SCHOOL TIMES

At 9.10am the first bell rings and this signals that all should children proceed to their classroom. Class commences for all pupils at 9.20a.m and this is signalled by the second bell. It is of the utmost importance that pupils arrive for school punctually. The habit of punctual attendance will benefit pupils throughout their lives and it is easier to instil this habit when the child is just commencing school. **Children are permitted to enter school now at 8.40am. Due to Insurance reasons we cannot permit children to enter the school premises before this time.** If children are com-

ing to school early – on dry days they will be supervised in the front yard and if it is raining they must bring with them a book to read to the assembly hall whilst they are being supervised.

PLEASE NOTE

All children must enter the school via the side doors. The Front doors should only be used by Parents and visitors to our school.

PUNCTUAL PICK UP

We would ask all parents and guardians to collect their children punctually from school at **2.15pm and 3.15pm.** At 2.15pm – **Mrs Herron has other duties to attend to whenever the P1 and 2 children leave for the day and is not available to supervise any children.** Any children that are not picked up punctually can be collected from the school office. If for any reason you cannot collect your child up from school please let us know so we can put alternative arrangements in place.

Due to our Child Protection procedures – we will not permit any child to leave the school with anyone not on our list of those with responsibility. Inform the school by phone or writing if you

want to change your contact list.

CHILD PROTECTION ARRANGEMENTS

In the era we live in, increasing emphasis has been placed on ensuring that all children are safe and protected from any type of harm. The school has a number of policies in place to ensure this happens. HEALTHY EATING

As our school is a Health Promoting School we would encourage the children to bring a piece of fruit, vegetables or bread items for their break or packed lunches. Please note crisps, sweets or fizzy drinks should not be brought to school.

UNIFORM

All children must wear the correct school uniform to school. It is part of our Positive Discipline Policy. We are very much aware that the onus on the correct usage of the uniform lies with the parents. **As part of our uniform, we have a P.E. kit which the children are also required to wear.** This has been successful as it

alleviates the pressure on the children to have the latest football jersey.

Please Note – last year we found that some children wore incorrect foot wear – namely boots. During adverse weather conditions, children are permitted to wear wellingtons to school and then change into their correct school shoes/trainers once inside school.

Over the past number of years since the formation of this group, the children in this school have had varied and exciting extra curricular opportunities that they may not otherwise have been able to avail of.

This Association have been responsible for many fund raising activities within our school. The money has gone towards the purchase of new equipment, new items of furniture for classrooms, cover of transport for school trips, The main constitution and

function of the Association is as follows

as there is already a waiting list in County Hall Office, Ballymena. If you have applied for Free School Meals, you will be notified by the Education authority (EA). Until both you and the school receive this notification, you must pay £2.60 for school meals.

The Education Authority (EA) has introduced a new, online process for parents applying for home to school transport assistance. Applications for transport assistance to all schools, primary and post primary should be completed online via the EA Website at www.eani.org.uk/transportapp. **This needs to be completed ASAP.**



Accidents Happen

If your child has received a bump to the head we will send home an incident report note to inform you. If a bump or cut is judged to be more serious, we will telephone you.

Play time

When outdoors, we expect all pupils to treat each other with respect. We have a friendship stop in both the senior and junior playgrounds where pupils can go

to if they feel they need someone to play with.

We expect all pupils to listen to and respect all adults in the playground. A pupil should only have to be spoken to once. If inappropriate behaviour is repeated the pupil will be asked to consider his/her actions in a 'cool off' zone in the playground. All pupils go outdoors at break and dinner playtimes in all reasonable weathers, where there are

always staff on duty. Hence a coat is appreciated! If your child has been very unwell and you request (in writing) that your child does not go outside, he/she can remain inside the building in the school foyer.

We have purchased new play equipment for the both playgrounds and we would like you to emphasise to your children the importance of not breaking the equipment and playing safely.

Anti-Bullying Measures

The school operates an Anti-Bullying Policy. If there are any problems, parents and children should inform the class teacher or Principal immediately. We do not tolerate bullying. We hold an Anti-bullying Awareness Week in November. We ask parents to support their children and the school by:

- o Watching for signs of dis-

stress or unusual behaviour in their children, which might be evidence of bullying;

- o Advising their children to report any bullying to their class teacher, principal or the listening box and explain the implications of allowing the bullying to continue unchecked, for themselves and for other pupils;

- o Being sympathetic and sup-

portive towards their children and reassuring them that appropriate action will be taken;

- o Informing the school of any suspected bullying, even if their children are not involved.

Your Child's SAFETY is Paramount

We would like to take this opportunity to remind all parents about our school parking arrangements which are included within our Health and Safety Policy (This can be viewed on our Website). Parents are **NOT PERMITTED** to drop off or collect children from the school gates unless this has been arranged with the prin-

cipal/chairperson of the BOG. **Children who walk home from school should NOT be collected from the front of the school. This has been put in place for the safety of your children and other road users.**

We would encourage you to exercise great care in the mornings and in the eve-

nings outside the front of the school and in An Rath Dubh Car. **The speed limit is 5 mph in the grounds of An Rath Dubh. Please be aware of traffic and children at all times. Before you pull off, please check your mirrors and check over your shoulder for on-coming traffic.**

Mobile Phones/Electronic Devices

Attendance Matters To Us

We remind you that it is very important that your child attends school each day. When attendance falls below **90%** the school will issue a letter to encourage improved attendance. When attendance falls below **85%** the Education Authority demands that pupils are referred to the Education Wel-

fare Officer and a home visit may follow. The Education Welfare Officer also has central access to all pupils' attendance data. We remind parents that late attendance in the morning or leaving early in the afternoon also impacts on your child's attendance figure as registration takes place twice a

day. We strongly recommend that holidays are not booked during term time. Please remember to contact the school by phone or in writing to explain your child's absence so that the appropriate attendance code can be recorded.

Parent/Teacher Meetings

The first round of parent/teacher meetings this year took place on Tuesday 20th and Wednesday the 21st of November. These meetings are very important in order that parents and teachers can pass on relevant information in respect to how individual pupils are progressing. The staff of the school is appreciative of all the parents who ensured that they attended these important meetings. However, these meetings are extremely confidential and the information can only be relayed to and by a parent or another person with legal parental responsibility i.e. guardian. If in the event that you are unable to attend, we will try to accommodate you at another time. We look forward to your continued support during the year. Timetable will be sent out shortly so that you can reschedule work commitments.

Student Council

Elections for the student council will be held during Term 1. The council will represent the views of the student body to the staff and assist staff in raising standards of educational attainment among the student body. The student council will meet with the student council teacher, Mrs Herron on a regular basis to

progress their work. We wish the student council every success in their work.

Changes in Home Circumstances of our Children

Parents are asked to inform us personally and quickly of any changes to the living arrangements of any of our children. Sometimes changes can occur suddenly for a variety of reasons and the child/children can be confused and give us incorrect information. If any of your contact list changes we need to know in order to update our records. **THIS IS VITAL FOR OUR TEXT MESSAGING AND EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION.**

Water Bottles

We encourage pupils to drink lots of water throughout the day. All pupils in Years 3-7 should have their own water bottle. There are water fountains in school for the junior toilets. Going to the school water fountain can be a cause of disturbance, hence the pupil's own water bottle is preferable.

Some General Information

Nut Allergy

There are a number of children in the school with a nut allergy. We would remind parents of the seriousness of this condition. Under no circumstances should nuts or foods containing nuts be brought into the school by any child.

Positive Behaviour Programme

As part of our Positive Behaviour Programme, each teacher will discuss with you during the Parents Meetings their classroom discipline plan. We would then like you to discuss it with your child, sign and then return it to the school. We would appreciate your support in encouraging good behaviour at all times.

School Absences

If your child is off school for any reason – please send in a note or

ring outlining the reason for absence. This information is required by DENI.

Credit Union Savings

Savings are collected on a **Tuesday** and any child can save. This is a very worthwhile exercise as it teaches children that it is sometimes necessary to save their money. New members are always welcome and our local Credit Union provides a starter pack.

Homework

Homework extends class learning. It provides you with the opportunity to support learning. It is important to establish a good routine early. If for any reason homework cannot be completed, please inform the class teacher. Learning homework's are often regarded by staff as the more critically important homework. En-

sure these are given adequate time. Please see the Homework Policy which can be found on our Website.
