












# St Mary's Mullymesker Easter Draw

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### Numeracy

#### Our Focus for the next few weeks will be Measures:

This involves lots and lots of practical work in weighing, measuring, filling emptying etc.

Children will be learning to:

- Understand and use the language associated with length, 'weight',
  capacity, area, long /longer /longest etc is the same length
  /weight as: full/empty /half-full etc
- Use non-standard units to measure i.e handspans, cubes, spools etc As children get older they themselves recognise the need for standard units;

Children will take part in activities which will enable them to understand the conservation of measures.

- Know all units of measurement cm,mm,m: ml,l,kl:g:kg: tonnes.
- Convert units of measurement i.e grammes -kilogrammes millimetres-centimetres-metres-kilometres etc

Encourage younger children in the Foundation Stage(Year One and Two) to use the language of measure around the house. The living room is six strides long...ten footsteps wide etc. Support children in helping you to weigh out ingredients. Or simply filling and emptying containers at the sink or in the bath. How many cups fill the bottle? etc

Encourage older children to help you measure things around the house, estimating and then checking their measurements.

Older children should convert measurements in their heads:
e.g 5 metres=500 cms, 300g=0.3kg etc
