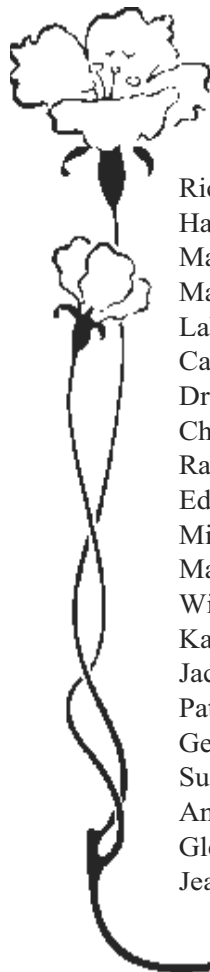

RESIDENT SPOTLIGHT LaVAUGHN TILTON

May I introduce my neighbor and good friend, LaVaughn Tilton, this month's "SPOTLIGHTER." Many of you already know her. You know that she is sweet and friendly and unassuming. Yet, LaVaughn is a mover and shaker, a woman who has done tremendous good. Please meet the founder of Hibiscus Children's Center.



LaVaughn originally comes from Vienna, Missouri. Her family had a farm and she was raised on fresh food that they grew. Her first job was secretary at the local draft board. Her husband, working for Grumman aircraft, hated the cold so the family moved to Florida in 1962. She knew all about the Mathesons and witnessed the development of this area and of Sandhill Cove. Here, also, she saw the way to fulfill her dreams of finding a safe place for children and, thus, the Hibiscus Shelter was born. I say, "Tell me about the Hibiscus Shelter" and her face lights up. For the next hour or so she tells me, all the while handing me more and more literature. Wow, I think, when am I going to have time to read it all? But I am hooked. Not only do I read about it, I also Google it.

The operation is funded, in part, by the Florida State Dept. for Children and Families, plus private supporters. To this day, she remains President Emeritus of Hibiscus Shelter. The children's psychological and physical needs are priority. Therapists work with the kids, who also receive medical and dental care and of course must go to school, as mandated. Yes, it takes a village And the fundraising continues. It is hard to believe, but human trafficking is going on right under our noses, right here, right now, in our peaceful little community, in Martin County! Hibiscus is certainly making a dent, she says, but it's only a small dent. Many more centers are needed, and not only in Florida. Also, one of the immediate needs, she tells me, is vans for transportation. And always more land for new Centers, where new activities will constantly be introduced, as now. Sports are offered, dancing, you name it. There are many, many success stories, a few failures and very little support from our Governments, she says. To which I add: that is our job, the general public's job. Because it takes a village!

LaVaughn tells of the times when she would hear about children living with abusive parents. "These children need some help" LaVaughn told her husband. She could not stand doing nothing so she did something. She had an idea for a children's shelter. Funding for such services as this is always an issue. At first the original shelter was funded by donations and was built on 1.5 acres by the Tilton & Kiplinger families in connection with the Jensen Beach Community Church. A local builder, Mosley and Sons of Stuart, offered to build the first building of this facility. In 1989, the Hibiscus Tilton/Kiplinger Shelter opening in Jensen Beach as a place for abused children. "The mission of Hibiscus Children's Center is to maintain a safe shelter

for children who are abused, abandoned and neglected by providing prevention, early intervention, and advocacy in a quality residential, assessment and recovery program". It was then that the Florida State Department for Children and Families stepped in to help fund Hibiscus Shelter. At first there were 6 boys and 6 girls but in a short time the need exploded to 36 children resulting in full capacity. That problem was solved on May 16, 2004 with the opening of "Village" in Vero Beach. It consists of eight homes with a Center Building for offices and special events and houses 13 to 18 year olds. These youngsters are guided to be independent citizens. There is a third shelter in St. Lucie County for infants and toddlers. It gives LaVaughn GREAT PLEASURE to talk about Hibiscus and provide literature to anyone who is interested.

Once a year, the Kane Center, through the Council of Aging in Stuart, Florida and Martin County, gives the SAGE Award "honoring the wisdom and worth of our seniors". Throughout the years, SAGE Award recipients given much of their lives to making life better for many residents of Martin County. This year, our very own LaVaughn Tilton has been nominated for this award.

Russian Duo of Oleg Kruglyakov and Terry Boryarsky will be performing in the Sandhill Clubhouse lounge on Sunday, February 16 from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.



Russian Duo is an international project, born out of a love of traditional music and classical elegance. Oleg is a balalaika virtuoso from Siberia and Terry is an American concert pianist. They celebrate cross-cultural creativity, exploring the range of possibilities for balalaika, voice, and piano. Audiences are taken on a journey across the span of Russian culture—from humorous pieces, virtuoso variations, pulsating dance music, rhythmic folk songs, and lyrical romances. In addition to classical music Russian Duo performs other genres including tango, blue grass, Soviet film music, and their own arrangements of ragtime.

Since the inception of Russian Duo, in 2007, Oleg and

Terry have performed from Canada to Florida, from Minnesota to Texas, and from Massachusetts to Oregon. In 2017, they performed in Kirov, Russia.

Russian Duo was selected to showcase at the Chamber Music America National Conference in NYC, January 2011. They have also showcased for Ohio Arts Professionals Network and Pennsylvania Presenters. Russian Duo has been on the Ohio Arts Council "Ohio Artists on Tour" roster since 2008.
