Some activities to do with your child at home

- Talk to your child about his/her day at school
- Tell him/her about your day
- Encourage him/her to listen to and carry out instructions
- Encourage your child to be independent e.g. putting on and taking off jumpers and coats, tidying away toys and hanging up clothes
- Sing/say the rhymes sent home on the monthly rhyme sheet
- Read traditional fairytale stories to him/her
- Point out the names of different fruits, vegetables etc to build on their vocabulary
- Point out different colours and shapes of objects in the environment
- Discuss the 'Green Cross Code' when you are crossing the road and chat about ways to stay safe when out and about
- Talk to them about different jobs people do and point out different vehicles e.g. fire engine

Your unwanted items can be nursery treasure!! ©

As you may notice we try to incorporate as many 'real life' objects as possible into our learning experiences. Some of the things we use and always need are:

- Cardboard boxes, cereal boxes, clean yogurt pots, yogurt drink bottles, clean bottle tops and lids
- Wool, string, fabric, buttons
- Jewellery boxes, broken or unwanted jewellery (we can use them for beads and 'treasure'
- Fishtank accessories, pebbles and shells
- Crates and pallets, rubber tyres
- Guttering and pipes, old keys and padlocks, nuts and bolts
- Planters and pots
- Gardening tools
- Wellieboots
- Magazines, greeting cards, wrapping paper, gift bags
- Unwanted crockery, pots, pans, wooden spoons, colanders, whisks, baking tins...

The list is endless! If you have unwanted items at home please check with the Nursery before you throw them out as we may be able to use them to enhance our play.

TOTS TOOTHBRUSHING CLUBS

Research has shown that regular use of 1,000-1,450 parts per million fluride toothpaste reduces the levels of tooth decay in children. To improve oral health toothbrushing clubs were established in facilities throughout the Southern Health and Social Care Trust in 2004.

We aim to run a 'toothbrushing club' here in nursery. We have received resources and training from the Community Dental Service, free of charge, and aim to encourage your child to brush their teeth during the school day. If you consent to your child participating in this programme then please sign the consent form in your child's class.
