# Welcome Back to School



A very warm welcome to any new families joining us for the very first time and a special welcome to all of our new Primary 1's. We trust you will all feel very much part of our school family.

### Return to FULL School Uniform

We would like to praise all our pupils who have arrived in school looking very smart in full school uniform. We want you to help ensure this daily consistency throughout the year and remind everybody that school uniform is COMPULSORY. Black shoes must be worn daily with trainers brought separately if playing football at break/lunchtimes or staying for after school/late club. Black shoes will get marked and will mark the sports hall floor during sporting activities, hence the need for a pair of trainers.

Each class teacher will make you aware of the child's class timetable and P.E. days. Children (P1-P5) should wear full school P.E. uniform on THESE DAYS ONLY. Primary 6 and 7 bring their PE uniform separately to change into at school. This helps prepare them for Post Primary transition. Our PE uniform consists of royal blue polo T-shirt (available from school office), trainers and plain black shorts or track bottoms (strictly no football shorts or multi-coloured leggings are permitted).

Remember, you may be entitled to a grant towards school uniform/FREE School Meals and if not already done so, can make enquiries through the Education Authority website <a href="https://www.eani.org.uk">www.eani.org.uk</a>. Even if only occasionally taking school dinner or not at all, availing of FSM provides EXTRA funding into our school budget to be spent on resources for our pupils and school.

### Extra Curricular Clubs

Our *Early Morning Club* for P1-P7 (7.50-8.30am Monday to Friday) commences Monday  $2^{nd}$  Sept. *After School Play Club* for P1-P2 & (P3 Thurs-Fri) 1.30pm-2.30pm will also commence Monday  $2^{nd}$  Sept and run daily.

\*Note changes to the **Stay Late Club** for P1-P7 (2.40-4.00pm) which will run 3 afternoons weekly (Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday). <u>All children enrolling for these school clubs must be booked a week in advance before Sunday midnight via the online ParentPay platform</u> to ensure we can plan and prepare appropriately. Bookings CANNOT be taken during the week.

The Early Morning Club (£2 per day) provides pupils with the option of cereals (Rice Krispies/Cornflakes) or toast & milk daily. If your child has **any food allergies**, please

ensure this is indicated on your child's medical form or contact the school office to update this.

\*ANY CHANGES TO CONTACT DETAILS SHOULD BE COMMUNICATED TO THE SCHOOL OFFICE IMMEDIATELY\*

After School Club (£3 daily) & Late Club (£3.50 daily) will continue to offer a drink and snack as well as varied fun activities for those pupils attending. The <u>Late Club</u> (Tues-Thurs) will offer a range of fun activities from Arts and Crafts, Go karts, movies and popcorn, gardening, singing and dancing and much, much more.

# Healthy Eating Policy

We are keen to promote healthy eating during school hours. We offer a healthy break through our School Meals kitchen (only £1.50 per week with a choice of fruits or toast). If your child is bringing their own break, this should be a healthy option only. A packed lunch, should be healthy and balanced with no fizzy, sugary drinks or large bars of chocolate or bags of sweets. We encourage ALL children to bring a bottle of water to drink and keep hydrated throughout the day too.

Our hot school dinners will continue to be transported from the Hardy meal's kitchen in Barbara's absence. We will continue to keep you up-to-date regarding this situation.

School dinners will remain £2.60 for children (unless entitled to FSM) and are booked and paid for via the ParentPay App by Sunday midnight of the previous week. Always inform your child what you have ordered them daily so that they know what they're having when they approach the meals hatch. Remember: even if not taking a school dinner, please apply for FREE School Meals (FSM) and a uniform grant through the EA website if entitled.

\* School milk is optional and is payable on ParentPay for Term 1.

The 'Schools NI 'App (which is FREE), is our one main form of communication to keep you up-to-date on upcoming events, share class & school news and links closely with our school website and online calendar. The school texting service will be for emergencies only.
