

NYC-Resources on Energy Regulations

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Overview

In 2019, NYC Passed a <u>Climate Mobilization Act</u>. The most important regulations to keep in mind are Local Law 97 & Local Law 95, which both have fines and apply to all buildings over 25,000 sqft.

Local Law 97 creates carbon emissions limits with the goal of reducing building-based emissions 40% by 2030 from a 2005 baseline. It impacts 60 percent of the square footage in New York City. Buildings must pay \$268 per metric ton that their carbon footprint exceeds the limit, annually. There are also fines for not submitting a report and for submitting a false report.



Local Law 95 requires buildings to post their Building Energy Efficiency Rating Label in a public place near the entrance. Failure to comply results in a violation and a \$1,250 fine.
