Priorities for Improvement

As you know, we completed our 3 Year School Development Plan audit with all stakeholders in autumn of 2024 and using the feedback we formed our priorities Learning and Teaching to improve comprehension by reading and thinking about what we see and read, using our knowledge to make predictions, retrieval of information, and inference and deduction of what is going on, so that our understanding of things, across the curriculum improves. We have also been focussing on improving Mental Maths and Problem Solving in Mathematics and how we think about and solve problems. Thank you for supporting your children through listening to and talking about what they are doing in school and assisting in the learning through completion of homework.

Another priority for our 3 Year School Development Plan is to improve Parental/Guardian engagement. To this end we encourage you to attend workshops and meetings, and to support your child with homework. Please continue to support your child's learning through checking and signing homework every night and please get in touch if there is ever an issue with this. We also want to enlist your help in the development and improvement of our school, and we would like to sincerely thank those parents who have given so much of their time to through the Parents' Association and through volunteering to help with our Mindful Meadow Project which is really taking shape! We will be posting a full article on the progress made in the very near future.

We are also focusing on behaviour and would like to commend our children for displaying high standards of respect and good manners to all in our school, and through living our School Values of being Respectful, Inclusive, Caring and Hardworking. Well done children, you are a credit to your parents, guardians and families! We will be giving a special award at assembly to those children who are noted to be upholding our school values from this week onwards.

Breaktime Snacks/Water Bottle/Lunches

St Patrick's follows a Healthy Breaks Policy – this consists of water (**not flavoured**) and pieces of fruit/vegetables. No juice is allowed in class. We ask you to be mindful of the amount of sugary treats included in lunchboxes and please remind your children they should not share or swap food items because of allergies! Several children have severe nut allergies. **Please do not send any food with nuts into school.**

Attendance and Punctuality

Congratulations to all those children whose attendance was of a high standard last year! Our overall school attendance for last year was 96%. It is our aim that this will increase to above 97% by the end of 2025-2026. There will be a special award for those children whose attendance is above 98% at the end of year awards ceremony. Last year we had 5 children who received a £10 voucher! We look forward to rewarding many more children this year!

Please ensure your child attends school when they are well enough to do so. Missing school means your child is missing out on forming relationships with friends, staff, and of course learning. Therefore, it is extremely important that your child does not miss school unless they are ill or have an exceptional reason.

All absences must be reported on the first day, either to the general office or by email to info@stpatricks.hilltown.ni.sch.uk . When a child returns to school, they should have a written note

explaining the reason for absence. The Education Welfare Service will be contacting parents of children whose monthly attendance is below 90% where a valid reason has not been given to the school. Every effort is being made to assist in developing your child's experience of learning, with a focus on wellbeing, from when your child enters the school, therefore it is vital your child arrives punctually. The buzzer gate opens at 8:00am for breakfast club and 8:30am for all other children. Children are brought to class at 8:50am and learning commences at 9:00am. The school gate closes at 9:00am sharp.

Assemblies and Prayer Services

Each month a class has been leading an assembly with the whole school, and a prayer service for their parents and family members. Thanks to those of you that have been able to attend, it is great to have your support. We appreciate it is not always suitable to attend the prayer service and request that you get in touch if you are not able to attend the 1:15pm time. Health and Safety and Traffic management

Thanks to all those who park safely in the church carpark when leaving and collecting your child to/from school. At all times your child's safety is our number one priority. We respectfully request that no one parks or turns in the Bus Layby or the school vehicular gates or the old Parochial House site (staff car parking only). Anyone doing this is endangering the lives of our pupils and staff.
