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#### **Time-Keeping**

Time-keeping is extremely important in the education of your child and is a life-long learning skill. If your child is persistently late they are missing out on important learning opportunities at the start of the lesson. I would like to remind parents that school begins at 8.45am. Children may be dropped off at school from 8.30 am onwards. Arrival to school before 8.30 am is only permitted for the early bus children.

#### Attendance

It is essential that your child attends school regularly and maintains a pattern of good attendance throughout their school career. Excellent attendance at school is important to allow a child or young person to fulfil their potential. #### School Drop- Off Routines- Health & Safety

To avoid dangerous congestion on the Whites Road and to safeguard our school community, we kindly request that children entitled to school buses use them and parents should car share when possible. Those parents dropping off their children to school by car, should follow a one - way system to avoid dangerous traffic congestion on the Whites Road. Drivers should enter the Whites Road from the Dungannon / Ballygawley Road and exit the Whites Road onto the Fashglashagh Road. We also request that parents do not reverse into private drive - ways on the Whites Road. Please be mindful that our little children are walking to school on the pathways across these drive-ways. The health and Safety of our school community is paramount, and we appreciate your support with these safe- guarding measures.

#### Safeguarding and Child Protection

The P1 and P2 Afterschool is optional for P1 and P2 pupils. The Afterschool Club runs from 1:30 pm - 2:45 pm each day. The Afterschool for Primary 2 pupils will commence on Monday 2nd September 2024. If you want your child to have the opportunity to apply to an academically selective school, then your child will need to sit the SEAG Entrance Assessment papers. You will need to complete a Pupil Application so that SEAG has all the details it needs to be able to put arrangements in place for your child to take the Entrance Assessment on 16th November 2024 and 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2024 in one of the SEAG Assessment centres. Only pupils for whom a Pupil Application has been completed are registered to sit the Entrance Assessment. All Pupil Registrations for the 2024 SEAG Entrance Assessment including all outstanding documentation must be completed and submitted by the deadline on <u>Friday</u> 20<sup>th</sup> September 2024.</sup> If you wish your child to sit the Entrance Assessment, please register

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**as soon as possible so that you do not miss the deadline**. Your child's birth certificate and a passport sized photograph must be uploaded to confirm the identity of the pupil. There is an administration fee of £20 to register a child to sit the Entrance Assessment. Parents of pupils with a Free School Meals Entitlement (FSME) are exempt from the £20 fee.

#### **Fundamentals Coaching**

AB Coaching will facilitate a Coaching Programme for P1-P7 in St. Mary's. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Killeeshil GAA who will be contributing towards the cost of this programme and for reducing the cost to parents. This is very much appreciated by all at St. Mary's! There will be a small charge to parents. **The cost will be confirmed at the beginning of October. This can be paid in 3 termly instalments.** Fundamentals Coaching for P1-P7 commences on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September. The children in P1-P7 should wear their PE uniform into school on Fridays.

#### Swimming

Swimming lessons commence on **Friday 13th September** for **Primary 5.** (six- week programme). Swimming lessons are compulsory and part of our Physical Education Curriculum. **The cost of swimming lessons (including transport) for Primary 5 will be confirmed shortly.** (We are waiting for the bus company to provide a price). The fee can be paid on the School Money App. Children with long hair must wear a swimming cap. All children must wear goggles. The children should wear their PE uniform into school on swimming days (Friday). Your child will need to bring their swimming costume/swimming trunks, a towel, and goggles to school on each of the following Fridays.

### **French Club**

Le Club Français will resume in St. Mary's on Monday 9th September (P1-P5) and Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> September (P6 & P7). We look forward to welcoming Mrs Diane Daly back to St. Mary's. Diane will teach French to all children in P1-P7 during the school day. Le Club Français is a fun language club for children. The children will learn French through songs, games, plays, stories and lots of fun activities. **The cost of French Club is £16.50** per child for the year. This can be paid in 3 termly instalments of £5.50. The fee must be paid via School Money. Learning a foreign language at a young age has many benefits for children and can reinforce literacy skills and nurture enthusiasm. Studies suggest that at a cognitive and academic level, children learning an additional language are more creative, better at solving complex problems and can score higher on standardised tests.

As part of our ongoing commitment to the personal development of our pupils, St. Mary's PS has invited **Love for Life** to deliver the **'Choices and Changes'** programme to our Primary 6 pupils on <u>Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> November 2024</u>. This external input enhances what we already deliver in relation to Personal Development and Mutual Understanding (PDMU). Love for Life has a long-standing reputation for engaging effectively in the specific area of Personal Development and Mutual Understanding (PDMU). All of Love for Life's programmes are age-appropriate, offering accurate information in an engaging manner, helping children and young people to learn, reflect and develop in their knowledge, skills and attitudes in this important area.

The experienced and professional Love for Life team will create a safe and secure environment in which your child can have, engaging and respectful conversations about strong healthy relationships. Below is a short description of the programme, '*Choices & Changes' Choices & Changes - An introduction for 9-10 year olds to the physical and emotional changes they can expect during puberty, offering support as they explore and develop an understanding about the choices and changes in their lives.* 

### <u>'What's Inside' – Primary 7</u>

As part of our ongoing commitment to the Personal Development of our Primary 7 pupils, the children will be attending a workshop delivered by Love for Life, called 'What's Inside' on <u>Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> November 2024</u>. This interactive programme aims to equip pupils in P7 to deal with the changes that so often cause concern and anxiety at their age. We remind pupils that they are all unique by looking at the process of conception, the amazing construction of our bodies and the continuing process of growing up. The gender-specific puberty talk is often the most reassuring part of the day for pupils who are worried about changes in their bodies. Target setting, friendship and assertive behaviour skills are also addressed in the presentation.

The fun and interactive 'What's Inside' programme aims to equip the Primary 7 pupils to make healthy choices and is a vital part of their learning before their transition into secondary school. The workshop includes a separate boys and girls puberty talk, positive qualities in friendships, bullying and how to make good decisions. The main focus of the programme is to affirm the uniqueness of the individual and to encourage respect for themselves and others.

#### **Phonics Workshop**

St Mary's will be hosting a **Phonics Workshop** intended for parents of children in Primary 1 and Primary 2 on **Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2024 at 1.00 pm in the Primary 1 Classroom.** The Primary 1 and 2 children will be supervised until the end of the workshop at approximately 2pm. At St Mary's we recognise the importance of building a strong relationship with our

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children's parents and families. This workshop will help parents understand the place and purpose of teaching phonics as a starting point for teaching reading.

#### Spooktacular Day

We will celebrate 'Spooktacular Day' on **Friday 25<sup>th</sup> October 2024** to celebrate Halloween! The children will take part in lots of Halloween themed activities and are encouraged to dress up in their Halloween costumes.

### **Halloween Holidays**

School will be closed Monday 28<sup>th</sup> October 2024 – Friday 1st November 2024 inclusive.

### Accelerated Reader (P4-P7)

As you are aware, your child was set an individual AR target at the start of the school year. It is so important that your child uses this fantastic resource for reading, to improve fluency and comprehension skills. The end date for this term's target is **Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December 2024**. Please encourage your child to keep reading and taking AR quizzes to ensure he/she reaches 100% by 13<sup>th</sup> December 2024.

### Mathletics (P3-7)

Mathletics is an online learning platform that engages pupils through challenges and rewards. Linked to the National Curriculum, Mathletics supports children as they develop confidence in mathematics and allows them to practise key skills in a wide range of areas. It is designed to provide pupils with a captivating and safe learning experience which combines targeted and adaptive curriculum content, structured and interactive support, with engaging games and rewards.

#### **Healthy Eating**

St Mary's Primary School promotes healthy eating at school. Schools are monitored by the Department of Education to check that they are doing everything possible to promote healthy eating. Lunch is an important meal for school going children. It should provide one third of their recommended daily allowance of nutrients without being high in fat, sugar or salt. It should also provide dietary fibre. <u>High fat and high sugar content foods like crisps</u>, <u>sweets</u>, <u>biscuits</u>, <u>buns</u>, <u>chocolate</u>, <u>sugary cereal bars and soft drinks are not permitted for lunch</u>. Children should bring a water bottle or milk to school. All children are allowed **one small treat on a Friday**. (EG- A fun size bar, Kit-Kat, Milky Way etc) **TO BE EATEN AFTER LUNCH**. We do not permit the children to bring in fizzy drinks,

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lollipops or packets of chewy sweets. The dentist does not recommend children eating sugary snacks mid -morning and recommends that children eat their treat immediately after their lunch.

#### **Break-time Snacks**

All children have a break at 10.30am. It is important that all children bring a daily snack to school for their mid-morning break. Children should bring a healthy snack (sandwich, wrap, crackers/cheese, fruit, carrot sticks etc.) <u>High fat and high sugar content foods like crisps</u>, sweets, biscuits, buns, chocolate, sugary cereal bars and soft drinks are not permitted. <u>PLEASE NOTE:-</u> We have a large number of children with life threatening nut allergies. Please DO NOT send nuts to school with your child or foods that contain nuts.
