On behalf of the Sheldon Chamber and Development Corporation's Office and Board of Directors, thank you for your support of the SCDC in 2023. I would like to thank Curt Strouth for his excellent leadership of the SCDC for many years. I appreciated the opportunity to work with Curt as an SCDC Board Member for five years. I also had the opportunity to work alongside Curt for three valuable weeks as I transitioned into the Interim Executive Director role. Much of the economic success that Sheldon experienced in 2023 was the direct result of Curt's efforts working with the Sheldon City Council and the various key economic development subcommittees that are so important in incubating strategic incentives that drive economic growth in our community.

Several economic metrics showed positive gains in 2023. The most dramatic was a record shattering performance in residential construction which came in at just under \$11,000,000, a 32% increase over the next previous high that was set back in 2017. A creative twin home economic incentive that was co-authored by the Sheldon Development Committee, SCDC, and the Sheldon City Council was a driving factor in this residential growth. In addition, Iowa Workforce Housing credits in excess of \$1,000,000 were awarded to two local residential developers, further supporting area residential growth.

The city set another record for local options sales tax revenue in 2023 by collecting a total of \$1,026,745. This amount is up by 9% vs 2022, which at that time, was an all-time high. Local option sales tax is a 1% tax imposed on the gross receipts from sales in our community. This is proof a key indicator that local commerce continues to be on the rise.

Our hotel/motel tax revenue showed an increase from last year's record numbers. The upcoming 2024 year will be the first full year with Cobblestone Inn and Suites reporting, so we expect a record-setting year ahead.

We move into 2024 with a lot of momentum as a community and the Sheldon Chamber and Development Corporation looks forward to continuing the hard work to make our community one to be proud of.

Thank you to the SCDC Board of Directors for their leadership. Thank you to all the development subcommittees for their wisdom and guidance. Thanks to Sam Kooiker and the Sheldon City Council for their support. And of course, thank you to Curt, Brandi, Ashley, and Allison for their valuable work during this past year.

While 2023 served as a year of transition in the SCDC organization, real work continued to be accomplished, as evidenced by the numbers above. Best wished to a prosperous 2024.

Our Success Continues...

A year ago, we were celebrating all of the successes we experienced in 2022 as a community with much of that success coming from the additions of commercial property and businesses. As we set our sights on 2023, we wanted to be more aggressive with our goals related to the housing supply here in Sheldon.

Thanks to the collaboration of the SCDC, the City Council and the Housing Review Board, we were able to jumpstart the supply of housing with the sale of six lots in the Sheldon Crossing addition. This will no doubt lead to several single-family homes coming on the market as those new units sell and starts a trickle-down effect. I hope that our realtors are very busy this spring when those units are completed.

We also have several single family homes slated to begin construction on the former Bethel Church ground this spring, with some additional duplex units to be constructed there as well. If you have been out by the Event Center recently, you have also noticed that they are hard at work constructing Phase 2 of the Prairie Trail apartments and townhomes. This is going to add forty more housing units to the supply. This year will no doubt go down as one of the largest increases in housing units in Sheldon's history and will help to attract people to our community, which benefits all of us!

Our quality of life continues to increase here in Sheldon with the completion of two major projects. The completion of the trail around the pond is a great addition and has seen much activity already. It also paves the way for future amenities and quality of life projects in the future. Possibly the most notable project in our city's history is the completion of the Lewis & Clark pipeline. This not only improves our quality of water significantly, it also significantly increases our capacity, which allows us to look at recruiting businesses that we would not otherwise be able to operate in Sheldon. The impact of this is huge and we should all be thankful to the past city leaders who had the foresight to invest in this long-term project.

As you well know, we experienced the loss of Curt Strouth, our long-time Executive Director. While we were saddened to see him and his family leave Sheldon, we also congratulated him on the opportunity to grow in his career aspirations. On behalf of the entire Board of Directors, I want to thank Curt once again for all of the work he put in to make 2023 a successful year.

We continue to work on identifying the right person for the Executive Director. This is not a quick process and we want to be sure that we are able to get the right person in place. It has been a huge blessing to have Mark Brown serving in this interim role as he has done a wonderful job of keeping things moving forward. His presence has allowed us to take our time in finding the right person to lead our organization. Our board is also thankful for Brandi Fuerstenberg and her willingness to continue assisting us in a part time capacity during this transitionary period.

The board has spent significant time looking at the organizational structure and benefits for our employees and we are confident that we have a solid plan to move our organization forward. We are hopeful to be able to share some additional information on our transition and introduce you to our new employees in early 2024.

As we look ahead to the coming year, we have much to be excited about as a community. Our high school will soon begin a \$33 Million dollar expansion and remodel and we will be announcing additional projects that are in the works, which will be wonderful additions to Sheldon!

2023 Economic Development Statistics Summary

Each year the Sheldon Chamber and Development Corporation compile a number of statistics that are a representation of the Economic Development activity in Sheldon. Here is a brief summary of the 2023 statistics provided with this report.

The Sheldon Redevelopment Incentive Fund or "Storefront Program" funded three projects in 2023 with the total investment of \$41,236.00. These are forgivable loans made available to SCDC member businesses. This program has approved a total of 124 forgivable loans since the inception of the program with a total capital investment of \$1,751,463.00 in existing building improvements.

The Interior Renovation Program assists in funding local businesses and their renovation projects. This is a 0% loan program amortized over 5 years. This program was started in 2016.

Local Option Sales Tax Revenue during FY 2022-2023 generated an income of \$1,026,744.65. This is a increase of 87,280.54 from the previous fiscal year. These are sales tax dollars collected as consumers purchase goods and services from the local businesses in our community.

In 2023, there was \$166,562.00 of Hotel/Motel Tax Revenue generated, compared to \$166,072.00 collected in 2022. These funds are used by the Sheldon Marketing Committee and the City of Sheldon for community betterment projects and to market the community.

Sheldon T.I.F. Revenue generated during the 2022-2023 fiscal year was \$3,494,085.51.

There were 6 new loans in the Sheldon RLF program during 2023. The Sheldon Revolving Loan Fund has in excess of \$700,000 dollars to loan to local businesses for start-ups, expansions, etc. The Sheldon Revolving Loan Fund currently has 20 outstanding loans.

In 2023, the City of Sheldon issued 65 building permits estimating \$23,195,773.00 in capital investment.




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
