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- **Mathletics Challenge-** This week, instead of the usual homework we are asking all children to complete some Mathletics Activities each night, as we are competing in a world-wide Mathletics Challenge. Pupils should all have their login details in their bags. The aim is for each pupil to earn as many points as possible by completing Mathletics tasks or playing Live Mathletics, so the more they play, the better chance we have of getting on the world leaderboard.
- Friday will be a **Numeracy themed dress up day**, where pupils can come dressed in clothes with a Numeracy theme, such as shapes, numbers, patterns etc... or they can create their own number themed costume to be in with a chance of winning best dressed pupil (see the attached photos for some ideas).
