Action taken: Has been installed as suggested.

Good pupil encouragement on activities and communication with parents and also pupil safety inside school grounds.

Things that the school should approach the council about is to improve is safety outside school by putting speed ramps outside gates and the approaching road and slow down signs because it is only a matter of time before there is a serious accident or fatality caused by speeding passing traffic.

Action taken: Roads service were contacted but have deemed our section of Dublin Street not suitable for speed ramps due to the gradient of the hill and the effect they would have in snow/ice.
