Engaging in Remote/Blended Learning

- We know that families are all doing their very best during this difficult time and this is very different in every home
- Teachers aim to be realistic in our expectations and we have shared these with you regularly: 3 activities per day & uploading one to Seesaw for feedback plus daily reading
- We ask that you log on daily to receive the message from your child's teacher and a summary of the work to be completed. Teachers may also add teaching videos to explain new concepts.
- Pupil attendance is also calculated by daily logins.
- DENI have asked that we monitor daily activity and record sustained engagement/absence
- However, we are aware that in different houses there are different arrangements – children in childcare, parents working a rota etc. If this is the case, simply let the school office know which days you are working and your child will not be online.
- This may affect when work is sent in and that is fine. Teachers will give feedback the following day.
- It is also important to let us know if your child is sick and unable to engage in remote/blended learning



Parent/Teacher interviews: beginning Mon 1st February 2021

- Interviews took place for Y7 in term 1 alongside baselines for Y1 parents.
- Term 1 face-to-face meetings were postponed due to COVID restrictions
- To prevent any further delay and unsure of what restrictions we may be working with later in the year, parent interviews are scheduled for week beginning Mon 1st February.
- Teachers have been assigned a specific day. Interviews will be by telephone and last up to 10 minutes.
- *Teachers will send you details next week via Seesaw of the date and an approximate time.*
- Any changes to phone numbers should have already been shared with the office. If in doubt, please feel free to check so your child's teacher will have the most up to date information.
- On this day, work will still be prepared and a morning message posted. However, teachers will not be available to give feedback to work sent in via Seesaw.

Essential supervision for children of key workers

We appreciate that parents only use this service if there is *no alternative option*. Keeping numbers low is fundamental to the success of this lockdown. We have now reached our capacity and following a risk assessment are unable to offer any additional places at this time. *Some days are very busy – particularly Monday and Thursday*. If those already using this service have any flexibility on these days, we would appreciate you getting in touch. Also, if your child's place is no longer needed e.g. if it is possible to work from home or your work is no longer considered to be that of an essential key worker, please withdraw your request for care. Shift workers should confirm requested days by 12 noon on Thursday each week.

Family Activity Sheet – Cyber Security

This activity sheet has been created to help you to learn more about cyber security, take some actions to stay safe, and have some fun together while becoming Cyber Aware!

Conversation starters

Here some questions you can ask to start a conversation:

- Depending on your child's age, ask if they have ever seen a 'pop up box' on screen or been sent an email or text which asked them to click on a link? Discuss if they think it would be safe to click the link.
- Ask why passwords are important and how they would create a password nobody could guess.
- Watch the You Tube video '[How private is your personal information](#)'. As a family discuss the ways that leaving personal information exposed online, and what you would do to protect it.

Online safety action

Pick one of these actions to do as a family:

Visit [The National Cyber Security Centre's Cyber Aware](#) website and pick one Cyber Aware action you can all take - or if you want to be super cyber secure – do all of them!

- Create a new password for your main email account. You can use our **Cyber Aware activity** sheet to help.
- Turn on two- factor authentication.
- Check your devices have up to date software
- Turn on 'back-up information'

Fun family task

Who's the most Cyber Secure.

Ask each person in the family to write down all the different online accounts they have. This can be anything from an account on a shared family device or at school, to an online gaming account or social media, to an email account.

How many are there?

Now ask them to tally up how many different passwords they use for the accounts.

The highest number wins! And also a great opportunity to go and change passwords.


