### **School Crossing Patrol Update**

Thank you to everyone using both the Nelson Drive pedestrian gate, road crossing and upper car park in such an appropriate, safe manner.

I have continued to press several groups/ organisations for solutions to the issue of no SCP in place.

I would like to remind parents that this was not a school decision, but an EA decision, due to budget cuts. They have made it clear that it is not a statutory duty for EA to ensure pupils arrive safely to the school gate, rather it is a parental/ guardian responsibility.

I have been so impressed to see parents and pupils talking about safe road crossing at this junction and we will continue to reinforce the road safety message in school.

I would like to thank our local representatives from the UUP, Ryan McCready and Darren Guy and DUP, Gary Middleton and Niree McMorris, who have come to discuss the matter in school and are carrying through with action points through the appropriate channels. I was pleased to have a visit from Department for Infrastructure on Monday morning, where I had the chance to highlight the issues and put forward potential solutions. I am hopeful that we can have some form of safer crossing markings and signage in this area.

I am very conscious that there is a reduced traffic volume this week due to the good weather.

I trust we can all continue to work together as the darker, colder, wetter mornings arrive to ensure the safety of our pupils arriving to school.

**With this in mind, could I ask you to please NOT PARK at the footpath area on the school side beside the upper car park.** It creates a bottleneck with traffic and has a significant impact on sightlines for pedestrians.



### **Car Park**

I wish to pass on a huge THANK YOU to so many of you who have followed our updated guidance with regards parking off site. I know it places additional pressures of time in the morning for many families, but it has been fantastic to see the vast majority of parents keeping the lower area free for drop offs, pedestrians, staff cars, taxis and those with mobility issues who have previously contacted school-both in the morning and afternoon. Please continue to follow this guidance.

## Active travel to school




The weather over the last week has seen so many more pupils travel actively to school. It is wonderful to see this, with so many bikes and scooters parked up at the shelters. With this in mind, please remind your child that bikes should be ridden safely within the school grounds and should be walked when there is a high number of pedestrians. We have had a couple of close calls on the path down from Nelson Drive in the last couple of mornings.



## School Dinner bookings

Please ensure school dinner bookings are completed the night before dinner is required. They can be booked well in advance. We will be sending out a paper copy of the menu to each family. I would encourage you to put this on the fridge door, so that you can see clearly the menu for a day and any allergens there may be.

Reminder of booking process:

- ✚ When app set up, the three black lines  on top left of screen, let you go into **dinners** (to book child's meals)
- ✚ Click on your child's name (green bar at top), if you have more than one child, simply swipe across for next child's name
- ✚ Select the W/C (week commencing) down arrow, go into day required, down arrow again and make your food selection
- ✚ When the total appears at bottom left, click on the **+** (plus sign)
- ✚ Go into top right and click on highlighted green box with number inside 
- ✚ Click on  Pay option
- ✚ Put in details of Cardholder's Name & Press **Next**
- ✚ Put in all details – Card Number, Expiration Date, Security Code etc
- ✚ Press **Pay**
- ✚ It comes up with **Processing**
- ✚ Then **Payment Successful**
- ✚ Select Done- a receipt of confirmation should be sent to your email.

## School start times and finish times

**School starts at 8:50am**, with **pod doors opened at 8:40am**. There have been quite a few families arriving between 8:50-9:00am. This means by the time pupils get to class, they will have missed registration and welcome and the daily timetable. For pupils, especially younger ones, this can cause quite a disruption. I ask that **we all** please make a special effort to be in class **on time**.

We have plans to have a whole school sponsored event this term, in the hope that it would raise enough funds to help deliver in school provision of some of these former activities, including school counsellor, highland dancing and Ryan McBride pupil wellbeing programme.
