<u>Our school</u>

St. Macartan's Primary School, Clogher is a Catholic Maintained Primary School and enrols both boys and girls. It supports an urban and rural community and is located on the periphery of the Clogher village. The school was first established in September 1933.

The school enrolment has grown throughout the years and as it has done so, additional classrooms were added to accommodate growing pupil numbers. Located off the main road, behind Saint Macartan's Cathedral, the school building is set within ample grounds with a car park and hard and grass areas to play located to the front and back of the school. We take great pride in our school setting, lying below the beautiful Clogher Hillfort.

There are three classrooms within the school building and an Assembly Hall, which also serves as the Dining Hall. Two mobile classrooms to the front of the school serve as additional Classrooms for Primaries Six and Seven.

The staff have the overall well-being of the children as their priority whilst ensuring each child achieves their full potential academically, socially, spiritually and physically. A happy atmosphere permeates throughout the school allowing children to relax and effective learning to take place.

Admissions Criteria

Enrolment number	136
Admissions number	19

During the admissions procedure when applying the criteria <u>punctual applications</u> will be considered before <u>late applications</u> are considered. The application procedure opens on 10th January 2024 at 12noon (GMT) and an application submitted by the closing date of 24th January 2025 at 12noon (GMT) will be treated as a <u>punctual application</u>. An application received after 12noon (GMT) on 26th January 2025 and up to 4 pm on 29 January 2024 will be treated as a <u>late application</u>, this is also the last date and time for processing a change of preference in exceptional circumstances. After 4 pm on 29th January 2025 no applications will be processed until after the close of procedure on 25th April 2024.

The Principal will apply the following criteria as directed by the Board of Governors in order to identify which children should be admitted either at initial admission to education (P1) or on transfer from another school. The order of preference will be:

- 1. Children of compulsory school age.
- 2. Children who are the eldest in their family.
- 3. Children who have brothers and sisters currently enrolled in the school.
- 4. Children who have selected the school as their firstplace preference.
- 5. Children who reside in the Parish of Clogher.
- 6. Children for whom the school is the Catholic Maintained Primary School nearest to their home.
- 7. The remaining places will be allocated on the basis of the proximity of the child's home to the school, priority being given to those living nearest. All distances to be measured using Google Maps UK.

NOTE:

- (a) Children living in Northern Ireland must be given preference before children residing in the Republic of Ireland.
- (b) The home of the child must be clearly identified on any application form.

DUTY TO VERIFY

The Board of Governors reserves the right to require such supplementary evidence as it may determine to support or verify information on any application.

If the requested evidence is not provided to the Board of Governors by the deadline given, this will result in the withdrawal of an offer of a place. Similarly, if information is supplied which appears to be false or misleading in any material way, the offer of a place will be withdrawn.

DELIVERING THE CURRICULUM

Our school aims to provide high quality teaching and learning, delivering a curriculum for the development of the whole school in a safe, secure, happy, caring and stimulating environment. In keeping with the aims of the Northern Ireland Curriculum we aim to empower our children to develop their potential and make informed and responsible choices throughout their lives.

The curriculum in St. Macartan's P.S. is provided in a way that encourages each child to develop. Learning is interactive, practical and enjoyable. There is a wide use of teaching methods, balancing whole class, group and individual activities, to engage children in effective learning.

The Primary curriculum is delivered to our pupils in three phases:

Foundation Stage - P1 and P2 Key Stage One - P3 and P4 Key Stage Two - P5, P6 and P7

The pupils of Saint Macartan's study the full breadth of the six areas of learning within the NI Curriculum:

1. Language and Literacy to include talking and listening, reading and writing.

2. Mathematics and Numeracy focusing on the development of mathematical concepts and numeracy across the curriculum.

3. The Arts including art and design, drama and music.

4. The World Around Us focusing on the development of knowledge, skills and understanding in geography, history and science and technology.

5. Personal Development and Mutual Understanding (PDMU)

focusing on emotional development, social skills, learning to learn, health, relationships and mutual understanding in the local and global community.

6. Physical Education focusing on the development of knowledge, skills and understanding through play and a range of physical activities. At the heart of the curriculum lies the emphasis on the development of core skills and capabilities to produce lifelong learners.

Cross Curricular Skills

The three cross-curricular skills of Communication, Using Mathematics and Using ICT are embedded within the curriculum and our children are encouraged to manage information, communicate, work with others, think, problem solve, decision make, self-manage and be effective and creative in the use of ICT.



Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities

At Saint Macartan's, we promote a wide and varied programme of learning experiences for our pupils. At all times we seek to foster positive attitudes in our children whilst developing skills in decision making and problem solving.

Religious Education Programme

Saint Macartan's is a Catholic school and Religious Education is delivered through the 'Grow in Love' programme. We aim to develop the distinctive Catholic Ethos of our school, to enrich the spiritual and moral development of your child and to foster links with the Parish of Clogher. We assist parents in preparing children for the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, recognising that parents are key educators of their children particularly in the areas of faith and religion. We endeavour to develop each child's sense of confidence in his/her own identity





Outdoor Learning

We are an Eco-school and value the benefits of outdoor learning. Children are stimulated by the outdoors where they can undertake a range of practical activities to support and enhance learning across the curriculum. Our Foundation Stage and Key Stage One pupils benefit from incorporating the outdoors into their play and activity-based learning, whereas further up the school, opportunities are built into the curriculum for children to continue learning across the classroom including fieldwork and enquiry based-work within our extensive school grounds

<u>Assessment</u>

At Saint Macartan's each child's progress will be closely monitored and recorded throughout the year. Through the ongoing assessment of pupil work, the class teacher will plan and organise lesson content to suit the needs of all learners. We use a range of assessment tools such as class assessments, teacher observation and standardised tests. Children are an integral part of the assessment process and become involved in their own learning through 'Assessment for Learning'.



Happy and Contented Children

In Saint Macartan's we adopt a whole school approach to mental health and well-being. We strive to provide a supportive school and classroom climate and ethos which builds a sense of connectiveness, focus and purpose. We are committed to setting a culture within the school that values all pupils; allows them to feel a sense of belonging and makes it possible to talk about problems in a non-stigmatic way



Healthy Eating

We promote healthy eating, through healthy breaks and promoting healthy lunch boxes and children are encouraged to drink water throughout the day. A choice of healthy meals is delivered to the school premises and are served in the dining hall.

We have a strict nut free policy, in order to support children who may have an allergy.

We make the most of our wonderful outdoor surroundings and, weather permitting, play and explore outside.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

Our school family values individual differences. All children are supported, throughout their time in Saint Macartan's, to ensure that they reach their full potential.

We encourage pupils to be resilient, happy and self-confident individuals, who develop social skills, communication skills and assertiveness, alongside academic achievement.

It is estimated that 1 in 5 pupils need extra support at some time in their school lives. In Saint Macartan's Primary we work in partnership with parents. We monitor pupil progress closely and develop suitable programmes and support to meet pupil needs. We provide additional learning support for children who may struggle with aspects of learning. This takes the form of small group sessions or 1-1 sessions, where children can benefit from specialist teaching. The Special Needs Coordinator, Miss Kerry Mc Connell works closely with class teachers, parents and external educational professionals to plan and access support for pupils.

As a school, we promote a caring and supportive learning environment, where we help the children develop their full potential. As an inclusive school, we have disabled access externally and internally and accessible toilet facilities.

Enriching the Curriculum

Saint Macartan's Primary School provides a number of enrichment opportunities for our pupils and offers an extensive range of extracurricular activities that run after school hours. They are organised by staff and out-side agencies. Through these activities, we encourage and enable our pupils to learn new skills and develop their confidence. These are also an extension of the official curriculum.

Our comprehensive programme of activities meets the needs and interests of each individual. In addition to our wide range of clubs, we also organise visits, trips and workshops to support topics studied in class and which provide opportunity and inspiration for pupils to further develop their skills, knowledge and experience.

The wide range of extra-curricular activities offered at Saint Macartan's Primary School means that there is something for everyone and ensures pupils can be busy after school.

Typically, the school has art, music, science, sport and ICT clubs.

There are numerous opportunities for pupils to participate in a variety of sports outside the curriculum, whether they wish to take part competitively or just for fun.

Saint Macartan's Primary School regularly competes against other schools in a range of sports including football, cross country, Gaelic and Hurling

Non-competitive clubs are offered for all abilities and include, drama, multi-sports and gymnastics.

The opportunity to take part in a wide range of extracurricular activities is an integral part of a broad, balanced education. No matter where an individual's interests and talents lie, every pupil is sure to find something in our extra-curricular programme that will enable them to develop existing interests and to discover completely new ones.

From the Choir and Traditional Group to Art and Drama, Saint Macartan's Primary School offers a rich and varied programme which all pupils are encouraged to participate in, enjoying invaluable experiences and gaining skills which will remain with them long after they have left school.

Saint Macartan's provides educational visits throughout all year groups to allow pupils to develop social and interpersonal skills in a range of different environments. Our school enjoys extremely well established links with Augher Central and Carntall Primary Schools. We have received over £90000 in funding to deliver the governments Shared Education programme. The government project is an intrinsic part of the future development work for all three schools. It has enhanced the learning opportunities for all children involved and provided opportunities for staff to work together and share expertise and talents. Parents are always kept informed and involved in the process and invited to join with their children for some of these sessions.
