Every year in school we participate in Safer Internet Day, which this year will be on Tuesday 9th February.

Safer Internet Day 2021 will be celebrated in the UK with the theme '**An internet we trust: exploring reliability in the online world.**' The campaign this year aims to celebrate the amazing range of information and opportunities available online, and the internet's potential to inform, connect and inspire us; whilst also looking at how young people can separate fact from fiction when online.

As we are all learning from home at the moment, we would encourage you to watch the **VIRTUAL ASSEMBLES** attached to this post, which explore this year's Safer Internet Day theme. **Parents, please watch these with your child and discuss together the questions and information given.**

The assemblies will look at why inaccurate content exists, where it comes from, and what young people can do in response. They will look at what to trust online, supporting young people to question, challenge and change the online world for the better. They will also look at the emotional impact navigating a misleading online world can have on young people and give strategies to help spot and speak out against harmful and misleading content online.
