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Nigel's Famous Chicken Curry Recipe

Serves 6

Ingredients 4oz oil or fat 2 Small onions, chopped 1oz ginger root, grated 1oz garlic clove, grated 1 Small chilli, finely chopped and seeds removed 1 pepper (any colour), chopped 2oz curry powder 2oz garam masala 1 pint of chicken stock (can be done using 3 chicken stock cubes) 1 small jar of mango chutney 1 small jar of curry paste eg. Tikka masala/Balti/rogan josh Salt and pepper to taste 2 x 400g tins of chopped tomatoes 1 oz of flour or cornflour

Method

- 1. Warm oil/fat in pot
- 2. Add onion, garlic, ginger, chilli, pepper, garam masala and curry powder. Cook for 10 minutes on a low heat.
- 3. Make stock, or add water to stock cubes and add to mix.
- 4. Add flour or corn flour (corn flour is gluten free) and cook for 5 minutes.
- 5. Add all remaining ingredients and simmer for 30mins
- 6. Blend to a smooth paste and season to taste

Serve by adding cooked chicken, lamb, beef or vegetables of your choice and some boiled rice and naan.





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School Reports

Your child will receive an end of year school report this year as normal. However, the content will be slightly different.

1) The class teacher will only be able to comment on progress in each area of the curriculum up until the time of school closure in March. This will not be that different to the comments made at parent interviews in February.

2) Attendance information on your child's report is also only up until school closure in March.

3) As we didn't get to complete our end of year assessments, these boxes will be left blank.

Reports will be available to collect, from the school office, on the following dates. Please obey social distancing rules when collecting from the office. Only 1 person will be allowed into the waiting area at a time. If a parent is not collecting a child's report, you must phone school and inform us of the name of the person collecting your child's report. Without this initial phone call, we will be unable to hand over your child's report.

<u>We are aware that some children will receive reports before others, however, it is important that we do not have parents of 430 children arrive at school at the same time. Thank you in advance for supporting us in the arrangements outlined below:</u>

Mon 22nd June, 9am – 12pm – NURSERY CHILDREN (parents can collect reports of older siblings)

Mon 22nd June, 1pm – 3pm – PRIMARY 1 CHILDREN (parents can collect reports of older siblings)

Tues 23rd June, 9am – 12pm – PRIMARY 2 CHILDREN (parents can collect reports of older siblings)

Tues 23rd June, 1pm – 3pm – PRIMARY 3 CHILDREN (parents can collect reports of older siblings)

Wed 24th June, 9am – 12pm – PRIMARY 4 CHILDREN (parents can collect reports of older siblings)

Wed 24th June, 1pm – 3pm – PRIMARY 5 CHILDREN (parents can collect reports of older siblings)

Thurs 25th June, 9am – 12pm – PRIMARY 6 CHILDREN (parents can collect reports of older siblings)

Thurs 25th June, 1pm – 3pm – PRIMARY 7 CHILDREN (parents can collect reports of older siblings)

School will be open on Thursday 25th June from 6pm – 7pm to accommodate any parents unable to make the above times.



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The Education Authority wrote to all Principals to inform us about changes in relation to the Post Primary Admission process.

As you will be aware, Primary 7 pupils had been expecting to find out their post primary school information on Saturday 30th May. As a result of the recent changes to Saturday post etc, the Education Authority has made the following changes:

- Letters should now arrive with parents on Thursday 4th June 2020.
- The letter will come from the Education Authority and not from your child's post primary school.
- Primary school principals will receive a list of post primary placements also. We will be here to speak with you on the phone if you do not, for whatever reason, receive your letter in the post. I will be in school on Thursday 4th and Friday 5th June for any parents to make contact with me. However, the EA have very clearly stated that we are unable to give this information out to parents until 12pm on Thursday 4th June. I'd be very grateful if parents would not contact school until 12pm on Thursday 4th June as I would not want to be put in an awkward position over the phone with you.

STATEMENT FROM MINISTER OF EDUCATION ON REOPENING OF SCHOOLS

Many parents have been asking about what school will look like when we reopen. Unfortunately, I really don't have any idea as yet! We are still awaiting firm guidance and advice from the Department of Education and/or the Education Authority.
