Code of Conduct

We will not tolerate the following:

- Aggressively pushing your own services, products, or causes.
- Distribution or consumption of alcohol at NANOG-sponsored in-person venues (alcohol not served by hotel-licensed providers).
- Audio or video recordings of the few sessions where such recording is not permitted.
- Engaging in any activity that is illegal, or violates NANOG's or its sponsors' contracts with venues or contractors.



Code of Conduct (Cont.)

We will not tolerate the following:

- Offensive verbal comments or physical contact because of sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, disability, physical appearance, personal appearance, race, color, national origin or religion (or lack thereof).
- · Sexual images of any kind, displayed in public spaces.
- Deliberate intimidation, stalking, threatening, or following.
- Demeaning or disruptive behavior or speech.



Code of Conduct (Cont.)

We will not tolerate the following:

- Harassing photography or recording of any kind.
- Sustained disruption of a presentation or other event.
- Inappropriate physical contact.
- · Unwelcome sexual attention.

- The NANOG Ombuds is our designated impartial conflict resolution practitioner.
- They provide confidential and informal assistance to our community on a variety of issues and concerns.
- The Ombuds does not advocate for any position in a dispute; instead, they strive for fairness of process.
- They can also help identify systemic issues that hinder the rights of others.




Areas covered by the Ombuds

- Confusion around policies or procedures
- Perceived ethical dilemmas
- Perceived unfair treatment or bullying
- Or any other breach of our code of conduct
- Communication with the Ombud is completely confidential. Neither the staff nor the board are copied on emails.


