PARENT TEACHER MEETINGS

We plan to plant lots and lots of bulbs over the next few weeks and are looking for your help. If you have any old welly boots at home we would love to have them as we hope to use them as planters. They will help to further enhance our outdoor environment and teach the children all about the importance of looking after plants.



Coats, Labels & Spare Clothes

Please ensure that your child's belongings are all labelled, that's everything from jumpers to hats and even shoes!

Please leave a bag of spare clothes on your child's coat hanger.

This is to ensure that we have dry items to change your child in the event of an accident e.g. a toileting accident or a messy play accident.

We ask that you include pants, socks, trousers, t-shirt and a vest. A uniform is not necessary as the child may never need the spare items and good clothing will go to waste!

Now that we are experiencing more autumnal weather can I ask you to bring a coat, preferably with a hood, every morning for your child.

Lunch/Dinner Time Reminder

Now that children are staying for dinners/lunches we would like to mention a few things. If your child is taking lunches please remember not to send a drink in their lunch bag as water and milk are provided for all children. Also remember to pack a healthy lunch; this can be a sandwich/wrap/pasta etc. with a piece of fruit, yoghurt and one treat – this is in line with our 'Healthy Eating Policy'.

We are aware that children have different eating patterns and that some are picky eaters at this age. In order to encourage good eating habits stickers are provided for those who try hard to eat most of their meal. Please speak to a member of the nursery team if you have concerns around meal time.

Playdough Recipe

Here is our very quick recipe for dough that you can make at home:

Ingredients

1 cup of flour
1/2 cup of salt
2 tbs of cream of tartar
1 tbs of oil
Food colouring
1 cup of boiling water

Directions

Mix flour, salt, cream of tartar and oil into a large mixing bowl.

Add the boiling water (with food colouring added) and mix well

Stir well and knead until the mixture reaches the desired texture!

Roll it out on a flat surface and you are ready for some playdough FUN!
