given to the Seminole student-athletes. It goes to the team that contributes the most service hours to the community over the course of an entire year. The womens golf team has won the Athletic Director's Cup for Service in each of Bond's five years as an assistant coach and in her first two seasons as the Seminoles' head coach.

PERSONAL

An Ocala, Fla., native, Bond earned a bachelor's degree in sport management from Florida State in 1997 before earning her master's degree in sport administration from Florida State in 1999. Bond's twin brother, Tommy, is the Director of Athletics and head baseball coach at Trinity Catholic in Ocala, Fla.

Matt Savage, one of the top golfers in Seminole history, is in his first season as an assistant coach for the men's and women's golf programs at Florida State. He earned All-America honors in 2007, was the first player in school history to earn All-ACC honors three times, played on one NCAA Championship final and four NCAA Regional Championship teams and led the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history in 2008. Savage closed his career in 2009 with a 73.09 scoring average in 44 career tournaments – the fifth best average in school history.

Savage works with both nationally ranked Seminole men's and women's programs in the areas of skill development, recruiting, practice planning and match coaching. He has a unique ability to relate his experiences as both an accomplished player on the collegiate level and as a professional golfer to teach the game of golf to the next generation of Seminole golfers.

Savage was one of the building blocks of the Seminole men's program under Director of Golf Trey Jones from 2006 through his graduation from Florida State in 2009. The Seminoles were nationally ranked during each of his four seasons and finished the 2008 season ranked 11th after winning the ACC Championship for the first time in school history. The Seminoles were ranked as high as No. 7 nationally and earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA West Regional Championship in 2008.

Savage began his professional career on the NGA Hooters Tour soon after his graduation from Florida State and enjoyed three prosperous years on golf's third largest tour. He won his first event as a professional – the 2009 Kentucky Open – and was among the top money winners on the tour during his three seasons.

NATIONAL SUCCESS

Savage earned first place honors at the 2008 North and South Amateur Championship at Pinehurst, advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2006 U.S. Amateur Public Link Championship and played in the 2006 U.S. Amateur Championship.

2008 ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Savage led Florida State to its first ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship on April 20, 2008 as the Seminoles defeated Duke by three strokes at the 55th Annual ACC Championship at the Old North State Club at Uwharrie Point. The Seminoles defeated the Blue Devils by four strokes in the third round as they rallied from a one stroke deficit after two rounds to claim the school's first ever ACC championship in the sport of golf. Each of the five team members contributed to the victory as the Seminoles closed the 54-hole tournament with four players under par and only one at over par. Savage led the way with an eight-under score of 208 and finished in a tie for third place in the individual standings.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

In addition to leading the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history in 2008, Savage helped Florida State to four tournament championships during his career: the Inverness Intercollegiate (Fall 2007), the Seminole Intercollegiate (Spring 2008), the ACC Championship (Spring 2008) and the Florida State Spring Break Invitational (Spring 2009).

ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

Savage earned regional All-American honors in both 2008 and 2009 and earned All-American Honorable Mention honors from the Golf Coaches' Association of America in 2007. He was named to the PING All-Southeast Regional All-American team in 2008 as he led the Seminoles to the ACC Championship and was named to the Ping / Southeast Regional All-American team in 2009 as he led Florida State to an appearance in the 2009 East Regional Championships. Savage earned Ping / Division I All-America Honorable Mention Honors as a sophomore after finishing in ninth place in the individual standings at the NCAA Championship Finals and earning 11 top 25 finishes in 12 events in 2007.

SCHOOL RECORD SCORE

Savage carded a school record 63 in the second round of the 2009 Florida State Spring Break Invitational. His nine under par score of 63, coupled with a 69 in the first round, allowed Savage to win the individual championship and helped the Seminoles to the team championship

in the event. Savage's score of 63 allowed him to gain the first individual championship of his career.

PREP STAR

Savage won the individual state championship, led his team to the state title, was named Mr. Golf in the State of Kentucky and earned National Player of the Year honors by the National High School Golf Coaches Association as a senior at St. Xavier Prep in Louisville in 2005. Savage earned All-America honors from the AJGA as both a junior and a senior, was a four-time All-State First Team honoree and played in the US Publinks Championship in 2005.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Savage was an academic standout during his collegiate career at Florida State as he was named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll in 2006, 2007 and 2009 and earned his degree in communication studies in 2009. He is one of three players to earn All-Academic honors at least three times under Seminole men's coach Trey Jones.

Robert Duck, who helped coach both the Florida State men's and women's golf teams to their respective NCAA Tournaments in 2012, is in his second season as an assistant coach under Trey Jones. He works directly with each of the players on both teams and has been a sensational addition to the Seminoles' coaching staff. Duck's affable personality which allows him to relate to the players on a one-on-one and team basis, his strong teaching skills and his ability to help each golfer with his course management skills allowed him to quickly become an important member of Florida States coaching staff in his first season in Tallahassee.

Duck works with both programs at Florida State in the areas of player development, recruiting and daily team and individual coaching responsibilities.

Duck was an instrumental part of the coaching staff as both the Seminole men's and women's teams advanced to their respective NCAA Tournaments for a school record seventh consecutive season. The Seminole men finish in ninth place in the NCAA Championship Finals, in a tie for third place at the NCAA Southwest Regional Championship and in third place in the ACC Championship in 2012. Duck helped

Florida State earn tournament championships at the 2012 Seminole Intercollegiate and the 2012 FAU Spring Break Invitational as the Seminoles earned seven top five team finishes during his first season in Tallahassee. His teaching abilities and coaching philosophies also translated well with the Seminole women as they finished in 10th place in the NCAA Central Regional and in fourth place in the ACC Championship.

Duck also coached two of the top golfers in school history - Brooks Koepka and Maria Salinas -- during their senior seasons. Koepka enjoyed the best season of his career as he won three individual titles, earned ACC Golfer of the Year and All-American honors and played in his first U.S. Open. Salinas earned All-America and All-ACC honors and participated in the NCAA Championship finals for the third time in her career.

The Seminoles - both the men and the women - were ranked among the nation's top 25 teams throughout his first season at Florida State. The men were ranked as high as No. 13 while the women were ranked as high as No. 22 nationally in 2012.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

Duck, a rising star in the collegiate coaching ranks, is in his second season as an assistant coach at Florida State. He was the acting head coach at Augusta State in 2002 and served the Jaguars as a volunteer assistant coach during the 2001-02 season and as an assistant coach during the 2002-2003 season. During his tenure as the acting coach at Augusta State, the Jaguars were ranked as high as No. 9 nationally.

COLLEGIATE PLAYING EXPERIENCE

Duck enjoyed a standout career at Augusta State (1998-01) where he earned All-America honors as a sophomore (1999) and led the Jaguars to three NCAA Championship appearances (1998, 1999, 2001). He is one of the top golfers in the storied history of the Augusta State program and remains listed prominently in the record book more than 10 years after his playing career ended. Duck owns the school record for lowest stroke average by a freshman (73.22) in 1998 - an average that still ranks as the seventh best single season stroke average in school history. His career stroke average of 73.86 is ranked ninth in school history. During his career he earned 12 top 10 and 28 top 20 individual finishes.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY AS A **PLAYER**

Duck led Augusta State to three NCAA Championship tournament appearances and helped the Jaguars to a seventh place finish as a senior. The seventh place finish was the best in program history at the time. With the foundation put in place by Duck and his teammates, the Jaguars won the NCAA Titles in 2010 and 2011.

SUCCESS IN PROFESSIONAL WORLD

Duck enjoyed a successful career as a manager of professional golfers for the Hambric Sports Group (2003-2012) before accepting his current assistant coaching position at Florida State. Based in London, Duck was the supervisor of the European Division of Hambric Stellar Golf. He was a player manager who oversaw public relations and marketing for seven clients including 1988 Masters champion Sandy Lyle, 2005 European Tour Rookie of the Year Gonzalo Fernandez-Castano, former Augusta State All-American Oliver Wilson and Francesco Molinari.

PERSONAL

Duck is married to the former Michelle Digsby. He earned his bachelor's degree in marketing from Augusta State in 2001. A native of Northampton, England, he represented Great Britain-Ireland as a member of the 1998 Palmer Cup team. He played in the 1997 European Amateur Championship and finished tied as the runner-up with Sergio Garcia and Luke Donald.

Top national finishes, All-Americans, professional success and academic achievement have become synonymous with the Florida State men's golf program under Trey Jones. Now in his 10th season as the head men's coach and Director of Golf for the Seminoles' men's and women's golf programs, Jones has lifted the sport of golf at Florida State to new heights. Under his direction, there is no limit on how high the Seminole programs will go.

Jones is responsible for attracting nationally ranked recruiting classes, upgrading the Seminoles' schedule to where it is ranked among the nations toughest on an annual basis and creating one of the most functional player development facilities in all of college golf on one of the Seminoles' six home golf courses. Jones continues annually to build on the Seminoles' success in developing the nation's top talent into national contenders and collegiate golf's elite players. Named the 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year as he led the Seminoles to the first conference championship in the sport of golf in school history, Jones is no stranger to competing with the nation's best in one of the top conferences for college golf.

Building championship teams and elevating those teams onto the national stage is nothing new to Jones who has earned four conference coach of the year awards and led 11 of his 16 teams at the Division I level to the NCAA Championship tournament. His teams consistently hold prominent places in the national rankings, are adept at winning conference championships and are annually among the top producers of All-American and all-conference performers.

Jones has become one of the winningest coaches in school history in his first nine years at Florida State. He is the only coach in school history to lead the Seminoles to seven NCAA Tournament appearances (no other coach has led Florida State to more than five appearances) and he is ranked second in school history with seven tournament championships (the school record is nine by Don Veller). The Seminoles have appeared in a school record seven consecutive NCAA Tournaments entering the 2012-13 season.

2012 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State earned an eighth place national finish at the 2012 NCAA Championship Finals to mark the second time in the last three seasons the Seminoles finished in the top eight of the standings at the national tournament. The Seminoles entered the championship ranked No. 19 in the nation by GolfStat and finished as one of only two teams ranked outside of the top eight to finish in the top eight of the final standings.

2010 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in a tie for third place at the 2010 NCAA Championship Finals to earn the best national finish in school history. The Seminoles fell to Augusta State (the 2010 National Champion) in the semifinals of the championship tournament after defeating Texas Tech in the first round of match play. The Seminoles led the stroke play portion of the tournament and finished in second place to earn the No. 2 seed in the match play portion of the event. The third place finish at the NCAA Championship marked the best finish in school history - one better than the Seminoles fourth place national finish in 1957 and tied for fourth place finish in 1958.

2008 ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State, which was led by All-Americans Jonas Blixt and Matt Savage, won its first ever Atlantic Coast Conference championship as it defeated Duke by three strokes at the 2008 ACC Championship at the Old North State Club at Uwharrie Point. The Seminoles defeated Duke as they rallied from a one stroke deficit after two rounds to claim the school's first ever ACC championship in the sport of golf. Each of the five team members contributed to the victory as the Seminoles closed the 54-hole tournament with four players under par. Blixt and Savage led the way with eight-under par 208 scores as they both

finished in a tie for third in the individual standings.

RECRUITING

Known as one of the nation's most dynamic recruiters, jones is nationally and internationally recognized as one of the top talent scouts in all of collegiate golf., His ability to recruit talented players, which in turn helps him build solid teams, is one of the aspects of coaching that has made Jones a top Division I coach. Florida State's recruiting class ranked fourth best in the nation in 2007, fifth best in 2008, sixth best in 2005 and among the nation's top 15 in 2006, 2010 and 2012.

BROOKS KOEPKA

Jones coached Brooks Koepka - the school record holder for lowest stroke average in a single season (71.09) and for a career (71.85) - the ACC Golfer of the Year in 2010 and 2012 and a threetime All-ACC selection. Koepka was named the ACC Golfer of the Year twice, the ACC Rookie of the Year in 2009 and earned All-American twice in his career in leading the Seminoles to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and two top-10 NCAA Championship Finals finishes. As a senior, Koepka tied the school record with a nine under par score of 63 in the third round of the FAU Spring Break Invitational and set the school record with his 199 total for three rounds of the event. Koepka won three events as a senior - at the Brickyard Collegiate Championship, the Seminole Intercollegiate, the FAU Spring Break Invitational.

PERSONAL

Jones is married to the former Cathy McVeigh, who is the coordinator of financial aid for student-athletes at Florida State. They are the proud parents of a daughter, Jordan (11) and a son, Lawrence Andrew (7). Jones earned his bachelor's degree in health and physical education with a minor in business administration from North Alabama in 1991. Jones is a 22-year veteran of the collegiate coaching ranks. He was the head men's coach and Director of Golf Operations at Georgia State for eight years (1996-2003) before becoming only the fifth coach in the history of the Seminole program in 2004. Prior to his career at Georgia State, Jones was an assistant coach at Wallace State Junior College (1992-95) and his alma mater North Alabama (1991).





Chad Smith Manager

Chad smith, who played an integral role in helping the Seminole men's and women's golf teams advance to their respective NCAA Tournaments in 2012, is in his second season as the Golf Operations Manager at Florida State. Smith works directly with Director of Golf and Head Men's Golf Coach Trey Jones and Head Women's Coach Amy Bond and each of the golf student-athletes on the day-to-day management of the teams.

Golf Operations Smith was the manager of player services at the American Junior Golf Association prior to his appointment at Florida State. His primary role was mentoring junior golfers in their quest to earn college scholarships. In his position with the AJGA he handled all contact and benefits programs more than 5,000 member golfers. As an undergraduate student at Florida State, he was an intern in both the Seminole Athletics Marketing office and the FSU Licensing Office in Seminole Boosters. As a member of the golf staff, Smith's responsibilities include managing the business affairs for both teams, arranging all aspects of team travel and overseeing the improvement and maintenance of Florida State's nationally renowned facilities at the Don Veller Seminole Golf Course. He also serves as the Co-Tournament Director for the annual Seminole Intercollegiate Golf Tournament and will play an integral role in the tournament operations when Florida State plays host to the 2013 NCAA East Regional championship at Golden Eagle Country Club. The Florida State women's golf team, which finished the season ranked No. 29 by GolfWeek Magazine and SALINAS PLAYS IN NCAA No. 30 by GolfStat, made its school record seventh consecutive NCAA Championship appearance, finished in a tie for 10th place in the NCAA Central Regional Championship, finished in fourth place in the ACC

Championship and finished in the top 5 of the team standings in five different events during the fall 2011 and spring 2012 seasons. The Seminoles have now appeared in every NCAA Championship tournament since 2006. Florida State earned its best finishes of the season as it finished in third place in the Lady Gator Invitational and in a tie for third place in the Susie Maxwell Berning Classic at the University of Oklahoma. Senior Maria Salinas, who earned All-American Third Team Mention honors from the National Golf Coaches'

Association of America, led the Seminoles with a career-low 74.30 stroke average.

CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS AS AN INDIVIDUAL

Senior Maria Salinas carded a 2 under par 70 in the final round of the NCAA Division I Women's Golf Championship and finished in a tie for 102nd place in the individual standings of the 72 hole event on the Legend's Course at Vanderbilt University. She birdied three of her final five holes as she played her best round of the tournament and closed her Florida State career on a very high note.

SALINAS EARNS ALL-AMERICAN **HONORS**

Senior Maria Salinas, who became the first NCAA Regional Champion in school history at the 2012 NCAA Central Regional Championship, earned All-American Third Team Honors from GolfWeek Magazine and All-American Honorable Mention honors as selected by the National Golf Coaches Association in 2012. It marked the seventh time since 1989 that a Seminole women's golfer has earned All-America status from the national governing body of women's collegiate golf. Salinas also earned All-Central Region All-American honors from the NGCA after finishing in a tie for first place at the NCAA Central Regional

Championship – her finish at the regional championship allowed her to qualify for NCAA Championship Finals as an individual participant. Salinas finished with a 3 under par score of 213 on the Scarlet Course at The Ohio State University Golf Club to become the highest finishing Seminole in a regional championship in school history.

SALINAS EARNS SECOND ALL-ACC HONORS

Senior Maria Salinas was named to the All-ACC Women's Golf Team for the second consecutive year as announced by the league office. Salinas became one of only four players in school history to earn All-ACC honors multiple times during her career. Salinas' selection to the All-ACC team marked the school record 12th consecutive season that at least one Seminole has been named to the All-ACC team. Salinas tied the school record for best finish in an ACC Championship (tied for second) and won her first career individual championship at the Lady Gator Invitational in March. Salinas joins a select group of Seminoles - Karen Stupples, Kristin Tamulis and Caroline Westrup - who have earned All-ACC honors multiple times during their careers. Westrup earned the honor a school record four times while Tamulis was honored by the ACC three times during her career.

Florida State earned three top 10 team finishes this fall with a tie for third place finish at the Susie Berning Maxwell Classic, a fifth place finish at the Mo Morial Tournament and a tie for 10th place finish at the Landfall Tradition during the fall season. Three different players led the Seminoles in the individual standings with junior Malin Jansson leading the Seminoles at the Mo Morial, freshman Laure Castelain earning team honors at the Susie Berning Maxwell Classic and Maria Salinas leading the way for the Seminoles at the Landfall Tradition.

A FINE SPRING FOR FLORIDA STATE

Florida State earned three top five and four top 10 team finishes with a third place finish at the Lady Gator Invitational and the fourth place finish at the ACC Championship during the

spring season. Four different players led the Seminoles in the individual standings with Maria Salinas leading the Seminoles at the Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge, the Lady Gator Invitational and the ACC Championship, Jessica Negron led the Seminoles at the Bryan National Collegiate, Malin Jansson leading the Seminoles at the AllState Sugar Bowl Classic and Laure Castelain leading Florida State at the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic.

FLORIDA STATE'S TEAM CAPTAINS

Florida State's team captains during the 2011-12 season were seniors Maria Salinas and Hannah Thomson.

SEMINOLES FINISH FOURTH AT ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Senior Maria Salinas finished in a tie for second place in the individual standings

and the Seminole women's golf team finished in fourth place in the team standings at the 24th annual ACC Women's Golf Championship at Sedgefield Country Club. Salinas tied the school record for best individual finish in the ACC Championship to help Florida State to its fourth top four team finish in the last six seasons. Salinas joined three other Seminoles in the history of the tournament who have finished in second place in the individual standings of the ACC Championship. She

joined Mary Lee Cobick (1992), Tiffany Faucette (1995) and Caroline Westrup (2007 and 2008) as Seminoles who have finished as runners-up for the coveted title of ACC individual champion. In finishing in a tie for second place, Salinas established a personal best in a conference tournament - one spot better than her finish of tied for third at the Southern Conference Championship in 2009.

SALINAS AMONG BEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Senior Maria Salinas, who was one of five ACC golfers with at least one win in 2011-12, finished her career with a scoring career scoring average of 74.37 – the second lowest by a Seminole since 1993-94. In addition, Salinas's score of 66 in the third round of the 2012 Lady Gator Invitational is tied for the third best since 1993-94 while her tournament score of 206 (minus 4) at the 2012 Lady Gator is the second best score by a Seminole player since the 1993-94 season.

SALINAS NAMED GOLFER OF THE MONTH OF MARCH

Senior Maria Salinas, who won her first career individual

championship at the Lady Gator Invitational, was named the ACC Golfer of the Month of March - along with North Carolina's Catherine O'Donnell. Salinas won her first career individual championship with a 4-under par score of 206 at the Lady Gator, played March 16-18, 2012 in Gainesville, Fla. She helped the Seminoles finish in third place in the team standings and her final 66 score on the last day ranked as her career low.

"Colleen was not only a great ambassador for the LPGA and the game of golf, but more importantly was a true and faithful friend," said five-time LPGA Tour winner Barb Mucha. "From her caring smile, unselfish ways and deep devotion to her family, her life touched all those she knew.

She will be dearly missed, but her love will live on forever in our hearts. I am blessed to have called her friend."

The Jacksonville, Fla. native started playing golf at the age of 14. Four years later, Walker was named the 1974 Palm Beach Post Athlete and Player of the Year. She went on to attend Florida State University where she earned a degree in marketing and earned Most Valuable Player honors on the women's golf team in 1977 and 1978. Walker joined the LPGA Tour 1982 after winning the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament in December of 1981. She won the first of her nine titles on the LPGA Tour in 1987 at the Mayflower Classic. The following year, 1988, she captured the LPGA's Vare Trophy for lowest scoring average and finished a career-high fifth on the LPGA Official Money List, one of four times she finished in the top 10 in her 23-year career. Walker led the Tour in top-10 finishes (18), birdies (325), rounds under par (55) and rounds in the 60s (29) that same year and was also named the Most Improved Player by Golf Digest.

In 1992, Walker tallied a career-high three victories in a season and in 1997, she won her first major title at the du Maurier Classic - just 10 months after giving birth to her son, Tyler.





Remembering Colleen Walker

Known for her tenacious spirit, Walker surprised no one with her determination and strong will as she faced her battle with breast cancer in 2003. After all, it was that same fighting spirit that helped Walker to overcome various injuries throughout her career including tendinitis in both elbows and surgery to repair torn cartilage in her left wrist. She was also awarded with the LPGA's Heather Farr Award in 2004, given to a player on the Tour who through her hard work, dedication and love of the game of golf, has demonstrated determination, perseverance and spirit. Walker was inducted into the Florida State University Hall of Fame in 1991 and the Palm Beach County Sports Hall of Fame in 2003. She joined the Legends Tour in 2001, winning her first tournament that year.


Walker's son, Tyler, is carrying on his mother's golfing legacy. He is a standout junior golfer who competed in the Florida Class 2A State Championship with the Newsome High School golf team in October. Tyler also won the Florida State Golf Association Junior Match Play Championship in his age group this past July. "I will always remember Colleen for her fight and determination on the golf course," said three-time LPGA winner and close friend of Walker's, Dawn Coe-Jones. "Off the golf course, I loved her sense of humor. I will miss walking the fairways with her as we watched our sons compete. Rest in peace, Colleen."
