

## Primary 3 Week 12

### Week beginning 22<sup>nd</sup> June– Literacy

The week is split into 5 lessons which will take you through a weeks' worth of literacy learning and activities. Most will be completed in your Literacy classwork books.

- ✓ No new Spellings. Focus on spelling tricky word we've been working on from pages 84 -86 of the planner.
- ✓ Tricky word test – Ask any 30 spellings from the pages 84 -86 of the planner, depending on how far on your child has progressed.
- ✓ Reading – One book each night from the **Oxford Owl** or **Collins Big Cat Readers** online schemes. Links for these can be found in the P3 online learning section of the school website.

#### Monday

##### Activity 1 – Grammar – Commas

This week we will continue our grammar work on using commas in lists. Remember when you are listing more than two items you use a comma instead of and to separate the items.

*e.g. Mrs McFadden likes reading, walking, drawing and listening to music.*

Today's activity is to write a list using commas. Remember as always complete the activity in your book.

- Group A – Complete the lists by adding commas and then writing the lists at the bottom of the page.
- Group B & C – Write out the sentences adding commas.
- Group D – Spelling worksheet. Page 8 in the Literacy booklet (with the worm in the front). These words are Group D's spellings for the week and should be tested in the Friday test.

#### Tuesday

##### Activity 2 Grammar – Speech Marks

This week our grammar work will be on speech marks which is a type of punctuation. First look through the PowerPoint. This is quite a tricky concept and we just touch on it in P3. We are happy if your child becomes familiar with speech marks at this stage.

- Groups A, B and C – Look through the PowerPoint with an adult.
- Groups A, B and C – Look at the speech marks sheet. Practice drawing speech marks, like little 66's and 99.s Draw them in the air, on your whiteboard or even in the sand or paint them.

- Groups A, B and C – Write out the sentences adding in speech marks.
- Group D – Onset and Rhyme. Read the instructions on page 9 of the literacy worm booklet and look at the example on page 10. Then ask your child to read the words on pages 34-35. Complete page 18 in the booklet using **ob** words.

#### Activity 4 –Writing

- Does he have superpowers? What are they?
- Does he pretend to be a normal cat, then change?
- What does he eat?
- What happens when he meets a dog?
- Do people know he's special?

Remember to be as creative as possible and use capital letters and full stops. You can always check spellings with an adult.

- Group D – Cut and stick pages 58 -59 in the literacy booklet (with the worm on the front)

Today we are going to complete our work on speech marks. Take another look at Tuesday's power point to remind you how to use speech marks. Then complete the activity in your literacy book.

- Group A – Speech marks – own sentences A
- Group B and C – Speech Marks – own sentences B&C
